

Daffodils Narcissus

Daffodils are probably one of the easiest bulbs to grow. They usually begin welcoming Spring to our farm in mid-February. One can see them all along the ditchbanks at first, their presence a direct result of 'spills' during our annual harvesting and replanting. While this is not necessarily a tribute to mechanization, we think it certainly is to nature! All daffodils are DNII (14/16 cm in circumference) size unless noted otherwise.

Large Trumpet - This group of daffodils has a trumpet equal to or longer in length than the perianth (petal) segments. One flower per stem.


- 2DF010 **Bravoure** Bi-color, replaces Magnet. White petals with a golden yellow trumpet turning a pale lemon yellow. (Mid-season, 18") [B]
- 2DF020 **Councillor** Golden yellow. Very strong grower. (Very late, 18") [A]
- 2DF035 **Flower Carpet** Slightly smaller flowers than King Alfred, but more blooms. (Mid-season, 16") [A]
- 2DF040 **King Alfred** Famous golden yellow. (Mid-season, 18") [A]



Mount Hood

Double - One or more double flowers per stem.

- 2ND025 **Erlicheer** Clusters, 6-8 small double flowers per stem, white with creamy yellow centers. Ideal for pots. (Early, 10") [D]
 - 2DF405 **Flower Drift** White with red markings in the center. (Mid-season, 16") [A]
 - 2DF400 **Golden Ducate** Solid gold double. Strong & tall flower. (Mid-season, 18") [A]
 - 2DF420 **Mary Copeland** Cream interspersed with glowing orange segments throughout the flower. (Late, 16") [C]
 - 2DF430 **Tahiti** A rich golden yellow with red center petals. (Mid-season, 16") [B]
 - 2DF440 **Cheerfulness** White clusters of 3 or more flowers per stem. Fragrant. (Late, 16") [A]
 - 2DF450 **White Lion** Large, white double flower. (Mid-season, 18") [B]
 - 2DF460 **Yellow Cheerfulness** Golden yellow. Fragrant. (Late, 14") [A]
- Triandrus** - 2 to 3 pendulous flowers per stem.
- 2DF510 **Ice Wings** Like Thalia. but shorter. Pure white. (Late, 10") [C]


2DF040 **King Alfred** Famous golden yellow. (Mid-season, 18") [A]

2DF060 **Mount Hood** The best white, trumpet daffodil. Opens flushed pale yellow and fades to pure white (Mid-season, 15") [C]

2DF080 **Spellbinder** Lemon yellow, green color with a medium-sized cup. Turns lighter with age. (Mid-season, 18") [B]

2DF090 **Unsurpassable** One of the largest blooms in the daffodil family. Pure golden yellow with extra long trumpet. (Mid-season, 15") [A]

Fortune

Large Cup - Corona (cup) more than one third, but less than equal to in length than the perianth. One flower per stem.

2DF140 **Bella Vista** Perfectly formed, rich orange corona with white petals. (Mid-season, 16") [D]

2DF166 **Ceylon** Yellow corona with perianth yellow at base, turning orange. Extremely long lived flowers make it one of the all time great naturalizers. (Early, 16") [D]

2DF167 **Filly** Pure white blushed pink. (Mid-season, 16") [A]

2DF170 **Fortune** Golden yellow bloom with large cup, edge tinted orange yellow. Prolific blooms. (Mid-season, 14") [A]

2DF190 **Gigantic Star** Large flowered, yellow cup, similar to Carlton. (Mid-season, 18") [A]

2DF200 **Ice Follies** White with yellow, flat-fringed cup. (Mid-season, 18") [A]

2ND050 **Largo** Yellow with heavy fringed deep red tinted cup. (Mid-season 16") [C]

2ND110 **Pink Charm** Cup fades to coral pink. White perianth. (Mid-season, 16") [C]

2DF230 **Professor Einstein** White perianth, bright reddish orange, flat rimmed cup. (Late, 14") [B]

2DF245 **Redhill** Best red colored cup available. White petals. (Mid-season, 16") [B]

2ND130 **Rosy Wonder** White perianth with rosy pink cup. (Mid-season, 16") [C]

2DF250 **Salome** White perianth with cup fading to salmon. (Mid-season, 15") [A]

2DF280 **St. Kaverne** Lemon yellow perianth, deeper gold corona. (Mid-season, 14") [A]

2DF290 **St. Patrick's Day** Reverse bicolor. Lemon green petals turning pale white turning lemon green at the rim of the cup. (Mid-season, 16") [B]

2DF295 **Stainless** Snow White cup and corona. (Late, 15") [D]

Small Cup - One flower per stem. Cup not more than one third the length of the petals.

2DF360 **Barrette Browning** White perianth, frilled orange cup. (Mid-season, 16") [A]

Triandrus - 2 to 3 pendulous flowers per stem.

2DF510 **Ice Wings** Like Thalia, but shorter. Pure white. (Late, 10") [C]

2DF530 **Thalia** 2 or 3 lovely white flowers per stem, two inches or more across. Good for rock gardens. (Mid-season, 16") [B]

Cyclamineus - 2 to 3 pendulous flowers with reflexed petals per stem.

2DF550 **February Gold** Golden yellow. (Very early, 10") [B]

2ND027 **February Silver** White trumpets with yellow crowns that quickly change to white. (Very early, 8") [D]

2DF560 **Tete a Tete** Miniature. Ideal for forcing. Reflex yellow petals with pale orange cup. (Early, 5") 11-12 cm bulbs [C]

Jonquilla - Multiple, small flowers on a single stem. Well known for their fragrance.

2DF600 **Trevithian** Like old-fashioned jonquils. 3 to 4 yellow flowers per stem. (Mid-season, 18") [A]

2DF650 **Early Splendour** Pure white perianths, deep orange cups. (Early, 15") [B]

2DF660 **Geranium** 4 to 6 white with orange cup flowers per stem. (Late, 15") [A]

Poeticus - Fragrant. Small, red-rimmed cups.

2DF670 **Acteae** The dogwood daffodil. Bright white petals, small yellow cup rimmed in red with a green eye. (Early, 16") [C]

Tazetta - Clusters of many, extremely fragrant flowers. Excellent forcers.

2PP020 **Grand Soleil d' Or** (Yellow Paperwhite) Often advertised for forcing indoors, but we recommend using them as a garden flower in the South. Must be planted deep. (Very early, 16") [B]
