Please order before the middle of July to avoid disappointment, because some stocks are small and all unsold bulbs are replanted by beginning of September. Figures following the names of varieties denote approximately the relative time of flowering. No. 1 being the earliest, and No. 6 the latest.

- 1yyw-wwy** **BEDGEBURY 3-4** (Carncairn) Camelot x Daydream. A wonderful flower for garden display, also an exhibition flower. Stands up well to bad weather, very free flowering with good reverse. The whole trumpet turns pure white, edged with a crinkled band of deep chrome yellow. In some seasons the inside of the trumpet turns faintly pink. Named for Bedgebury school. Seedling No. 15/51/78.

- 1w-w** **CLONEYTRACE 2-3** (Carncairn) Empress of Ireland x Arctic Doric. A very healthy plant making clean bulbs, has grown consistently for many years without basal rot. I think I have underestimated this flower. It has breeding potential if crossed with a good 1w-w. Seedling No. 1/69/69

- 3w-gyo** **GREEN BRIDGE 3-4** (Carncairn) Merlin x Rockall. A very tall flower with good poise and strong stem. The perianth segments are smooth and overlapping, the small corona is six-angled with vivid green at the base and chrome yellow with a crinkled band of bright orange. Exhibition flower. In our winning twelve Omagh 1995. Seedling No. 3/60/79

1y-y	<b>COMAL 3</b> (W. Jackson Jr.) Very smooth texture, pure golden yellow. Letti x Zimi. Each £3/\$4.50
