



Daffodils should be ordered by August 15th, as after this time I shall likely be re-planting my bulbs. In the following list, the number and letter following the name of the variety indicates the type; No. 1 being trumpet varieties; No. 2, incomparabilis, or those with cups more than one-third the length of the petals but less than the entire length; No. 3 Barri, cups less than one-third the length of the petals; No. 4, Leedsii or white incomparabilis. The letter "a" refers to yellow as a dominant color. The letter "b" refers to white as a dominant colors.
