

## OVERSEAS LIST OF SPECIES AND HYBRID NARCISSI



1983 has seen many changes at Broadleigh and, as part of our reorganisation we are pleased to send you this our first condensed overseas catalogue. For the past couple of years we have only issued a specialist narcissi list but this year we have expanded it to over 80 of our varieties and hope in the future to add other rare non-narcissi bulbs. Stocks of the rarer hybrid and species narcissi remain very small, with only a handful available each year, so early ordering is essential.

We regret we must insist on pre-payment to cover the cost of the bulbs but the exact cost of airmail postage will be notified at the time of despatch and accounts adjusted accordingly. Cleaning the bulbs for export is time consuming and costly and therefore we regret we cannot accept orders under £15 in value, excluding postage.
