RULES

- Classes are open to all members of the American Daffodil Society and Pennsylvania Horticultural Society, and to non-members except in Classes 60 and 67.
- Entries will be accepted at the outside entrance to the Brandywine Corridor between 8 and 11:30 a.m., April 20. Local exhibitors should endeavor to make entries between 8 and 10 a.m. All exhibits must remain in place until 9 p.m. Friday. All exhibits not removed will be disposed of by Committee.
- 3. Entry tags and labels will be mailed to the exhibitor. For record purposes they should be requested from the Show Secretary by April 13th. THEY SHOULD BE COMPLETELY FILLED IN BY THE EXHIBITOR IN ADVANCE OF THE SHOW. The stub is the only record and is used by the Awards Committee in compiling Awards.
- 4. All daffodils must be grown in the open by the exhibitor. Only one entry may be made in each class except in the Miniature and Seedlings Classes. Daffodil foliage is not permitted in horticultural classes. Cotton may be used to support specimens.
- Exhibits that are not named or incorrectly named will be disqualified. The Committee will assist in classification but will not be responsible for naming varieties.
- Containers for specimen classes will be furnished by the Committee. Each specimen in collection classes will be staged in separate containers.
- Each entry must be passed by the Classification Committee before the exhibitor leaves the room.
- Any or all awards may be withheld by the Judges if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy. Their decision shall be final.
- The Committee disclaims all liability for loss or damage.
- 10. Miniatures may be exhibited only in Section D.

SECTION C-COLLECTIONS

A neat list of varieties must accompany each collection and each variety must be labeled. The name and division should appear on both label and list. REGISTRATION is required in all Collection Classes. Except where noted, 1 stem each of five different varieties is required.

- 53 Collection of American breeding or origin, 5 named varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS RED, WHITE, BLUE RIBBON.
- 54 Collection of 5 named white varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS PURPLE RIBBON.
- 55 Collection of five named yellow varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS PURPLE RIBBON.
- 56 Collection of five named pink varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS PURPLE RIBBON.

- 57 Collection of five named bi-color varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS PURPLE RIBBON.
- 68 Collection of five named reverse bi-color varieties from any division or divisions. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS MAROON RIBBON.
- O Collection of 15 named varieties for garden decoration from at least four divisions. To be judged on suitability and harmony as well as excellence of bloom. ELIGIBLE FOR PENNSYLVANIA HORTICUL-TURAL SOCIETY RIBBON AWARD.
- THE CAREY E. QUINN SILVER MEDAL AWARD.

1 THE AMERICAN HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY SILVER MEDAL AWARD.

Collection of 24 named varieties of daffodils, one stem each, representing not fewer than five R.H.S. Divisions. Each specimen must score 90 points or more by ADS Scale of Points. Each bloom must be correctly labeled and exhibited in a separate container. A list must accompany entry. OPEN TO ALL AMATEUR GROWERS.

CTION D-MINIATURE DAFFODILS

To include only varieties which are named on the Approved List of Miniatures. Entries are not limited in Classes 62, 63, 64, and 65 if they are of different varieties. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS MINIATURE GOLD RIBBON.

- 62 Single specimen of garden origin, having one bloom to a stem.
- 3 Single specimen of garden origin, having more than 1 bloom to a stem.

- 64 Three stems, one variety, of garden origin.
- 65 Species, Wild Forms, Wild Hybrids, from Division X, one specimen (Example — N. juncifolius, N. tenuior)
- 66 Collection, one stem each of five varieties, named, on the Approved List of Miniatures. ELIGIBLE FOR ADS LAVENDER RIBBON. Registration required.
- 67 THE ROBERTA C. WATROUS GOLD MEDAL AWARD.

Collection of twelve different miniature blooms, one stem each, from at least three divisions. Each specimen must score at least 90, be correctly labeled, and exhibited in a separate container. OPEN ONLY TO MEMBERS OF THE AMERICAN DAFFODIL SOCIETY. Registration required.

SECTION E-SEEDLINGS

Entries not limited. One specimen identified by number and exhibited by the originator. The originator is the person who first flowers the bulb. Judges may further subdivide when desirable. ELIGIBLE FOR THE ADS ROSE RIBBON. The George S. Lee, III scroll for the best american raised seedling in the show.

- 2. No backgrounds may be used.
- Exhibitors must find a substitute if they are unable to exhibit when they have reserved space.
- Arrangements must be staged by 11:30 a.m. Thursday, April 20 and may not be removed before 9 p.m. Friday, April 21.
- The Society cannot be responsible for loss or damage.

ARTISTIC CLASSES

72 "NATURE'S BOUNTY"—a mass arrangement to be staged on a pedestal 48" high, with 15" square top painted black. Limited to 5 entries.

73 "SPRINGTIME BEAUTY"—a composition in a shallow container. An accessory may be used. To be staged on a two drawer end table 21" wide, 27" deep and 21" high, black composition top. Limited to 4 entries.

74 "COFFEE BREAK"—an arrangement suitable for a coffee table. To be staged on a round pedestal table 24" in diameter, 20" high, with a walnut grain top. Limited to 6 entries.
