## RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All classes open to anyone who grows daffodils except where specified otherwise.
2. An exhibitor may make as many entries as he wishes in any class, provided each entry is a different cultivar or species or a completely different collection of cultivars and/or species.
3. Exhibitors shall place an entry tag, properly filled out, with name, division, and color code, on each exhibit. Containers for specimens will be furnished by the show committee. No daffodil foliage permitted.
4. All blooms must have been grown in the open by the exhibitor. Miniatures may be grown in protected areas.
5. Exhibits which are incorrectly named or without Division and Color Code will not be judged. However, blooms of seedlings may be shown by the originator or by other persons in classes for "named cultivars" provided that they are identified by a number designation by the originator.
6. Correct classification according to the RHS System as printed in the latest edition of Daffodils to Show and Grow and the ADS Data Print-out, and labeling shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor. No label may be changed, specimens added, removed, or substituted after judging has begun or after awards have been placed. If an error is discovered in an exhibit after completion of judging any award placed thereon (ADS, special or ribbon) shall be forfeited by the exhibitor.
7. Each stem in an exhibit receiving an ADS award must score 90% or more by the ADS Scale of Points.
8. All collections of 5 or more stems must be exhibited with each cultivar in a separate container. Each cultivar must be correctly labeled with name, division, and color code. Hybridizer's name must appear on label in American Bred classes 144 and 193.
9. Miniature daffodils, as named in the most recent ADS Approved List of Miniatures, with any official additions thereto, may be shown only in classes for miniatures and seedlings which are candidates for the Miniature List.
10. Only one first, one second, and one third award may be given in each class. Honorable Mention awards may also be given.

11. Any and all awards may be withheld by the judges if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy. The decision of the judges shall be final, except as stated in Rule #6.
12. Entries may be placed from 8:00 - 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 23, 1983. No entries accepted after 11:00 a.m. Entries must be removed from 5:00 - 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, April 24, 1983.
13. All classes are for standard daffodils except where specified otherwise.
14. All seedlings will be judged by the regular ADS Scale of Points.
15. A novice is anyone who has never won a blue ribbon in an ADS Show. All novices should place a visible "N" on the top portion of the entry tag for Section J.

SECTION H - SEEDLINGS

Seedlings grown and exhibited by the originator only, with his designated number, classification and parentage (if known). The originator of a daffodil seedling is the person who first flowers the bulb regardless of who made the cross and/or planted the seed.

Class 150 - One stem, candidate for Miniature List - eligible for ADS MINIATURE ROSE RIBBON

SECTION M - ADS AWARDS OPEN ONLY TO ADS MEMBERS (See Rule #8)

Class 209 - ROBERTA C. WATROUS AWARD - Silver Medal or Ribbon  
Collection of 12 cultivars and/or species of miniature daffodils, one stem each, from at least 3 div.  
This medal may be won only one time in all ADS shows by any exhibitor. A former winner may exhibit in this class, but may receive only the Watrous Ribbon.

Class 210 - CAREY E. QUINN AWARD - Silver Medal or Ribbon  
Collection of 24 standard cultivars and/or species of daffodils, one stem each, from at least 5 div.  
This medal may be won only one time in all ADS shows by any exhibitor. A former winner may exhibit in this class, but may receive only the Quinn Ribbon.
