

One of the most famous of daffodils. A consistent prize winner in the strongest competition. Huge 5-6" flowers. The perfectly balanced trumpet is quite narrow but is finished with a beautifully managed flange that makes the trumpet of noble, generous proportions. Strong in growth. 

We have never handled any variety that has enjoyed such an immediate and sustained response since we introduced Ambergate in 1971. Ambergate has gone all over the world, to all the likely spots like Holland and the USA, but also to unlikely ones like Japan, Iran, Norway, and some South American countries. This flamboyant flower is the result of several generations of breeding. It is the strongest coloured flower yet generally available. The wide crown is a rich scarlet, the petals are a glowing tangerine orange. A pyromaniac in the border, a flower that will set the garden alight and make a seasoned fire-eater think twice. 



Delicate and bewitching in colouring. Parchment firm petals stand broad and flat away from the longish crown. Flowers open in shining lemon, the crown being darker, but this is quickly changed, for, whilst the petals retain their colour, the crown fades after a day or two to white. Tall and strong. Much the earliest of the reverse bi-colour large cups but also the longest lasting. Distinct from any other in this class and with a long future stretching ahead of it as a garden plant. On some counts this is perhaps the most successful of all pinks to have been introduced since the second world war. We introduced it and it was soon obvious that everyone thought highly of it. Our stock was in constant demand and only by severe restraint have we managed to build up our stock to its present fine position. We have not listed Passionale in our catalogue for some years and have not shown it to enable us to get to our present position of being once more able to offer everyone good bulbs of this exceptional plant. It produces an abundance of perfectly formed and textured blooms of white and shining rose pink, any one of which would grace the show bench. It is a constant prize winner at the leading shows. It is a bulb of out-of-the-ordinary strength and ability to increase. Perhaps you would like to read what Mr Herbert Barr wrote in a Daffodil Year Book? The idea was to get a lemon and pink flower. What arrived was a fine white petalled flower of bold proportions bordering those of a trumpet. The trumpet crown is painted in subtle shades sometimes pale primrose sometimes showing hints of buffy pink but fading to near white though retaining a frill of pinky buff around the brim. 

## **Triandrus**

Whisper has a trumpet type and *N. cyclamineus* for maternal grandparents and *N. triandrus* and *N. poeticus* as the paternal set. From this mixed parentage came a graceful maidenly quiet-toned beauty, a flower with delicate smooth texture in the pointed narrow petals at right angles to a slender trumpet of pale creamy primrose. Whilst both petals and trumpet have lemon shaded colour in youth, as they age the petals become white whilst the trumpet retains some colour. The fine spun quality of the flower demands its recognition as a *triandrus* though some might argue that the longish trumpet with its neat little flange declares as strong an allegiance to the *cyclamineus* family.
