Please order before the middle of July to avoid disappointment, because some stocks are small and all unsold bulbs are replanted by beginning of September. Figures following the names of varieties denote approximately the relative time of flowering. No. 1 being the earliest, and No. 6 the latest.

6y-y	CHARITY MAY 1-2 (Coleman) A charming and graceful flower of lovely quality and a soft clear yellow. Broad overlapping much reflexed perianth segments. Cup waisted with frilly and expanded mouth. Each £1/\$1.70

2o-r	CREAGH DUBH 2-3 (Lea) Very deep orange colour in perianth and goblet shaped cup. Rather a long neck but good poise. Top class show flower. Each £7/\$11
2w-gww	CRYSTAL BLANC 3 (Pannill) Very good exhibition flower with heavy substance and good form. Pure sparkling white. Easter Moon x Pristine. Each £3/\$5
2w-p	DAILMANACH 3-4 (Lea) Inverpollu x Pink seedling. One of the best exhibition pinks. A large flower with glistening white perianth and long slightly rolled cup which is clear pink to the base. Also very good for breeding. Each £4/\$6.80
2wy-gwy	DALLIANCE 2-3 (Carncairn) Probably Daydream x Moonspell. Very like Daydream, but it is a much stronger grower and produces excellent bulbs. Each £1/\$1.70

3w-wwo *	DELL CHAPEL 3-4 (Lea) Suilven x Hamzali. This delightful flower has a round pure white perianth and a small flattish cup with a neat rim of pinkish orange. Consistent show flower. Each £2/\$3.40
1w-p	DEL REY 3-4 (Pannill) 1979 Each £5/\$8.50
4w-p	DELNASHAUGH 4 (Lea) Kinbrace x Romance. The perianth segments are broad and flat and the inner segments are deep pink interspersed with white. Produces pollen and is sometimes fertile. Each £2/\$3.40
7y-w	DICKCISSEL 3 (Mitsch) Binkie x Jonquilla. A very attractive reverse bicolor. Two or three blooms per stem. Each £2/\$3.40

- 6w-y** **DOVE WINGS 1-2** (C. F. Coleman) A.M., R.H.S. 1954. A sister seedling to Jenny. White, reflexing perianth and primrose yellow cup finely indented at the rim. A good garden flower.
