RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All classes open to anyone who grows daffodils except where specified otherwise.
2. All blooms must have been grown in the open by the exhibitor. Miniatures may be grown in protected areas.
3. An exhibitor may make as many entries as he wishes in any class, provided each entry is a different cultivar or species or a completely different collection of cultivars and/or species.
4. Exhibits will be received Saturday, April 22 after 7:30 a.m. and until 11:00 a.m.. No entries accepted after 11:00 a.m.. Exhibits must not be removed before the close of the show at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 23.
5. All classes are for standard daffodils except where specified otherwise.
6. Exhibitors shall place an entry tag, properly filled out, with *name*, *division*, and *color code*, on each exhibit. Containers for specimens will be furnished by show committee. All collections will be staged in properties provided by show committee. No daffodil foliage permitted.
7. All collections of 5 or more stems must be exhibited with each cultivar in a separate container. *Each cultivar must be correctly labeled with name, division, and color code.* Originator's name must appear on label in American Bred Class 145 except seedlings shown by originator.
8. Miniature daffodils named in the most recent ADS Approved List of Miniatures, with any official additions thereto, may be shown only in classes for miniatures and seedlings which are candidates for the Miniature List. Miniature Candidate: any named or numbered "small daffodil" is considered a "Miniature Candidate." Such candidates are eligible for ADS Awards in the miniature section, with the exception of the Miniature Rose Ribbon.
9. Correct classification according to the RHS System as printed in the latest edition of *Daffodils to Show and Grow* and the ADS Data Print-out, and labeling shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor. No label may be changed, specimens added, removed, or substituted after judging has begun or after awards have been placed. If an error is discovered in an exhibit after completion of judging any award placed thereon (ADS, special or ribbon) shall be forfeited by the exhibitor.

10. Exhibits which are incorrectly named or without division and color code will *not* be judged. However, blooms of seedlings may be shown by the originator or by other persons in classes for "named cultivars" provided that they are identified by originator's designated number.
11. All seedlings are judged by the ADS Scale of Points.
12. Each stem in an exhibit receiving an ADS Award must score 90% or more by the ADS Scale of Points.
13. Only one first, one second, and one third award may be given in each class. Honorable Mention awards may also be given.
14. Any and all awards may be withheld by the judges if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy. The decision of the judges shall be final, except as stated in Rule #9.
15. A **novice** is anyone who has never won a blue ribbon in an ADS Show. All novices should place a visible "N" on the top portion of the entry tag for Section J.

Class 142—Daffodils of Australia/New Zealand breeding, 5 cultivars

Class 143—Daffodils of English/Irish breeding, 5 cultivars

Class 144—Daffodils introduced prior to 1963, 5 cultivars (Label must include registration date)

Class 145—Daffodils of American breeding, 5 cultivars, (See rule #7)

Class 146—Colored perianth, cup paler than perianth, 5 cultivars

Class 147—12 cultivars and/or species from not less than 4 divisions

Class 148—15 cultivars from 15 different RHS Classifications

Class 149—12 white daffodils any division(s)

Class 150—3 stems of 6 cultivars of white daffodils

Class 151—3 stems each 12 cultivars and/or species from at least 3 divisions, each cultivar labeled

SECTION I—SEEDLINGS

Seedlings grown and exhibited by the originator only, with his designated number, classification and parentage (if known). The originator of a daffodil seedling is the person who first flowers the bulb regardless of who made the cross and/or planted the seed.

Class 152—One stem, standard cultivar — eligible for ADS ROSE RIBBON

Class 153—One stem, candidate for Miniature List — eligible for ADS MINIATURE ROSE RIBBON

SECTION J—JUNIOR DIVISION

Class 154—One stem, Division 1

Class 155—One stem, Division 2

Class 156—One stem, Division 3

Class 157—One stem, Division 4, 5, 6

Class 158—One stem, Division 7, 8, 9

SECTION M—ADS AWARDS OPEN ONLY TO ADS MEMBERS

(See Rule #7)

Class 186—ROBERTA C. WATROUS AWARD

Silver Medal or Ribbon Collection of 12 cultivars and/or species of miniature daffodils, one stem each, from at least 3 divisions. This medal may be won only one time in all ADS shows by any exhibitor. A former winner may exhibit in this class, but may receive only the Watrous Ribbon.

Class 187—CAREY E. QUINN AWARD

Silver Medal or Ribbon Collection of 24 standard cultivars and/or species of daffodils, one stem each, from at least 5 divisions. This medal may be won only one time in all ADS shows by any exhibitor. A former winner may exhibit in this class, but may receive only the Quinn Ribbon.

Non-competitive exhibits dealing with daffodils. Literature and other printed matter pertaining to daffodils will be available in this section.
