## THE GARDENS

Mary and Bob Cartwright moved to a charming home four years ago and have created a delightful jewel of a garden. With limited space, Mary has managed a truly marvelous collection not only of daffodils, but also diverse and unusual spring bulbs. The summer garden is a collection of lilies, hostas, daisies, herbs, and other items in which blue and blue-lavender tones predominate. Their latest addition is a small pond at the rear of the house. Though the garden is lovely now, it was spectacular last week — trust the weather!

Dick and Kitty Frank are still suffering from leaving a 14-acre track where "I can plant anything I want." Now their attitude has to be "I love it; where can I put it?" This has led to a large garden with many daffodils in rows, but also under trees there are daffodils which are alternated with hosta, herbs, day lilies, and iris with mums in some areas in the fall. The area near the pool not only has all these flowers, but includes bulbous lilies, peonies, and shrubs. Presently they are trying to cover the fence with ivy. The stone area at the back of the property is the summer home of more than 100 different camellias, a few of which may still be blooming in the glass house.

Margaret Ann and Walter Robinson have a delightful garden for all seasons. Under foundation and area plantings are large number of daffodils as well as hyacinths, pansies and crocus in the grass. The pool area, now empty, will be filled with summer flowers as will many raised planters. Around the edge of the property are large clumps of "heritage" daffodil plants by Margaret Ann's mother. Her formal garden is enclosed in boxwood at the south of the property.
