INTRODUCTION

Ballydorn shared in the Joint Exhibit at the main RHS spring show on 11/12th April 2000 which was awarded a Silver Gilt medal in the Flora Range after Nial and Hilary Watson returned from the World Daffodil Convention, hosted by the ADS, in Portland Oregon a week before.

We hope, in spite of poor planting weather last autumn, to have an early crop of flowers as growth is well advanced and remarkably strong after so much heavy rain and frost.

We have two new Ballydorn things named this year, N. Kiltarn and N. Silver Sabre after a good show and grower reports on performance elsewhere. We hope to have quite a few more in the next few years particularly when some promising seedlings from Ringhaddy Daffodils have multiplied.

We have again made a £ Sterling/US\$ forecast of \$1.50 to £1.00 but will as usual make good any shortfall in added bulb value for customers paying in advance.

Payment must be by cheque or Postal Money Order payable in London in £ Sterling or US\$ as Saving Bank cheques are not negotiable and cannot be cleared.

It will be noted that Ringhaddy Daffodils who have taken over the staging, exhibiting and growing of the Ballydorn flowers and bulbs for the past few years have now taken the lead in producing this catalogue and all the cultivars listed therein.

ARRANGEMENT OF LIST, AND CODING SYSTEM

The list has been arranged in alphabetical order with the Division and Classification of each cultivar shown in the margin. The classification is in accordance with the Revised System adopted by the R. H. S. Colours are abbreviated as follows:

w - white or whitish; g - green; y - yellow; p - pink; o - orange; r - red.

For the purpose of description, the daffodil flower is divided into perianth, and corona. The perianth is described by the first letter following the number of the Division to which the cultivar belongs.

The corona is treated as having three zones: An eye zone, a mid-zone and an edge or rim. The description of the corona is separated from the description of the perianth by hyphen and the letter then following the hyphen describes the corona colour starting with the eye zone. If however the corona is of a single colour, only a single letter of the colour code is used to describe it.
