

General

All bulbs are offered subject to crop and being unsold on receipt of order.

Complaints cannot be entertained unless made immediately on receipt of the bulbs.

Ordering

Orders should be sent before July 31st.

Acknowledgements of orders will not be sent except on special request.

No orders cancelled except by mutual consent.

New customers are requested to send cash with order and to add appropriate postage and packing charges (see below). **No V.A.T. charged.**

In the event of varieties being sold out we will send specially selected substitutes of at least

equal value unless otherwise instructed.

Payment

Invoices will be included in all parcels and payment is due within one month. 2% per month charged on overdue accounts.

Receipts for payment will not be sent unless specially requested.

Despatch

Bulbs travel at customer's risk and expense.

Postage and packing will be charged at cost except on pre-paid orders (see below).

GOLD MEDAL DAFFODILS New Introductions 1984

Each name is followed by a number to indicate the approximate time of flowering, No. 1 being the earliest and No. 6 the latest. The name of the raiser is shown in brackets.

6W-GPP DIANE, 4 (B. S. Duncan). (*Roseworthy x Rosedew*) x *Foundling*. From our varied range of new pink Cyclamineus hybrids we think this might prove to be the best of those with deep pink cups. First Prize London 1981 when it left a bevy of **Foundlings** in its wake. Very smooth well reflexed pure white perianth with straight fluted narrow half length cup of deepest pink. Good stem and pose. Very consistent. Was Seedling D.547. Only a few available.

3Y-YYO DILEMMA, 4 (B. S. Duncan). *Aircastle x B. Seedling*. Very large, smooth flower with perianth of attractive primrose yellow. The nicely proportioned cup of deep yellow is attractively rimmed in sunproof orange. Though the colours are subtle rather than vibrant we have been encouraged to list this flower by several admirers who contrast its excellent size, form and growth habit with current competitors in the 3Y rimmed class. Was Seedling D.351.

6W-W ELROND, 3-4 (B. S. Duncan). *Stainless x Foundling*. A lovely pure white Division 6 with a hint of green in the eye of the cup which seems even whiter than the perianth. Slightly more pointed form, slightly larger cup and a glistening rather than moth like texture distinguish this most attractive Show flower from its sister **Elwing**. Was Seedling D.350.


6W-GWP ELIZABETH ANN, 4 (B. S. Duncan). *D. Seedling x Foundling*. A very special flower named for a very special lady. A truly lovely little flower of ideal and consistent exhibition form and absolutely distinct. nicely rounded and reflexed pure white petals of smoothest texture; the rather bowl-shaped cup has a sharply defined narrow rim of a delightful shade of rose pink. Was Seedling D.419.

3W-GWY ERNEVALE, 3-4 (B. S. Duncan). *Woodland Prince x Crepello*. A lovely round, consistent Show flower with smooth pure white perianth segments of excellent substance and texture. The mid-zone of the smallish slightly crinkle edged cup is pale yellow on opening. The flower is most attractive either as a GYY or GWY and colour is better than in most flowers of this type. Very good stem and pose. Good grower. Was Seedling D.459.

2W-P HAZEL WINSLOW, 4-5 (B. S. Duncan). *Simile x Passionale*. A very large flower of bold and bright style with a nicely rolled trumpet crown of deep solid pink backed by a broad, smooth and pure white perianth of lovely quality. Has won many prizes at Northern Ireland Shows. The name celebrates the "Ruby" anniversary of Major and Mrs. Bill Wilkinson, stalwarts of the Fermanagh Garden Society and the Winslow relatives who made the epic "Mayflower" voyage of 1620. We trust this daffodil will prosper as did those Pilgrim Fathers of the past. Was Seedling D.279.

2YW-P **KELANNE, 3-4** (T. Bloomer). (*Rose Caprice x Binkie Seedling*) x *Daydream*. A lovely attractive Show flower of nice form and good size. The broadly oval and very smooth perianth segments are deep sulphur yellow paling to a white band around the nicely proportioned cylindrical and slightly expanded cup of distinct salmon pink. Very free flowering and one of the best of this colour combination. Was Seedling B.211. Good stock. **Each £8.00 / \$11.20**

3W-R *Illustrated on page 10* **LIGHTHOUSE, 3-4** (B. S. Duncan). *Avenger x Merlin*. A really first class Show flower of amazing consistency. Colour and form are reminiscent of **Mahmoud** but the flower is much larger and the plant much more vigorous. The large white perianth is very round, smooth and flat and forms a lovely background for the deep red flat cup of traditional Division 3 style. Very long lasting flower well posed on a tall, strong and round stem. Regular Prizewinner in Northern Ireland and Best Division 3 London 1982. Though of different style we rate this flower alongside **Doctor Hugh** as possibly the best 3W-R's we know. Stock very limited. Was Seedling D.109. **Each £30.00 / \$42.00**

2W-Y **PARTERRE, 3-4** (T. Bloomer). *My Love Seedling?* Parentage is doubtful but we couldn't resist listing this truly lovely and distinct flower which could equally be classified as 6W-Y were it not for its size. 



- W-GYR ★ **POET'S WINGS, 5** (T. Bloomer). *Smyrna Seedling*. A sister to **Poet's Way** but of very different style. This flower is like a large and broader petalled **Old Pheasant Eye** with beautifully reflexed perianth. The small yellow cup has a deep green eye and bright red rim. Very consistent Show flower, good plant. **Each £1.00 / \$1.40**
- W-GYR **QUETZAL, 5-6** (G. E. Mitsch). *Cantabile x Cushendall*. A lovely quality Poeticus similar to **Cantabile** but slightly larger, more rounded form and apparently a more vigorous grower. **Each £2.00 / \$2.80**





Revised Classification of Daffodils 1977

1. The classification of a daffodil cultivar shall be based on the description and measurements submitted by the person registering the variety, or shall be the classification submitted by such person.
2. Colours applicable to the description of daffodil cultivars are abbreviated as follows:
W—white or whitish; G—green; Y—yellow; P—pink; O—orange; R—red.
3. For purposes of description, the daffodil flower shall be divided into perianth and corona.
4. The perianth shall be described by the letter or letters of the colour code most appropriate.
5. The corona shall be divided into three zones: an eye-zone, a mid-zone, and the edge or rim. Suitable coded colour descriptions shall describe these three zones, beginning with the eye-zone and extending to the rim.
6. The letter or letters of the colour code most accurately describing the perianth shall follow the division designation.
7. The letters of the colour code most accurately describing the zones of the corona shall then follow, from the eye-zone to the rim separated from the perianth letters by a hyphen. In Division 4, the letters of the colour code most accurately describing the admixture of petals and petaloids replacing the corona shall follow in proper order, using 3, 2, or 1 colour codes as appropriate.
8. If the corona is substantially of a single colour, a single letter of the colour code shall describe it.

Using these basic requirements, daffodils may be classified as follows:

DIVISION 1: TRUMPET DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; trumpet or corona as long or longer than the perianth segments.

DIVISION 2: LONG-CUPPED DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; cup or corona more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments.

DIVISION 3: SHORT-CUPPED DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: One flower to a stem; cup or corona not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments.

DIVISION 4: DOUBLE DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Double flowers.

DIVISION 5: TRIANDRUS DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of *Narcissus triandrus* predominant.

DIVISION 6: CYCLAMINEUS DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of *Narcissus cyclamineus* predominant.

DIVISION 7: JONQUILLA DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of the *Narcissus jonquilla* group predominant.

DIVISION 8: TAZETTA DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of the *Narcissus tazetta* group predominant.

DIVISION 9: POETICUS DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Characteristics of the *Narcissus poeticus* group predominant.

DIVISION 10: SPECIES AND WILD FORMS AND WILD HYBRIDS

All species and wild or reputedly wild forms and hybrids. Double forms of these varieties are included.

DIVISION 11: SPLIT-CORONA DAFFODILS OF GARDEN ORIGIN

Distinguishing characters: Corona split for at least one-third of its length.

DIVISION 12: MISCELLANEOUS DAFFODILS

All daffodils not falling into any one of the foregoing Divisions.






