
In closing, we would like to wish everyone the finest showing and gardening year.

## FOR THE NEW CUSTOMER

**Flower Color** – Our descriptions are based on observations of the blooms when they reach maturity as they bloom here. The preceding has involved several years. In many cases, pinks may open a yellow or greenish color. The intensity of the pink color develops with maturity of the bloom. Reverse bi-colors will open all yellow with the corona reversing to a white as the bloom matures. Many of the red cups develop their brightness with maturity as well. It is not unusual for a double to require more than one year to adapt to its new habitat and climatic conditions.

## COMMON QUESTIONS

Frequently, we are asked what is the difference between narcissus, jonquils and daffodils.

1. The daffodil as we know it belongs to the genus narcissus. The word daffodil is the English term to refer to the preceding.
2. Daffodils which belong to Division 7 (see page 31) are correctly called jonquils.
3. Generally, jonquils (Division 7) and tazettas (Division 8) do particularly well in warmer climates.
4. Seedling-A seedling is a blooming size flower which has been selected, but not named.
5. The word NET after price means that bulb is NOT subject to early discount which is offered on orders arriving before May 1 from customers in the United States. Discount does not apply to floral cards.
6. A culture sheet will be sent with bulb order for advisement.

# Order Information

1. Please include **Item Number** on order blank. (Number preceding Price . . . i.e. Alamo – **02-106** \$4.00 each.) Each of the collections will have an individual **Item Number** just preceding price as well.
2. **Payment:** Please send payment with order and make check or money order payable to Richard Havens.
3. **Postage and Handling:** Prices quoted include prepaid postage on orders \$20.00 and over. Orders less than \$20.00 to one address, please add \$3.00 for handling. If total Gift Collection is less than \$20.00, per location, please include \$3.00 handling.
4. **Acknowledgment:** Orders \$20.00 and over and received before August 1 will be automatically acknowledged – Orders under \$20.00 will be acknowledged by request.
5. **Extra Copies of 1995 Order:** We encourage the writing of an extra copy of your order to be retained for personal reference upon receipt of bulb shipment. If there should be a question concerning your order, please do not hesitate to contact us immediately.
6. **Substitution:** It is not our policy to freely substitute; however, on occasion, a variety is sold out. In this case, a similar substitute of equal or greater value may be made. Please advise on order blank if we may substitute. If you should have any special instructions, please place on order blank as well. It is most important to us that we respect your wishes. All of our bulb offerings are **subject to crop. On orders sent after August 1**, alternate choices should be listed.
7. **Order Date:** The bulk of the orders are arriving during the spring and early summer, so we encourage early orders to avoid disappointment.
8. **Shipping Rotation:** Bulbs are shipped by Parcel Post and United Parcel Service. We endeavor to send orders in rotation as received with the complete shipping process starting the first week of September. **Orders arriving during July through September will have a good chance of being shipped during the month of October**, for spring and early summer orders deserve our first attention.
9. **Retail Bulbs:** Nearly all bulbs sent out are double nose except in the case of miniatures, most of which are rounds. Some tazettas and species hybrids produce primarily rounds as well. If ordering for the first time, please note that bulbs will vary in size as to their variety and genetic makeup. All bulbs are hand cleaned, graded and selected. We personally grow and care for all of our retail bulbs from planting and harvest to order filling and shipping on our Oregon farm. The smallness of our business permits the preceding.
10. **Bulb Care:** It is our goal to send out good quality bulbs and if upon receipt, they prove otherwise, please notify us immediately. If ordering for the first time or if one is a beginner, please read complete culture sheet when order first arrives for general advisement. Due to the value of the bulbs, every effort to avert disappointment is important.
11. **Extra Bulbs:** Orders over \$10.00 received by August 1, will include extra bulbs worth at least 10% of the order value.
12. **Gift orders, gift certificates:** In recent years, an increasing number of requests to send bulbs as gifts has been received. We are very pleased to do this and will enclose a card with bulbs if desired, indicating they are a gift from you. Also, gift certificates are available – if recipient has not recently ordered from us, please advise, so that we can send a current catalog with the gift certificate. Thank you so very much.
13. **Net:** The word "net" means bulbs **not** subject to discount when placing an order before May 1.
14. **Special Needs:** If there are any special garden club needs, please do not hesitate to contact us. It is greatly appreciated if requests can be made early in the season to facilitate good service.
15. **Customer Number** is in upper right hand corner of address label if you have ordered recently.

## GENERALIZATION OF DAFFODIL CLASSIFICATION

(as defined by the Royal Horticulture Society)

Color codes are as follows: white or whitish W, green G, yellow Y, pink P, orange O, red R.

Division 1 – TRUMPET – one flower to a stem; trumpet at least as long as perianth segments. Division 2 – LARGE – CUPPED – one flower to a stem; corona more than  $\frac{1}{3}$ , but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments. Division 3 – SMALL-CUPPED – one flower to a stem; corona not more than  $\frac{1}{3}$  the length of the perianth segments. Division 4 – DOUBLES – doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both. Division 5 – TRIANDRUS – usually two or more pendent flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed. Division 6 – CYCLAMINEUS – one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed, flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short neck. Division 7 – JONQUILLA – usually one to three flowers to a rounded stem; leaves narrow, dark green; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers fragrant. Division 8 – TAZETTA – usually 3-20 flowers to a stout stem; leaves broad; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers fragrant. Division 9 – POETICUS – usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona usually disc-shaped, with a green or yellow center and red rim. Division 10 – SPECIES. Division 11 – SPLIT-CORONAS – corona split rather than lobed and usually for more than half its length. Division 12 – MISCELLANEOUS – all daffodils not falling into any one of the previous.

Classification for daffodils is composed of division number, color of perianth – color of corona.

# 1995 Daffodil Introductions

**ANGELIC CHOIR** (Havens) 1995 3W-GYY L. 17" (Alabaster x (Quetzal x Smyrna)) TEH91/1. Pure poeticus white smooth, rounded perianth sets off the small bright yellow corona accentuated with a distinctly defined green eye, extending nearly half way up the cup. A most refined, precise little flower, having capability for shows. An unorthodox cross, attempting white and red doubles, shows that byproducts sometimes make unsuccessful ventures worth the effort! Limited stock. Picture on page 11. **03-772** \$30.00 each net.

**CATALYST** (Mitsch) 1995 2W-R LM. 17" (Decoy x Magician) TT3/1. One of the first of the Magician seedlings to be introduced, indicating what intensely colored progeny are possible. Large, ruffled, brilliant red corona, even more red coloration for us, than indicated by the picture. White broadly ovate perianth of heavy substance. We feel Catalyst is another step toward true red with no yellow undertones, achieved by breeding from pinks. True to its name, a catalyst for color intensity. Picture on page 28. **02-783** \$80.00 each net.

**CLASS RING** (Havens) 1995 3W-WWP LM. 18" (First Formal x Coral Light) TEH8/1. In the seventies, when we began a somewhat extensive hybridizing program for pink division 3 flowers, First Formal appeared to be a promising parent, with its impressive beauty and appropriate measurements. We made a good many crosses and the best of the combinations was with Coral Light. First Formal seems to contribute the proportion, size and grace, while Coral Light gives formality and color. Rounded, broadly ovate perianth segments of pure white, accentuate the defined coral rim of the cup shaped corona. Perhaps inherited from Coral Light, a hint of the pink coloration is seen inside the corona upon maturity. Repeated measuring has indicated that for us its average measurements are: corona 13 mm.; perianth 40mm. Picture on front cover. Limited stock. **03-789** \$40.00 each net.

**FIRESTAR** (Havens) 1995 2W-P L. 14" (Pink Valentine x (D17/13 x Spaceship)) VH20/4. Two cultivars have carried red coloration extraordinarily well for us--Eclat and Spaceship. Continuing on the quest for color intensity, it seemed logical to cross progeny of these two and a wide range of colors resulted. Firestar is one of the brightest, with this fascinating array of hues. The saucer shaped corona has a pinkish lavender midzone and tomato red at the heavily ruffled rim. The white broadly ovate perianth lends contrast, which seems to give even more presence to the bold statement from the corona. **02-791** \$30.00 each net.

**FIRST IMPRESSION** (Mitsch) 2Y-R E 17" ((Chemawa x Brer Fox) x Loch Hope) 2Q15/10. A sibling to Scarlet Chord, the long bowl shaped crown of deep orange red and the broad perianth of deep yellow gold make this a real show stopper in the garden in early spring. The heavy substance throughout, contributes to a very long lasting flower. Well formed and consistent. Sufficient stock allows low introductory price. **02-827** \$15.00 each.

**HONEY WARBLER** (Frey) 1995 7W-Y L (F33/x N. jonquilla) QEE4/1. A unique dwarf jonquil with very bright golden yellow corona and lemon yellow perianth segments that whiten upon maturity with a slight reflex. This will be a welcome addition to a rockgarden collection with attributes including bright color, dwarf length stem, and prolific flowering habit with most having several florets per stem. **07-900** \$18.00 each net.

**IRAQUOIS** (Havens) 1995 2YYW-O LM 18" ((Paricutin x Daydream) x (Red Marley x Brer Fox)) LEJ28/1. Probably the most unique flower we have introduced to date, receiving numbers of favorable comments at the 1994 ADS convention. Long narrow bright orange trumpet-like corona, about .8 the length of the lemon yellow perianth, which is very flat and possesses a white halo, the sort of color one would expect on a reverse bicolor. Especially impressive is the orange outline at the juncture of the corona to the perianth. Though smooth and flat, the perianth could be a bit more broad, but certainly makes for a pleasing flower of interest. May be useful in hybridizing for trumpet proportions. **02-780** \$25.00 each net.

**JUNIOR PROM** (Havens) 1995 4Y-R L. 15" (Gypsy x unknown red double) TEH77/1. A very precise double, with broadly ovate perianth segments and even symmetry, measuring 85 mm in diameter. Short, bright petaloids of orange red complement the outer petals of light yellow, which in some climates, may show its tendency to be suffused with a buffish tinge, undoubtedly inherited from Gypsy. Standing up well in the garden, it is also beneficial to the scarce group of late red and yellow doubles. **04-792** \$12.00 each net.

**LIEBESLIED** (Havens) 1995 3W-WWP L. 16" (Ever Pink x Jewell song) TEH6/14. A number of promising division 3 pinks were selected from this cross, most of which are rimmed. Ovate white perianth segments make a clean backdrop for the brightly rimmed cup shaped corona, slightly ruffled. A flower with clean lines and refined form, ideal for exhibiting, hybridizing and possessing excellent health and vigor. Measurement for us averages: corona 12mm.; perianth 38mm. A welcome addition to its division. Picture on page 5. **03-773** \$30.00 each net.

**OREGON PIONEER** (Havens) 1995 2Y-P M. 17" (Widgeon x Pink Silk) VH19/1. A special thank you to all of you at the 1994 Oregon ADS convention who participated in naming this one, winner of the Rose Ribbon. Many euphonious names were submitted, all of which were greatly appreciated and the choice was difficult. The goal here was to improve pink and yellows. One would wonder at the choice of a pink trumpet and white perianth (Pink Silk) and a very pastel pink and yellow (Widgeon) to use as parents. Interestingly enough, the pink and yellow were intensified and not surprisingly, smoothness and heavy substance resulted. The rather straight corona is light lemon upon opening, quickly developing pink on the inside of the corona and on the rim. The lemon perianth is very flat and smooth. An excellent flower for exhibition. **02-777** \$40.00 each net.

**OREGON ROSE** (Havens) 1995 4W-P L. 16" ((Precedent x Pink Cloud) x Music) TEH85/3. A well formed double of great interest with its pinkish tint in the outer petals. Music has been used quite extensively to produce pink coloration in perianths and a number are beginning to emerge, particularly of interest in doubles. Oregon Rose appears to have broad enough petals, though fewer of them, to give the needed fullness, the entire flower of heavy substance. We are not certain as to the pink coloration in the petals in other climates, but this may be a candidate for hybridizing for all pink, most flowers having stigmas. As in many doubles, it may take more than one year to acclimate. Picture on page 28. **04-797** \$60.00 each net.





# 1995 Daffodil Introductions (continued)

**PHOENICIAN** (Mitsch-Havens) 1995 2W-W M. 15" (Broomhill x Canisp) TT23/18. One of the best of all of the flowers we exhibited at the 1994 ADS convention in Portland, winning best flower in the Hybridizers' Challenge Class. Very consistent, broadly ovate, silken smooth perianth segments endowed with heavy substance. The 3/4 length corona is straight and in ideal balance to the perianth. Clean lines and clean white. **02-774** \$40.00 each net.

**PINK CHARISMA** (Frey) 1995 7W-GYP LM. (F31/5 x N. jonquilla) QEE14/26. An exquisite flowered jonquil with a distinctive intense rich pink corona which softens on maturity to shell pink with a deep yellow midzone and green eye. The white star shaped perianth segments are very nicely formed and somewhat reflexed. This should have potential as a small exhibition flower as well as a lovely rockgarden addition. One of our best from this cross. Limited supply. **07-901** \$45.00 each net.

**SILVER FALLS** (Havens) 1995 2W-W. M. 15" (Graduation (A39/1 x Panache)) QEJ4/1. Well formed long straight corona on a very flat broadly ovate perianth, the entire flower of pure white. Smooth texture and fine form make it suitable for showing; may have value in hybridizing for pink trumpets. Offered previously. **02-676** \$15.00 each net.

**SMOOTH SAILS** (Havens) 1995 3W-W L. 17" (Silken Sails x Verona) REH45/2. Flat broad rounded perianth of pure white with smooth texture, but heavy substance. Straight bowl shaped crown opening a soft lemon becoming ivory white at maturity. Beautifully formed elegant flower with grace and perfection. **03-785** \$15.00 each net.

**TENDER MOMENT** (Frey) 1995 7W-GYP LM. (F31/5 x N. jonquilla) QEE14/43. Bell shaped cream colored cup, edged in a 3 mm. ribbon of pink, deepening to yellow midzone with green eye. While a sibling to Pink Charisma, it has a standard length stem and rather large nicely formed star shaped perianth segments of white. It is free flowering and makes a lovely garden plant. I find my pink jonquils from this cross (including Baby Pink, Pink Charisma and many others) indispensable as a decorative enhancement to floral arrangements. They provide me with many delightful hours during flowering season. **07-902** \$15.00 each.

**TRIGONOMETRY** (Mitsch) 1995 11aW-P M. 15" (Recital x Phantom) 205/2. One of the best formed of the series of pink split coronas we have offered. Well formed white ovate perianth. Creamy pink corona a bit ruffled, but symmetrical and evenly splitting into the perianth. **11-779** \$20.00 each net.

**VELOCITY** (Havens) 1995 6Y-R EM 12" (Jetfire x Gypsy) TEH53/2. A classically formed division 6 with heavily reflexed perianth segments of gold containing underlying orange hues, apparently inherited from Gypsy. Not as even in its reflex as we would like. Long orange red tubular crown formed similarly to that of Jetfire, and about the same size. **06-776** \$30.00 each net.

## From Jackson's Daffodils

Again, this year, we are privileged to have an offering from David and Robin Jackson from Tasmania, Australia. As is widely known, the Jacksons have originated some of the finest cultivars in commerce. An ongoing arrangement has been made to offer a number of their originations.

It was a pleasure to have the Jacksons at the American Daffodil Society Convention in Portland, last spring, as well as in our gardens. We especially enjoyed their visit at flowering time. They set up a superb winning entry for the Hybridizer's Challenge Class. David Jackson was awarded the prestigious Gold Medal for excellence in hybridizing.

A number of newer cultivars are being offered this year as well as some that were previously listed.

### New Offerings From Jackson's Daffodils

**FORTESCUE** (Jackson) 4W-R M. 46 cm. (Potent x Glowing Red) An outstanding double of most perfect form with four to five layers of perianth neatly in line and symmetrical. Interspersed with short bright red petaloids. It has a long thick stiff stem and neck which gives it ideal stance, only occasionally has pollen or style. Very consistent. The white is not pure white but the contrast is so great it doesn't detract. Jackson's indicate this is by far the best formed double they have ever released. Very limited stock. **04-832 \$60.00 each net.**

**GALLECTICA** (Jackson) 2Y-YOO E. 52 cm. (290/70 x Sansui) A tall striking flower that front on gives the impression of having a narrow rim of bright red, but side on the funnel shaped cup is more than half a fairly sun resistant red. The petals are a contrasting deep golden yellow, very smooth with thick substance and are an ovate shape. Stands up well and all flowers are consistently good. Limited stock. **02-833 \$28.00 each net.**

**IMPECCABLE** (Jackson) 2Y-Y E. 43 cm. (3/74 x Abona) A golden yellow with the cup only just shorter than the petals. A plane perianth, a blend of double triangular and rounded. Has very broadly ovate petals, overlapping at the back and almost touching in the front. The cylindrical trumpet ends with a slight frill. A very, very consistent and outstanding show flower. **02-834 \$75.00 each net.**

**MIRRABOOKA** (Jackson) 2W-W EM. 45 cm. (Rhapsody x Immaculate) A vigorous healthy vivid white large cup with the best of both parents. A flat double triangular perianth of very broadly ovate back petals and ovate minor petals. The funnel shaped three quarter length cup has a yellowish-green eye and a flare at its end. **02-835 \$28.00 each net.**

**MISQUOTE** (Jackson) 1Y-Y E. 38 cm. (Warcom x Akaia) An early very consistent smooth flower that has inherited its broad shovel shaped petals from Akaia, its narrow tubular plain trumpet from Ricom. Has been Champion in a number of shows in the southern hemisphere. Very limited stock. **01-836 \$70.00 each net.**

**NONCHALANT** (Jackson) 3Y-GYY LM. 57 cm. (250/78 x Lemonade) A very good bright yellow flower with a round perianth of broad shovel shaped petals overlapping the back and with the front almost touching. The petals are almost the same bright color as the cup. The cup is flared and frilled with a deep green eye. **03-837 \$30.00 each net.**

**NYNJA** (Jackson) 2Y-Y M. 40 cm. (11/78 x Scipio) A very consistent smooth flower that just measures large cup with the cup 2 mm shorter than the petals. A plane rounded perianth of very broad ovate petals slightly lighter lemon colored than the funnel shaped straight plain trumpet. Good stance on a strong stem and every flower is show quality. **02-838 \$45.00 each net.**

**RELENTLESS** (Jackson) 1Y-P LM 49 cm. (Lalita x Daydream) A yellow pink definite trumpet of pale but bright and most attractive colors. The plane rounded perianth is of very broadly ovate petals that overlap at the back. The funnel shaped corona is flared and frilled. A strong stem and good stance give a smooth consistent show flower. **01-839 \$25.00 each net.**

**SCALLYWAG** (Jackson) 2W-YYO M A bright attractive consistent show bloom that is not far off Division 3. The petals are white, smooth and shovel shaped. The saucer shaped cup is yellow with a bright orange frill. **02-840 \$15.00 each net.**

**SEA LEGEND** (Jackson) 2W-W M 45 cm. (Rhapsody x Immaculate) Opens small with its head hanging but after a few days grows out and lifts its head to be a very good show flower that has inherited the strong constitution of both its parents. The round flat perianth of glistening pure white very broadly ovate petals is a perfect foil for the short cylindrical straight cup that has green eye. **02-841 \$15.00 each net.**

**SHYKOWSKY** (Jackson) 4W-W M 38 cm. ## EXPLANATION OF DESCRIPTIONS

In the descriptions of the varieties as listed below, the name of the variety is given first in capital letters, followed by the name of the originator in parentheses. Then there is the date of registration or introduction. Next there is the classification symbol, composed of a division number and color code, (see page 3); flowering season, E. for early, M. for mid-season, L. for late. etc. Approximate height in inches or centimeters follows. **Just preceding the price is an item number to be used on the order form.** Following are two definitions of terms:

Corona: The cup, or trumpet-shaped or disc-like outgrowth, arising from the inner surface of the perianth at the base of the segments. Perianth: The six floral leaves, comprised of three sepals and three petals.

**ACE** (Mitsch) 1980 2W-PPW. M. 15" (Accent x Luscious) F5/1. Quite similar in size and form to Credo, but with a light pink crown, bordered white. A lovely color, with vigorous plant, good poise and substance. Attractive and different. **02-101** \$3.00 each.

- LORIKEET** (Mitsch) 1980 1Y-P. LM. 16" (Rima open pollinated) HO9/3. A quite large flower having a soft, medium yellow perianth, and a large flared trumpet of apricot pink. Blooms are long lasting. **01-235** \$12.00 each net.
- LYREBIRD** (Mitsch) 1977 3Y-GWW. LM. 19" (Irish Coffee x Rich. 3Y-W) H123/3. The pale lemon, broad and nearly flat but somewhat reflexed perianth is about the same shade as seen in Binkie.
