## CODS SHOW, 1977

In spite of the weather, the 1977 CODS show was a great success--our largest to date. Most of the flowers had been refrigerated for at least a week, but few failed to hold up through the entire show. Twenty-nine adults and 3 juniors made 688 entries with 1385 total blooms. There were 298 single stems, 136 vases of 3, 62 collections of 5 (try judging those!), 5 collections of 12, 2 Quinns, 2 Watrous, 59 miniatures, 21 juniors, 91 small growers and 12 seedlings. It was very encouraging to have so many entries in the small growers section, but sad to see the juniors decrease again. We need to do something to increase this area now that most members' children are grown and in college.

The Sogetsu School of Ohio Exhibit again was breathtaking and had a total of 21 arrangements. Lunch was a gastronomical treat and some very tasty and interesting dishes were prepared by the Japanese ladies. Thanks go to Katie Rollins, Chairman, and Jennie Belle Adler, her able assistant, for the great job they did.

Mary Knierim won the Quinn medal with a beautiful collection using many old reliables such as Ave 2C, Beryl 6B, Avenger 2B, Arbar 2B, Kingscourt 1A, Festivity 2B, Merlin 3B, and Rockall 3B along with some newer varieties Foundling 6B, Misty Glen 2C, Glensides 2C, Firgrove 3B, and Rialto 2A.

Ruth Pardue won the Purple Ribbon with a collection of large cupped daffodils, the Maroon Ribbon (getting to be one of her specialities), and the Green Ribbon (Cynthia Bell Memorial Trophy). Her reverse bi-color collection which consisted of Bethany 2D, Charter 2D, Rushlight 2D, Chat 7B, and Verdin 7B won the Walter T. Poppenger Award for the best collection of 5 in the entire show.

A collection of Sun Disc 7B, Bebob 7B, Bobbysoxer 7B, Rikki 7B, and Xit 3C earned the Lavender Ribbon for Tag Bourne. This is the second one this season for Tag--the first being her first-ever ADS ribbon. After getting that first one under your belt, others seem to come a little easier!



Mary Lou Gripshover won the Red-White-Blue Ribbon with Coral Light 2B (Kanouse), Aircastle 3B (Mitsch), Chapeau 2B (Evans), Daydream 2D (Mitsch), and Coral Ribbon 2B (Mitsch). The entire seedling section (12 entries) was made possible by Mary Lou's hybridizing work. She won the blue with 69-31-1 Bithynia x jonquilla. Second and third places were both poeticus crosses.

Grace Baird's lucky number was three--winning the Miniature White Ribbon with 7B Bebob and the White Ribbon (Mary & Wells Knierim Award) for 3 magnificent Old Satin 2B blooms.

The Small Growers Award was won by brand new member Nancy Gill. This was Nancy's first experience as a daffodil exhibitor, but by no means her last! The quality of blooms in this section was very high. Other blue ribbon winners here were Gretchen Stegmeier with Golden Rapture, Empress of Ireland, Merlin and Quetzal; Betty Lincoln with Patricia Reynolds, Lunar Sea and Ormeau; Charlyne Segmiller with Craigywarren and Cheerfulness; Nancy with Leonaine, Pigeon, Double Event, Charity May (1 and 3), and Accent; Marty Schmidt with Avenger, Enniskillen, Dallas and Laurens Koster; Virginia Whalen with Daydream, Lemon Ice, Pipit, Accent (3), and Minnow; and Jean Wright with Mahmoud.

Quetzal won the Junior Award for Sallie Bourne along with the Christopher David Lang Award. Sallie also won blues for Dinkie, Baccarat and Bebob. Maria Schmidt was successful with Yellow Cheerfulness and Passionale.

Foxfire 2B won the Gold Ribbon (Mary Elizabeth Blue Founders Cup) and Stafford 7B the Miniature Gold Ribbon (Leonora C. Wilkie Award) for Naomi Liggett. She also won the Watrous Ribbon and the Silver Ribbon with 41 blue ribbons.

Excellent educational exhibits were provided by Mary Lou, Tommy Dunn, and Peggy MacNeale. We couldn't ask for better publicity which was handled by Virginia Whalen. (CODS will certainly miss her next year in this job!)

This year we had several out of town exhibitors who helped make our show such a success. They were Ruth Junk, Betty Beery, Mrs. Michael Beery, Mary and Wells, Fred and Kevin Taylor, Mary Ann Zmijewski, Goldie Vernie, Mary Rutledge, Louise and Tommy Dunn, Peggy MacNeale, and Mary Elizabeth Blue.

Many thanks to all who worked so hard on the show and to all the exhibitors. It's all worth while when the results are so great!
