

## GENERAL

All bulbs are offered subject to crop and being unsold on receipt of order.

Complaints cannot be entertained unless made immediately on receipt of the bulbs.

## ORDERING

Orders should be sent before July 31st.

Acknowledgements of orders will not be sent except on special request.

No orders cancelled except by mutual consent.

New customers are requested to send cash with order and to add appropriate postage and packing charges (see below). **No V.A.T. charged.**

In the event of varieties being sold out we will send specially selected substitutes of at least equal value unless otherwise instructed.

## PAYMENT

Invoices will be included in all parcels and payment is due within one month. 2% per month charged on overdue accounts.

Receipts for payment will not be sent unless specially requested.

## DESPATCH

Bulbs travel at customer's risk and expense.

**Priority will be given to pre-paid orders.**

Postage and packing will be charged at cost except on pre-paid orders (see below).

The appropriate amount should be added to the cost of bulbs ordered. Please make allowance for gratis bulbs when estimating.

## GOLD MEDAL DAFFODILS

## New Introductions 1988

Each name is followed by a number to indicate the approximate time of flowering, No. 1 being the earliest and No. 6 the latest. The name of the raiser is shown in brackets, followed by the pedigree and original Seedling Number.

6W-GPP **BILBO, 3-4** (B. S. Duncan). *Roseworthy x Foundling*. [D.465]. This has been regarded as one of the very best of our Division 6 pinks. It is rather similar to **Foundling** but it has a distinctly bell-shaped corona, being waisted where it joins the perianth segments and nicely expanded at the rim. The pure white perianth segments are wide, slightly waved and generously reflexed. A very bright pink cupped flower which has won many local prizes and was Best Division 5-9 at the 1987 London Show. **Each £25.00 / \$50.00**

2W-GPP **BROADWAY ROSE, 4-5** (J. M. de Navarro). *Raspberry Ring x Fair Prospect*. Regarded by its raiser as one of his best flowers. Rather similar to **Fair Prospect** but the perianth is whiter and the bright true pink is more stable. Very consistent, lovely exhibition form. **Each £15.00 / \$30.00**

2Y-Y **BULBARROW, 4** (J. W. Blanchard). *Camelot x Golden Aura*. At the 1985 Daffodil Competition in London John Blanchard exhibited a really beautiful specimen of this large deep golden large-cupped flower to gain the Best Bloom in Show award. As would be expected from such parentage, **Bulbarrow** is a genuine large cup rather than a failed trumpet; it has substance and size to spare. It should prove to be an important prizewinner and it has the added advantage of flowering when most yellows are over. **Each £15.00 / \$30.00**

2Y-O **CASTERBRIDGE, 4** (J. W. Blanchard). *Golden Aura x Daydream*. This is a very neat flower of most unusual and distinct colouring which is difficult to fit within the limitations of the colour coding system — the cup is of that amber/buff/orange/pink combination which is so difficult to describe but which is so attractive. It may be compared to a deeper coloured **Amber Castle** and has been referred to as a fluorescent-cupped **Hambledon**. Extremely consistent exhibition flower; good strong plant. **Each £15.00 / \$30.00**

2Y-R **CATTISTOCK, 4** (J. W. Blanchard). *Revelry x Dewlish*. A valuable late yellow-red with smooth, broad and slightly pointed deep yellow petals and a solid red cup of nicely balanced proportion. Very useful for late shows or in early seasons when yellow-reds may be scarce. Consistent flower, rapid increaser. **Each £3.50 / \$7.00**

4Y-O **CRACKINGTON, 3** (D. A. Lloyd/J. W. Blanchard). *Golden Aura x Beauvallon*. Raised by John Blanchard from seed hybridised and sent to him by David Lloyd. The immaculate and bright well-contrasted flower promises to challenge its illustrious father for supremacy in the yellow-red double division. Selected as Best Division 4 at the 1986 London Daffodil Show, **Crackington** has a very neat, broad outer circle of perianth segments with nicely arranged inner whorls of yellow segments interspersed with deeply coloured red petaloids. Consistent exhibition flower on a good stem and neck. Strong grower. Very few bulbs available. See A.D.S. Journal December 1986 — seedling 73/35A. **Each £70.00/\$140.00**

2Y-W **HALSTOCK, 4** (J. W. Blanchard). *Golden Aura x Daydream*. This is a beautifully smooth and precise exhibition quality bloom of slightly angular but broad outline. The perianth is deep lemon yellow with a distinct white halo at the base of the perianth and the cup fades to a very clean white more rapidly than many of this type. We think this flower can become a really serious challenger to the clear supremacy of **Daydream**. **Each £10.00/\$20.00**

5W-W **ICE WINGS** (C. F. Coleman). *Ischia x t. albus*. Admired and coveted many years ago at the London Daffodil Show when exhibited by its raiser. It was a delight to re-discover **Ice Wings** in all its remembered glory and refinement at the Breezand Show, Holland, in late February 1986. It is a pleasure to be able to list **Ice Wings** which we think may have as great an exhibition impact in Division 5 as did **Unique** in Division 4 after we retrieved it from Holland some years ago. **Each £4.00/\$8.00**

2W-GPP **MANTLE, 5** (B. S. Duncan). *R.3341 x Fellowship*. [D.641]. This is another flower which defies the colour coding system — it opens 2W-YYP and matures to an absolutely distinct and glowing fluorescent mandarin orange/pink blend reminiscent of a ripe persimmon. Broad, flat, triangular pure white perianth segments of smoothest texture form an ideal background to a flower which flowers with the N. Poeticus hybrids and is invaluable for late Shows. **Each £12.50/\$25.00**

2W-P **MELBURY, 3-4** (J. W. Blanchard). [*Green Island x Roseworthy*] *x Debutante*] *x Romance*. This is one of the deepest pinks yet available. The narrow bowl-shaped cup is deep pink to the base and contrasts well with the pure white broad, flat and smooth textured perianth. Excellent Show flower. Tall, strong plant. **Each £5.00/\$10.00**

2W-W **MOUNT FUJI, 3-4** (B. S. Duncan). *Easter Moon x Silent Valley*. [D.619]. There are so many good all-white large cups, further introductions seem to be superfluous. We think **Mount Fuji** is too good to cast aside — it has the usual good qualities of the **Easter Moon/Silent Valley** cross and has the added attraction and distinction of having prominent and uniform clasps at the perianth tips giving an unusually pointed effect to a basically large round flower. **Mount Fuji** was good enough to win a very strong 2W-W class at the 1985 London Daffodil Show.
