

Over the past 90 odd years, and through 5 generations, the Broadfield/Glover family has been growing and breeding daffodils in Tasmania. At first the interest was kindled in the small country town of Wilmot on the North West Coast, where granny Connell grew Narcissus during the late 1800's, showing them at the local church flower show. Her daughter, later to become Mrs. Claude Glover Sen., also took interest and was showing blooms in Wilmot, Sheffield and surrounding areas from the early 1900's until the late 1950's, when her son, Ross Glover was also showing. Ross grew his first bulbs in a small plot at his Wilmot home in 1948. Ross was greatly encouraged by his mother and the late Mr. Henry Mott, to begin to cross pollinate (she always said she was too old to begin) and soon he had seedlings on the way. Ross & Ida moved to Ulverstone in September, 1955, bringing his bulbs 'in the green' with him. His first seedlings appeared on the show bench in 1958. He obviously discovered quickly that this was the most challenging section in the show and consequently went on to win the class for the "Best Seedling" at the Ulverstone Daffodil Show for 5 out of the following 6 years. Ever since, through rigorous and very selective breeding, he has regularly taken out this award at the coastal shows.

Ross encouraged his Son-In-Law, Don Broadfield to grow and breed daffodils, and by the early 1960's, his blooms too were appearing regularly on the showbench. As family tradition goes, at the tender age of seven, I made my first crosses and have been showing ever since.

In 1980, Ross joined forces with my father - Don & myself under the title of "BROADFIELD'S DAFFODILS", which has been marketing Glover/Broadfield stock ever since. Among Ross's major hybridising success stories are such cultivars as 'Craig' 1 y-y (Reg. R.H.S. 1972) which has to date won 11 Grand Champions; 'Flash Affair' 2 w-y (Reg. R.H.S. 1973) which is still reputed to be the best of it's class in the world; 'Merry Princess' 2 w-w (Reg. T.D.C. 1977) is the ONLY Tasmanian raised daffodil to appear in the American Journal listing of winners over the past 10 years for winning 4 major awards.

Both Ross, and his wife Ida passed away in 1988. Their deaths came as a great loss to the daffodil fraternity, but their names live on with the many hundreds of cultivars Ross has raised.



The year 1989 has once again been a most successful year for Broadfield's Daffodils on the showbench - taking out numerous awards in most sections.

A consistent flower of even colour and excellent form and substance. Attractive narrow trumpet. Ch. Sheffield, 1985, 1988 - First 1y-y Whitmore

Smooth, flat perianth with a well proportioned cup with light frill. Winner of countless awards including Aust. Ch. 1986, Ch. Ulverstone, 1986. A must for any hybridist.

An excellent show flower with a beautifully formed overlapping perianth and well proportioned trumpet with a serrated rim.

Excellent form, colour, substance and texture. Pure yellow, overlapping perianth segments.

Another fine flower from these parents. Large flower with excellent colour and form. Good meaty substance with good carriage. A well balanced flower in all respects.

GOOD OH (Dream Prince x Warbin) R.H.Glover (Reg. T.D.C. 1983)

As the name may suggest, this flower is a top quality show-bench bloom. Features a fairly narrow trumpet and a well overlapping perianth. Best 1y-y Sheffield 1987.

ALMA FRENCH (Abebe x Lady Slim) R.H.Glover (Previously listed as 'ALMA')

A fine show bloom of large proportions. Opens with a lemon cup which soon fades out to the purest of whites. Early to mid season.

BELLMONT GLORY 1 w-w (Abebe x Castle of Mey) R.H.Glover.

An excellent show flower of fine rounded form. Large overlapping perianth segments with a well proportioned, slightly flaring trumpet. Opens with a lemon trumpet which soon fades to white.

HERALDING (Glenshesk x Gwyn) R.H.Glover (Reg. R.H.S. 1975)
Pure white, flat, perianth. Opens lemon, but soon fades. Well proportioned large cup with wide flare and slight frill. Ch. Aust. Daffodil 1980. Very consistent show flower and excellent parent. Best 1w-w Launceston, 1984; 1988 - In winning 3 1's, Ulverstone. 10.00

LADY RHANA (Rhana x Lady Slim) R.H.Glover
Beautiful smooth, flat perianth, pure white and of very good substance. Excellent show flower. REMOVED FROM SALE FOR INCREASE

MERCEDES (Kapital x 54/52 / Tranquil) Jackson
Very large, pure white, flat perianth with shovel-shaped, overlapping minor petals. Well balanced, slightly serrated trumpet. Has won many awards and has been used extensively for breeding. REMOVED FROM SALE FOR INCREASE

BI-COLOUR TRUMPETS

ARTIFICIAL (Karamudli x Riverdale/Renown) R.H.Glover
An excellent trumpet with smooth overlapping white perianth. Pale yellow cup of good proportion. 1988 - In winning entry 3 x 1's, Ulversone 10.00

BETRIN 12/64 (Ammon x Rowella) Jackson
Smooth white perianth of good quality & substance with slightly pointed overlapping minor petals. The well proportioned trumpet is of a dark lemon colour, slightly flanged and serrated at the rim. Has won many champion awards. 4.50

LADY DOROTHY Broadfield's
Large smooth flower of pure white perianth and deep yellow/orange trumpet. Mid season flowering. In winning 3 dist. Sd1's. Westbury 1987. 15.00

PONTES (Jackson)
A true bi-colour trumpet with a well shapen, pure white perianth and a bold golden yellow trumpet. A very consistant Show flower. 1988 - Ch. 1w-y Ulverstone; 1st 1w-y, Whitmore; in winning entry 3 x 1's, Ulverstone. REMOVED FROM SALE.

LARGE CUPS - PINK

AARE (Vanessa x Dear Me) R.H.Glover (wrongly named RAAD - 1988 shows)
A large flower of the most unusual shade of pink/orange. Flared cup in good proportion with the perianth. Perianth slightly pointed. 8.50

ARGYLE (Vanessa x Sprightly) R.H.Glover.
A very attractive slightly pointed flower with clear white perianth segments that touch. The cup opens a yellowish pink, but soon matures with a rich pink finish. 10.00

LARGE CUPS - PINK 2wp continued

DEAR ME (Nina x Keera/Bon Rose) T.H. Piper.
Although a smallish flower, this old favourite still has a place on the show bench. Its intense pink cup is it's main feature. Slightly pointed perianth segments. A very good pink for any breeding programme 5.00

DOT B. (Pink Special x Vixen) R.H.Glover.
A neat flower with pure white perianth and mid pink cup. 5.00

ELGEMAN (Accent x Verran) H.G.Cross.
A smooth white perianth and solid deep pink straight cup. Ch. Pink, Launceston 1979 10.00

GLORY BE (Mirra Donna x Vahu) R.H.Glover
One of the deepest pink coloured cups available locally, being of a deep rich block pink which forms a dark halo around the base of the perianth. Pure white perianth of reasonable form, but of excellent substance. 12.00

K.J. HEAZLEWOOD (Rostella x Salmon Trout) Yeates
A cultivar of exceptional substance and texture. A completely differently shaped flower to most others in this class. Rich salmon pink cup of straight proportions. Very intense colour. A must for any collection, particularly those of hybridists. 8.00

MELTON LEA (Nina x Rose Royal) Heazlewood
An older flower which still has great merit for the show bench. It's silky white perianth is of good form and substance. The cup is unusual in that it is straight for most of it's length, then suddenly flares out to form a lovely rim. Salmon/pink rather than a true pink. 1988- in winning 6 x 2's, Launceston, in winning 3 x pinks, Sheffield. REMOVED FROM SALE FOR INCREASE

MIRRA DONNA (Pink Treasure x Dear Me) R.H.Glover
Good overlapping perianth with a nicely shaped cup with slight flair. An excellent parent. 5.00

***PINK SPECIAL (C.E.R. x Salmon Trout) R.H.Glover (Reg. T.D.C. 1968)
An extremely consistant flower of outstanding quality. Large, Pure white perianth with wide segments. Beautifully proportioned cup of the deepest, most even pink colour. Early to mid season. 1986 Ch. Pink Wynyard, Westbury. 1987:- Ch. 2w-p Ulverstone, Sheffield & Launceston. 1988 - in winning entry Piper Tray-Ulverstone, 1st 2w-p, Sheffield. SEE PHOTOGRAPH - PAGE 19 60.00

RARE GEM (C.E.R. x Sprightly) R.H.Glover
A lovely flower of excellent proportions. Pure white perianth and even pink narrow, coloured cup. A fine flower with excellent pose and stem length. 20.00

A large flower of excellent proportions. Pure white perianth and even pink coloured cup. A fine flower with excellent pose and stem length.

SWANNIE (Pink Special x Vahu)

A large, richly coloured flower of excellent texture and substance. It may not be quite as white in the perianth as Pink Special, but has it's own individuality.

A lovely flower with smooth, pure white perianth and bright pink cup. A little on the pointed side with a slightly frilled cup.

A flower with a smooth white perianth and deep block pink cup. Pure white pointed perianth with a neatly serrated edge to the cup.

An early pink of outstanding quality. The perianth has excellence in size and substance but has a tendency to nick on the cup. Has won many awards.

Flat white perianth of good substance. Minor petals are wide and shovel-shaped with the majors overlapping at the back. The cup is green at the base with a deep pink glow. A deeper pink than it's parent, Verran. A strong grower and extremely consistent show flower.

Pure white crystalline perianth with very broad, round minor petals, the majors overlapping at the back. The large trumpet-shaped cup is widely flanged & serrated at the rim. A strong neck with good carriage.

It sports a beautifully overlapping white perianth and a split and serrated perianth with deep pink cup. 1988 - In winning 3 x pinks, Sheffield

A borderline trumpet which sports a beautifully overlapping white perianth and a deep pink, serrated cup with a yellow base.

LARGE CUP - WHITE PERIANTH YELLOW CUPFLASH AFFAIR 2 W-Y (Easter Moon x Lady Slim) R.H.Glover (Reg. R.H.S. 1973)

Pure white perianth of good substance & excellent show form. Intense yellow cup 4-5cm. long in exacting proportions with the perianth size. Still regarded by many top Australian/New Zealand growers as the best in this class in the world. - Highly recommended. Winner of countless awards. 1986:- Ch. 2WY Ulverstone, 1st Open 2wy Westbury, Ch. 2wy Sheffield, 1st Open 2wy & 1st Seedling 2wy Whitmore. 1988 - Ch. 2w-y, Sheffield; 1st 2w-y, Whitmore; 1st 2w-y, Ulverstone.

IRISH MINSTREL (Green Island x Tudor Minstrel) Richardson

An old favourite which still has merit in any collection. Smooth white perianth with contrasting deep yellow cup with serrated edge

Pure white slightly pointed perianth. Long deep yellow cup. Large flower. Very consistent & good grower.

PACIFIC LADY (Green Island x Arbar) R.H.Glover (Reg. T.D.C. 1977)

A large flower for a 2b with very broad overlapping perianth. Flattish cup with lemon/orange colouring. Deeply serrated and scalloped. A very good show flower. Some large flowers can measure 3's. Winner of many class awards. 1988 - Ch. 3w-y, Wynyard.

WARBURTON (Heralding x 25/62) Broadfields

A most unusual and very attractive flower with a pure white, flat, smooth perianth which requires no grooming. The major petals are wide and rounded while the minor petals are half the width. The cup is straight and narrow with a slight serration on the rim. The cup colour is an unusual yellow/orange with a whitish rim. An outstanding flower. 1988 - in winning 6 seedlings & 3 x 2's, Launceston

LARGE CUP - WHITE PERIANTH RED/ORANGE CUP

ADORN 2 w-oww (Yin Nell x Ida May) R.H.Glover

A lovely small flower with rounded perianth segments and bright orange flattish cup scalloped and serrated in a whitish edge. Good carriage.

***ARWON 2 w-ooo (Ida May x Yin Nell) R.H.Glover Reg. T.D.C. 1983.

A difficult flower to classify, but reg. as a large cup. The perianth is beautifully white, rounded and overlapping and the vibrant orange cup is split, scalloped and serrated with a slightly paler edging. A real eye catcher.

BOLD EFFORT (Rockall x Ida May) R.H.Glover

One of the many good seedlings from this cross. Pure white perianth, smooth & overlapping. Deep black orange/red cup. Sure prize winner & very consistent. Champion Sdl. Launceston '88; 1988 - 1st 2w-r, Sheffield.

DORUS 2 W-00 (Arbar x Jo) Jackson

Pure white perianth of good substance and texture. A very good flower of this class for your breeding programme.

IDA MAY 2 W-000 (Arbar x Old Faithful) R.H.Glover (Reg. R.H.S. 1968)

Large white overlapping perianth. Flattish cup of orange. This flower is a must for any show collection. Many claim it to be a colour breakthrough. It has taken many awards in class sections. Is proving to be an excellent parent, especially for decorative flowers. It passes on a wonderful frilliness which makes excellent decorative flowers with overlapping perianths.

KAY (45/70) (Arbar/Jo x Signal light) Jackson

This flower has a smooth pure white nicely rounded flat perianth. The cup is broad at the rim which is attractively serrated. The edge of the rim is a brilliant orange/red, verging into yellow and green at the base. A most attractive flower with good carriage.

LARGE CUP, WHITE PERIANTH, COLOURED CUPS Cont.

KOALA (Signal Light/Jo x 83/64) Jackson.

White perianth of good quality and texture. Cup orange at the base, changing to a deep orange/red at the edge. Cup is wide and serrated at the rim.

20.00 LURE 2 w-ow (Ida May x Dorus) R H Glover.

A lovely round flower with pure white rounded perianth segments. The cup is flattish and extremely frilled and scalloped and of a bright orange colour with a whitish frill.

Good smooth overlapping perianth. Flattish cup of solid red. Good show flower & winner of many class awards.

Smooth show flower with pure white perianth and red cup.

Although registered as a 3, it seems difficult to grow it as one. It is a most beautiful flower with the whitest of perianths and a deep orange and yellow/orange cup with a whitish frill. The perianth is large and has rounded, wide segments.

A bright and attractive flower of medium size and good colour contrast. The major petals are slightly larger than the minor, but both are smooth with good substance. The cup is flared and bright orange.

A striking flower with pure white perianth of smooth texture. Minor petals rounded and shovel-shaped, while the major petals overlap at the back. The cup has a broad rim, attractively serrated of an orange/red colour which extends to the base of the cup. Champion Launceston 1982-3.

DAYDREAM 2 Y-W (Mitch)

Very consistent flower, almost unbeatable in this class. Very good breeder which passes on it's excellent form. A very useful parent for the new yellow pink class. 1988 - 1st 2y-w at Sheffield & Ulverstone

A quite differently formed flower to Daydream, having more rounded segments.

LARGE CUP - ALL YELLOWABONA (Goldscript x Berrima) Jackson

The smooth perianth is golden yellow of good substance and has shovel shaped petals. A strong grower with excellent posture.

DEMAND (Phillips)

A top New Zealand 2 y-y. Sports a large flower of good form. The deep yellow perianth has good substance. The ample petals are well rounded, smooth, with very little hooding. The mid length cup is of the same colour and is mildly serrate with a gently flared mouth. Has won many top awards.

DREAM PRINCE R.H.Glover

A small but perfectly formed flower of excellent colour. Perianth segments overlap greatly to form a near round flower. Excellent parent. Can measure a 1 y-y Ch. 1yy Whitmore 1987; 1988 - 1st 2y-y, Sheffield; in winning 6 x 2's, Launceston N.A.

FORMIDABLE 2 y-y (Jobi x Melissa) R.H.Glover

Smooth perianth of good substance and colour. Well proportioned cup with slight roll.

KAPITAL 116/75 2 y-y (Comal x Carrickberg) Jackson

Broad shovel shaped petals. A slightly flared trumpet and stands on a good stem.

PROSKA (Goldscript x Vixi) Jackson.

Very smooth, flat perianth, a pleasing shade of yellow but paler than the cup. Very good perianth substance. Short stiff neck. Does well and nearly every bloom good. Best bloom Springworld '84

SEAN 53/69 (Vixi x Goldscript) Jackson

A deep yellow flower with a good quality perianth with strong substance. A nicely balanced cup, slightly expanded and flanged at the rim. Short neck, good stem and presentation.

WINKIPOP 2 y-y (Goldscript x Future) Broadfield's Daffodils

An unusually shaped, but very attractive flower of deep golden yellow. Although the perianth segments are broad and rounded, each one ends in an acute termination which gives it individuality. It forms a full rounded flower which has excellent carriage. 1988 - in winning 6 seedlings at Whitmore. SEE PHOTOGRAPH - PAGE 19
