- 4 ACROPOLIS (Richardson). One of the most beautiful flowers ever raised. Full double flower with pure white rounded petals interspersed in the centre with small petals of intense bright red. Perfect exhibition flower. Recommended. Each \$ 1.15; 10 bulbs, \$ 9.50
- 5b APRIL TEARS (Gray). An extremely charming hybrid bearing four to seven sweet little corn-yellow flowers on a stem. Recommended for large plantings as a naturaliser. 10 bulbs, \$ 2.40; 100 bulbs, \$ 20.--
- 1a ARCTIC GOLD (Richardson). Uniform solid gold throughout. Free flowering. Straight and upright habit. First class exhibition variety. A treasure in the garden. Early and long lasting. 10 bulbs, \$ 9.--; 100 bulbs, \$ 75.--
- 2b AVENGER (Richardson). Wellknown Kilworth seedling. Perfectly round and smooth perianth with large almost flat crown of intense deep orange red. Highly praised show flower. Each, \$ 2.50
- 7b BABY MOON (Gerritsen). A great improvement on the original Jonquil. Flowers have the same strong scent. Ideal cutflower. Rapid increaser. 10 bulbs, \$ 1.20; 100 bulbs, \$ 10.--

- 6a CHARITY MAY (Coleman). Graceful clean cut bright yellow flower throughout. The perianth is typically reflexed. Attractive show flower and a pleasing long lasting variety in the garden. 10 bulbs, \$ 3.60; 100 bulbs, \$ 30.--
- 2d DAYDREAM (Grand Mitsch). Perfect flower with very flat overlapping sulphur lemon perianth segments. The trumpet shaped crown opens lemon. An attractive white halo around the base enhances the beauty of the flower. Long lasting and a winner on the show bench. Each \$ 2.25
- Pink 2b DEBUTANTE (Richardson). Broad rounded pure white perianth with a uniform bright coral pink cup, nicely frilled at the mouth. Rapid increaser! Each \$ 1.75; 10 bulbs, \$ 14.50

- 2a DELIBES (Rijnveld). A flower with excellent qualities. Rich yellow petals with broad flame orange crown lighter towards the throat. Very free flowering; stands the sun well. Demanding in the garden.

- 6a JACK SNIPE (M.P. Williams). A most cheerful hybrid. The long reflexed perianth petals are creamy white. The orange-yellow cup is short and straight. A very charming and welcome introduction. Recommended.

- 6a JENNY (Coleman). Gracefully reflexed pure white petals and white slender trumpet. Much admired fine flower and welcome addition to its class.

- 3b MERLIN (Richardson). Favourite flower on account of its clear colors and clean appearance. Pure white rounded perianth. Flat yellow crown with narrow margin of intense red. Splended show flower and garden plant. Sunproof. Each \$ 1.45; 10 bulbs, \$ 12.--
- 8 MINNOW (Gray). A very dainty little hybrid producing two to four flowers on a stem. Creamy white perianth and flat yellow cup. Very charming in the rockgarden. Recommended for large plantings in orchard or woodland.

- 1a MOON ORBIT (Warnaar). Fine well-balanced flower of a very attractive lime green color. Up right habit. Desirable show flower.

- 1b NEWCASTLE (Dunlop). Large flower of impeccable quality. Broad pure white perianth and perfectly proportioned deep golden yellow trumpet. Ideal show flower; a certain winner in its class. Each, \$ 3.50
- Pink 2b PASSIONALE (Wilson). Soft pink, trumpet shaped crown with pure white pointed overlapping perianth. Delicate coloring but fine quality flower.

- 6a PEEPING TOM (P.D. Williams). The favourite amongst favourites! Long narrow rich golden yellow trumpet. The reflexing petals are a slightly paler color. Very free flowering, early and extremely long lasting garden plant. Ideal naturaliser. 10 bulbs, \$ 3.85; 100 bulbs, \$ 32.--
- 2a PINZA (Richardson). Canary-yellow perianth. The nicely serrated cup has a wide band of deep orange. Long lasting and sunproof flower of striking appearance. Attractive show flower. Each \$ 0.95; 10 bulbs, \$ 8.--
- 2b PONTRESINA (Richardson). A typical Richardson seedling. Round pure white perianth with large almost flat crown of an uniform primrose. Perfectly balanced. Fine show flower. Each \$ 1.45; 10 bulbs, \$ 12.--

- 1b PREAMBLE (Wilson). Well contrasted clean bicolor of superb quality; smooth flat pure white perianth standing at right angles to the well proportioned bright chrome yellow trumpet, which becomes more lemon in tone as the flower ages. Recommended. Each \$ 0.95; 10 bulbs, \$ 8.--
- Pink 2b RAINBOW (Richardson). Famous Richardson seedling. Broad overlapping glistening white perianth segments. Large goblet shaped cup with a clear band of lovely coppery pink. In all respects a perfect flower. Rapid increaser. Lovely showflower. Recommended.
