

2023 ADS Convention and Show Atlanta, GA March 9-12, 2023

Recent ADS Region Changes

The Southeast Region of the ADS consists of Georgia, Florida, South Carolina, Tennessee east of Tennessee River, and Alabama. As of the Spring 2022 Annual Meeting at the Gettysburg Convention, Alabama is now a part of the Southeast Region! That is only one of the changes made. Here is a brief summary of all the changes and how they came about:

The following Motion was approved by the ADS Board of Directors at the **Fall Board Meeting 2020** and was subsequently approved by all affected Regions by a majority favorable vote of those responding to the ballot.

Motion 1, Presented by Ad Hoc Regional Realignment/Restructuring Study (RRRS) Committee, Jaydee Ager Chair

RESOLVED: That the State of Alabama be moved from the Southern Region to the Southeast Region;

the present Pacific Region be renamed the Western Region;

the state of New York be moved from the Northeast Region to the present New England Region;

the present New England Region be renamed the North Atlantic Region.
Upon approval of the ADS Board of Directors, all above changes would be voted on by the affected regional members responding to a ballot question per Article VIII, Section 2 of the ADS Bylaws.

Aforementioned changes would become effective congruent with the Annual Meeting of the American Daffodil Society in Spring 2022.




