



- 2w-p** **DRENAGH 3-4** (Carncairn) Guy Wilson seedling x Rose Royale. This is a tall, upstanding pink. The cup is pure pink right to the base. This plant stands up well to bad weather, and is a sturdy grower.

- 3w-yyr** **DRESS CIRCLE 3-4** (Bloomer) A good size flower, pure white perianth and yellow corona edged deep red.


