A Middle-of-the-Packer Takes Her Daffodils on the Road

Imagine my excitement when and my husband qualified for the Boston Marathon in April 2015. Imagine my dismay when I realized that "Boston" was the same day as the Maryland Daffodil Society show! We daffodil lovers have one point in the year to show the blooms that we've been thinking about all year – and Jim's achieving his lifelong dream meant that I would miss our show.

I grabbed a calendar, looking for a show where I could enter my daffodils. District II's show in Severna Park looked good. Scheduled for the single-digit days of April, it's a little early for Towson-grown daffodils, but I'd have something. I always like to enter a Division 6 collection. In March I emailed to ask for an electronic copy of the schedule – and found that the show had been canceled! Back to the calendar.

The Chambersburg Garden Club and Tuscarora Daffodil Group's show had entries on Saturday, April 25, and was in Chambersburg, PA. I thought Chambersburg was near Gettysburg, about an hour and fifteen minutes away. That sounded reasonable. I could drive an hour and fifteen minutes to enter my daffodils.

Well, it was 105 miles and an hour and 45 minutes. I woke up at 5 am, collected my daffodils and staging equipment, and started driving. I passed Whitetail ski resort and Mercersburg Academy, and arrived at First Lutheran Church on Washington St. The show was lovely and the people so welcoming. I raced through the decisions of what to put in what collection, the clipping of boxwood, and the filling out of entry cards, as usual. I chatted with fellow exhibitors, the show chairs, and judges. There were some heavy hitters! I snacked. The garden club cochair invited me to join them for the judges' breakfast, because I had come such a long way.

I entered a collection of five Division 2s and the collection of Daffodils of American Breeding, and as many single blooms as I could muster by 9:30 a.m. I told everyone how much fun I had had, and headed back to Baltimore.

The happy ending is that I won Best Standard White Daffodil in Show for the Colonial White in my R-W-B Collection! The award was a beautiful bone china cup and saucer - in the flower of the month for March, the daffodil! Immediate gratification! I also won a blue (Pink China for Intermediate single stem), some reds (including the Div. 2 collection), some yellows, and an honorable mention.

What an exciting day! I had told my husband earlier that I was glad I had made the trip because it was a nice show and I had seen or met so many friendly people. Now I was extra glad I had made the drive!
