Dear Daffodil Friends,

2013 WDS "early" Daffodil Show postponed to April 2014 - Here's why:

As many of you know, we have had a great deal of difficulty with the planning of the 2013 daffodil show. Early on, we knew that the dates of our show conflicted with the national ADS convention and that many of our most dedicated members have positions with the ADS and would not show here or participate. After considerable discussion we decided that we would stage the show realizing that the participation would be significantly reduced.

Later Brookside Gardens told us that they had "double booked" the adult classroom and adult workroom and they could not honor our reservation for those spaces. We could use only the atrium and auditorium. That space could work for the display of blooms, but would not for support activities such as receptions, luncheons, properties, etc.

When we started using Brookside Gardens, we staged flowers in the auditorium, children's workroom, children's classroom, and the adult classroom. Several years ago we were told that the children's workroom and classroom were no longer available and we tightened our belt and used less desirable space for the judges lunch, judges reception, photo competition, and artistic arrangements. We worked together very well and overcome most of the important space limitations.

When we were told that two more rooms would not be available--rooms that we used for staging exhibits and storing test tubes, blocks, boxwood and other supplies, it was as if we were denied about half of the space we needed. The show chair and others began considering other places such as shopping malls, nurseries, and alternative locations including several churches (after many members were impressed with the place we held the Fall meeting). But nothing worked out. They were already booked, too small, in a bad location, not available on weekends. or too expensive.

Absent any viable alternative to a show at Brookside Gardens we had only 2 options: (1) have a scaled down show at Brookside Gardens or (2) cancel the early show and only have a late show. The Board voted to cancel the early show.

Many of us believe that Brookside is a great place to have a show. It is a beautiful place, they always have visitors coming through to see our blooms and we can enjoy their gardens too. We have already made application for Brookside Gardens in 2014 and are looking forward to another great show there if we don't find something more suitable. In the meantime, plan on participating with the WDS Late Show Saturday April 27, 2013 at the Walker Nature Center in Reston and with the many other fine daffodil shows in our area and around the country.

I have assumed that the persons who served so well last year for Glenna on committees and appointments will continue to serve this this year and do not intend to make any new appointments. It seems to me people are doing things that are comfortable to them. Please let me know if this is not the case.

Who knows what the rest of Winter has in store for us, but we are looking forward to Spring, so come celebrate its arrival with the WDS at our Spring Luncheon. Soon the 2013 Bulb Order will be out to fuel your Daffodil Fever and we will be hectically running around to daffodil shows in April.

It is difficult for us to invite judges in advance, because it is impossible to judge the size of a show this late in the bloom season. So just because you didn't get an invitation, don't let that stand in your way of planning to come, even if you don't have flowers. We need you.

Lunch will be provided at 12 Noon for all who exhibit, judge, clerk, and clean up followed by Judging. The show will be open to the public 1 pm to 5 pm followed by clean up. If you've never been to this show before, you've been missing out on a really fun daffodil day. Mark you calendar and make this the year you join in the camaraderie and the last hoorah for daffodils in 2013.

With the holidays over we immediately begin to check our gardens and daffodil beds for the first signs of green tips and begin to dream of our season to come. Warmer seasonal temperatures have already provided a few with early blooms and then we wonder just what the future season will have in store for us all.

Due to unfortunate circumstances, our WDS early show has been cancelled. There was double booking at Brookside Garden site for part of our show space which we were not aware of until the end of October. By the time we contacted several alternate possible locations they were already booked for the 2013 season. The ADS Daffodil Convention is being held in Columbus, Ohio the same weekend as our show was originally planned so I do encourage you to take advantage of a 'free' show date weekend, attend the convention, see many blooms from across the country you may not have seen before and also meet many of those daffodil enthusiasts we read about in our Journal and on Daffnet. Take your blooms and perhaps you will be among the top winners of the convention show.

We do live in a very special area – Mid Atlantic Region – for growing daffodils of all divisions. We have a wide range of blooming season, and also have some **TEN shows** offered that are within our travel distance starting with the

If you remember last year the season was early and several of our WDS members loaded their cars with blooms and attended the Barco, NC show. This turned out to be a very timely show as many gardens were almost 'bloomed out' by the time the ADS convention was held in MD - which would have normally been our main blooming season. We will have the regular WDS show next year in April 2014. 

# Keeping Your Blooms for the Late Show

With a little planning, you can refrigerate your blooms for up to 10 days to keep them fresh for the Late Show. After cutting the bloom, groom it as you would for show, place in a container with water and put in the refrigerator. If your fridge is self-defrosting, you will need to spray the bloom with water daily to keep it from drying out. If you have an older non-frost free fridge, you won't need to spray the blooms since the moisture will not be evaporated. Contact the editor if you have questions, wbill@bellatlantic.net

# US National Arboretum Daffodil Collection -- November 2012


Cool weather brought gorgeous color to the plantings at the National Arboretum last week setting ablaze beautiful fall trees and shrubs illuminated with backlit glowing tones. A further advantage was taking time to visit Lynn Batsdorf, curator of the Daffodil Collection, gain an update of progress in the Collection and assess how our National Arboretum changed from the crisis mode of two years ago. Not only a glorious afternoon — it presented a positive outlook for the future.

An energized Lynn beamed as he showed off his carefully stacked trays of cultivars awaiting planting this week with gardeners already assigned to work with him. He was most pleased with many notes of thanks received from Regional ADS Representatives and from Caroline Thompson, now developing the Backhouse Heritage Museum Collection, all thanking him for sending spare bulbs. Lynn carefully documented the cultivars sent to the various ADS Regions and is delighted that these cultivars now grow again in a variety of ADS Zones and at the Backhouse Museum in Great Britain.

We went into the bowels of Head House #1 to see the carefully stored bulbs. You may remember the first series of daffodil bulbs dug since the Collection was moved from Fern Valley in  $\pm$  2000 were lost two years ago in this same place—then rediscovered and fortunately replanted. The Collection was threatened at the time by a series of unfortunate Management mis-steps. Now, under the new leadership of Dr. Colien Hefferan, how comforting to hear from Lynn that her positive leadership greatly changed the tone and atmosphere for all who work there. Renewed efforts restore the USNA in the gardening public's mind and in fact, as an important responsible place of horticultural leadership. Certainly, this showed in Lynn's excitement digging, sorting, organizing and distributing unique Daffodil Cultivars. What a very positive visit on a beautiful fall day.

Next steps for continuing to build the USNA National Daffodil Collection into a superior display garden involve:

- continuing analysis of the existing cultivars,
- improving and updating the public labels,
- distributing extra bulbs to spread and save Germplasm,
- continuing lifting and replanting,



- continuing to upgrade the ADS Wister Collection begun there by the Washington Daffodil Society.
- develop a means to add updated cultivars to the display.

This last item requires more thought and the inclusion of a funding means to develop a complete modern collection. Goals for the administration and maintenance of the collection are met in the short term. Continued interest and review need address establishing a recognized process for continual upgrading of the collection as an important horticultural resource in the United States. My hope would accomplish this by the World Convention in 2016.

WDS Members we solicit your help to review the USNA Daffodil Collection next spring. We need folks to plan an outing to the Arboretum and view the daffodils noting the bloom, how you'd assess them, the health of the clump etc. It would also be of interest to know which missing cultivars you want to see. We're continually trying to give information and guidance to the USNA to improve the planting.(contact: Robert Darling at darling@aol.com)

#### 2012 WDS Fall Meeting Minutes

President Glenna Graves called the Fall meeting of the Washington Daffodil Society to order at 10:20 am on October 20, 2012 at Langley Hall of Trinity United Methodist Church in Mclean VA.

Glenna thanked Tom Taylor, Mary Anne Barton, Babs McClendon, Suzi Worsham, Ruth Ann McGrail, Susan Kroner and Mary Swegler for volunteering at Merrifield Garden Centers, some more than once, to fulfill our commitment for use of a storage unit for our properties.

The minutes of the June16, 2012 Summer meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report-Tricia Goins reported that CD account contained \$10,018.00, Checking account \$17,133.16. Total assets \$27.151.16.

Bulb Order- Glenna reported that there were 98 orders this year, down from 2011. She thanked Bob Huseman, Amelia Abrams, Martha Best for assisting her labeling bulbs for the order. Mary Koonce was thanked for her hard work in putting together the bulb order. Membership- Kathy Welsh, longtime membership chairman, has resigned. Tricia Goins will take over receiving dues and new memberships. No new directory will be printed at this time.

Locations and various suggestions were discussed for the Spring WDS meeting tentatively scheduled for February 23, 2013 with March 2, 2013 as snow date. It was voted that we return to Trinity United Methodist Church and have a similar lunch menu as 2012. Donna Clausen will co-ordinate this event.

WDS 2013 Show- Glenna reports that Tom Taylor, Steve Morrison and Robert Darling will set up the photography exhibit at the show. Glenna has purchased some plastic crates to replace some of the aging containers for WDS show properties.

No new artistic design chairmen have been found for the 2013 WDS Daffodil Show as yet. Various points of view were discussed. May need to postpone this section for one year. Mary Anne Barton made several suggestions, and reminded the Board that Artistic judges depended on our show as one of the venues to renew their judging credentials. It was remarked by several persons that the artistic arrangements were one of the big draws for the public to come view our show.

Glenna reminded us that there are many shows in which to exhibit in the Washington Baltimore area. ADS Show is the same weekend as the WDS Show in Columbus Ohio and many of our members will be attending that show. Some board members were concerned our exhibit numbers may be down because of the conflict. The WDS Late Show is April 27, 2013.

Glenna stated that the Waltrous Bowl, presented to the WDS by Katherine Beal ,should be placed in a plexi- glass container for safety when exhibited at our shows. She will look into this.

Holly Ruffin suggested that the WDS needs new signs and section numbers for the Daffodil Show exhibit. The Board asked her to develop a new design. Also Martha Best, Amelia Abrams and Susan Kroner will look into new way to display exhibitor numbers so that recorders will have an easier time recording the results at the end of the judging.

Newsletter- Mary Anne Barton, editor, states she still mails 73 newsletters. She thanked all members who are willing to receive theirs via e-mail. Mary Anne, Tom Taylor and Tricia Goins will review labels, membership issues, and newsletter mailings.

Nominating Committee- Glenna announced the slate of officers and board members in the absence of chairman Lucy Rhame.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:10.


