### **BETTY SMITH**

Stevenson, Maryland Known to us as "Aunt Betty" she was a Life Member of the ADS, joining in 1967. She went to her first daffodil show in the early 1950's

and attended the meetings at the formation of the ADS. She served as our Regional Vice President in the Mid Atlantic Region and was and ADS accredited judge. She was also a Garden Club of America judge and was a member of the Greenspring Valley Garden Club, MD

The family gathered early this July to memorialize her life. Her niece. Anne Donnell Smith, said she lived a complete life. She became a Wave in WWII and was one of the first female officers in the Navy. After the war she became a high school teacher but also found time to tutor the less fortunate. Her interest in gardening was sparked from a family trip to the Swiss alpine tundra where the vast array of blooms fascinated her. She returned and started growing all sorts of plants from seed. But daffodils were always a main interest and she had a group of friends that she traveled up and down the east coast attending shows. Later in the 1980's she was the companion of Anne Donnell to go to the daffodil shows and enter flowers and judge. This picture of her was at one of the last shows she judged at Longwood Gardens in 2008. She judged the full portion of the show assigned which shows her determination and the tenacity of a well lived life.

Queen of Historics By Ceci Brown Elizabeth Clopton Brown is known at the Virginia daffodil shows as their resident Queen of Historics. She was born at home on

October 24, 1918, in a rural area of Gloucester County known as Clopton. Elizabeth remembers her mother's beautiful cut flower bed which had many narcissus including 'Twin Sisters'. Elizabeth's passion for daffodils began in 1953 when she joined the Garden Club of Gloucester (GCG) and ordered her first Garden Club of Virginia (GCV) daffodil collection. She entered all five stems at the GCV show and received five blues. She was hooked. Since that time she has shown yearly including at the former Tidewater Daffodil Society Show (Newport News), VDS Show (Richmond), NC Show (Barco), WDS Show, and Upperville Show. In 1976 she became an ADS judge. She also brought daffodils to these Conventions: 1976 Williamsburg, 1998 Richmond, 2004 Washington DC and 2007 Richmond convention where she won best historic with 'Daphne' from one of her early GCV collections.

Now at 93, her favorite daffodils are the first daffodils she planted which are now classified as historic and she regularly wins the historic collections at local shows. A few of her favorite historics are 'Daphne', 'Beryl', 'Kansas' 'Little Witch' and 'Rubra'. She still plans to exhibit her sentimental historics as long her health allows. She is looking forward to the Baltimore Convention in 2012.


