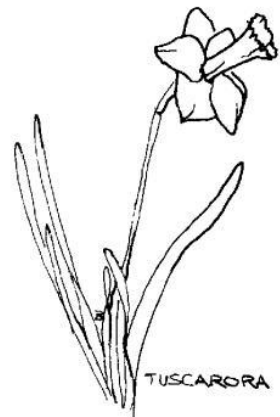

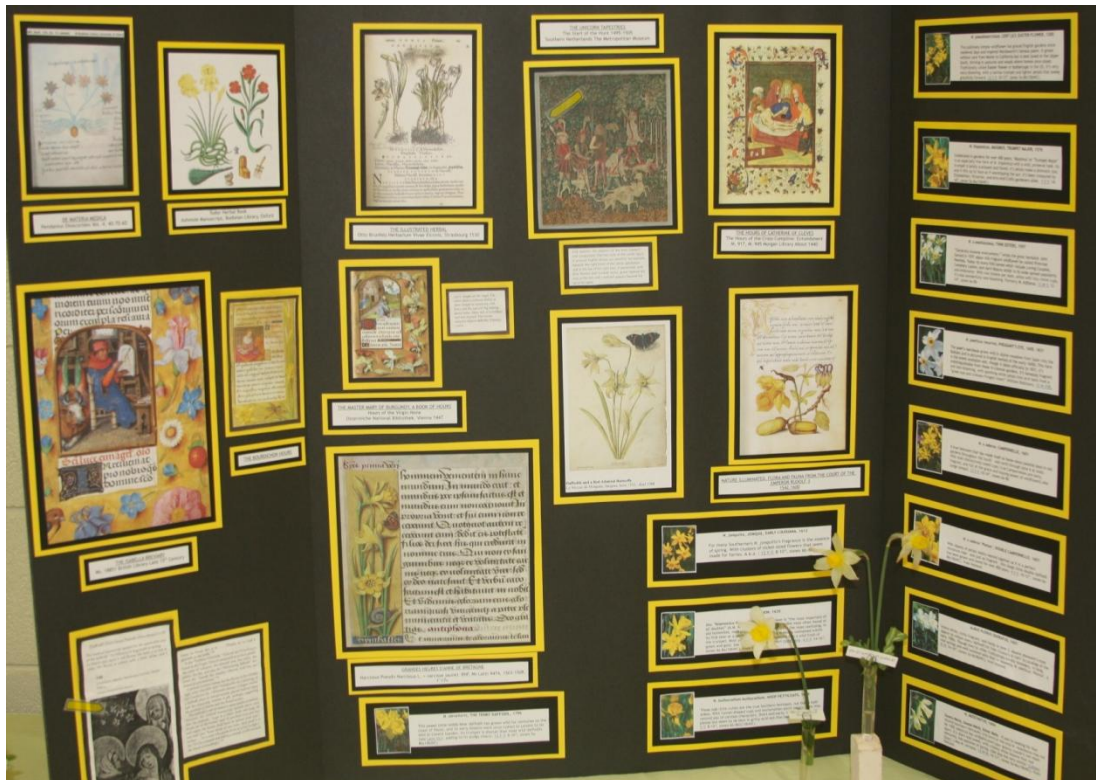
Silver Ribbon: Most Blue Ribbons in Show
