## FIRST ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE AMERICAN DAFFODIL SOCIETY Washington, D. C. April 6th and 7th

At this time we are going to give you a rest period before dinner which will be served at 6:30 P.M. As yet we have not decided who the speaker will be but if our plans go through for this bit of entertainment you will not be disappointed.

Next comes our Symposium Session at 8 P.M. which will be headed up by Hubert Fischer as Master of Ceremonies. Here the main event will be a panel discussion of "Novelties of the Future". Where possible we expect to have a slide showing every daffodil mentioned in the discussion. The panel of 8 will consist of:

This will be followed by a membership participation program entitled "Successful Daffodils" in which members will be asked to make a brief statement on the varieties which have performed best for them. These will also be illustrated with slides where possible. This will conclude the program for the day and those who can sleep will turn in and those who can't will attend their favorite bull session.

SATURDAY, APRIL 7th. At 8 A.M. there will be three important breakfast meetings (Dutch). One will be for Commercial Daffodil Growers and Hybridists with Grant Mitch and George Heath acting as Co-Chairmen. It might interest some of you to know that Guy Wilson and Frank Reinelt plan to attend this meeting. Another will be a meeting of the Regional Vice-Presidents conducted by George S. Lee, Jr., our First Vice-Prez. The third meeting will be a Round Robin breakfast led by the Top Robin Mrs. E.G. Sawyers

After breakfast we have scheduled a bus tour of representative daffodil gardens of the Washington, D.C. area. This tour will feature about all of the newer varieties including SALMON TROUT (if it is in bloom), which was sent to us last fall by Harry Tuggle as a guest, but the tour will not include EMPRESS OF IRELAND. At the last

garden we will enjoy a delicious box luncheon, afterwhich we plan to give you a leisure period of about 4 hours so you can take in the commercial daffodil exhibits which will be the greatest collection of daffodils ever assembled in this country in one place. Or if you wish, some of you may like to attend the Camellia Show at Woodward & Lothrop's auditorium to see which varieties can stand our cold climate.

And now comes our piece de resistence, the Annual Banquet, which will be at 7 P.M. with Freeman Weiss presiding and Fred Lee as Toastmaster. What a team! When these two get together you can bet you will be provided with entertainment which will be nothing but the best. I can reveal this much, however, that the highlight of the evening will be MR. GUY L. WILSON, THE KNOCKAN, BROUGHSHANE, COUNTRY ANTRIM, NORTHERN IRELAND, who will speak on "Fifty Years of Daffodils".
