




THIS CATALOGUE CANCELS ALL PREVIOUS ISSUES

All bulbs are offered subject to being unsold on receipt of order and to a satisfactory crop being lifted and being available at time of dispatch.

No complaints as to quality of bulbs, health, size or number will be entertained unless made immediately on receipt of bulbs.

I will not be responsible for results of planting or forcing.

Orders cannot be cancelled except by mutual consent.

All bulbs travel at customers' risk and expense.

Not less than 5 bulbs supplied at the 10 rate.

All prices are for nett cash within two months from date of invoice.

Receipts for payments by cheque are not sent unless requested.

New customers are requested to send cash with order or satisfactory references.

Orders are dispatched as far as possible during August and early September and any customer in the British Isles who has not received bulbs on order by the 20th September is requested to notify me immediately.

Overseas orders will be insured at customers' expense, if required.

Small lots of valuable bulbs can be sent by letter post or air mail if desired.

Prices are given in new British Decimal Currency and U.S.A. Dollars.

Dollar prices are based on the SPECIAL Concessionary Rate of £2.50 to £1.00 sterling and are subject to market fluctuations. The best method of payment is by a personal dollar cheque or banker's draft in U.S.A. Dollars.

IMPORT PERMITS AND MAILING TAGS ARE NO LONGER REQUIRED FOR U.S.A. ORDERS. BULBS CAN NOW BE SENT DIRECT TO CUSTOMERS.

CANADIAN customers must still apply to their Department of Agriculture for an import permit and address label and post to me to attach to the parcel. Bulbs cannot be dispatched until it is received.

CARRIAGE OR POSTAGE AND PACKING IS CHARGED AT COST ON ALL ORDERS.

General Collection

ALDERGROVE (Large-cupped 2b) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). I consider this much the finest and most brilliantly contrasted bicolour in the Large-cupped Division which I have seen to date. The large pure white perianth is very broad and perfectly flat, of immense substance and lovely smooth texture standing at right angles to the perfectly proportioned deep golden yellow crown. A first class show flower combining wonderful size and perfect quality.

ARMADA (Large-cupped 2a) 1 (Guy L. Wilson). F.C.C., R.H.S. A magnificent first early flower having broad smooth rich golden perianth and large bold frilled cup of intense deep tangerine-orange red which does not burn in the sun. The flowers are of great substance, short necked and carried on tall strong stems. Very vigorous and free flowering.

ARMAGH (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). A first-class large clear golden yellow trumpet of highest exhibition quality with splendid silken smooth perianth and nicely proportioned trumpet. A beautifully finished bloom with exceptionally good stem and neck. Strong vigorous plant and good doer.

ARRANMORE (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4-5 (W. J. Dunlop). A magnificent late flowering deep golden yellow trumpet of the highest quality raised from **Royalist** x **Crocus**. Broad smooth flat overlapping perianth of immense breadth standing at right angles to the perfectly balanced trumpet; splendid exhibition flower.

ARDBANE (Large-cupped 2c) 2-3 (Guy L. Wilson). Bred from **St. Brendan** x **Greenland**, this is a pure ice-white green-based flower of outstanding beauty and quality. Lovely clean-cut broad perianth and three-quarter length crown; short neck and stiff not too heavy stem.

AVE (Large-cupped 2c) 3 (Guy L. Wilson). Bred from **Truth** x **Slemish** this is a most perfect large absolutely pure white of flawless smoothness and symmetry, having broad pointed flat perianth standing at right angles to the large well balanced crown. Splendid show flower.

BALLINTOY (Large-cupped 2a) 4-5 (W. J. Dunlop). A splendid late flowering yellow red of beautiful quality having broad smooth deep golden yellow perianth and nicely proportioned deep red crown. Likely to prove of much value for late shows coming as it does when most flowers of its type are over.

BALLYCASTLE (Small-cupped 3b) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). P.C., R.H.S. A lovely show flower of splendid quality most attractive character and delightful colouring having broad smooth sparkling icy white perianth and shallow white crown edged with a most entrancing pinkish orange rim. Very free of bloom and increase and comes in lovely form in pots in the cool greenhouse.

BALLYGARVEY (Bicolour Trumpet 1b) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). A magnificent brilliantly contrasted bicolour trumpet of the highest quality bred from **Effective** x **Sincerity**. Broad smooth flat pure white perianth standing at right angles to the deep golden trumpet which is beautifully rolled at the brim. A perfect show flower of splendid size, substance and perfect form.

BALLYMARLOW (Large-cupped 2a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). An exceptionally brilliant flower of beautiful quality having broad flat smooth yellow perianth and well proportioned intensely vivid solid crimson red crown. One of the finest and most brilliantly coloured flowers seen to date. Comes in magnificent form with exceptionally brilliant colour in pots in the cool greenhouse.

BALLYROBERT (Yellow trumpet 1a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). Best Flower in the competitive classes and also best seedling at the Daffodil Society's Show, 1968. A splendid exhibition flower of superb quality having broad silken smooth perianth and perfectly proportioned trumpet slightly frilled at the mouth. The whole flower is rich deep golden yellow throughout. Strong plant and free of bloom and increase.

BALLYSILLAN (Small-cupped 3a) 2-3 (Guy L. Wilson). An early and brilliant small-cupped flower of fine quality with clear yellow perianth of very smooth firm texture and shallow vivid deep red cup; good stem and neck.

BALLYWALTER (Bicolour Trumpet 1b) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). A very fine bicolour trumpet having broad smooth pure white perianth and clear deep lemon yellow trumpet with beautifully rolled brim. Good stem and neck, vigorous plant. A splendid show flower.

BANBRIDGE (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 2 (J. L. Richardson). A lovely flower of superb form and highest quality having broad smooth flat overlapping perianth standing at right angles to the perfectly proportioned trumpet. The whole flower is of a most lovely deep old gold colour throughout which seems to deepen with age as the flower develops its wonderful size and substance. First class show flower and a strong vigorous grower and doer.

BASTION (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4 (Guy L. Wilson). A.M., R.H.S. and M.D.S. A very late flowering deep self-golden trumpet of fine quality and substance, having very broad flat smooth perianth standing at right angles to the rather long straight sided trumpet; short necked on a very stout but rather short stem. Very broad foliage and immense bulbs.

BELLEVUE (Large-cupped 2b) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). An extremely beautiful and most striking flower bred from **Mitylene** x **Painted Lady**. The broad smooth petals are of sparkling white and the crown is of a most unusual and attractive bright orange with a slight tint of apricot in certain lights. Very vigorous and free of bloom and in increase. Comes in beautiful form in pots.

BESSBROOK (Large-cupped 2c) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). Bred from **Polindra** x **Kanchenjunga**. An outstanding giant flower of wonderful substance and quality having very large broad smooth overlapping perianth standing at right angles to the crown which opens pale cream soon passing to white. Tall strong stem and very good neck.

BINKIE (Large-cupped 2d) 4 (Wolfhagen). A most distinct but rather curious seedling raised in Tasmania; it is really a reversed bicolor. A flower of very good form and quality, with broad, flat, pointed perianth, and a well-proportioned cup. On first opening, the whole flower is clear sulphur-lemon, but the cup gradually passes to almost white.

BLARNEY (Small-cupped 3b) 4 (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1946, as a Show flower. This is one of the most distinct and charming flowers yet introduced. It has a firm, satin-smooth snow-white perianth and a flat salmon-orange crown with a narrow primrose rim. A flower of lovely quality, ideal as a Show Flower or Decorative Bloom. Tall, strong stem.

BROOKFIELD (Large-cupped 2c) 2-3 (W. J. Dunlop). A lovely large flower of wonderful thick waxy texture and smoothest quality, bred from **Dava** x **Justice**. Broad, flat, pure white petals and well proportioned rather shallow crown which opens cream soon passing to white, one of the most perfectly modelled exhibition flowers in cultivation.

BROUGHSHANE (White Trumpet 1c) 3 (Guy L. Wilson). A.M., R.H.S., 1943. A magnificent giant white trumpet of perfect form and balance. The large trumpet being widely flanged reflexed and frilled does not overbalance the immense perianth which is fully $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, the outer segments being up to $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide. A flower of immense substance and quite exceptionally durable. Strong vigorous plant.

BUNCRANA (Large-cupped 2b) 3-4 (J. L. Richardson). A.M., R.H.S., 1942. A most distinct and beautiful first-class Show flower, having very broad flat, pure white shovel-shaped segments, and a beautifully proportioned longish frilled cup of unusual deep peachy orange colour.

BUSHMILLS (Small-cupped 3b) 4 (W. J. Dunlop). Bred from **Portrush** by **Foggy Dew** this is one of the very finest flowers of its type seen to date. Broad, flat, extremely smooth pure white perianth of perfect quality and nicely proportioned crown with a wire rim of pinky orange. Apparently a good doer and free of bloom and increase.

CAMELLIA (Double 4) 3 (v.d. Zalm). A very fine fully double flower of a most pleasing soft primrose-yellow colour throughout. Strong vigorous grower, free of bloom and increase. Very popular both for exhibition and house decoration.

CAMELOT (Large-cupped 2a) 3-4 (J. L. Richardson). A first class exhibition flower of deep clear yellow throughout having broad smooth flat perianth and well proportioned cup slightly shorter than the petals. Very strong plant.

CARGAN (Large-cupped 2a) 4-5 (Guy L. Wilson). A.M., R.H.S. 1950 as a Show flower. F.C.C. Wisley 1952. An extremely beautiful flower of perfect Show form, superb quality and wonderful thick waxy texture having broad smooth flat perianth and nicely proportioned crown which approaches trumpet measurements. The whole flower is of a lovely deep old gold colour throughout. Should prove of much value coming as it does when many yellow varieties are past their best. Tall strong plant, very free of bloom and increase.

CARNBEG (Large-cupped 2a) 2-3 (W. J. Dunlop). A most striking flower of the very largest size measuring up to 5 inches in diameter when grown here under my conditions of soil and climate. The broad smooth overlapping perianth is deep yellow with an orange flush while the base of the crown is of similar colour gradually becoming deeper until the rim is quite deep solid red. Exceptionally vigorous giving an extremely prolific display of bloom.

CASTLECAT (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4 (W. J. Dunlop). One of the best of a splendid series of yellow trumpet seedlings which are quite remarkable for clarity of colour and exceptionally fine form and proportion. This is a flower of most delightful clear yellow throughout both trumpet and perianth. Tall strong stem and good neck.

CASTLECOOLE (Large-cupped 2b) 4 (W. J. Dunlop). A most lovely large flower of unknown pedigree having very large broad flat perianth of somewhat circular outline and silken smoothness. The large rather flat crown is creamy white with a delightful pale wire rim. Grows to an immense size and lasts quite an exceptional time in good condition. Must be in flower for some time before it develops its full size, substance and colour in the rim. A nice Show flower of quite unique colour.

CASTLEWELLAN (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4 (W. J. Dunlop). A first class yellow trumpet of superb quality and thick waxy texture, coming fairly late in the season when many yellow flowers are going over. Broad perfectly smooth perianth standing at right angles to the perfectly proportioned trumpet. The whole flower is clear deep golden yellow throughout and lasts an amazing time in good condition.

CEYLON (Large-cupped 2a) 2-3 (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. A flower of beautiful form and proportion having broad smooth shovel-pointed perianth of wonderful deep aureolin gold and dark clear intense cadmium orange-red crown which the raiser claims to remain quite sunproof. Tall, robust plant with stiff stem and short neck. Free flowering and rapid increaser.

CHARITY MAY (Cyclamineus 6a) 2 (C. F. Coleman). A.M., R.H.S., 1948, as a Show flower, A.M., Wisley Trials, 1952. One of the best of a remarkable series of Cyclamineus hybrids bred from **Mitylene** x **cyclamineus**, which represents a wonderful advance in this section. This is a most charming and graceful flower of lovely quality and soft clear yellow colour: broad overlapping much reflexed perianth segments: cup waisted, with frilled and slightly expanded mouth. Height 12-15 inches. Free of increase and good laster making a splendid garden plant. Lovely in pots.

CHINESE WHITE (Small-cupped 3c) 4 (Guy L. Wilson). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1949. A very large flower of quite faultless form and quality having very broad circular satin smooth perianth fully $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter and perfectly proportioned shallow fluted saucer crown; absolutely pure white throughout except for a faint touch of green in the eye. The finest exhibition flower of its type seen to date.

CHUNGKING (Small-cupped 3a) 2-3 (Guy L. Wilson). This magnificent flower is the finest yellow perianth small-cupped variety for exhibition yet sent out. A large, tall-stemmed, circular flower, having very broad, smooth, clear golden perianth and intense deep vivid red shallow crown. A wonderful piece of colour. Strong, vigorous plant and exceptionally free of bloom and increase.

CLOCKFACE (Small-cupped 3b) 5 (Guy L. Wilson). A very large late flowering variety coming when most large flowers are past and just before **Corncrake**. CLOYFIN (Large-cupped 2a) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). This is a most beautiful flower of lovely clear soft lemon yellow throughout both perianth and crown. Very vigorous and free flowering making a splendid garden plant and a delightful flower for cutting for house decoration.

COTTERTON (Large-cupped 2c) 3 (Brodie of Brodie). A sturdy rather short stemmed neatly built pure ice-white border line flower which is of immense value in breeding whites. Has given a number of really first class seedlings.

CORBY (Large-cupped 2c) 5-6 (Guy L. Wilson). A fine flower of beautiful quality having broad flat pure white perianth and well proportioned cream crown which soon passes to white. CRAIGYWARREN (Large-cupped 2a) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). A magnificent flower of largest size, splendid quality and wonderful thick waxy texture. Broad, smooth, flat, overlapping, deep, yellow perianth and beautifully proportioned crimson-red crown. A first-class Show flower. Vigorous plant and good doer.

CREBILLY (Large-cupped 2b) 2-3 (W. J. Dunlop). A charming flower with broad overlapping white perianth and rather flat creamy white crown rimmed and flushed with pale greeny lemon. A lovely decorative flower which comes in particularly beautiful form in pots in a cool greenhouse.

CRUMLIN (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). One of the largest and most outstanding trumpets grown here which has been consistently good each year. The broad smooth overlapping perianth stands at right angles to the nicely proportioned trumpet and the whole flower is clear yellow throughout. Strong vigorous plant, very free flowering giving an exceptionally high proportion of perfect flowers. A splendid Show flower and will undoubtedly be of much value as a cut flower when stocks permit. Lovely in pots.

DAVIOT (Large-cupped 2b) 3 (Brodie of Brodie). A.M., R.H.S., 1953. A quite distinct flower of exceptional charm, grace and refinement. The clean pure white perianth which has a hint of cool green shading where the petals join the crown is of most lovely quality; the rather goblet-shaped crown is clear bright orange coral, shading towards primrose at the rim. Tall stem and good doer.

DEERFIN (Large-cupped 2b) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). A lovely decorative flower of most unusual colour throughout both perianth and crown opening clear limey lemon but as the flower develops the lemon tone becomes less pronounced and the colour seems to mature and develop a lustre. Beautifully proportioned and rather similar in build to **Binkie** which was one of its grandparents. Strong vigorous plant, exceptionally free flowering making a delightful garden plant. Its quite unique colour makes it ideal for floral decorations.

DOUBLE EVENT (Double 4) 4-5 (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. 1956 as a Show flower. One of the very finest doubles introduced to date. A very round flower, the larger segments are pure white and interspersed amongst them in the centre are small segments of soft lemon yellow. A splendid Show flower and fine robust plant with strong tall stems.

DOWNPATRICK (Bicolour Trumpet 1b) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop). A.M., R.H.S. 1971 as a Show flower. First Prize Open Single Bloom Class, Div. 1b. R.H.S. Daffodil Show, 1971. One of the largest and finest bicolours I have seen to date having exceptionally large smooth perfectly flat pure white perianth standing at right angles to the beautifully proportioned yellow trumpet. A really first class Show flower of most wonderful thick texture and superb quality. Tall strong plant with good stem and neck.

DUNFANE (Large-cupped) 1-2 (W. J. Dunlop). A splendid flower of beautiful proportion having broad flat overlapping perianth standing at right angles to the crown; the whole flower being pure white throughout. Tall strong plant flowering early in the season.

DUNGANNON (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). The whole flower is clear mid-yellow throughout. Tall strong plant with good stem and neck.

DUNMINNING (Large-cupped 2a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). A very fine flower bred from an unnamed seedling. Lovely Show flower and should make a first class market and garden variety as it is so vigorous and free flowering. The flowers are held well above the foliage.

A most brilliant colour contrast and one of the most perfect exhibition flowers seen to date.

DUNSILLY (Large cupped 2a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop). A lovely flower of splendid quality having very broad smooth overlapping perianth of deep golden yellow and perfectly proportioned cup of dark orange red. Fine show flower and good garden plant. Vigorous and free flowering.

EASTER MOON (Large-cupped 2c) 3 (Guy L. Wilson). A very perfect flower having broad smoothly overlapping perianth of the most faultless waxy texture and substance; shortish cup, purest white throughout with cold sage-green base in cup.

EMPRESS OF IRELAND (White Trumpet) 2 (Guy L. Wilson) A.M., R.H.S. 1956. One of the largest and most striking white trumpets seen to date.

ENNISKILLEN (Small-cupped 3b) 4-5 (W. J. Dunlop). A magnificent small-cupped flower of exceptionally perfect form and quality combined with good size. Broad smooth flat pure white perianth and deep crimson red crown of startling brilliance. A first class Show flower with good stem and neck; comes in splendid form in pots. One of the best red and whites I have seen to date.
