- Class 5 — Collection of 5 cultivars or species of miniature daffodils
- Class 6 — Roberta C. Watrous Award or Ribbon (Open to ADS members only)

Collection of 12 cultivars or species of miniature daffodils from at least 3 divisions. Medal may be won only one time by any exhibitor. Former winner may exhibit but may receive only the Ribbon.

The ADS Miniature Gold Ribbon will be awarded for the best miniature daffodil in Section C.

The ADS Miniature White Ribbon will be awarded for the best entry in Section C, Classes 3 or 4.

The ADS Lavender Ribbon will be awarded for the best entry in Section C, Class 5.

The Matthew Fowlds Award, Silver Medal or Ribbon (Open to ADS members only). The best named standard cyclamineus hybrid in the show. Medal may be won only one time by any exhibitor. Former winner will receive only the Fowlds Ribbon.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

SECTION A — Challenge Collections (open to ADS members only)

Class 1 — Carey E. Quinn Award, Gold Medal or Ribbon

A collection of 24 cultivars of daffodils from at least 5 divisions. Medal may be won only one time by an exhibitor. Former winner may exhibit but may receive only the Ribbon.

Class 2 — Harry I. Tuggle, Jr., Trophy, a perpetual award

Vases of 3 stems each of 12 cultivars of standard daffodils from at least 3 divisions. (To be held one year.)

Class 3 — Little England — Larry P. Mains Memorial Trophy, a perpetual award

Vases of 3 stems each of 9 cultivars of standard daffodils from division III. (To be held one year, but winner will receive a similar trophy but smaller in size to keep.)

Class 4 — Maxine M. Lawler Memorial Trophy

Six cultivars of all-white daffodils, 3 stems each, from at least 3 divisions. (Winner will keep the trophy.)

Class 5 — The ADS Green Ribbon

A collection of 12 cultivars of daffodils representing not less than 4 divisions. (Open to all exhibitors.)
