NEW INTRODUCTIONS

- (A) **BERYL DETTMANN** 1 2Y-Y 49/75. Arctic Gold x Gahna. A very distinctive deep golden long cupped Daffodil of excellent form. Similar to Arctic Gold but the perianth segments are almost flat. The cup is slightly open and serrated at the mouth. each \$(A)20.00.
- (A) **BONNIE MUIR** 2 2Y-GO — AOB 1/76. Arthur Overton x Bubbles. A very nice yellow backed orange cup flower with a green eye. Perianth

segments are of good overlap and substance and the corona is three quarters its length. Delightful green eye. each \$(A)14.25

- (A) **CRESTA** 3 2Y-RO GT 1/80. Tmemawa x Torriron. Raised from seed sent out by George Tarry. Promises to be an excellent Daffodil for the future. Very good overlap, substance and colour contrast.

NONE TO OFFER

- (A) **FREDDIE WATTS** 3 2Y-YO 55/77 Bubbles x Fireking. Quite a good exhibition Daffodil. Deep golden shovel shaped perianth segments with good overlap. The two toned smallish cup has a 5 mm base of deep gold, the remaining 13 mm is a deep orange. each \$(A)14.25

- (A) **GOLDEN GLOW** 2 2Y-Y 45/75. Arctic Gold x Ghana. Medium coloured yellow perianth of good overlap. The long slender cup is attractive and adds up to a neat, smooth flower. each \$(A)12.25

- (A) **GRAEME DETTMANN** 1 2Y-R GT 2/80. Tmemawa x Torriron. A sister seedling to Cresta, a lovely long looking yellow/red.

NONE TO OFFER

- (A) **GRAEME MEMORY** 2 Y-W B-8 1/79. Binkie x Beaugreen. I believe an excellent addition to the Division 2 reverses. Excellent substance and form, similar to Beaugreen but has a better shaped long cup.

NONE TO OFFER

- (A) **JACK KAVANAUGH** 1 2Y-OR V-S 1/77. Vulcan x Spelter. From seed sent me by the late Mr. Reginald Wootten the year he died. Similar in colour and form to George Tindale, but the colour is deeper.

- (A) **JOE BREARLEY** 2 2Y-GW E 1/68. Ellimatta x Spellbinder. This Daffodil is really a pleasing soft line which took some years to demonstrate its potential. Pointed perianth segments of good overlap with a mid-sized green/white crown. each \$(A)12.75

- (A) **JOHN BOWTELL** 6 2W-YW B-NJ 55/72. Binkie x Njonquilla. A late flowering reverse bi-colour miniature, free of increase, good substance and form and is viable. each \$(A)6.25
- (A) **JOHN FENTON** 3 2Y-YO 62/75 Vulcan x Spelter. A reliable exhibition Daffodil and viable shovel shaped bright gold perianth segments, deep yellow cup with a 16 mm orange margin. each \$(A)20.00
- (A) **KATHLEEN SIMPSON** 5 2W-GP BS-P 1/79. Bulman Seedling x Pink Treasure. An attractive long pink cup of exhibition standard. Similar to Pink Treasure but the cup is a deeper pink. each \$(A)12.50 ■
- (A) **LINDA BETZ** 5 2W-YO 80/75. Ogeesan Wally x Trumpet Call. Similar to Ogeesan Wally, but no yellow splash in the white perianth segments. Smaller and more open two toned cup. each \$(A)12.25
- (A) **LINLEY DETTMANN** 3 2W-YO 58/74. Janice Dettmann x Jennifer Sholl. A short cupped Division 2 of exhibition quality. The perianth segments are white, good substance and have great overlap. The open cup is yellow with 8 mm margin of deep orange, viable. each \$(A)14.75
- (A) **MOON ROSE** 3 2W-P L-AC 1/81. Langley x Ann Cameron. A delightful bright pink Daffodil that took five years to develop. Perianth segments are a good white and overlap with excellent substance. The bright pink is NOT carrot. Viable. each \$(A)12.75
- (A) **NORMAN HARPER** 0-1 6Y-Y. Cyclades open pollinated. A delightful deep yellow miniature cyclamineus who would be a perfect mate for Laura. each \$(A)12.75
- (A) **PHILLIS BOSSENCE** 2 2W-WY 16/71. Arctic Doric open pollinated. A strong exhibition long cup Daffodil. White shovel shaped perianths of first class substance and overlap. The medium sized long cup is white except for a 4 mm margin of light grey. each \$(A)14.25

- (A) **ROBERT DETTMANN** 1 2W-YP CH-ST 1/80. Creamed Honey x Salmon Trout. A very distinctive Daffodil. Excellent perianth segments in all respects and the enchanting long cup is soft yellow with a 10 mm margin of pink. NONE TO OFFER
- (A) **RUTH MURPHY** 5 3W-GR R-R 1/76. Rockall x Ramesses. Quite a good addition to the Division 3 white backs. Shovel shaped large; white perianth of first class substance set off by a blood red flat cup with a green eye. Viable and tall stem. each \$(A)15.50
- (A) **SHARON ELIZABETH** 3-4 2W-P JA/CP 1/75. Jill Bolte x Cherry Pie. Too small for standard exhibition flower and too large for a miniature, nevertheless worth growing. White perianth of excellent substance and the soft pink cup is slightly open and serrated at the mouth. each \$(A)8.75
- (A) **STEPHENIE MARGARET** 3 3W-YR 15/70. Lynette Sholl x Langley Dandy. Another first class addition to the Division 3W-. Good white perianth segments with lots of substance and overlap. The small cup is deep yellow with a 2 mm margin of red. each \$(A)9.50
- (A) **THERESA DRAPER** 3 1Y-Y AG 1/81. Arctic Gold x Ghana. Deep gold flat perianth segments of good overlap and substance. The straight sided trumpet has an attractive round barrel. Very few to offer. each \$(A)25.00
- (A) **WENDY STEWART** 3 2W-P PD 1/81. Peggy Dettman open pollinates. A very tall stem for a pink. First class perianth substance and overlap supported by the softest of pink medium length cups. each \$(A)10.75
- (A) **WOT** 2 2Y-O. Vulcan x Spelter. Written up by Bill Ticknor in the American Quarterly Journal and repeated in the English Daffodil Book 1980/81, page 55. The perianth segments are shovel shaped, much overlap and a bronze sheen. The long cup is deep orange and serrated at the mouth. each \$(A)12.75
