

Please order before the middle of July to avoid disappointment, because some stocks are small and all unsold bulbs are replanted by beginning of September. Figures following the names of varieties denote approximately the relative time of flowering, No. 1 being the earliest, and No. 6 the latest.

An Exchange rate of \$1.60 to the £ will be used. We trust that is nearly right but it needs second sight to know what the rate will do in 1990. If at despatch time the dollar is stronger than the present \$1.60 to the £1 we will send extra bulbs to make up the difference.

SPECIAL OFFER

This year we would like to offer our customers something unique.

In 1974 we pollinated a pot of Frigid with Silver Chimes, also in a pot.

From the resulting seeds we raised nine different cultivars. These flowers come very late, about the same time as Albus plenus and would probably blast in some warm parts of the U.S.A. but we would like to give them a trial. Following is list of those available:—

1 4 w-w 1/19/74, Flowers about 2 inches in diameter, Broad well formed outer petals, with smaller petaloids towards the centre where tiny frills appear and a touch of green.

2 4 w-w 3/19/74. A little smaller than No. 1 but more doubled. Some of the petaloids are cream white. The green in the centre is more obvious.

3 3 w-w. 10/19/74. Single very like Frigid. Emerald Green eye.

4 4 w-yww. 11/19/74. Very free flowering. The centre is more open with a clear pistil surrounded by a lemon frill. The whole flower is slightly more cream than the others.

5 4 w-w. 15/19/74. Greenish white rather than cream 2 to 3 layers of rounded petals. When the inner petaloids are pushed back a green eye is visible with a tiny white frill and clear pistil.

6 16/19/74 and 23/19/74 seem to have 2 different clones one of which is only semi double.

Most of these cultivars come with two heads per stem in some seasons. All are very strongly scented.

We are offering collections of 2 bulbs from each of the above. 12 bulbs in all.

- 1 y-gyy** **BISHOPSTONE 3-4** (Carncairn). Loughanmore x Golden Sovereign. Resembling Loughanmore but with deeper colour. Useful for late shows. Seedling Number 3/8/76.

- 2 w-gpp** **GEORGE'S PINK 2-3** (Carncairn-Tarry). Raised from seed given to us by George Tarry this is one of the earliest pink Daffodils we grow. The perianth is glistening white, the only fault being that the inner segments are a little narrow. The corona is long and trumpet shaped, curling back at the mouth, deep pink with a lovely green eye. Breeding Ann Cameron x Dailmanach was sdg: 1/67/79.

- 3 w-gyo** **MERLIN'S CASTLE 4** (Carncairn). Glistening white overlapping perianth. Saucer shaped corona with slightly serrated orange rim. Consistent. In winning 12 in Championship of Ireland in 1989. Breeding (Corofin x Merlin) x Air-castle. Was seedling 5/30/69.

- 2 w-p** **PARKFIELD'S BEAUTY 3** (Carncairn). Very smooth perianth and pure pink corona. Best seedling in Hillsborough, Northern Ireland 1989. Breeding (Easter Moon x Rose Caprice) open pollinated. Only a few to offer. Was Sdg. 1/18/76.

- 2 w-w** **ROCKPORT 3-4** (Carncairn). A very white flower, bred from a Wootton seedling with Shantallow breeding. This corona is straight with a regular edge which opens with a faint tinge of pink. First prize in a large class of 2 w-ws at the Championship Show in Belfast 1989. Was Sdg: 3/76.

- 4 w-o** **TULLYNOG 4** (Carncairn). This is a rather short double, perhaps an advantage as it stands up to wind. The brilliant orange of the petaloids comes from pink breeding in both parents. (Egg Nog x Tullycore). In 1989 a pot of Tullynog produced much comment for it's incredible colour.

- 3 o-o** **BENEFACOR 3-4** (Carncairn). Altruist O.P. I think this is the best of a large batch of Altruist seedlings, which has produced beautiful show flowers for three years. The perianth is very broad and overlapping, of a clear apricot-orange, but intensifying in colour with age. The cup is orange-red, crinkled, but lying flat against the perianth. Sdg: No: 7/86/79. Only a few to offer.

- 2 w-gpp** **PORTNAGOLAN 4** (Carncairn). Seedling x Tynan. A neat pink with a stiff, indented corona and smooth perianth. A late flower, very good in pots. Of exhibition quality.

- 2 o-o** **RORY'S GLEN 3** (Robinson-Carncairn). A tall flower with fantastic deep orange colour in the perianth. Raised from pollen taken from one of our flowers of Fireraiser by A. E. Robinson who took it home from the R.H.S. show and put the pollen onto a flower of Bunclody. The seeds were grown on at Carncairn. Bulbs of RORY'S GLEN were grown at the National Arboretum near Washington D.C. for their "Flowers of the future" garden in 1988 where it produced excellent blooms.

The perianth segments are slightly reflexing. Selected for naming after the Botanical artist Wendy Walsh by Dr. Charles Nelson of Glasnevin Dublin. Was Sdg: 1/52/76.
