




These tags, which will bear your permit number, will take the bulbs first to the Inspection House at Hoboken, N.J., where they will be inspected, and may according to existing regulations, be given any necessary treatment, after which they will be carefully repacked and forwarded to your private address.

2b—**ARIEL, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*) A very attractive and decorative flower bred from *Blarney's Daughter*; the perianth is wide and overlapping very smooth and of thick texture; the saucer shaped crown is vermilion with a wide band of pale lemon at the outer edge. A high class Show flower, exhibited in the Engleheart Cup Class 1961 and 1962

2a—**CATHAY, 3-4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A large flower of splendid form and quality bred from *Air Marshal x Firecracker*. The deep yellow perianth segments are wide, and overlapping; the medium sized crown is deep orange red, this takes a few days to develop its deep colour. A fine Show flower, and a strong vigorous plant.

2a—**CUBA, 3-4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A brilliant flower bred from *Narvik x Sun Chariot*, with wide, overlapping round perianth of deep glowing golden yellow of fine substance and quality. The large expanded bowl shaped crown is intense orange red right down to the base; one of the best 2a.'s yet introduced. A fine, tall strong, vigorous plant.

2b—**DAYBREAK, 5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very nice quality flower bred from two unnamed pink seedlings. The perianth segments are pointed, very smooth and of lovely texture; the bell shaped crown is nicely frilled and expanded at the mouth, a deep rosy pink which extends right down to the base. A good strong grower.

2b—**GEORGE LEAK, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very striking large red and white flower bred from *Kilworth x Arbar*, with wide, overlapping shovel-shaped, snowy white perianth segments of thick texture, and a large brilliant orange saucer shaped crown is nicely serrated at the edge. A very strong vigorous grower.

1a—**GOLDEN AGE, 3** (*J. L. Richardson*). A fine medium sized yellow trumpet of nice quality and substance which came from self pollinated *Goldcourt*. The smooth perianth stands at right angles to the well balanced trumpet which is neatly rolled and serrated at the brim. A strong grower with flowers standing well above the foliage.

1a—**GOLDEN CLOUD, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A fine, large, deep golden yellow trumpet of grand form and quality, bred from *Spanish Gold x King's Ransom*. The perianth segments are wide and overlapping of nice quality and texture; the trumpet is well balanced and neatly rolled at the brim. A useful addition to this class on account of its lateness in flowering. Good plant.

4—**HAWAII, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). Bred from *Falaise x Ceylon* this is undoubtedly the best red and yellow Double yet introduced. A flower of wonderful substance and quality, the deep golden yellow outer petals are broad and overlapping, likewise the small inner ones, interspersed amongst these in the centre are small petals of bright orange red forming a perfect combination of colour. A strong grower standing on tall stiff stems.

3b—**KILMORE, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A small flower of nice form and quality, a *Kilworth x Signal Light* seedling. The pure white pointed perianth is very smooth of good texture and substance; the small crown is bright orange red neatly serrated at the edge; a useful addition to this class.

2b—**LORENZO, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). This is a well balanced and perfectly proportioned medium sized flower bred from *Kilworth x Arbar*, with a very white, smooth, slightly pointed perianth, and a deep solid orange crown with a neatly frilled edge. A tall strong plant, vigorous grower, and a fine Show flower.

1c—**MATTERHORN, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S., 1962 as a Show flower. A magnificent ice white trumpet of majestic proportions, and good form bred from self pollinated *Petsamo*. The petals are very broad and overlapping, of thick very smooth texture, standing at right angles to the large well proportioned trumpet which is neatly rolled and finely serrated at the edge. A very strong vigorous plant with broad, stiff foliage; one of the best white trumpets yet introduced from Prospect House. (See illustration page 5).

2b—**MIKADO, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). Another fine flower bred from *Kilworth x Arbar*, not unlike *Northern Light*, but flowering a little later. The pure white perianth is very smooth, and much overlapping of grand texture, and the large saucer shaped crown is deep orange red almost to the base. A first class Show flower; strong grower.



2b—**NORVAL, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very large flower also bred from *Kilworth x Arbar* of excellent form and quality. The pure white perianth segments, of grand substance and good texture are slightly pointed and much overlapping. The large shallow crown is deep vivid orange red throughout, neatly serrated at the edge. A magnificent Show flower and vigorous plant.

1a—**OLYMPIC GOLD, 3-4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very large trumpet of lovely quality and form, bright *Kingscourt* yellow throughout, bred from *Yellow Idol x King's Ransom*. The outer petals are very broad, and overlapping, beautifully smooth and flat, and of wonderful substance, the inner three are slightly rounded, standing at right angles to the rather long trumpet which is nicely rolled at the edge. A very tall, strong plant giving consistently good flowers.

1c—**PERICLES, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). A flower of grand form and quality which came from *Spitzbergen x Cantatrice*. The wide perianth segments are shovel shaped and slightly pointed, of good substance and quality, the large bell shaped crown is nicely flanged and frilled at the mouth; the whole flower is pure white throughout, standing on good strong stems.

2a—**PINZA, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). A.M., R.H.S. 1962 as a Show flower. A flower of good form and quality bred from *Ceylon x Narvik*, and rather like the latter in shape. The perianth segments are canary yellow, overlapping, and slightly reflexed; the cup, which is nicely serrated, has a wide band of deep orange which turns to deep yellow at the base. A tall, strong grower and a good laster. (Illustrated in *R.H.S. Daffodil Year Book, 1963*).

2b—**ANCONA, 4** (J. L. Richardson). A very fine brightly coloured flower bred from *Kilworth x Arbar*. The very round perianth is pure white and much overlapping of grand substance and quality; the large crown of bright glowing orange red is slightly flanged and nicely serrated at the edge. A good Show flower and a strong grower.

4—**BALI HAI, 4** (J. L. Richardson). A very nice red and white Double bred from *Falaise*, the white outer petals are broad, interspersed in the centre with narrower segments of bright orange red forming a lovely contrast. A fine plant with good strong stems.



1a—**CARAVELLE, 2-3** (J. L. Richardson). This is a high quality flower bred from *Kingscourt x Goldcourt*. The broad overlapping perianth segments are slightly pointed at the tips, the trumpet is nicely proportioned and neatly rolled at the mouth, of good quality and substance, uniform golden yellow throughout. Tall strong plant, free increaser.

3c—**CASCADE, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). This is a lovely flower of fine proportions bred from *Altyre x 548*, the latter a seedling from *Templemore x Green Island*. The pure white perianth is very broad, round and much overlapping, of grand substance, and the fairly large icy white flat crown is neatly frilled at the edge. On opening, the frill has a faint tinge of colour which quickly passes to pure white.

1c—**CHAMONIX, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). A magnificent flower of majestic proportions and beautiful quality, bred from *Broughshane x Alycidon*. The immense, broad, overlapping, very rounded perianth is of splendid substance and texture, the large well proportioned trumpet is nicely balanced and rolled at the mouth. The whole flower is pure ice white throughout and stands well on a tall strong stem. A very robust plant and fine Show flower. **Each, \$33.60. Each, £12/-/-**

2a—**FALSTAFF, 2-3** (J. L. Richardson). A striking flower of brilliant colour and quality bred from *Ceylon* by pollen of a red and yellow seedling. The deep golden yellow perianth is broad overlapping, very smooth and flat, the large cup is deep orange red with a nicely rolled mouth. A very well balanced flower and one of the best in its class so far. Strong vigorous plant and a first class Exhibition flower. **Each, \$49.00. Each £17/10/-**

1a—**GOLDEN HORN, 3** (J. L. Richardson). A magnificent golden yellow trumpet bred from self pollinated *Kingscourt* which it strongly resembles though it is taller. The perianth segments are wide and overlapping, of grand substance, very smooth and slightly pointed; the trumpet is well proportioned, nicely flanged and serrated at the mouth. Very consistent Show flower, good robust grower. **Each, \$9.80. Each 70/-**

2a—**LEANDER, 2-3** (J. L. Richardson). Bred from *Sun Chariot x Ceylon* this is one of the best of the newer red and yellows raised here. The broad faultlessly smooth petals are deepest yellow, and the well proportioned, dark, vivid orange red cup has an incipient fringe, an unusual feature in flowers of this type. A splendid Show flower and a good plant. **Each, \$14.00. Each, £5/-/-**

2b—**MERRY WIDOW, 4-5** (J. L. Richardson). A.M., R.H.S. 1962. A very beautiful "pink" flower of faultless form and quality bred from *Templemore x Salmon Trout*. The clean cut, overlapping, slightly pointed perianth is pure white, of grand substance and lovely texture. The well balanced bell shaped cup is nicely flanged and serrated at the mouth and is a clear bright pink right down to the base. A first class Show flower and good strong grower. **Each, \$49.00. Each, £17/10/-**

2b—**ORION, 4** (J. L. Richardson). A.M., R.H.S. 1962. This is one of the many fine flowers that have been raised from *Kilworth x Arbar*, a magnificent variety of outstanding quality and form. The large pure white petals are very round, broad and much overlapping, of wonderful rich substance and texture; the large cup is deep orange red throughout neatly serrated at the edge, without doubt the best flower of its class yet introduced. A very vigorous plant with strong stems and foliage. (See illustration back cover). **Each, \$42.00. Each, £15/-/-**

4—**PAPUA, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). This is one of the few all yellow Doubles raised from *Falaise* with *Kingscourt* as the pollen parent. A fine full flower whose outer petals are very broad, round and of excellent substance; the large inner petals are interspersed with smaller ones, the whole flower being clear golden yellow throughout, nicely balanced on stiff strong stems. **Each, \$11.20. 2b—**RHINEMAIDEN, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). Bred from *Rosewell x Salmon Trout* this is a grand Show flower of lovely form and quality; the well proportioned cup is soft clear pink throughout, without any tinge of orange; the pure white perianth is very flat, broad and overlapping, of good substance and quality. A strong grower and a valuable addition to this class.

2b—**ROSE BROCADE, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A flower of grand form and quality bred from *Rose of Tralee x Rose Caprice*. The pure white perianth is round and overlapping, of wonderful thick substance and the large cup is slightly expanded and frilled at the mouth, bright rosy pink throughout. Another good strong grower and nice Show flower.

4—**TONGA, 3** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S. 1961 as a Show flower. A fine red and yellow Double raised from *Falaise x Ceylon*; the very broad outer petals are mimosa yellow, much overlapping and of great substance, the inner petals are not so broad and are interspersed in the centre with smaller ones of deep orange red. A lovely full flower standing on strong stems, illustrated R.H.S. Daffodil Year Book 1962. (See illustration page 10).

1a—**YELLOW IMAGE, 3-4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very fine large yellow trumpet bred from self pollinated *Yellow Idol*; the large very broad perianth segments are beautifully smooth, overlapping and of wonderful thick waxy texture, the large well proportioned trumpet standing at right angles to the perianth is slightly rolled and serrated at the brim. The whole flower is clear golden yellow throughout, an outstanding new introduction.

2a—**ZANZIBAR, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). Bred from *Benghazi x Firecracker* this flower has an absolutely flat golden yellow perianth of smooth silky texture; the crimson red crown is rather straight, nicely frilled at the mouth, and perhaps the darkest in tone yet seen in a daffodil; a brilliant colour contrast. A late flower for its type and hence of great value to Exhibitors.

3b—**ACCOLADE, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A large flower for this class, bred from *Kilworth x Cairo*; the perianth is very broad and overlapping of beautifully smooth texture and great substance, pure white and slightly pointed at the tips. The crown is cup shaped of intense solid red; a fine tall plant and a first class Show flower.

4—**ACROPOLIS, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1959 as a Show flower. Bred from *Falaise x Limerick* this is undoubtedly the finest red and white Double yet introduced. A very full flower, the outer petals are very broad and round of purest white and great substance, likewise the inner ones which are not so broad, interspersed amongst these in the centre are small petals of intense bright red. A really remarkable flower with lovely contrast in colour; very strong grower with tall stiff stems. (See illustration page 12). **Each, \$49.00. Each, £17/10/-**

2a—**AIR MARSHAL, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S., 1957. A.M., Wisley 1962. A large flower bred from *Carbineer x Malta*, with very broad widespread perianth of intense glistening golden yellow. The cup is rather straight, nicely frilled at the mouth, of bright orange red slightly paler towards the base. A very striking flower with a truly wonderful perianth. Fine tall upstanding plant. **Each, \$1.75. Each, 12/6**

3b—**ALGECIRAS, 5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S., 1956. A nice flower bred from *Mahmoud x Khartum* with very broad pure white perianth and an almost flat frilled crown of intense red. **Each, 49 cents; Dozen, \$5.32. Each, 3/6; Dozen, 38/-**

1b—**ALPINE EAGLE, 3** (*J. L. Richardson*). Bred from *Spitzbergen x Broughshane* this is a Show flower of the highest quality, with broad flat pure white perianth segments of unusual substance, slightly pointed at the tips. The trumpet is well proportioned and beautifully rolled at the mouth, a rich creamy buff colour. Very good laster. **Each, \$2.10. Each, 15/-**

1c—**AMBASSADOR, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A magnificent large flower bred from *Spitzbergen x Broughshane*, with very broad round flat perianth of great substance standing at right angles to the well proportioned trumpet which is beautifully rolled and serrated at the mouth. The whole flower is pure white throughout; a grand plant in every way. **Each, \$1.96. Each, 14/-**

2a—**AMBERLEY, 3** (*Sir. F. C. Stern*). A.M., R.H.S., 1949. A flower of high quality, bred from *St. Egwin x Crocus*, with broad beautifully smooth, over-lapping perianth of great substance and a nicely proportioned bowl-shaped cup. The flower is uniform clear golden yellow throughout. **Each, 28 cents; Dozen, \$2.94. Each, 2/-; Dozen, 21/-**

1c—**ANDES, 2-3** (*J. L. Richardson*). A fine large pure white flower with broad, smooth, flat, shovel pointed perianth segments, and a large, slightly expanded trumpet beautifully rolled and serrated at the mouth. **Each, \$1.96. Each, 14/-**

1a—**ANTWERP, 3** (*J. L. Richardson*). A fine, large, deep golden yellow flower with broad over-lapping perianth of good substance and a bold trumpet slightly flanged and serrated at the mouth, standing sharply at right angles to the perianth. **Each, 24 cents; Dozen, \$2.52. Each, 1/9; Dozen, 18/-**

2b—**ARBAR, 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. 1961. This fine large flower was raised from *Monaco x Forfar* and is somewhat similar in appearance to *Monaco* but much larger; the pure white perianth is very broad and flat, of great substance and magnificent Show quality. It has a large saucer-shaped cup of deep reddish orange, which stands sun reasonably well.

1a—**ARCTIC GOLD, 2-3** (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. 1960 as Show flower. A flower of superb quality bred from *Goldcourt x Kingscourt*. The broad overlapping perianth is of smooth waxy texture, and the well proportioned trumpet is widely flanged and serrated at the mouth. The whole flower is of even deeper gold than *Goldcourt*. Tall plant.

1c—**ARCTIC PRINCE, 4** (J. L. Richardson). A very fine white trumpet bred from an un-named seedling crossed *Broughshane*. The perianth is very broad and round, standing at right angles to the bold trumpet, which is nicely expanded with a neat roll at the mouth. Very robust plant.

1a—**ARGYLL, 3** (Brodie of Brodie). A fine large bright yellow trumpet, with broad smooth perianth and a large bell-mouthed trumpet. A well-proportioned flower in spite of its large size. A strong vigorous plant.

1a—**ARK ROYAL, 3** (J. L. Richardson). A splendid large yellow trumpet with broad overlapping flat perianth of great substance, bred from *Kilkenny x Goldcourt*. The large bold trumpet is neatly serrated and rolled at the mouth—the whole flower is uniform deep golden yellow throughout. Fine very tall plant.

2a—**ARMADA, 1** (Guy L. Wilson). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1947. A.M. Wisley 1962. A fine first early flower having broad rich golden perianth and a large frilled cup of intense deep tangerine-orange-red which does not burn. The flowers are of good substance, short necked on a tall stem. Very strong grower and free increaser.

2a—**ARRIBA, 3** (Navarro). A medium sized flower of highest quality bred from a *Trevisky seedling x Gibraltar*. The perianth is very round and flat, of very smooth texture, deep clear yellow. The nicely proportioned goblet shaped cup is a vivid orange red, almost crimson, a very brilliant colour contrast.

2c—**AVE, 3** (Guy L. Wilson). A lovely large flower, absolutely pure white of flawless smoothness and symmetry with broad flat pointed perianth standing at right angles to the large well balanced crown.

- 2b—**AVENGER, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). A very fine flower, bred from *Kilworth x Arbar*. The perianth is very round and perfectly flat, of wonderfully smooth velvety texture, and immense substance. The large almost flat crown is of most intense deep orange red slightly serrated at the edge. A magnificent Show flower and excellent plant. **Each, \$21.00. Each, £7/10/-**
- 2a—**BALALAIKA, 2** (*J. L. Richardson*). Bred from *Aranjuex x Bahram*, this is a Show flower of most beautiful quality, with clear bright yellow broad perianth of beautifully smooth waxy texture, and a nicely proportioned goblet shaped cup of the same shade with a narrow wire rim of deep red. **Each, \$3.85. Each, 27/6**
- 1a—**BAYARD, 4-5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S., 1958. A.M. Wisley 1962. Bred from a *Seedling x Goldcourt* this is a Show flower of the highest class, medium sized with very round broad perianth of beautifully smooth thick texture and a well proportioned trumpet, nicely flanged and serrated at the mouth; deepest gold throughout. A very useful Show flower as it is late for this type. **Each, \$5.25. Each, 37/6**
- 3c—**BENEDICTION, 5** (*J. L. Richardson*). A lovely flower bred from *Chinese White x Bryher*; the snowy white perianth segments are very broad and flat of much substance; the medium sized flat eye is also pure white with a deep emerald green centre. Good strong plant and a fine Show flower. **Each, \$7.00. Each, 50/-**
- 2d—**BINKIE, 4** (*Wolfhagen*). A. M., Wisley, 1952. A distinct rather curious seedling raised in Tasmania; it is a reversed bicolor. A flower of very good form and quality, with broad, flat, pointed perianth, and a well-proportioned cup. On opening, the whole flower is clear sulphur-lemon, but the cup gradually passes to almost white. **Each, 31 cents; Dozen, \$3.36. Each, 2/3; Dozen, 24/-**
- 2b—**BIZERTA, 2** (*J. L. Richardson*). A.M., R.H.S. 1947. Similar in form and quality to *Polindra*, but of most unusual colouring having pure white perianth of thick waxy substance; the cup is rich apricot-chrome with a slightly paler frill. Very lasting flower either on the plant or cut. **Each, 35 cents; Dozen, \$3.78. Each, 2/6; Dozen, 27/-**
- 3b—**BLARNEY, 4** (*J. L. Richardson*). F.C.C., R.H.S., 1946. One of the most charming flowers yet introduced. 





1a—**WEXFORD, 3** (*J. L. Richardson*). A medium sized flower of very fine, smooth quality, uniform clear soft golden yellow. The perianth segments are beautifully smooth and flat, slightly shovel-pointed, standing at right angles to the trumpet, which is nicely expanded and frilled at the mouth. This flower measures trumpet but is very near the border-line. Strong robust plant.

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; Trumpet or Corona as long or longer than the Perianth segments.

- (a) Perianth coloured; Corona coloured, not paler than the Perianth.
- (b) Perianth white; Corona coloured.
- (c) Perianth white; Corona white, not paler than the Perianth.
- (d) Any colour combination not falling into (a), (b) or (c).

Division II

LARGE-CUPPED NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; Cup or Corona more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the Perianth segments.

- (a) Perianth coloured; Corona coloured, not paler than the Perianth.
- (b) Perianth white; Corona coloured.
- (c) Perianth white; Corona white, not paler than the Perianth.
- (d) Any colour combination not falling into (a), (b) or (c).

Division III

SMALL-CUPPED NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; Cup or Corona not more than one-third the length of the Perianth segments.

- (a) Perianth coloured; Corona coloured, not paler than the Perianth.
- (b) Perianth white; Corona coloured.
- (c) Perianth white; Corona white, not paler than the Perianth.
- (d) Any colour combination not falling into (a), (b) or (c).

Division IV

DOUBLE NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing character: Double flowers.

Division V

TRIANDRUS NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of *Narcissus triandrus* clearly evident.

- (a) Cup or Corona not less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.
- (b) Cup or Corona less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.

Division VI

CYCLAMINEUS NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of *Narcissus cyclamineus* clearly evident.

- (a) Cup or Corona not less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.
- (b) Cup or Corona less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.

Division VII

JONQUILLA NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of any of the *Narcissus Jonquilla* group clearly evident.

- (a) Cup or Corona not less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.
- (b) Cup or Corona less than two-thirds the length of the Perianth segments.

Division VIII

TAZETTA NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of any of the *Narcissus Tazetta* group clearly evident.

Division IX

POETICUS NARCISSI OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of the *Narcissus poeticus* group without admixture of any other.

Division X

SPECIES AND WILD FORMS AND HYBRIDS

All species and wild, or reputedly wild, forms and hybrids.

Division XI

MISCELLANEOUS NARCISSI

All Narcissi not falling into any of the foregoing Divisions.
