

I would like here to add a word of advice in regards to the little bulbs. PLANT SHALLOW - they haven't the strength to push through deep, heavy soil. PLANT EARLY - if they get a good root growth before the severe cold they will not freeze.

However, in the North it is very necessary to mulch them well, over the winter months. Many of our customers write us that they plant their miniatures in pots to eliminate the chance of loosing these little fellows. If you have problems or suggestions in regards to raising Miniatures and are especially interested in them, you may care to join the American Daffodil Society's Miniature Round Robin.
