DAFFODILS - DAYLILIES - COMPANION TREES, SHRUBS, GROUNDCOVERS

I have just received notice of a shipment of 1400 miniature daffodils from the successor to van Tubergen and Matthew Zanbergen. The former has long been the chief wholesale bulb supplier of the world, while Matthew was, of course, recently head of the Holland Bulb Growers, Assoc. and a miniature fancier, too.

I bought these for our Springdale, family, miniature fanciers, as gifts, but because several asked for some for their own gardens, I made the following list to permit sampling. It is priced by tens, a bit over wholesale.

If you wish to collect here, we must charge 5% for NJ. If you ask us to mail, we find it costs \$2 to mail 20 bulbs.

MINIATURE DAFFODILS

N. minor, trumpet, a bit later, larger, and stronger than "minimus"	\$2.00
N. pumilus, a bit larger and later than above	3.00
N. obvularis, -taller, the "Lent Lily"	3.50
N. cyclamineus, 2nd to flower, likes water	3.00
N. triandrus albus, little bell-like white cluster	2.00
N. t. concolor, yellow form of above	2.00
N. t. pulchellus, yellow, ? if different from above	3.00
N. juncifolius, small jonquil. (We think this is ruplicola, a better one, but we are testing.)	2.50
N. scaberulus, cluster jonquil of tiniest bloom	2.50
N. canaliculatus, only miniature tazetta,- hard to keep , in bloom	2.00
Jumble, cyclamineus hybrid	3.50
Tete-a-Tete, cyclamineus hybrid, recently increased by Matthew Zanbergen to reach a larger audience	3.00
Minnow, tazetta hybrid	3.50
