Narcissi = Daffodils

Yellow Trumpet Daffodils

Particularly Recommended in This Class is **Aerolite**

Division 1a: Trumpet as long or longer than perianth segments, trumpet lemon, yellow or sulphur colored, with perianths of same shade but not of white.

***Aerolite** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
The large flower is beautifully proportioned, giving the impression of gracefulness, despite its size; perianth deep primrose, with a medium yellow trumpet which is left in bold relief by the broad pointed star formed by the opening outer petals, an inch and a half wide; medium early, but remains until late, and is one of the longest lasting of all Daffodils in the garden or after being cut. (Color illustration, page N).

***Alasnam** Each \$0.40, Doz \$4.25, 100 \$30.75
Wide, short, densely frilled trumpet of pure deep yellow, a shade deeper than the perianth; finely placed with a good neck; flower "looks you in the eye;" excellent for landscape groups, also for forcing; very early. (Color illustration, page L).

***Cleopatra** Doz. \$1.60, 100 \$10.50
A splendid flower which has won many awards and is well known everywhere; lemon-yellow perianth, overlapping petals; trumpet light yellow; very late.

***Emperor**
Big Round Bulbs. Doz. \$1.25, 100 \$8.25
Double Nosed Bulbs. Doz. \$1.60, 100 \$10.50
Perianth primrose, trumpet darker, a forcing and bedding flower of proven merit. Still a fine old variety.

***Golden Spur** Doz. \$1.05, 100 \$7.00
Uniform yellow, a most popular Daffodil for forcing or for the garden.

***King Alfred**
Top size, round. Doz. \$1.50, 100 \$10.00
Mammoth Bulbs. Doz. \$2.30, 100 \$14.00
A king among the fine varieties. Rich, lustrous golden yellow throughout. Extremely vigorous in habit. Perianth often measures 4 inches across, trumpet fully 2 inches. The most popular variety for forcing and the garden.

***Matamax** Doz. \$2.05, 100 \$13.00
A strong grower and exceptionally tall; clean, golden color, fine substance; very late.

***Olympia** Doz. \$1.50, 100 \$10.00
A much improved and enlarged Emperor, free flowering and hardy.

***Robert Sydenham** Doz. \$2.30, 100 \$14.50
The superb, heavily frilled trumpet of beautiful golden yellow, glittering as if sprinkled with gold dust, backed by the symmetrical soft sulphur-yellow perianth, presents an unforgettable picture. The entire flower suggests rugged proportionate beauty. The length of the stem and the quality of the foliage strengthen the first impression obtained from the blooms. At the flower shows it is a consistent winner.

***Statendam** Each \$1.50, Doz. \$15.00
An extremely large golden yellow Trumpet Daffodil of superb yet graceful proportions. Massive overlapping deep golden yellow perianth, large, flaring, well-formed trumpet. A very vigorous grower most suitable for exhibition purposes.

***Tresserve** Doz. \$1.45, 100 \$9.50
One of the leaders among the new giant trumpets; deep canary-yellow with a pale perianth, the segments of which reach forward about the trumpet, producing a flower of distinct individuality; the trumpet mouth, 2 inches across, is deeply lacinated.

***Warwick** Doz. \$2.30, 100 \$14.50
Another of the striking new King Alfred seedlings outstanding in every way and very early; refined stem and neck bearing a star-shaped perianth of great substance; golden yellow, with trumpet a shade deeper in color.

White Trumpet Daffodils

Particularly Recommended in This Class is **Silver Glory**

Division 1b: Varieties with white perianth and white or nearly white trumpet, including pink or apricot trumpets.

***Beersheba** Each \$2.00, Doz. \$20.00
Perianth and trumpet of magnificent proportions. Sturdy foliage and stem. Height 20 to 22 inches. Its color is not pure white, yet is expressive of purity in the highest sense. Those who are forming collections of fine Narcissus rate Beersheba at the top of the large white Trumpets.

***Eve** Each \$0.50, Doz. \$5.25, 100 \$41.25
Of good size but of such perfect proportions that the name suits it absolutely; a harmony in white and old ivory, with even the pistil and stamens blending into the color scheme; the green and gold shading at the outer base of the trumpet adds to the flower's delightful charm.

***La Vestale** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$3.75, 100 \$25.75
Giant trumpet type with pure ivory-white perianth, of informal design, with trumpet of deep cream-yellow, tall, fine for small groups or naturalizing in dim shade; though of delicate appearance, it is of good substance and lasts well; early. (Color illustration, page K).

***Lovenest** Each \$0.75, Doz. \$8.00, 100 \$63.75
One of the very few members of the "Pink Daffodil" class; among the daintiest of all the trumpets; medium in height with a starry shaped perianth of informal type; nicely proportioned trumpet of saffron-yellow turning to apricot-pink; delightfully charming at all stages; very early.

***Madame de Graaf** Doz. \$1.70, 100 \$11.00
This lovely graceful Daffodil was the first of a new class and most famous of the white trumpets.

***Mrs. E. H. Krelage (White King Alfred)** Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.40, 100 \$15.00
A charming visitor standing before a bed of this exquisite variety asked us: "Is this the White King Alfred?" That question conveys quite satisfactorily the impression its flowers make. The pristine purity of this regal flower, the play of light on its balanced petalage, the graceful curve of the trumpet brim are unforgettable. An excellent grower. Easy to force, long-stemmed. Has no rival at the shows. (Color illustration, page L).

***Mrs. John Bodger** Each \$2.75, Doz. \$27.50
Considered by many the most exquisite of the new white trumpets; a semi-dwarf hybrid of medium size, with a pure white, star-shaped perianth and a good trumpet; wonderful variety for the rock garden or the front of the border; sure to become a great favorite as it has been enthusiastically received at every show.

***Mrs. R. O. Backhouse** Each \$2.00, Doz. \$20.00
This is the famous "Pink Daffodil;" fine informal perianth of ivory-white, and beautifully proportioned, slim long trumpet of apricot-pink, changing to shell-pink at the deeply fringed edge; delicately beautiful but of exceptional substance; long lasting; early, belongs in every collection. (Color illustration, page K).

***President Carnot** Each \$0.40, Doz. \$4.00, 100 \$28.25
A self-colored creamy white trumpet of the Olympia type, with perianth petals slightly twisting and reaching forward, adding beauty of form to the charming color harmony.

***Imperator** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$2.75, 100 \$18.00
In our trial gardens this magnificent white Daffodil has received the admiration of hundreds of visitors. Its sparkling purity as well as its strength of bloom, so well able to resist heat has made it one of our favorites. It should be in every collection.

Bicolor Daffodils

Particularly Recommended in This Class is Sylvanite

Division 1c: Bicolor Trumpet Daffodils, with white or whitish perianth and a yellow, lemon or pale primrose trumpet.

- Empress** Doz. \$1.20, 100 \$7.75
An old variety still deservedly popular; broad overlapping perianth with trace of gold down center of each cream-white petal; graceful trumpet of good proportions, and uniform, deep canary-yellow.
- Jefta** Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.50, 100 \$16.25
Very delicately colored giant trumpet of moderate size; cream-colored perianth and pale lemon trumpet slightly recurved at mouth; early.
- Sylvanite** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$3.00, 100 \$20.75
A striking new variety with broad overlapping perianth of creamy white, and light canary trumpet; strong grower, but graceful.
- *Spring Glory** Doz. \$1.30, 100 \$8.50
Still a favorite both for the garden and for forcing; pure yellow trumpet, slightly paler perianth, excellent stem, and always free blooming. (Color illustration, page K).
- *Van Waveren's Giant** Doz. \$2.05, 100 \$13.00
Enormous flower with deep yellow trumpet, well opened; perianth pale yellow with outer petals exceptionally broad and inner ones usually slightly twisted, making the flower more graceful.

Poeticus Narcissus

Particularly Recommended in This Class is Rupert Brooke

Division 9: Poet's Narcissi, white petals with scarlet cup.

- Edwina** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
Purest white perianth, broad and overlapping petals, very flat cup, yellow edged red. Fine form and substance, highly recommended.
- *Horace** Doz. \$1.15, 100 \$7.50
Large, star-shaped perianth, gleaming white broad petals, with flat eye, yellow edged red; graceful and free blooming.
- *Ornatus Maximus** Doz. \$1.15, 100 \$7.50
Extremely broad overlapping petals, recurving from typical pheasant's eye cup; a larger Ornatus, unsurpassed for naturalizing.
- *Recurvus** Doz. \$0.80, 100 \$5.75
The old Pheasant's Eye. Perianth pure white, somewhat reflexing; cup margined deep scarlet; sweet scented. Fine for massing in borders or in grass.
- Rupert Brooke** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
One of the finest of the new Poeticus varieties, beautifully proportioned; small pheasant's eye, reddish cup. This variety was introduced by Englehart in 1927 and is still considered one of the best new varieties.


Particularly Recommended in This Class is Silver Star

Division 4: Perianth white, cup white, or pale citron, sometimes tinged with pink or apricot.

- *Evangeline** Doz. \$0.80, 100 \$5.75
A tall dancing Daffodil with reflexed, star-shaped, white perianth, and lemon-yellow cup. Fine for naturalizing.
- Gertie Millar** Each \$0.45, Doz. \$4.75, 100 \$36.00
Wonderful flower of the new Giant Leedsii type with pure white perianth similar to and as large as Van Waveren's Giant, with a beautifully proportioned pale primrose cup deeply fluted and frilled and of translucent texture; unusually long pistils and anthers match these colors perfectly; a most handsome flower. (Color illustration, page L).
- *Hera** Doz. \$1.50, 100 \$10.00
Broad-petaled creamy white perianth, star-shaped and deeply frilled cup of creamy white with a dainty edging of light primrose; one of the most beautiful of all Daffodils. (Color illustration, page N).
- Her Grace** Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.40, 100 \$15.00
A beautiful overlapping snow-white perianth with a large cool ivory crown resting firmly against it. Its prominent characteristic is the exquisite curving of the crown's edge. The delicate related tints of cream color and ivory which play in the texture of the lacy ruffles of the brim are most unusual. A strong grower, making large broad foliage. The flower has much substance and the entire plant is of exhibition quality.
- *Lord Kitchener** Doz. \$1.45, 100 \$9.50
Broad, flat, pure white perianth, very pale primrose crown. A fine variety and great improvement over Mrs. Langtry.
- *Louis Capet** Doz. \$2.05, 100 \$13.00
A dainty little flower of perfect conformation from whatever angle viewed; poised on tiptoe ready for a dance at the slightest breath of air; perianth white; trumpet light primrose with golden anthers, and pale green shading to gold; foliage clean and upright, not too heavy; an ideal Narcissus for naturalizing and for the rock garden. (Color illustration, page K).
- *Nette O'Melveny** Doz. \$1.50, 100 \$10.00
A dancing Daffodil with pure white perianth and cup of clear lemon-yellow, with orange picotee; splendid foliage; tall, graceful stem, and good neck; in every way a delightful flower and sure to become immensely popular.
- *Queen of the North** Doz. \$1.00, 100 \$6.50
Substantial flower with broad white perianth and lemon cup prettily fluted.
- *Silver Star** Doz. \$2.05, 100 \$13.00
Perfect broad-petaled, star-shaped perianth of pure cream-white, with finely proportioned, wide mouthed trumpet of primrose, changing to cream-white, just a shade deeper than the perianth; extra fine and free flowering. (Color illustration, page M).

Incomparabilis Narcissi

Particularly Recommended in This Class is **Lucinius**

Division 2: Incomparabilis, cup or crown measuring from one-third to nearly the length of the perianth segments.

***Bernardino** Doz. \$1.20, 100 \$8.00
Perianth cream colored, the frilled and fluted cup stained deep apricot-orange at its edge. A good hardy grower which forms nice clumps in a short time. (Color illustration, page N).

***Croesus** Doz. \$1.60, 100 \$10.50
Universally popular both for the garden and for exhibition; light canary-yellow perianth of perfect form, with outer petals nearly touching, the inner ones overlapping, opening flat; broad fluted cup of rich orange to base; substantial, free flowering, and a fine propagator. (Color illustration, page M).

***Dick Wellband** Each \$1.50, Doz. \$15.00
The perianth is pure white and the cup a brilliant flame-orange. One of its most remarkable qualities is that the color does not fade but rather intensifies with age. The flower has unusual lasting qualities. Its greatest beauty lies in the startling contrast between petals and cup which makes it stand out even in the largest collection of Daffodils. An exhibition variety "par excellence." (Color illustration, page L).

***Fortune** Each \$5.00, Doz. \$50.00
This is undoubtedly the most wonderful flower of recent introduction. It is a Giant Incomparabilis of the largest size, perfect form, and gorgeous color on a 2-foot stem; fine flat, overlapping perianth of great substance which stands boldly at right angles to the crown, of clear deep lemon-gold color with long bold crown of wonderful glowing coppery red-orange. It is of great substance, vigorous and very lasting—free bloomer.

***Francisca Drake** Each \$0.50, Doz. \$5.25, 100 \$40.00
The pure white perianth petals are of unusual substance, an inch and a half wide, and tinted gold at the base, which shows through on the outside; the cup, wide and deep, is golden yellow at the base; changing gradually to flame-orange at the densely frilled edge; the flowers are held well above the fine foliage and give the effect of a flock of white seagulls taking flight; strong growing and free flowering. (Color illustration, page N).

***Gallipoli** Each \$0.45, Doz. \$4.50, 100 \$33.25
World-famous variety, citron-yellow perianth, cup deeply fluted to base and with a double frill effect at edges, is yellow, shading to vivid orange; somewhat drooping, very decorative.

***Helios** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
A most refined flower. Creamy yellow perianth, star-shaped; pale orange cup, slightly frilled. A deliciously beautiful variety a clump of which placed near an evergreen would make an unusually interesting picture. Very early.

***John Evelyn** Doz. \$2.30, 100 \$14.50

Outstanding among the new Incomparabilis hybrids; flatly opening perianth, 4 to 5 inches across, with a flat cup nearly 2 inches in diameter, densely frilled, the perianth being pure white without a trace of shading, and the cup lemon-yellow and fluted or shirred to the base; good neck; strong grower; free flowering and a good propagator; one of the greatest Daffodils. (Color illustration, page M).

***Lucifer** Doz. \$1.25, 100 \$8.25
Perianth sulphur-white with long, well-rounded petals, starlike in effect; cup chrome-yellow edged bright orange. A showy flower for outdoors; it holds its color splendidly. Height 18 inches.

***Lucinius** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
A self-colored, rich golden yellow flower of unusually good form and excellent substance. A very distinct type. It is one of the best golden yellow short cups.

***Milford-Haven** Each \$0.40, Doz. \$4.00, 100 \$28.25
Fine flower with cream-white perianth and wide cup ruffled and deeply frilled at edge, chrome-yellow at base and shading into rich orange-scarlet, the same gorgeous color combination as in the Montbretia "His Majesty."

***Red Cross** Each \$0.45, Doz. \$4.50, 100 \$34.00
Famous throughout the Daffodil world; extra large, strong flower, opening flat, primrose-yellow perianth, and deep yellow cup densely frilled, of deep orange; substantial and long lasting, and fine both in the garden and for exhibition.

***Sir Watkin** Doz. \$1.20, 100 \$8.00
Perianth primrose-yellow; large and well-formed yellow cup; tinged deep yellow. A giant among the medium trumpets.

***Stella Pratt** Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.35, 100 \$14.75
Not unlike Red Cross, star-shaped perianth of light primrose, deep yellow trumpet, shading to orange.

***Walter Hampden** Each \$1.50, Doz. \$15.00
Very tall and outstanding; bright primrose perianth and pure yellow trumpet of Loudspeaker type, with a tint of orange in the frills; very vigorous grower; medium late. (Color illustration, page M).

***Whitewell** Doz. \$1.30, 100 \$8.50
Pure white, broad petalled starry perianth, opening flat, or slightly reflexed; cup fluted and frilled, deep primrose, with orange edge; flower held well above foliage.

***Will Scarlett** Doz. \$1.40, 100 \$9.00
Medium sized flower of informal habit; reflexed perianth, petals often slightly curled; good cup of yellow ochre with flaming orange-scarlet edge; fine for the rock garden or for naturalizing near a small pool.

***Yellow Poppy** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
Among all the fine Daffodils of recent introduction, few have more quickly made a name for themselves—a flower of good size, with wide flaring trumpet, 1½ inches across, the whole flower being finely proportioned, and borne on a tall stem with a good neck; in color the perianth is pure yellow, and the cup of the same lovely shade deepening slightly at the frilled edge; conspicuous styles of the same shade as the perianth add to its beauty; outstanding and in every way a satisfactory, as well as a sensational flower, both in the garden and as a flower for cutting.

Barri Narcissi

Particularly Recommended in This Class is Mrs. Barclay

Division 3: Barri, cup and crown measuring less than one-third the length of the perianth segments.

***Alcida** Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.35, 100 \$14.75
Giant flower, pure white perianth opening flat, star-shaped, with individual petals over 1½ inches wide; broad, citron-yellow cup with blood-orange frill; strong grower, fine substance and wonderfully free flowering; very late.

Anna Croft Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.35, 100 \$14.75
One of the leaders in every show and equally fine in the garden; perianth light primrose, supporting a large sized trumpet deeply crinkled and frilled; cup of darker yellow shading to orange at edge; very tall stem; medium early.

***Bath's Flame** Doz. \$1.75, 100 \$11.25
Yellow perianth, deep yellow cup with broad edge of orange-red. The petals are very long, giving the flower a distinct and outstanding character. A perfection in scarlet and gold. Long stems.

Bonfire Doz. \$1.40, 100 \$9.00
Remarkable flower, entirely distinct, of perfect design and build; pure primrose perianth, outer petals so broad they nearly touch, and the three inner petals overlapping, forming a saucer-shaped perianth for the cup of deep fiery orange with the edge picoteed deep blood-red.

***Conspicuous** Doz. \$1.00, 100 \$6.50
Large, broad, spreading perianth of soft yellow; short yellow cup, edged orange-scarlet. One of the most useful of all Daffodils. Splendid for the border or naturalizing. Height 21 inches.

***Diana Kasner** Doz. \$1.65, 100 \$10.75
A pure white perianth and a large fluted yellow cup with blood-red frill, very free flowering and an excellent forcer. We consider this variety as one of our most valuable introductions and cannot recommend it too highly.

***Early Surprise** Doz. \$1.05, 100 \$7.00
Semi-dwarf habit of growth; pure white perianth with orange-colored cup, fine for naturalizing, and the earliest for forcing of this type. (Color illustration, page M).

***Firetail** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$2.60, 100 \$17.25
Popular the world over; broad petaled creamy white perianth and large orange cup with scarlet-orange frill. (Color illustration, page K).

Fleur Each \$0.50, Doz. \$5.25, 100 \$41.25
Broad petaled reflexing perianth of pure Poeticus white, with a flat deeply frilled cup, citron-yellow edged orange-red; beautifully proportioned. This variety received an Award of Merit in 1927 and is unquestionably one of the loveliest Barri varieties.

***Mrs. Barclay** Doz. \$2.25, 100 \$13.75
Large flower with flat, reflexed, broad-petaled overlapping perianth of pale primrose, changing to pure white; deeply frilled flat cup of primrose-yellow, with dainty orange picotee; extremely showy and a great favorite in the garden. (Color illustration, page L).

***Mrs. Walter Brewster** Doz. \$2.35, 100 \$14.75
Fine reflexed perianth of pure white, flat cup, lemon-yellow edged with oxblood-red; fine lasting flower; one of the best. (Color illustration, page M).

Red Beacon Doz. \$1.55, 100 \$10.25
A most lovely flower which immediately attracts one by its brilliantly colored cup. The perianth is ivory-white, slightly shaded sulphur at the base. The cup is prettily fluted and of the most intense fiery orange-red.

Red Shadow Each \$0.75, Doz. \$8.00, 100 \$64.00
A most attractive flower of bold appearance. The perianth is creamy yellow and the cup is dark yellow with orange-red margin. It is unusually free-flowering and a strong grower. Very good forcer. Makes a beautiful pot plant.

***Seagull** Doz. \$0.90, 100 \$6.00
Large, broad petaled perianth, slightly reflexed pure white, giving an effect suggestive of the name as the flowers seem to float above the foliage; cup light yellow, with red picotee edge; free flowering, extremely tall, late, fine for naturalizing.

***Shackleton** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$3.00, 100 \$20.75
Exceptionally large and graceful flower, with broad, pure white reflexed broad flat cup of chrome-yellow shading to brilliant orange-scarlet; extra fine.

***Sunrise** Doz. \$1.45, 100 \$9.50
Pure star-shaped white perianth, with distinct golden rays extending up each petal from the base of the cup; small cup of clear deep yellow-orange; unique and very attractive.

Sunstar Each \$1.25, Doz. \$12.50
Creamy white, broad petaled perianth, segments slightly reflexed; flat yellow cup with broad orange margin; tall, fine stem and neck; Poeticus habit; beautiful both in the garden and on the show bench.

Cyclamineus Hybrids


Particularly Recommended in This Class is February Gold

Division 6: Cyclamineus blood like that of Triandrus, imparts such a distinct form to Daffodils, that a separate division has been made of its hybrids, which have trumpets of rich yellow, straight and tube-like, and perianths reflexed as in a Cyclamen; very early flowering.


***February Gold** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$3.75, 100 \$25.00
Perianth golden yellow, trumpet tinged orange, very early.

March Sunshine Each \$0.45, Doz. \$4.75, 100 \$36.00
Smaller than February Gold and more adapted for rock garden planting.



Triandrus Hybrids

Particularly Recommended in This Class is Moonshine

Division 5: These are the cyclamen-flowered Daffodils with reflexing perianth. The flowers are more or less drooping, of elegant form and graceful habit.

***Agnes Harvey** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$3.00, 100 \$20.75
A most dainty Daffodil of drooping habit, 1 to 3 flowers on a stem; white starry perianth with Triandrus type trumpet, of the same color, sometimes flushed faint apricot. A wonderful flower for naturalizing, especially near water, and also for cutting; desirable in every way.

Moonshine Each \$0.40, Doz. \$4.00, 100, \$28.25
A beautiful Triandrus hybrid, star-shaped white flowers, often three to a stem, drooping gracefully, very beautiful and a great favorite, especially for the rock garden or for naturalizing in the shade. A fine exhibition variety.

Mrs. Alfred Pearson Each \$0.40, Doz. \$4.25, 100 \$30.75
Dainty, star-shaped flowers in generous clusters; white perianth and pale primrose cup; new type from crossing a Leedsii and a Polyanthus; excellent for the rock garden.

Pearly Queen Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.35, 100 \$14.75
Triandrus hybrid, 2 or 3 flowers to a stem; star-shaped, cream-white perianth, with clear lemon-yellow short trumpet; distinct pearly sheen provides the name; drooping habit; free flowering and a strong grower.

Queen of Spain Each \$0.40, Doz. \$4.00, 100 \$28.25
A wild hybrid discovered in Spain. One of the most beautiful, distinct, and graceful Daffodils and recommended either for pots and bowls or for naturalizing in woodlands, rock gardens, etc. The flowers vary slightly in size, and sometimes in form of trumpet, but all are of a soft, delicate canary-yellow, with a graceful reflexing perianth. Height 12 inches.

Shot Silk Each \$4.00, Doz. \$40.00
A charming Triandrus Hybrid, three flowers to a stem. Perianth and cup uniform creamy white, slightly star-shaped, long narrow cup. This is undoubtedly the most graceful little Daffodil in this class and will appeal to all lovers of the smaller types.

***Thalia** Each \$0.35, Doz. \$2.60, 100 \$17.25
In addition to a peculiar attraction at first sight, this flower leaves one with an impression that it is white, yet it is a whiteness that is not white. The recurving petals and the angle of the three trumpets are unlike the conventional short-cupped Daffodil. The stem is dark green, round and reedlike thin. Some call it the "orchid-flowered" Narcissus which adds to the mystery. Thalia provides unusually good material for artistic arrangement. (Color illustration, page N).

***Albus Plenus Odoratus** Doz. \$1.05, 100 \$7.00
The old Gardenia-flowered Double Poet's Narcissus. Pure snowy white; wonderfully fragrant. Should be planted in the shade and kept well watered at flowering time to prevent the flower buds from drying off. Blooms extremely late, long after most of the Narcissi have gone. It is a rare old variety preserved jealously in a few old gardens and worth special care.

The most promising novelty of this division. Pure white, sweet scented, large double flowers; early forcer.

Golden yellow flowers with a double trumpet and a single perianth. Prefers a cool soil and semi-shaded position, otherwise in some locations the flowers are liable to become greenish yellow.



Particularly Recommended in This Class is Orange Queen

Division 7: Hybrid Jonquils with two or more, small, very fragrant flowers on one stem.

***Jonquilla Simplex** (Queen Ann's Daffodil) Doz. \$1.05, 100 \$6.75
The true tiny single Jonquil. The bulbs as well as the flowers of this miniature Daffodil are not very much larger than the Snowdrop. The flowers are a pure golden yellow and delightfully fragrant; foliage is grasslike. Perfectly hardy and most satisfactory small Daffodil for the rock garden. (Color illustration, page R).

***Jonquilla flore pleno** Doz. \$1.30, 100 \$8.50
This is the charming double-flowered form of the above. Also splendid in the rockery. The double Queen Ann's Daffodil.

***Campernelle, Single** Doz. \$1.05, 100 \$7.00
A tiny golden Daffodil with tips of pointed grasslike foliage reaching above the flowers; the broad overlapping petals make a nicely rounded perianth; frequently three blooms on a stalk; a delightful little flower.



Particularly Recommended in This Class is Frans Hals

Division 8: All Poetaz are hybrids from Poeticus Ornatus and Polyanthus Narcissi. The plants are tall and vigorous growers, bearing heads of large, well-formed flowers, deliciously fragrant. There is no better group for indoor culture in flats, pots or bowls, while if planted in time, their hardiness outdoors leaves nothing to be desired.

Admiration Each \$0.30, Doz. \$2.30, 100 \$14.50
This beautiful cluster-flowered Daffodil is especially lovely in full sunlight, as it has a transparent character, but the flowers viewed in shade do not look poor or papery. The perianth, which is a sulphur-yellow, seems rather to be of the quality of the soft taffeta silk which, in the old days, was known as "sarsenet," and the petals are slightly ridged lengthwise. The corona is of rich orange-scarlet and there are usually about 6 flowers to a stalk.

Cheerfulness Doz. \$1.65, 100 \$10.75
The double Elvira, a very pleasing double white Poetaz, good stems, a fine garden and show flower.

Little Daffodils = Wild Species =

Particularly Recommended in This Class is **Bulbocodium Conspicuum**

The following are charming little subjects for rock work, where their dainty flowers are seen to perfection. They should be left undisturbed for years, and if happy, will soon establish themselves and afford a lovely picture in early spring. All the *Bulbocodium* (except *Monophyllum*) and the *Cyclamineus* like moisture, and should, therefore, be planted at the foot of the rockery. *Bulbocodium monophyllum* flourishes in a warm, dry sheltered situation planted in almost pure sand. *Triandrus Albus* (*Angel's Tears*) and *Juncifolius* delight in partial shade and a light, gritty soil, and should be given a well-drained position.

***Bulbocodium citrinus** Doz. \$2.05, 100 \$13.00
✓ Large sulphur Hoop-Petticoat, very beautiful pale citron-yellow. Height 6 to 8 inches.



Daffodils for Naturalizing

The greatest and most effective use of Daffodils is to naturalize them in quantity in meadows and orchards in woodlands and along the driveway, on the bank of the brook or along shrubbery.

By planting some bulbs on the south side and some others facing north, a long period of flowering, lasting well over a month, may be enjoyed.

Daffodils are the most prolific of flowers. If you plant a single bulb it will not be long in gathering a family, and in the course of two or three years the spot in which it grows will have become as populous as the tents of the patriarchs.

Planting mixed Daffodils is an investment that pays large dividends, **if the right varieties are used.**

The mixture presented by us is made up from named varieties and should, therefore, not be confused with other mixtures offered. This mixture is not grown as such, but varieties are selected that are especially adapted for naturalizing and will give an abundant and prolonged flowering period, increasing rapidly.
