


DAFFODILS & NARCISSI

Cultivation

Naturalizing Daffodils and Narcissi in Grass etc. Most Daffodils and Narcissi are suitable for naturalizing but in very heavy soils, preference should be given to stronger growing kinds e.g. Trumpet varieties and many Large-Cupped. They are all admirably adaptable for grassy slopes and banks, where they should be freely planted. A splendid effect is obtained when Trumpet and other varieties are grouped separately, scattered on the ground and planted where they fall.



Soil and its Treatment. Daffodils and Narcissi will thrive in any well-cultivated and well-drained garden soil. In preparing the ground for planting, dig deeply and if well-rotted stable or cow manure is available this may advantageously be worked in 10 to 16 inches deep so as not to come into immediate contact with the bulbs. Never use fresh manure of any kind at planting time. On poor and dry sandy soils we recommend a dressing of bone meal at a rate of about 1 oz. per square yard to be sprinkled over the surface of the ground after planting. The bulbs should be covered with soil to a depth of once and a half to twice its own depth, measuring the bulb from base to shoulder.



Growing Daffodils in the greenhouse or indoors. Many Daffodils and Narcissi are suitable for this purpose some varieties responding better than others to forcing. Pot up the bulbs on arrival and if ordinary pots are used take a good loamy soil, adding sufficient sand and peat to keep the mixture open. A light dusting of bone meal is also useful. Pot firmly in well-crooked pots. For bowls without drainage holes use a good fibre. Plunge the pots and/or bowls in the coolest place of your garden and in the absence of garden space the pots may be placed in a cool cellar (35-40°F) where watering from time to time is necessary. When the shoots are about 4 inches long and the flower buds well out of the neck of the bulbs, the pots may be removed into a warm room. Heat should be gradually increased from 50° to max. 60°F. It is advisable to remove the foliage of the sideshoots, if these do not show a flower bud. Just before the buds are open, water should be sprayed lightly over the buds, when they are in bloom less water should be applied.

The beauty of the Daffodil and the Narcissus is unquestioned and the fascination of the new varieties which appear each year gives proof of the ever growing interest and keen competition to obtain new varieties both by the professional grower and the amateur, many of whom spend a life-time in experimenting and hoping to raise new varieties. Some confusion sometimes arises when Daffodils are referred to as Narcissi. The term Narcissus is the correct botanical name of the whole genus and Daffodil is the popular name but nevertheless of considerable antiquity and acceptance. 'Daffodils' are generally understood to be that section of the genus which possess long trumpets and the commonly called Narcissi are the short-cupped and poeticus types.

The daffodils and narcissus listed in our catalog are holland grown and are the top size, double nosed bulbs, producing 2 or 3 flowers from each bulb.

PINK DAFFODILS (only top-size Bulbs supplied)

There is no official section for these Pink Daffodils in the R.H.S. classification, but their beauty and popularity seem to ask that they should be offered in a special group to assist customers to make their selection. It should be remembered that most varieties of Pink Daffodils do not show their colour until the flower is fully developed.

BLARIS (2b), charming decorative flower of most unusual colouring, pure white perianth, striking uniform buffrose crown; tall stem, good increaser.
