

- 2 w-gwp** **MAGIC FLUTE 3** (Carncairn). Easter moon x Rose Caprice. Formerly seedling W 9/24. A smooth textured flower which opens with a pink cup which soon turns white leaving a pink edge slightly crinkled.

- 3w-gwy** **MINT CUP 3-4** (Carncairn). Wooton seedling x Shantallow. Formerly seedling W 1/2. A rounded flower with a flat, pure white perianth, and circular cup edged with yellow. Good form and texture, beautiful grey-green eye.

- 2 w-r** **BARBADOS 4** (J. L. Richardson). Kilworth x Avenger. A flower of perfect form and great substance with pure white perianth and deep red cup.

- 2 w-y** **BARLEY COVE 3-4** (Carncairn). Bizerta x Aircastle. A distinctive flower with a glistening white perianth, well overlapping and a good texture. The corona is a deep chrome yellow, crinkled at the edge.

- 3 w-yyo** **BARLEY SUGAR 4** (Carncairn). Bravura x Bushmills. This flower has a flat, very rounded perianth with circular cup of soft yellow, rimmed with orange. Almost perfect form.

- 1 y-y** **BARONSCOURT 3-4** (Carncairn). Kingscourt x Prince Igor. This is a brilliant yellow trumpet, a strong plant and a good laster, one of the few varieties that does not lie down in heavy frost.

- 3 y-y** **BEIGE BEAUTY 4** (Grant Mitsch). Green Island x Chinese White. This lovely show flower develops colouring a few days after opening, the perianth taking on a soft chartreuse and the crown fading to almost the same colour.

- 2 w-p** **BELTRIM 4** (Carncairn). Rosario x Irish Rose. A pink of good deep colour, and coming in consistently good form, with a very rounded perianth and round cup with a green eye. An extremely good increaser.

- 3 w-w** **BENVARDEN 5** (Carncairn). Chinese White x Guy Wilson seedling. A beautiful and dainty flower. Of a clean, poeticus white, sweet-scented, with a frilled cup and dark emerald green eye.

- 2 y-w** **BINKIE 4** (Wolfhagen Tasmania). Well known as one of the first reverse bi-colours. A smallish flower with good form and colour.

- 3 w-yyr** **BIRDSONG 4** (Carncairn). Corofin x Tulyar. A beautiful well-poised flower with a pure white perianth and flat yellow cup banded with a brilliant orange red. An excellent show flower.

- 2 w-y** **BIZERTA 2** (J. L. Richardson). A flower of most unusual colouring, having a pure white perianth of thick waxy substance. The apricot chrome cup has a slightly paler frill. A very good laster.

- 3 w-ooy** **BLARNEY 4** (J. L. Richardson). A most charming flower with a firm, satin-smooth, snow-white perianth and a flat, salmon-orange crown with a narrow primrose rim.

- 7 y-o** **BOBBY SOXER 2-3** (Alec Gray). A small yellow flower not usually exceeding 8 inches in height with a flat pale yellow perianth and a flattish orange crown.

- 2 y-r** **BORDER CHIEF 4** (J. L. Richardson). A large flower with a bright yellow perianth and a large, expanded bowl-shaped crown of intense red.

- 3 w-r** **BORROBOL 3** (Lea). Arbar x Seedling. A rounded flower with a bright red flat cup. Consistently successful in shows.

- 1 w-p BOUDOIR 4** (Carncairn). A very beautiful and graceful flower. The perianth is of good form and texture. The trumpet, which becomes slightly rolled at the mouth as the flower ages, gives the effect of being covered in pale pink powder.

- 1 y-y CABRA 3** (Carncairn). Kingscourt x Prince Igor. A lovely smooth yellow trumpet coming very late in the season and useful for late shows. The flowers are consistently well formed, resembling Prince Igor.

- 3 w-gyo CADENCE 4** (Mitsch). Galata Tuskar x Light. A very pretty flower with pure white flat perianth. the crown is vivid green in the centre, shading to yellow with a wide orange-red rim and a nicely scalloped edge.

- 2 w-p CAIRNDHU 4** (Carncairn). E93/5 x RA 85/94. This small dainty flower comes consistently in good form. It has a dark olive-green eye, deep pink frilled cup and sparkling white perianth.

- 2 y-y CAMELOT 3-4** (J. L. Richardson). Kingscourt x Ceylon. One of the best self yellows, with a circular perianth of exemplary flatness, and broad petals of exceptional quality and thickness. The well-proportioned cup is evenly and neatly serrated at the brim.

- 9 w-ggr CANTABILE 5** (G. L. Wilson). One of the finest poets, having sparkling white perianth and large, flat deep green eye rimmed with red.

- 1 w-w CANTATRICE 3** (G. L. Wilson). A flower which won many awards in its day and still is one of the most beautiful white trumpets.

- 2 w-w CAPE COOL 2-3** (Carncairn). Empress of Ireland x Arctic Doric. A tall, early flower with a straight cup and short neck. A lovely white with green tinges like Empress of Ireland.

- 4 y-r CASTLE DOBBS (previously named BEAUVALLET) 3-4** (Carncairn). Falaise self-pollinated. Red and yellow double, not really double enough for exhibition, but very interesting as it is scented, and sets seeds readily. Frequently produces two heads.

- 2 y-r CASTLE UPTON 3-4** (Carncairn). Krakatoa x Fury. This is a very strong upstanding flower, borne on a short neck. The perianth is of a deep, intense yellow, and the corona, a brilliant red, stands a good deal of sun before it burns.

- 2 w-p CAVODA 3-4** (Radcliffe). A pink of lovely quality - very pure white perianth and rose-pink cup typical of Tasmanian breeding.

- 10 w-y CERNUUS PLENUS 2-3**. The double form of Moschatus. White, interspersed with lemon yellow. Not easy to grow. About 9 inches.

- 2 y-r CEYLON 2.3** (J. L. Richardson). Marksman x Diolite F.C.C. R.H.S. A very strong early red and yellow. Almost sun-proof.

- 11 w-ppy CHABLIS 3** (Gerritsen). Split x Silvretta. Attractive and unusual split corona. White perianth with soft pink corona segments edged with yellow.

- 7 y-w CHAT 3** (Mitsch). Binkie x Jonquilla. A reverse jonquil of very nice form. Perianth of pale lemon with cups fading to white. Up to three flowers per stem.

- 1 y-w CHILOQUIN 4** (Mitsch). Brilliantly coloured small reverse bi-colour. Very smooth texture.

- 3 y-r CHUNGKING 2-3** (G. L. Wilson). Market Merry x Clack Rattle. An old but bright red and yellow. Still wins in shows if protected from sun.

- 2 w-w CHURCHFIELD 4-5** (Carncairn). Easter Moon x Guy Wilson seedling. Very like Easter Moon, but with more expanded and better-shaped cup, which opens cream, but gradually turns pure white with a beautiful deep green eye. Very good show flower.

- 2 w-gww CHURCHMAN 2** (Ballydorn). Very white with an elegant straight cup. Consistent show winner. Large.

- 2 w-yyr** **CITY LIGHTS 3** (Bell) Fairy Mother x Green Island. Fine show flower with pure white rounded perianth and yellow bowl shaped cup rimmed with bright red.

- 2 w-p** **CLARE PARK 3-4** (Carncairn). Rosario x Debutante. This flower has a large crinoline like cup of a deep pink which opens very wide, backed by a pure white perianth.

- 2 w-w** **COLUMBUS 3-4** (Carncairn). Easter Moon x Guy Wilson seedling. A sister of Churchfield. A flower of wonderful substance and texture. Very pure white perianth of a greenish-grey eye. Very successful in shows.

- 2 w-gwy** **COOLATIN 3-4** (Carncairn). The rounded cup is edged with a beautiful lemon-yellow and has a greenish eye. A very long laster, sun-proof. Vigorous grower.

- 3 w-gww** **COOL CRYSTAL 4-5** (Mitsch). Chinese White seedling. Similar to Chinese White but with more substance, whiter and with a bowl-shaped cup. Has had many show bench successes.

- 2 w-p** **COOL FLAME** (Mitsch). Precedent x Accent. The immaculate white perianth is flat and well overlapping. The crown is cup shaped and fluted, of a clear coral red.

- 3 w-gwy** **COOLGREANY 4** (Carncairn). Rounded, white perianth and yellow frilled cup with the greenest of green eyes.

- 2 w-ooy** **CRAIGDUN 2-3** (Carncairn). Tryst x (Kilworth x Pirate King) seedling. A very tall flower, durable and strong growing. The cup is long and goblet shaped, with its sunproof colouring resembling that of Daviot. The perianth is pure white with good texture.

- 2 w-y** **CREBILLY 2-3** (W. J. Dunlop). A lovely decorative flower, very good in pots. The perianth is broad and overlapping, the crown is a pale cream rimmed and flushed with greenish lemon.

- 2 w-w** **CREME DE MENTHE 4** (Carncairn). Chinese White x Seedling. A tall pure white flower with an eye like emerald, and expanded crinkled cup and very smooth perianth. Good show flower.

- 2 w-ooy** **DAVIOT 3** (Brodie of Brodie). The perianth is of lovely quality, clear white with a hint of green where the petals join the crown, which is bright orange coral, shading towards primrose at the rim.

- 2 y-w** **DAYDREAM 3** (Grant Mitsch). Binkie x Deedling. A certain show winner. Perfectly formed with good substance and texture, the crown opens lemon coloured but soon fades to white. Very long lasting.

- 2 w-p** **DESERT ROSE 3-4** (Richardson). Daybreak x Romance. A very consistent flower with a pure white perianth and a small cup which is deep pink right to the base.

- 7 y-w** **DICKCISSEL 3** (Mitsch). Binkie x Jonquilla. A very attractive reverse Jonquilla. Perianth of rich lemon and cups of similar colour which soon fade to pure white. Two or three blooms per stem.

- 2 w-r** **DON CARLOS 4** (J. L. Richardson). A. M. RHS 1964. Kilworth x Arbar. Pure white perianth and flattish cup of brilliant deep solid orange. Good show flower.

- 4 w-y** **DOUBLE EVENT 4-5** (J. L. Richardson). A very round flower, with pure-white segments interspersed in the centre, with small segments of soft yellow. A strong plant.

- 6 w-y** **DOVE WINGS 1-2** (C. F. Coleman). A sister seedling to Jenny. White, reflexing perianth and primrose yellow cup finely indented at the rim. A good garden flower, and show winner.

- 3 w-w** **DREAM CASTLE 3-4** (Mitsch). Greenisland x Chinese White. This is a very rounded, overlapping white flower of substance, with a shallow saucer shaped white crown. Large and vigorous.

- 2 w-y ★** **DROMONA 4** (Carncairn). This is a beautiful clean cut flower with very pure colouring. The short rounded corona is of the colour of fresh butter, and the white perianth is of very good texture.

- 2 w-o** **DRUMADOON 3-4** (Carncairn). Home Fires x Armada. A brilliantly coloured flower with a clear orange cup, slightly expanded and serrated at the mouth. The perianth is shovel shaped and very pure white.

- 2 y-w** **DRUMAWILLAN 3-4** (Carncairn). Cantatrice x Content. Rather resembling Spellbinder with a cup instead of a trumpet. The perianth is smooth and without curl to the segments. Produces a very good colour reverse.

- 2 w-p** **DRUMCAIRNE 4** (Carncairn). Irish Rose x Radcliffe seedling. A very unusual flower with a very dark pink cup. Of great value for breeding. Does not burn.

- 3 w-y *** **DRUMNASOLE 4-5** (Carncairn). Sylvia O'Neill x Guy Wilson seedling. Difficult to classify as it could be shown in the first few days as a 3 yy, opening a clear butter yellow. The perianth eventually turns white, leaving the cup yellow. A large flower for Division 3.

- 2 w-wwp** **DULCIE JOAN 3-4** (Abel Smith). Ethel x Syracuse. A smooth white flower with a deep pink rim. Very free flowering.

- 2 y-r** **DUNDARAVE 3** (Carncairn). Market Merry x Fury. This is a strong grower, with a brilliant red cup, which is fairly sunproof, and a good, deep yellow perianth.

- 2 w-y** **DUNMURRY 3-4** (W. J. Dunlop). A first class flower of most beautiful quality and thick waxy texture. Brilliant colour contrast.

- 2 w-ypp** **ECLAT 4** (Mitsch). Caro Nome x Accent. A flower with very brilliant colouring. The flat pink cup can be almost red in some seasons. Of value for breeding.
