The 42nd Annual Daffodil Day in Bell Buckle, March 16, will include activities ranging from a barbecue cookoff to book signings.

The event, sponsored by Bell Buckle Chamber of Commerce and Bell Buckle Tree Board, will also include the traditional Daffodil Flower Show as well as seminars on beekeeping, gardening and native plants, and Bell Buckle's annual recognition as a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation.

# Long-term effect

The town's association with daffodils goes back many decades, with the story being that Webb School founder Sawney Webb had the school's students plant daffodils along the roads leading into town.

The "Battle of the Butts" barbecue cookoff will include both panel and "people's choice" judging, and the public will be able to buy tasting kits for \$5.

The book signing will include John T. Wayne, Cabot Barden and Lathan Hudson. Wayne was born Terry Wayne Hammock, but changed his name in 2012 after learning he was the grandson of legendary movie actor John Wayne. John T. Wayne writes the "Gaslight Boys" series of books, about Civil War orphans who become cowboys. Barden is a signer-songwriter who has nine novels to his credit, and Hudson is a Grammy-nominated songwriter who began writing books after retiring to Florida.

## Free tree seeds

There will be a tree seedling giveaway, with Red Oak, Redbud, and Flowering Dogwood seedlings given out while supplies last. A free plant and seed exchange will be held, music will be performed by the Horse Mountain Strings, and a big-screen TV will be tuned to the SEC basketball tournament.

Bell Buckle has had Tree City USA status for a number of years, and takes pride in being the smallest town in Tennessee to hold that designation. In addition to the Tree City USA recertification, the town will also honor the most notable tree of the year, and present its Citizen of the Year award.
