



#### Speakers, Seminars, A Day at Brent and Becky's


On Saturday night Carlos Van der Veek from Holland and Brent Heath will share the history of Carlos' father, Karel J. van der Veek, his daffodil breeding work and his contributions to the daffodil world. In the 1980's Carlos became a bulb exporter and today Carlos' company Fluvel supplies millions of bulbs to Brent and Becky's Bulbs



and other mail order businesses and through Fluvel's own bulb web shop.

Sunday will be a very full day spent at Brent and Becky's Bulbs including a visit to Brent and Becky Heath's gardens! Walking tours will be available to the composting facility, warehouse, greenhouse and Bulb Shoppe. Seminar topics are "A Bill Pannill Retrospective," "100 Years of Daffodils." "What's Different about Brent and Becky's Bulbs," and "The New Bulb Planter Machine Demonstration."

Felder Rushing is our dinner speaker for Sunday evening. He is the weekly online Q&A blogger for HGTV.com and hosts a popular weekly call-in garden program on NPR affiliate stations called The Gestalt Gardener. Felder has grown daffodils all his life, from his childhood spent helping his great-grandmother sort hers. His philosophy is Slow Gardening and according to Felder, Slow Gardening is about passion. Attention to detail. Savoring everything, every season, using all your senses. Felder will use down-home anecdotes and observations on ways we can better appreciate the amazing thing we call gardening.
