On Growing Daffodils

Daffodils will grow almost anywhere in Australia, but they seem to do best in districts where the winter is cold and the summer dry. Type of soil does not appear to influence the bulbs especially; good drainage and deep thorough working of the soil are the essentials.

Daffodils need a little of all basic plant foods, but English experiments suggest that in good soil the only additive which will produce an evident response is potash. Compost and well-rotted animal manure are suitable fertilisers, but most standard market garden mixtures are satisfactory. The fertiliser may be worked into the ground below bulb depth before planting, and potash added as a top-dressing before or after flowering. Heavy feeding increases size but there is a coarsening of texture and loss of refinement in the bloom.

The bulbs can be planted at any time in the summer, autumn or winter, but the usual practice is to plant during March. Early planting, if it is followed by rain or watering, gives the bulb a good start for the season.

In choosing a place to plant, the essential consideration is protection from wind. The chief enemy of the flowers, as for most plants, is a hot wind.

The bulbs need to be planted at a depth sufficient to ensure that they remain cool in summer. For an average sized bulb in average soil this means two or three inches of soil above the bulb. Distance between bulbs can vary within wide limits, but a normal spacing would be three or four inches apart.

Regular cultivation will help keep the ground moist and will check weed growth. Mulching is beneficial especially in sandy soils. The growth of the bulbs will be interrupted by prolonged dry weather, and in some districts watering may be required in the early autumn or late spring.

Daffodils can be left in the ground indefinitely, but it is usual to lift and divide every three years. The best time to lift is in the early summer after the foliage has died down and before new root growth has begun. The bulbs should be stored in an airy place on shallow trays. When replanting, offsets which separate easily should be removed from the main bulb.

Time of flowering is not decided by the time of planting, some varieties have the habit of blooming early, others of blooming late. Nevertheless, a new planting will usually bloom ahead of the same variety left in the ground for several years. In most of southern Australia, daffodils flower in August and September, with a few very early varieties in July and a few very late varieties in October. Together with other spring flowers, they will appear in some districts sooner than in others; generally, the cooler the climate the later the time of flowering.

Daffodils are easy to keep in good health. The most reliable means of dealing with almost any complaint is the hot water treatment. In the summer when the bulbs have dried out after lifting they are put in water which is kept at a temperature between 110 and 112 deg. F. for from one to four hours, depending on the size of the bulb. Formalin (40% formaldehyde) is added to the water to make an 0.5% solution, i.e., 1½ fluid oz. (3 tablespoons) to 2 gallons of water. A Fowler's Vacola bottling outfit, preferably with thermostatic control, would seem to be suitable equipment to use in giving the hot water treatment. Under certain circumstances the treatment may produce mottling of the foliage and distortion of the bloom, but only in the immediately following season. Commercial growers apply the treatment to healthy bulbs to encourage more vigorous growth.

In the case of basal rot, dusting with sulphur during storage and before planting is a preventive measure, and affected bulbs may be dipped in a fungicide such as Baytan. Daffodils are not as subject to virus diseases as most plants, but foliage and blooms may be deformed and discoloured from this cause, and there is no known remedy.

WHITE PERIANTH AND WHITE TRUMPET

- ANDES:** 2-3, J.L.R. A fine large pure white flower with broad, smooth, flat, shovel-pointed perianth, and a large slightly expanded trumpet, beautifully rolled and serrated at the mouth. \$4.00.
- CANOPUS:** 3-4, J.L.R. A very round flower; the perianth is very broad and flat of unusual substance. The trumpet is nicely flanged and much rolled at the mouth. A very robust pure white flower. \$5.00.
- CANTATRICE:** 2-3, G.L.W. Clean cut pointed perianth stands out sharply from the smooth, slender trumpet. The whole flower is pure clear white throughout. \$1.00.
- CLANDEBOYE:** 3. A tall stemmed flower of good substance. Broad overlapping pure white perianth, nicely balanced trumpet which opens lemon and soon passes to creamy white. \$1.00.
- EMPRESS OF IRELAND:** 3, G.L.W. A truly majestic pure white flower of faultless form, balance and proportion; smooth flat perianth with spade-shaped segments of immense breadth. The beautifully balanced trumpet is not too wide at the base and is nicely flanged and frilled. \$7.50.
- GLACIER:** 3, J.L.R. Broughshane x Killaloe. Perianth flat, very broad and overlapping, standing at right angles to the large bell-mouthed trumpet which is flanged and frilled. A beautiful show flower and very robust plant. Awards of Merit from R.H.S., London, and from Wisley. \$7.50.
- GLENSHESK:** 2, G.L.W. The white trumpet of great size is a beautiful thick smooth waxy substance, well posed on stout 18-inch stems. The trumpet on first opening is faint primrose passing to pure white. \$4.00.
- HAIL STORM:** 3-4, J.N.H. An immense bloom with a very broad perianth forming a complete circle of purest white and a magnificently widely flanged and serrated trumpet of palest lemon passing to white. \$1.50.
- HIMALAYA:** 2-3, J.L.R. A magnificent large white trumpet; the very broad perianth segments are beautifully smooth and flat, of lovely quality, the inner ones having a slight inward roll. The large trumpet is widely flanged and rolled at the mouth. \$5.00.

**COLOURED PERIANTH AND WHITE TRUMPET
(Reversed Bi-Colour Trumpets)**

HONEYBIRD: 3, Mitsch. The best of the new reverse bi-colour seedlings. Opens as a smooth even sulphur lemon, the trumpet gradually fading until it becomes almost clear white. Good form and substance. \$7.00.

MULATTO: 1, C. G. van Tubergen: The flower opens sulphur yellow throughout, but the trumpet passes to white except for a tinge of pale lemon at the brim. Very good stance, size and form. 50c.

SPELLBINDER: 2, G.L.W. A large flower of clear luminous greeny sulphur lemon. When fully developed, the inside of the flanged trumpet passes almost to white, while the outside retains its colour. Very useful for exhibition. 75c.

YELLOW PERIANTH AND YELLOW LARGE CUP

AMBERLEY: 3, F. C. Stern. St. Egwin x Crocus. Uniform clear golden yellow throughout. Well proportioned bowl-shaped cup. 30c.

BALMORAL: 3, Brodie. Broad overlapping perianth and a large cup frilled at mouth. The whole flower is a uniform clear deep yellow. An outstanding variety both in the garden and for exhibition. 40c.

GALWAY: 3, J.L.R. Tall, strong-stemmed, intense self-golden flower, bordering on trumpet proportions; having a broad, smooth perianth and a well flanged crown. 50c.

GOLDEN VINTAGE: 2, J.N.H. A superior and very useful exhibition bloom. Perfectly flat, smooth, overlapping perianth and darker yellow cup with distinctive wide and even fluting. Good stance, size, and height. 50c.
