Those of you who are ADS members know that the RHS has invited opinions regarding any possible changes in the classification system--not individual flowers. Some ADS members have suggested changing the a and b in Divisions 5, 6, and 7 from cup length to a, b, c, and d representing color as in the first three divisions. Others have suggested dropping the a, b, c, and d entirely and using the color code instead--i.e. Arctic Gold lyy, or Accent 2wp. It has also been suggested that species doubles be put in Division 10 with other species rather than in

Division 4. Since I am on the ADS committee which will formulate the recommendations, I would appreciate any comments or suggestions you may have.

The ADS is also working on a new publication tentatively titled Daffodils to Show and Grow. This is intended to supplement the RHS 1975 Classified List which only lists flowers registered from 1960-1975 and does not include many, many flowers which normally turn up at shows. It will contain about 4000 names, but is not complete. In my opinion it will be of no value to judges or show chairmen. I personally would prefer a complete list, and would be interested to know your preferences so that I could pass the information along to the ADS Publications Committee.

I have just completed two articles for the ADS Journal, one a Show Report, and the other a tabulation of prize winning daffodils, with points assigned 4, 3, 2, 1 for blue, red, yellow, and white ribbons. You might be interested to know that the top ten prize winners for 1976 were Festivity with 182 points; Beryl, 174; Silver Chimes, 173; Daydream, 165; Actaea, 143; Geranium, 135; Cheerfulness, 125; Stratosphere, 119; Accent, 113; and Sweetness, 112.

At the last meeting, members voted 4-3, with several abstentions, to continue to have a booth at the Dispatch Home and Garden Show. Since I can find nothing in our By-Laws that says a majority of membership must approve the question, CODS will again have a booth. We will, however, have the booth unmanned during slow show hours--unless the management complains.

Before long, packages will begin coming from the various growers to whom orders were sent in the Spring. Orders were placed with eight different growers, one from New Zealand, one from Oregon, two from Northern Ireland, one from Ireland, two from England, and one from Holland. The bulbs from New Zealand arrived in May and were planted immediately. In September, I anxiously await the mailman hoping for packages. I'm looking forward to seeing Premier 2b P, Vocation 2b P, Debbie Rose 2b P, and Modest Maiden 2b P in my garden next year, as well as Palmyra 3b, Coolgreany, and Silhouette 2b RRY. And of course it's always fun to see what "bonus goodies" the growers have sent. Now if I can just decide where to plant all these new cultivars, everything will be just fine!

Several catalogs have been recently been received, one from Park Seed Co. and one from John Scheepers, Inc. Both list mainly older Dutch daffodils, although Park does list a few American bred cultivars. Park lists the double "Coral Strand" which won awards at several American shows this Spring. Also listed is "Amor" which is a 3b YCO which also won ribbons this past Spring. Scheepers catalog has some nice color illustrations, but most bulbs are priced per 10. They also list "Amor" but call it a 2b.

Hopefully, all your digging is done and you can sit back and enjoy the rest of the Summer until planting time arrives. By this time of year I get tired of gardening, and it's nice to just sit back and watch the world go by. So, relax and enjoy
