Dear Friends . . .

I am pleased to announce that my good friend, Dave Karnstedt, has joined me in Oakwood Daffodils. He will be responsible for marketing and operations and for expanding our jointly-shared hobby into a viable business, allowing me more time to follow my major interest — breeding. We are planning commercial exhibits at one or two Midwestern shows, the National Convention in King of Prussia, PA and at the first ADS-sponsored show in this area on 7 May. If we're in your area this Spring, please stop by our exhibit to say Hello! We'd very much like to meet you and become acquainted.

As the snow disappears and the first crocus and snowdrops appear, we eagerly await the best of last year's first-bloom seedlings. We hope to exhibit some of them this year to gauge their show worthiness. I think it is with almost as much anticipation as apprehension that we look forward to some eight or nine thousand first-bloom seedlings this year. While we fully realize the ambition and scope a breeding program of this

size represents, we are also fully aware of the opportunity to make major advances and of the lasting beauty of the daffodils that will result from it.

A final word, about the purpose of our business: we will offer only the healthiest stocks of acclimated daffodils of our introduction, or those of other breeders. To meet that goal, we strictly rogue the stocks for any evidence of virus and are taking every possible precaution to prevent its introduction into our seedlings. We are convinced that this is the only possible approach for a business of this type and that it represents value to you, our customers. Therefore, we fully guarantee our bulbs to be healthy and true to name. If they should prove otherwise, please do let us know so that we may set things right!

OUR 1985 INTRODUCTIONS

Upon the death of J. Lionel Richardson, his wife, Helen "Nell," carried on the business for several years. Her final list in 1973 contained most of the last seedlings to be named and registered. Those bulbs, together with the sale of whole (very small) stocks, disappeared into private collections. From time to time, one would see or read about some of those fine named seedlings (2Y-R Red Rum, Best Bloom, London(Competition)-1973), but few were ever subsequently offered commercially. Over the years, we have managed to obtain most of those final cultivars. It is with a great deal of pleasure that we introduce them to American gardens through this catalog.

BOLD LAD (H.K. Richardson) 2Y-O M (Royal Palace x
(Firecracker x Spelter))

This superb show flower is one of her best yellow-reds. While the Firecracker breeding lends a slight narrowness to the inner petals, its also responsible for the beautifully flat, smoothly finished perianth and intense, golden yellow color. The deep orange of the somewhat tubular cup blends out over the perianth, intensifying the color, a heritage from Spelter.

CELTIC GOLD (H.K. Richardson) 2Y-Y EM (Golden Aura x
Camelot)

We strongly feel this cultivar will eventually gain status as the best 2Y-Y from the Richardson line. A marvelous show flower that superbly combines the benchmark smoothness and substance of its parents into a more refined flower intermediate in size. Enough said!

INISHMORE (H.K. Richardson) 2W-GWW M (Verona x
Stainless)

This the most outstanding long cupped white from Richardson breeding. It's dazzling, sparkling whiteness sets the standard for the Division — I can think of no other daffodil in its class that can match it. The

very smooth, flat perianth of the best show standard has marvelous substance. The rather small, but still well balanced, heavily frilled, expanded crown opens with the same sparkling whiteness as the perianth, enhanced by the deep green eye. Tall, strong stems.

LEMON CANDY (H.K. Richardson) 2Y-WWY EM (Camelot x
Daydream)

The very broadly overlapping, satin-smooth, flat perianth of this bright, lemon-yellow show flower has very heavy, opaque substance. The perfectly formed and balanced corona opens the same shade of yellow as the perianth, but soon fades to near white and edged with a frilled rim of gold. Robust plants with medium length, strong stems. Has been shown successfully at several Eastern shows.

MONTEVIDEO (J.L. Richardson) 2W-R M (Kilworth x
Arbar)

This grand flower has been the best of the Richardson 2W-R's grown here and, probably, overall, the best of the grex. It has long been one of John's favorites for its large size, massive substance, silken texture and purity of color, in both perianth and cup. Certainly, it has been one of the whitest 2W-R's seen here. Not a very rapid multiplier, it has always been scarce and only sporadically available after its appearance in the late sixties and not offered since dispersal of the Richardson stocks.

RED RUM (H.K. Richardson) 2Y-R EM (Tambourne x
Falstaff)

Beautifully formed and flawlessly smooth perianth of deep, rich, golden yellow. The neatly formed, bowl-shaped, frilled corona is a clear, red-orange, shaded slightly deeper at the finely serrated edge. Red Rum has inherited Falstaff's best characteristic — its marvelous, silky-textured perianth, but unlike that flower, displays a beautifully formed, balanced crown.

This flower has been much sought after, ever since it was Best Bloom on its first outing at the London RHS Competition in 1973.

SEA ROSE (H.K. Richardson) 2W-P M (Enchantress x Romance)

I consider this seedling to be, without doubt, the loveliest, most beautifully consistent Richardson pink I have ever seen growing here. The soft, pure rose-pink of the cup is, once seen, never forgotten. The ultra smooth, flat, waxy petals form a perianth of very good overlap and of purest, clear white. Vigorous plant with good stems.

Only one or two bulbs available this year.

TAMAR FIRE (H.K. Richardson) 4Y-R LM (Tonga x Vulcan)

Purchased as a seedling stock by the du Plessis Brothers firm in England and subsequently named and introduced by them. Broadly overlapping and beautifully smooth petals of golden yellow lightly shaded orange back a rather full center of petaloids (of the same color as the perianth) evenly interspersed with the dark red-orange segments of the cup. A really excellent, show-quality double borne on strong stems with good necks that hold the blooms at the correct angle. Appears to have the potential for ending the reign of Tahiti as the best Y-R show double.

Premier Bloom, Division 4, London(Competition)-1984

The second set of our 1985 introductions contains a few of John Lea's best cultivars. His sudden passing last year left his collection in the same sort of jeopardy as the Richardson one. Happily, however, the seedlings and newest of the named cultivars were sold intact to an individual who plans to continue the stocks. Although the Lea bulbs were imported by a number of fanciers in this country, to our knowledge, few of those

introductions have ever been offered as acclimated bulbs in an American catalog.

CREAGH DUBH (Lea) 20-R EM (((Chungking x Spry) x Home Fires) x Vulcan)

This was John Lea's contribution to the class. Its a flower of great size, good texture and fine form with a deep, red cup that immediately attracts the eye. The reddish color suffuses the flat perianth, but the remarkable coppery-orange-red color described by its originator has not appeared here, yet. Has been a very successful show flower (at its prime) in Lea's exhibits.

Engleheart Cup - 1980

One or two available this year. Each: \$40.00

DAILMANACH (Lea) 2W-P LM (Inverpolly x seedling)

Highly thought of abroad as one of the best exhibition pinks. The glistening-white perianth is flat, broadly rounded and better than four inches in diameter. Its long, trumpet-shaped crown is bright pink, deepening at the expanded and lightly rolled edge. Not entirely consistent in our short Springs and hot weather where its texture tends to crepiness and the stems to weaken. It seems to require a long, cool and moist growing season to produce the exceptional flowers seen in its originator's winning Engleheart Cup exhibits. In 1975, one particularly fine flower was selected as Best Bloom in the London Daffodil Show, the first "pink" to be so honored.

GLENFARCLAS (Lea) 1Y-O EM (Seedling x Vulcan)

The best of the Lea red-orange trumpets here. The broadly rounded perianth has heavy substance, although its not consistently smooth and flat. The trumpet is (more, or less, depending on the weather at flowering time) solidly colored orange-red to its base, gradually expanding to a slightly rolled, serrated edge. It has

been a successful show flower for its originator. A strong grower and quite fertile both ways, Glenfarclas has become the cornerstone of our red trumpet breeding program.

GOLD CONVENTION (Lea) 1Y-Y M (From seedlings of of orange trumpet breeding)

Immense broad, smooth, golden yellow petals form a nearly round, flat perianth that is slightly swept back. The rather narrow, borderline trumpet is slightly expanded at the mouth, frilled and a deep, rich gold that often becomes orange as the flower matures. Vigorous grower with tall, strong stems and good necks. Several times in its originator's winning Engleheart Cup groups, including that of 1984.

LOCH CARRON (Lea) 2Y-R EM (Capitol Hill x Vulcan) x (Capitol Hill x Vulcan)

An exceptionally smooth flower that is very consistent in its production of outstanding show blooms. The perfectly smooth, broadly pointed, flat perianth is a deep, rich gold color that borders on orange. The neat, rather small, straight-sided crown is a fiery red and solidly colored to the base. Strong vigorous plants with good stems and necks.

Engleheart Cup - 1982, 83 & 84

Only one or two bulbs available this year.

Our collection contains the largest number of "Down Under" cultivars (registered and named/unregistered) in the Northern Hemisphere. Our major interest in them has been as breeding material, but so many of them are such superb show flowers that we have decided to introduce them to American gardens as they become acclimated and as stocks permit. Most of them have not been offered commercially before in the Northern Hemisphere.

IMMACULATE (Jackson, Jr.-Tas.) 2W-GWW M (Green Valley x Tectata) x (Tudor Minstrel x Amorette)

This is Jackson's best white (currently available) and, without doubt, one of the best show flowers from Tasmania. Its immensely broad, beautifully rounded, snow-white perianth of heavy, opaque substance is remarkable. The rather straight-sided, frilled cup is beige-yellow on opening and has a serrated edge. The cream color soon fades to purest white enhanced by a deep green eye. A very large flower, yet the whole is beautifully balanced. Occasionally, the heavy substance will cause the perianth to hood and the bloom to have negative pose. These faults respond perfectly to a little careful grooming.

Best Bloom, Launceston - 1980

Only two or three bulbs available this year.

MELANCHOLY (Jackson, Jr.-Tas.) 1W-P E (C.E. Radcliff x Egina)

Magnificent, pure white bloom with very smooth, broadly overlapping perianth of excellent substance and long, frilled, slightly expanded crown, solidly colored salmon-pink. The best 1W-P yet grown here. Its pose is not consistently good, but will respond perfectly to careful grooming. Fertile both ways and early indications are that it will become a good parent. A favorite here.

VAHU (Jackson, Jr.-Tas.) 2W-P E (Cathlin x Verran)

One of the most sought after of the Jackson pinks and never released in the Northern Hemisphere until now. An early white-pink show flower of outstanding quality. Very broadly overlapping, satin-smooth perianth is inclined to lightly nick as it opens to reveal a long, frilled, out-turned corona of soft pink. The overall quality of this flower is so high and the occasional nick so minor that it will still handily win its class. Has won just too many show awards to list,

the most recent being Premier Bloom, Division 2, Springworld 84.

VERRAN (Jackson, Jr.-Tas.) 2W-P EM (Kootara x Egina)

Consistently, one of the smoothest pinks grown here — every bloom is of superb show quality! The long, frilled, out-turned, slightly rolled corona is a most delicate shade of lavender-pink. Pollen parent of Obsession and Vahu. Never before offered here "Up Over."

PALE BEAUTY (O'More-NZ) 2Y-O M (Red Baron x Dunkeld)

A most remarkably descriptive name that suits this bewitchingly colored show flower perfectly. Very smooth, flat petals of waxy substance colored a soft, clear, deep, primrose-yellow highlight the impact of the pure, glowing, spectrum-orange of the bowl-shaped, frilled cup. Very tall, strong stems present the flowers perfectly. One of the best flowers yet seen here from Reg Cull's stocks and John's favorite flower last season.

SEA DREAM (O'More-NZ) 3W-GWW LM (Nelly x Chinese White)

An outstanding show flower from New Zealand. The ultra smooth, consistently flat petals of extremely heavy substance form a perianth of precise form and beautiful presentation. The small, flat, frilled cup has a deep green eye.

Premier Bloom, Division 3, Springworld 84

DEAR ME (Piper-Aust.) 2W-P EM (Keera x Bon Rose)

While not a large flower, this has the purest pink color of any white-pink yet grown here. An elegant,

exceptionally consistent show flower whose satin-smooth, velvety texture, heavy substance and clear, soft lavender-tinted pink crown create a daffodil of near unprecedented quality. Destined for an illustrious career on the show bench and as a parent. It is proving to be an outstanding breeder of exceptional seedlings and has been much used by us in developing our strain of pinks.

EVERGLAZE (Free-NZ) 2Y-R EM (unknown)

One of the most deeply colored, show-quality, yellow-reds yet seen here and one of the best in its class from NZ. A perfectly colored bloom handily beat the smoother, better known English competitors in its class at Dayton in 1981. An exclusive Northern Hemisphere introduction for Reg Cull of New Zealand.

RUFUS (Tombleson-NZ) 6Y-R EM (Charity May seedling)

A very good example of a very scarce class that won Premier Division 6 in a recent NZ show, beating the always tough competition presented by numbers of Tracey and Treena; a remarkable achievement. The beautifully smooth, broadly overlapping, evenly reflexed perianth brings into prominence the rather short, lightly frilled, deep orange-red crown. Being introduced for Reg Cull in this hemisphere.

OUR DARLING (Forrester-Aust.) 3W-YYR M (Gyda x Estrella)

This daffodil is unique and, we feel, the most outstanding one in this season's catalog! Never have such massively wide petals been seen in a daffodil before — the outer petals (sepals) overlap each other and the lower third of the inner petals completely overlap, an achievement that is considerably enhanced by the smooth whiteness of the very flat perianth.

The rather flat, lightly frilled crown is evenly lobed and precisely stitched along the entire edge with a rim of deep red. We have only a few bulbs and are rather reluctant to let even one go, but feel this flower is so remarkably fine that it deserves to be seen by other daffodil enthusiasts.

CUPID (Cooper-NZ) 6Y-Y LM (jonquilla x cyclamineus)

A true, multi-flowered, miniature cyclamineus hybrid rather similar to Flyaway, but smaller, overall, than that delightful flower. Usually has three, tiny blooms per stem on established bulbs. Unknown outside of NZ and never before offered in this hemisphere. Far too scarce yet to be recognized as an approved ADS miniature, but that will be only a matter of time. An enchanting, elfin flower that has been a rather good increaser in the several years we have grown it.

OTHER HYBRIDIZERS

SNIPE (A.M. Wilson-Eng.) 6W-W E (W.P. Milner x cyclamineus)

Anyone who grows and loves miniatures loves Snipe! Always wins its class and lends distinction and elegance to Lavender Ribbon and Watrous exhibits. This white, drooping, Division 6 miniature appears on everyone's list of favorites, if it is not the favorite! A good grower, but very slow multiplier.

UNITY (Evans-USA) 1Y-P EM ((Daydream x Lunar Sea) x Rima)

The smoothest flower in its class yet grown here and the tallest stems. The corona is of true trumpet length and configuration being out-turned, flanged and lightly serrated. Its color can become a strawberry, red-pink some seasons. The flowers are quite large,

but the petals, though smooth, are relatively narrow and a pale lemon in color. Nonetheless, it is still the best colored daffodil in its class to date.

GREEN PEARL (de Jaeger-Holland) 9W-GWW L (unknown)

A most unusual, late season, green-eyed white that is registered as a poeticus. Rounded petals of clean, sparkling, poeticus-white that tend to incurve slightly, particularly the inner petals. The anther arrangement is also poeticus-like, but not, apparently, the white rim/band, since it lacks the more customarily seen red/orange. But then, who is to say, when the other poeticus attributes are present, that the white rim is not acceptable? We feel Green Pearl to be a unique addition to the Division.

JOHANN STRAUSS (Lefebvre-Holland) 2W-O E (Red Marley seedling)

A unique daffodil — nothing even resembles it! Primarily a flower for the garden and bouquets, it will occasionally produce a quite smooth, show-quality bloom when it should be benched to provide visitors with an idea of what diversity can exist in the daffodils of today. The most unusual, tubular, long cup is colored an intense, deep orange (lightly tinged red) that immediately draws attention, but, as you will see when the flowers open in your garden, the cup is that color when the buds burst to release it! A remarkable flower for its type with the bonus of being early. Never before offered outside of Holland that we're aware of.

LARKWHISTLE (Palmer-Eng.) 6Y-O EE (unknown)

An outstanding little flower of good form that is easily noticed on the show table or growing in the garden.

Bright yellow, reflexed, rather narrow petals and frilled short cup of orange with a flush of green in the throat. Strong, rather tall stems carry the blooms well above the foliage. Distinct and never before offered anywhere. Our stock was obtained from Mrs. Lewis Palmer, the wife of the originator.

ACCENT (Mitsch) 2W-P M (Interim x Interlude)

An excellent daffodil with a flat, clean white perianth and deep rose-pink cup. An appealing combination that produces a marvelous display each Spring. Vigorous grower and rapid increaser.

ACHDUART (Lea) 3Y-R M ((Spry x Carbineer) x Vulcan)

An extremely consistent, beautifully formed show flower that sets the standard for Division 3 yellow-reds. Its lovely, smooth perianth of soft gold is nicely balanced by the deep red cup. A reliable show bloom that has several major, Best Bloom awards to its credit.

AM(e)-RHS Each: \$8.50

ACHNASHEEN (Lea) 3W-W M (Suilven x Hamzali)

Dazzlingly white in both the smooth perianth and flat cup! Consistent in its quality and better formed than most in this class. Strong grower with tall stems.

ACROPOLIS (J.L. Richardson) 4W-WRR LM (Falaise x Limerick)

One of the first generation Richardson doubles, yet it firmly remains one of the finest white and red doubles

currently available today. Broad and rounded, poeticus-white perianth petals evenly back a rather full flower whose center petaloids of the same color are interspersed at their bases with the deep red fragments of the cup. Lightly fragrant. A very strong grower with tall, stiff stems and good necks, but a rather slow multiplier.

Best Bloom, London(Competition) - 1969

FCC(e)-RHS Each: \$2.00

AIR MARSHAL (J.L. Richardson) 2Y-R EM (Carbineer x Malta)

We have an exceptionally fine stock of this famous parent. The very broad, flat perianth is deep golden yellow and has sheen. The cup is straight-sided and not wholly red (as the color code would indicate), but pales to orange toward the base. Withal, a striking flower of great size whose marvelous perianth and deep color is producing second and third generation seedlings of extreme refinement.

ALTRUIST (Board) 30-R LM (Kindled x Alport)

A beautiful show flower of unusual, yet attractive coloring. The flat, waxen smooth perianth petals open a warm, coppery-orange in cool weather and somewhat lighter in very hot weather. The flat, heavily frilled, dark orange-red cup is rather more sun resistant than the petals whose color will fade to a coppery-buff in strong light. It should be cut early for showing, or protected from the sun. Has tall stems and excellent pose. Sometimes referred to as the "poor man's Sabine Hay!"

AMBER CASTLE (H.K. Richardson) 2Y-WPP EM (Camelot x Daydream)

An extremely consistent and wholly attractive exhibition flower of highest quality whose deep lemon perianth is broad, perfectly smooth and flat. The cup, while color coded as pink, is really lemon-yellow suffused with a subtle shade of amber-buff. Makes an excellent addition to a Green or Bronze Ribbon collection. Only one bulb available this season.

ARBAR (J.L. Richardson) 2W-O M (Monaco x Forfar)

A classic daffodil and parent/grandparent of the fine white-reds of today. Carefully grown, Arbar can still win in its class, in spite of its more expensive competitors. An excellent addition to a collection class, where its smooth, flat white perianth and bowl-shaped, dark, soft orange cup add a distinctive touch.

ANGEL EYES (Mitsch) 9W-GYO L (Quetzal x Smyrna)

One of the delightful poets bred recently by Grant Mitsch and, unusual for a poet, freely flowering because it is a good multiplier. Lovely, rounded perianths of clean, poeticus-white have lovely, green-centered, orange-rimmed eyes — a welcome breath of fresh (fragrant!) air in a rather stale section. Tall, strong stems hold the flowers well above the foliage. Very limited stock.

ARIEL (J.L. Richardson) 3W-OOY M (Blarney's Daughter
x (Tuskar Light x Green Island))

Elegant and distinctive show flower with little competition in its class. The soft orange cup is encircled with a ring of gold and set in a satin smooth, snow-white perianth; a lovely improvement over Blarney and her Daughter.

ARCTIC GOLD (J.L. Richardson) 1Y-Y E (Goldcourt x
Kingscourt)

The best, early season, yellow trumpet for both show and garden display. The deep golden yellow, smooth petalled flowers have good poise and come consistently good each year. Often Best Bloom or Best Vase of Three in the early shows; a "must" for any daffodil collection.

ARNDILLY (Lea) 2W-R M (?)

A beautifully balanced white and red flower of smooth,

broadly overlapping, very white perianth and neat, deep red cup. Tall stem and good neck. The parentage listed in the Data Bank is in error.

ASHMORE (John Blanchard) 2W-GWW LM (Easter Moon x
Chinese White seedling)

A lovely, smoothly finished exhibition white that must be left on the plant to achieve the size required to bring the perianth and cup into balance. If cut too early, size can be lacking and the cup can come with a ragged, sawn-off look. Cut at the right moment, it can be, as it was at the London Daffodil Show in 1975, Best Bloom. Has a beautiful, dark green eye.

AUDUBON (Mitsch) 3W-YYP M ((Interim x Mabel Taylor)
x Caro Nome)

One of the few Division 3's with pink in the cup. The flat, very white perianth with its white (the yellow fades out here) cup and band of deep, coral-pink create a lovely flower for showing or cutting. Each: \$2.50

AVENGER (J.L. Richardson) 2W-R M (Kilworth x Arbar)

One of the best flowers from this famous cross and still prized for its consistency in producing show quality blooms. Not as large as some, Avenger scores high for its whiteness, substance and even cup color. FCC(e)-RHS

BALLYROAN (H.K. Richardson) 2W-P M (Romance x Rose
Royale)

The perianth segments are shovel-pointed, smooth and pure white in this lovely show flower. The nicely balanced crown is of bright, rose-pink.

BARLOW (Mitsch) 6Y-Y EE (Cibola x cyclamineus)

One of Mitsch's early Division 6 hybrids. Still a welcome sight each Spring heralding the return of the

daffodils. Bright, sunny yellow, long lasting blooms, of typical reflexed form.

A quite large flower, but one with excellent quality. Overlapping perianth of broad, flat, clean white, opaque segments is balanced by a cup-shaped crown of deep, salmon-pink suffused lilac. The beautiful blooms appear on tall, strong stems with good necks. Vigorous grower. Each: \$5.00

CANISP (Lea) 2W-W EM (Ave x Early Mist)

An elegant and outstandingly beautiful, ice-white, show flower of near trumpet proportions that has many Best Bloom awards to its credit, including two at the London Daffodil Show. Flat, double-triangle perianth segments are broadly overlapping and consistently smooth. The narrow base, near trumpet-length crown is only slightly expanding and lightly ruffled, but some seasons can come neatly rolled.

CEYLON (J.L. Richardson) 2Y-O E (Marksman x Diolite)

This is a daffodil whose distinct form and presentation make it instantly recognizable and very easy to pick out from the crowd of look-alikes. The flat, perfectly smooth perianth is a clear, bright yellow

Graceful Divison 6 hybrid of lovely quality whose broadly overlapping, evenly reflexed perianth and long, elegantly formed trumpet are a soft, clear yellow. Performs at its best when carefully sited and left down for several years. A well-grown Vase of Three will nearly always win its class. Performs beautifully in the garden, covering itself each Spring with masses of bloom, increasing rapidly.

CHEMAWA (Mitsch) 2Y-OOY EM (Narvik x California Gold)

Smooth, very rounded, much overlapping flat perianths are rich gold. The straight-sided crown is an intense, rich orange devoid of red, enlivened by an intensely frilled and serrated yellow margin on its edge. A distinctive and very attractive daffodil that is easily identified on the show bench, in its seedlings or in the garden. Each: \$1.75

In cool, damp weather, the pink band of the cup darkens to a shade of crushed raspberry. An ideal show flower of precise form, perfectly flat perianth and beautifully balanced crown. Clean, pure white throughout and of heavy, opaque substance; a choice daffodil. Slow multiplier.

FESTIVITY (Mitsch) 2W-Y M (Bodilly x Brunswick)

Produces huge blooms with very widespread, broad, consistently flat and smooth, clean white perianths of beautiful substance. The purity of the white is enhanced by green highlights in the petal bases. The long, slightly expanding, frilled cup is a clear yellow of high saturation; its color does not bleed into the perianth. A classic show bloom and a fine grower in the garden that produces beautiful bulbs. Certainly one of Grant's best introductions and the best all purpose bicolor grown here.

NEWPORT (Pannill) 2W-YOY M (Profile x Avenger)

Pure white, very smooth, consistently flat, slightly pointed perianth of very heavy substance with a deep, orange-sherbet coloring in the straight-sided, lightly frilled cup with its indistinct band of yellow. A really beautiful example of Newport was Best Bloom at the ADS National Show in Williamsburg in 1983.
