- 6) Seedling number before naming.



## Murray Evans Cultivars



*Murray Evans (1912-1988) lived his entire life in Corbett, Oregon. He worked with daffodils for more than 50 years, starting in a family business with his grandfather and uncles, then growing his own commercial bulbs and cut flowers with his wife Estella.*

*With the encouragement and assistance of Grant Mitsch, Murray began hybridizing in 1953 and offered his first new hybrids for sale in 1968. Approximately 200 Evans-bred daffodils have been registered—a wide variety of show and garden flowers.*

| 1976 M. 32cm. (Lunar Sea x Galway) x Glenmanus. K-12. Perianth large, smooth and flat, with petals somewhat pointed. Pale to deep primrose cup is long, narrow at base, slightly flared at margin. Short-necked flower nicely posed on stiff stem. Suitable for show and garden. |               |                       |

| 1971 LM. 43cm. Green Island x Artist's Model. I-10. Unusual color. Round, white perianth; large saucer-shaped cup is primrose with a pink rim.   |               |                       |
| □ <b>APLOMB</b>  | <b>1W-W</b>   | <b>Each...\$28.00</b> |
| 1992 M. Neahkahnne x Cataract. Y-3/3. A classic Evans white trumpet from exceptional parents. A long tapered trumpet with a roll extends from a smooth flat corolla of overlapping triangles.  |               |                       |

| 1970 M. 48cm. Blarney x (Duke of Windsor x Lady Kesteven). F-285. Tall, strong-stemmed and vigorous. Like many of Blarney's descendants it has a salmon-orange cup with yellow margin. Resembles Ariel, but perianth is whiter, cup margin more frilled.                         |               |                       |

- ◆ **ARAWANNAH** 1Y-Y Each...\$2.00  
 1976 M. 40cm. Bethany x Daydream. H-3/1. Medium-sized, canary yellow, smooth, round, and flat perianth. Well-proportioned trumpet, slightly flared, lacinated at margin. Strong stem of medium height. Good for garden and exhibition.
- **ARCTIC CHAR** 2W-P Each...\$10.00  
 1974 M. 41cm. Accent x (Mabel Taylor x Radiation). J-30. Resembles most its seed parent. Perianth is broader and whiter. Cup less flaring, an intense, deep reddish pink, especially on the inside.
- **ARRAY** 9W-GYR Each...\$6.00  
 1982 L. 43cm. Recurvus open pollinated. P-18/1. Larger, taller, and much more vigorous than recurvus. Perianth segments are wider with less backsweep. It inherited little of the delicious scent peculiar to recurvus and blooms a bit earlier.
- **ARTFUL** 2W-P Each...\$20.00  
 1992 M. 50cm. Quasar x (seedling x Everpink). W-2/4.
- **BARBIE DOLL** 2W-WWP Each...\$5.00  
 1980 LM. 35cm. Kewpie x Chiquita. O-5. Medium-sized bloom with very white, round and fairly smooth perianth. Flaring cup opens primrose yellow with strawberry red margin. Cup gradually fades to white, retaining the colorful rim. Bloom posed upward of 90 degrees on strong stem.
- **BELLA COOLA** 2W-W Each...\$17.00  
 1987 L. Broomhill x Stainless. U-10/3. The latest bloomer of the U-10 series, this modest beauty is very smooth and well-proportioned. The medium length cup, not quite as white as the perianth, is slightly tapered and fluted its entire length. Tall and strong with a short neck and good pose.
- **BIG JOHN** 1Y-W Each...\$7.00  
 1975 M. 42cm. Daydream x Bethany. L-50. Large, tall flower on a stiff stem. Vies with Epitome for excellence and lacks the yellow margin on trumpet. Opens a bit later than Epitome.
- **BUCKSKIN** 2Y-Y Each...\$3.00  
 1973 LM. 41cm. Green Island x Foggy Dew. G-29/1. Name describes color, though in warmer areas cup may be lighter than perianth. Good show form, with beauty and durability for garden.
- **CABOCHON** 2Y-O Each...\$7.00  
 1989 EE. 40cm. Carnelian x Falstaff. T-9. Form resembles Falstaff, blooms earlier than either parent. Golden yellow perianth and orange-red cup

flared with serrated margin. Holds color fairly well. Some may be smooth enough for show.

☐ **CALCITE** 2W-GWW Each...\$32.00

1986 M. Easter Moon x Castle of Mey. O-31/1. A fine show and garden flower. Taller, larger and whiter than Easter Moon, and it did not inherit the cup irregularities of its parent. Broad, flat perianth and medium length cup, slightly frilled at the margin.

☐ **CANDY CANE** 4W-P Each...\$12.00

1993 EM. 44cm. (Pink Chiffon x Cordial) x Dewy Rose. W-6/1. A vigorous rose-pink double with distinct bands of white on the lateral margins of the wavy pink petaloids.

☐ **CATARACT** 1W-W Each...\$25.00

1975 EM. 47cm. [(Zero x Kanchenjunga) x Zero] x Vigil. M-90. Excellent white trumpet. Tall, smooth, with very broad perianth segments. Show quality with garden stamina. Very limited stock.

☐ **CHAPEAU** 2W-Y Each...\$3.00

1971 EM. 43cm. Wahkeena x Festivity. F-291/2. Form intermediate between its parents. Clean white, overlapping and pointed perianth. Long cup of butter yellow, fluted at margin. Strong stem, good pose and durability for garden or show.

◆ **CHARADE** 2Y-Y Each...\$3.00

1976 M. 37cm. Greenland x Green Island. K-50. Smooth, broad, flat flower which opens white, then ages to a soft greenish beige. Straight cup lightly fluted, frilled at rim. Short neck, good pose.

◆ **CHEDDAR** 2Y-Y Each...\$2.00

1972 M. 38 cm. Festivity x 2W-Y sdlg. F-292. Smaller sister to Monument. Round, smooth and well poised. Perianth is medium yellow, goblet-shaped cup is a cheesy buff color.

☐ **CHELAN** 2Y-W Each...\$2.00

1975 LM. 43cm. Daydream x Bethany. H-16. Sister of Suede, opening later and reversing well in cooler weather. Broad, smooth perianth, long tapered cup which fades to off-white at maturity.

☐ **CHEMEKETA** 2Y-YPP Each...\$15.00

1987 M. 44cm. [(Binkie x (King of the North x Content)) x Suede] x [Just So x (Bethany x Daydream)]. W-5/2. Medium yellow perianth with semi-round, flat and overlapping segments. Straight cup with slight roll at margin opens yellow at base, pink to and including the rim. Strong stem with well-posed bloom.





☐ **GINGER** 2Y-Y Each...\$6.00

1974 M. 43cm. Aircastle x Protege. J-45/1. Good show flower, the color of powdered ginger. Vigor and durability qualify it as a garden subject, as well. Large smooth perianth, with wide and rounded segments. Cup flared and crinkled at margin. Perfect division 2 proportions.

☐ **GIRASOL** 1Y-P Each...\$15.00

1986 LM. Salome x [(Binkie x seedling) x Suede]. S-2/2. Very smooth with shovel-shaped perianth segments of opalescent pale ivory yellow. Pale salmon pink trumpet is slightly tapered with a little flare and fluted at the margin. Bloom posed at 90° on short neck, with a strong, medium height stem.

☐ **HACIENDA** 1Y-O Each...\$30.00

1985 M. Arctic Gold x Brer Fox. Q-20/1. The best "yellow-red" trumpet bred by Murray before his death. Orange in the trumpet is not so brilliant as Brer Fox, but its elegant form will make it a worthwhile flower even should it come with little or no orange. Has smooth, broad, flattish perianth and a long symmetrical trumpet with a slight roll at the rim. Very durable and long lasting, with a medium stem and good pose. Excellent for garden or show.

☐ **HEART THROB** 2W-GWP Each...\$8.00

1976 M. 34cm. Everpink x [(Caro Nome x (Mabel Taylor x Rosario)) x Interim]. L-39. Could be considered an improved Everpink. Wide, flat and clean white perianth, inner segments not so broad. The green-eyed cup is white with a 1/2-inch band of ripe strawberry. Beautiful.

☐ **HEIRESS** 2YYW-P Each...\$9.00

1991 M. 39cm. [Daydream x (Green Island x Accent)] x (Daydream x Gypsy Princess). V-3/2. Oval medium yellow perianth segments with white halo at base. The long tapered and ruffled cup matures to a pleasing light salmon pink, lighter on the outer surface.

☐ **HONEYMOON** 1Y-Y Each...\$8.00

1969 E. 45cm. Trousseau x Cantatrice. H-4. Large and smooth, vigorous and durable. An early flower with unusual color, best described as fawn or chamoise, which is retained throughout its long life.

◆ **ICE AGE** 2W-W Each...\$7.00

1976 EM. 36cm. Zero x (Kanchenjunga x Zero). F-268. Well-grown blooms of this are striking, with their sail-like, smooth perianths. Cups are fairly long, tapered sharply at margins and flared. Very short necks, blooms nicely posed. Seed parent of Cataract. Limited stock.

- IVY LEAGUE** **1W-Y** **Each...\$8.00**  
 1971 M. 45cm. Effective x Festivity. F-303/2. A consistent producer of show-quality blooms. The big flowers stand proud and tall on ramrod-stiff stems. Winner at several eastern shows. Limited stock.
- JANICE BABSON** **2W-WWP** **Each...\$5.00**  
 1968 M. 41cm. Cordial x Caro Nome. G-25. Entire flower is snow white except for a band of "baby pink" on the margin of the ruffled cup. Perianth segments are broad and somewhat pointed. One of our favorites.
- JET SET** **1W-Y** **Each...\$5.00**  
 1971 M. 45cm. Effective x Festivity. F-303/1. Selected along with its sister Ivy League by Bill Pannill, and both have proved their worth at shows. Good form and cleaner color than Ivy League, but slower to increase. Garden and show.
- JOLLY ROGER** **2W-Y** **Each...\$2.00**  
 1969 M. 43cm. Wahkeena x Seedling from Bread and Cheese. E-250. Circular, broad perianth opens pure white. Medium length cup of bright rich yellow, ruffled at margin.
- KEN'S FAVORITE** **2W-P** **Each...\$5.00**  
 1978 M. 36cm. Cordial x Caro Nome. L-30/1. Large for a pink, with very broad, flat and white perianth. Sharply tapered cup is short, uniformly colored a beautiful shade of deep rose pink. Ruffle on cup margin causes some perianth segments to catch, resulting in "mitten thumbs", but many qualify for show.
- KEYSTONE** **2Y-W** **Each...\$6.00**  
 1979 M. 35cm. Binkie x (Bethany x Daydream). L-10. Highest contrast in reverse bicolors here. Broad, slightly reflexed perianth is sulfur-lemon; the lightly frilled cup matures very white. Medium height, well posed.
- LIMBERLOST** **3W-YYW** **Each...\$5.00**  
 1969 L. 51cm. Carolina x Lady Kesteven. C-25. Large, tall and snow white with wide, pointed perianth segments. The pale primrose cup usually has three pairs of white stamenoids extending from the margin. Resemble great white moths taking flight when stirred by the breeze. Probably too odd for shows.
- LINGERIE** **4W-Y** **Each...\$7.00**  
 1977 M. 39cm. [Falaise x (Shirley Neale x Chinese White)] x Dawnlight. L-42/2. Bicolored sister of Sun Ball. Outer petals ivory white, inner segments have tiny waves on margins, suggesting lacy petticoats. Holds up well for a double.



- MINIKIN** **3W-GYR** **Each...\$3.00**  
 1970 L. 41 cm. Snowball x Interim. F-310/2. Similar to Minx, a bit smaller with reflexed perianth. Poet-like cup wire-edged red, stands sun fairly well. May lose red edge in hot weather.
- MINX** **3W-GYR** **Each...\$3.00**  
 1969 LM. 41cm. Snowball x Interim. F-310/1. Beautiful poet-type flower with round, flat, glistening white perianth. Small yellow cup edged red. May lose the red edge in adverse conditions.
- MONUMENT** **2Y-Y** **Each...\$3.00**  
 1969 M. 40cm. Festivity x 2W-Y seedling. F-292/1. A huge flower, all yellow, cup a bit deeper than perianth. Flat overlapping segments, good form and vigorous.
- MULTNOMAH** **2Y-YOO** **Each...\$10.00**  
 1971 E. 43cm. Paricutin x Armada. H-31. Rather spectacular large, round, early flower. The great flat cup has a wide band of orange-red, blending to yellow in the center. Makes small bulbs.
- NACRE** **2Y-P** **Each...\$24.00**  
 1986 LM. Salome x [(Binkie x seedling) x Suede]. S-2/1. A smooth, well-overlapping semi-pointed perianth of primrose yellow surrounds the long slightly tapered cup with some fluting near the margin. Color is pale to rich shell pink depending on the season. Well posed on short neck atop a medium height stem.
- NEAHKAHNIE** **1W-W** **Each...\$20.00**  
 1985 M. 38cm. Empress of Ireland x Celilo. O-15. This flower swept the WDS show in the early 80's when exhibited as a seedling. Somewhat like a smaller, whiter and more refined Empress of Ireland. Nice roll on margin of trumpet. Medium height stem holds bloom up well outdoors.
- NEHALEM** **3W-GWY** **Each...\$4.00**  
 1975 M. 45cm. [Carolina x (Rubra x Otranto)] x Marshfire. G-40. Tall and durable, with green-eyed frilly cup. Occasional white flecks on cup margin may spoil it for show.
- NEWCOMER** **3W-P** **Each...\$25.00**  
 1991 EM. 50cm. Quasar x (Mitsch sdlg. x Everpink). W-2/2. Rounded, glistening white perianth segments are smooth with inner segments slightly wavy. The short goblet cup is fluted and slightly ruffled with uniform deep pink color. Limited stock.

- ODIST** 9W-GYR Each...\$10.  
 1985 L. 42cm. [Chinese White x (recurvus x Carolina)] x (Falaise x Foxfire P-29). The largest poet we've seen. Flowers are generally larger than 1 mm. Perianth segments are glistening white, flat, and overlap more than half their length. Tiny cups are light green in the throat, blending primrose yellow with flame-coral-orange margins. Tall, strong and vigorous with excellent pose.
- ONEONTA** 2Y-Y Each...\$4.  
 1968 L. 41cm. Open pollinated Mitsch seedling. Our latest-blooming smooth yellow flower here. Very smooth and vigorous. Perianth and cup medium yellow with greenish highlights.
- PAINTED DOLL** 2W-WPP Each...\$7.  
 1985 L. 36cm. Julep x Pontsianna. O-44. Charming small-to-medium sized flower, our last pink to bloom. Wide, pointed perianth overlaps 2/3 of the length. White, with a hint of green as in Julep. Cup rather straight, somewhat fluting near margin, white to midway, blending to strawberry red to an including the margin. Strong, wiry stem.
- PANTOMIME** 9W-YYR Each...\$7.  
 1978 LM. 26. cm. recurvus x Dallas. N-25/1. Reflexed snow white perianth is much broader than that of its seed parent. Small cup of yellow with bright red rim. Good strong stem. Very short neck, and ideal pose. Should fare well in its class.
- PARFAIT** 4W-P Each...\$3.  
 1975 EM. 43cm. Pink Chiffon x Accent. L-43/3. Not so consistent in form as its sister Replete, but a better seeder with good breeding potential.
- PARKROSE** 2W-P Each...\$10.00; 3/\$25.  
 1987 M. 40cm. Quasar x Arctic Char. V-11/1. Perianth is broad and wide overlapping, whiter than most pinks. Medium length cup of deep reddish pink, serrated at margin.
- PEACE PIPE** 1W-Y Each...\$4  
 1969 M. 41cm. Effective x 1W-YMitsch sdlg. C-173. Smooth bicolor of good quality and balance. "Stovepipe" trumpet has no ruffle or roll. Popular despite its unusual form.
- PEACH PRINCE** 4W-O Each...\$9  
 1985 EM. 40cm. Pink Chiffon x [(Siam x Radiation) x Cordial]. Q-28 favorite double of unusual color and form. Center is more wavy than frill color bright peachy pink-orange which lasts until the flower is well past prime.



- PORTRAIT** 2W-P Each...\$7.00; 3/\$16  
 1983 M. 37cm. Cordial x Caro Nome. L-30/2. Sister of Dewy Rose and Ken's Favorite, this has proved outstanding and dependable, smoother than its sibs. Broad clean white perianth with a solid deep rose pink cup, slightly frilled.
- PROFILE** 2W-Y Each...\$2.00  
 1970 LM. 53cm. Limerick x Broughshane. B-110. This skyscraper stands up in most Oregon weather. Not really distinct; resembles Polindra, and opens when others of this type are past their prime.
- PROPRIETY** 2W-P\* Each...\$2.00  
 1970 M. 36cm. Rose of Tralee x Interim. B117/1. Large for its type with good show form. Smooth perianth, and in favorable seasons the long cup colors a rich salmon pink.
- PROTEGE** 2Y-Y Each...\$4.00  
 1969 M. (Trousseau x Pink O' Dawn) x (Tunis x Trousseau). F-297. Smooth flower of buff primrose yellow. Ideal form and proportions. Makes large firm, short-necked bulbs.
- PYRITE** 2W-GYY Each...\$4.00  
 1977 L. 41cm. Artist's Model x Marshfire. I-19. This late flower may be more consistent in other locales. Sometimes during cold, wet spells it doesn't open properly; spectacular when it does. Very large, round ivory white perianth, inner segments slightly wavy. The short, somewhat frilled cup has a deep green eye.
- QUASAR** 2W-PPR Each...\$15.00  
 1977 M. 34cm. Cordial x Precedent. M-49. Similar to Cool Flame with deep color. Broad, flat and rounded perianth segments with heavy substance. Medium length cup with some taper is lighter in the throat, shading to a deep rosy-red outward.
- RAIN DANCE** 2W-W Each...\$6.00  
 1986 EM. 40cm. Celilo x Arctic Doric. N-35. Fairly large flower with flat overlapping perianth, very white. Tapered cup with some flare and frill at the margin. Bloom posed at 90 degrees to the tall strong stem. For garden or show.
- RAPPORT** 2Y-WWY Each...\$5.00  
 1985 M. 44cm. Binkie x Limeade. J-5/1. Perianth is sulfur yellow, broad flat and semi-pointed. Long off-white cup is fluted from midway to rim retaining a not sharply-defined yellow margin. Bloom posed at about 45 degrees. Durable, good for garden or show.

- ◆ **RED FOX** 3Y-O Each...\$2.00  
1973 LM. 43cm. Hades x Paricutin. H-64. Rounded perianth of canary yellow, small cup of brilliant orange red. Not sunproof.
- **ROSE CITY** 2W-P Each...\$3.00  
1969 M. 41cm. Interim x Radiation. Somewhat like Irish Rose, larger and taller. Very white with cup near to true pink.
- ◆ **SATSUMA** 1Y-Y Each...\$5.00  
1975 M. 45cm. Daydream x New Era. K-39/1. Sister of Epitome. Large, tall, and smooth with well-overlapping perianth. Instead of fading to white, the trumpet turns peachy-buff with age.
- **SAUCY** 2W-P Each...\$6.00  
1974 M. 41cm. (Wild Rose x Rosegarland) x Interim. F-286. Medium sized and noted for form rather than color. With backswept perianth, it consistently gives a high percentage of perfect blooms. The half-length tapered cup is pale to fairly rich pink, depending on the season.
- **SERAPE** 3Y-YYO Each...\$5.00; 3/\$10.00  
1977 M. 36cm. Aircastle x Showboat. M-55. Looks much like Aircastle with an orange-red rimmed cup. Unlike Aircastle, it opens soft canary yellow and remains the same color throughout its life. Very smooth and round. Bloom nicely posed. Makes small bulbs.
- **SHADOW** 2W-GWW Each...\$22.00  
1977 M. 43cm. Desdemona x Knockbane N-72. Of classic form, very smooth and white, with wide, pointed perianth segments. Emerald green shading in throat and base of cup. Slow to increase and scarce.
- **SHERBET** 2W-P Each...\$15.00  
1987 LM. 45cm. Quasar x Arctic Char. V-11/2. Sister of Parkrose, later and not quite as white. Broad, slightly pointed perianth segments overlap two-thirds of their length. Medium length cup is a deep salmon pink, becoming lighter toward the base.
- **SHORTCAKE** 2W-P Each...\$10.00  
1983 M. 46cm. Rose City x Chiquita. Q-19/1. Tall for a pink, with form somewhat like Chloe. As the name implies, the long goblet shaped cup is almost strawberry colored here. Will be paler in less favorable climates.
- **SHOWBOAT** 2W-YYO Each...\$5.00  
1970 M. 36cm. Bithynia x (Seraglio x Gracious). F-296/1. Striking large flower with broad smooth white perianth. Saucer-shaped flat cup of yellow, rimmed with a distinctive band of bright salmon-red.

- SHRINER** 2W-Y Each...\$3.00  
 1972 E. 42cm. Wahkeena x (Content x Flora's Favorite). G-16/1. Probably better for a garden flower, though some may be smooth enough for show. Perianth is nicely reflexed and the pale yellow cup fades to almost white with age. Prolific, durable, and nicely posed on stiff stems.
- SILVER THAW** 3W-W Each...\$8.00  
 1978 M. 43cm. (Duke of Windsor x Green Island) x White O'Morn. K-37. Looks somewhat like a pure white Green Island with smaller, flatter cup. Tall, smooth garden or show flower with good pose and neck.
- SKOOKUM** 3Y-Y Each...\$4.00  
 1976 L. 50cm. Green Island x Actaea. I-12. Nice tall all yellow, small cupped flower with round flat perianth. The short, fluted cup remains deep primrose as the perianth lightens some with age.
- SNOW PINK** 2W-P Each...\$3.00  
 1972 LM. 40cm. Shirley Wyness x (Interim x Mitsch pink seedling). F-277/2. Sister of Vantage, and name aptly describes colors: very white and very pink. Not large, about 90 mm diameter, it is graceful and colorful.
- SOUBRETTE** 2W-Y Each...\$4.00  
 1974 M. 41cm. Blarney x (Siam x Green Island). H-30. Perianth clean white and round. The 17 mm cup is butter yellow with some flare. Good pose, and nice for garden or show.
- SPACE AGE** 2Y-Y Each...\$2.00

# Revised Classification of Daffodils 1998

1. The classification of a daffodil cultivar shall be that which was submitted by the person registering the cultivar, or shall be based on the description and measurements submitted by such person.
2. The classification shall consist of a division number and a color code.
3. The numbered divisions in which a daffodil cultivar may be placed are defined below
4. Measurements taken in determining between divisions 1, 2, and 3 will be those of the flower maturity. The length of the perianth segments is the measurement from the tip of one segment when flattened out to the base of the corona. The length of the corona is the measurement from the base of the perianth segments to the furthest margin of the corona.
5. (a) The colors and equivalent code letters that may be used to describe a daffodil cultivar will be those of the flower at maturity: W-white or whitish; G-green; Y-yellow; P-pink; O-orange; R-red.  
(b) The color code shall consist of two letters, or two groups of letters, separated by a hyphen; the letter(s) following the hyphen shall describe the corona ("trumpet" or "cup").  
(c) For purposes of description, the perianth segments shall be divided into three zones - outer zone, mid-zone, and base; and the corona into three zones - eye zone, mid-zone, and rim.  
(d) If the perianth segments are substantially of a single color, a single code letter shall describe them; if they are of more than one color, either two or three code letters shall be used, describing the outer zone before the mid-zone and/or base.  
*Note:* If a cultivar is registered with more than one color in the perianth segments, the major area of color shall determine the class in which it may be shown. For example, although they have white in the perianth, cultivars registered 2Y YW-W may be shown in a class requiring those which are 2Y-W.  
(e) If the corona is substantially of a single color, a single code letter shall describe it; if it is of more than one color, three code letters shall be used, describing the eye zone before the mid-zone and rim.  
*Note:* The code letters do not indicate the width of the zones, and the registration of three colors in the corona has no bearing on whether one color is "predominant".  
(f) In double daffodils the code letter(s) before the hyphen shall describe not only the perianth segments but also any extra perianth segments (being of the same color), even if they are interspersed with the corona at the center of the flower; the code letter(s) following the hyphen shall describe the corona or segments of the corona. Multiple letters before or after the hyphen shall in doubles as in all other daffodils indicate that there is more than one color from outer zone to base of the perianth segments or from eye zone to rim of the corona or the segments of the corona.  
*Note:* If a double daffodil is registered with more than one color in the segments of the corona, the major area of color shall determine the class in which it may be shown. For example, although they have yellow in the corona segments, cultivars registered 4Y-YOR may be shown in a class requiring those which are 4Y-O or 4Y-R.

## DIVISION 1: TRUMPET DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One flower to a stem; corona ("trumpet") as long or longer than the perianth segments ("petals").

## DIVISION 2: LARGE-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments ("petals").

## DIVISION 3: SMALL-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One flower to a stem; corona ("cup") not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments ("petals").

## DIVISION 4: DOUBLE DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or corona or both.

## DIVISION 5: TRIANDRUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of *N. triandrus* clearly evident; usually two or more pendant flowers to a stem. Perianth segments reflexed.

## DIVISION 6: CYCLAMINEUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of *N. cyclamineus* clearly evident; one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short pedicel ("neck").

## DIVISION 7: JONQUILLA AND APODANTHUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of Sections Jonquilla and Apodanthi clearly evident; one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; flowers usually fragrant.

## DIVISION 8: TAZETTA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of Section Tazettae clearly evident; usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading, not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant.

## DIVISION 9: POETICUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of the *N. poeticus* group; usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona very short or disc-shaped, usually with a green and/or yellow center and a red rim, but sometimes of a single color; flowers usually fragrant.

## DIVISION 10: BULBOCODIUM DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Characteristics of Section Bulbocodium clearly evident; usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona; anthers dorsifixed (i.e., attached more or less centrally to the filament); filament and style usually curved.

## DIVISION 11: SPLIT-CORONA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Corona split - usually for more than half its length

- a) Collar Daffodils  
Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in two whorls of three.
- b) Papillon Daffodils  
Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in a single whorl of six.

## DIVISION 12: OTHER DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

Daffodil cultivars which do not fit the definition of any other division.

## DIVISION 13: DAFFODILS DISTINGUISHED SOLELY BY BOTANICAL NAME
