As most daffodil enthusiasts know, Grant Mitsch uses varieties of birds as names for his daffodil cultivars. When I received my May-June issue of International Wildlife, what appears on the cover but a gorgeous picture of a Quetzal.

The Quetzal is a rare and resplendent bird that lives high in the cloud forests of Central America. Their iridescent feathers glitter with the colors green, gold, blue and red. But the quetzal is more than just a beautiful creature. It was so sacred to the ancient Mayans that killing one was a capital crime. The Quetzal figures prominently in Mayan and Aztec myths and artwork. Today the quetzal is the national bird of Guatemala and the main unit of currency is named after it.

The 19th century naturalist, Osbert Salvin, the first explorer to see the quetzal in its natural home, wrote that the bird possesses "a degree of elegance that defies description." I think the Division 9 W-GYR "Quetzal" introduced by Grant Mitsch also has a degree of elegance. A lovely poeticus with green eye, yellow band, and red rim; and a rounded white perianth. It is a vigorous grower and reproduces well.

Many of the forests in Central America are part of a network of national parks and reserves, therefore, the quetzal should continue to dazzle people for generations to come as will the daffodil, "Quetzal", introduced by Grant Mitsch.

I could not forget to thank all the people in our club who came to help dig the bulbs this June. We dug three beds and the work went quickly with all the willing hands. On Saturday we enjoyed lunch, courtesy of Ray Scholz, with help from Cecile, Phyllis, Elsie and Cindy. Bulbs from the excess were sent to three other ADS test gardens, and some were planted at the Reynoldsburg Senior Citizen's Center. What was left, will be planted along the ravine at Whetstone and the cultivar "Columbus" will be planted in front of Columbus City Hall.

We are working with the Recreation and Parks Department on some interesting developments for our garden. I hope to let you know what is going to happen for us at our November meeting. We're ironing out the details now, but it's quite good.

Planting at the park will be Friday, <u>October 7th</u>, and Saturday, <u>October 8th</u>, with rain dates of October 14th and 15th. Bring your trowels and kneepads and help us get all these new things in the ground. We'll provide some lunch again
