



Receipts for payment will not be sent unless specially requested.

Orders will be executed in strict rotation.

All bulbs at customer's risk and expense.

Please order before the middle of July to avoid disappointment, because some stocks are small and all unsold bulbs are replanted by beginning of September. Figures following the names of varieties denote approximately the relative time of flowering, No 1 being the earliest, and No. 6 the latest.

- 1 w-w** **BALLYFREMA 2-3** (Carncairn). Empress of Ireland x Arctic Doric. Pure white medium sized flower with a very straight trumpet. Very consistent and produces the best bulbs we have seen in this class. Should prove a good show flower.

- 2 w-gww** **BARNWELL ALICE 3-4** Named especially for Her Royal Highness Princess Alice, Duchess of Gloucester, at her request. A very lovely flower opening with a fine rim of lemon round the goblet shaped cup, this soon fades to pure white as the flower matures.

- 2 w-yyo** **BONAMARGY 4-5** (Carncairn). Merlin x Seedling. Slightly reflexing white perianth and brilliantly rimmed cup. For best colour should be shown young.

- 2 w-yyo** **BRAVE JOURNEY 4** (Carncairn). Same breeding as Bonamargy. A large flower with very rounded, overlapping perianth with a wire rim of clear orange. Formerly seedling W4/7. First prize Ballymena 1985.

- 2 w-gww** **CONNOR 3-4** (Carncairn). Easter Moon x Rose Caprice. Especially chosen by members of The Mothers' Union for planting to commemorate the centenary in N. Ireland. Tall, with a translucent hexagonal green eye. Greenish cream cup which turns to pure white.

- 2 w-gwp** **FAR COUNTRY 3-4** (Carncairn). A lovely flower with a very clean, pure white perianth and green-eyed cup which is goblet shaped, and edged with a delicate shade of pink.

- 2 y-goo** **FORGE MILL 2-3** (Carncairn). Vulcan x Spelter. A really consistent flower with a neat, orange-red cup, and rounded perianth segments. Formerly seedling W24/8.

- 3 w-gyo** **KIRKINRIOLA 3-4** (Carncairn). Merlin x Fairmile. A very consistent flower with deep green eye and brilliant orange rim. Formerly seedling 1/7/73.

- 2 y-r** **LOUGH BAWN 2** (Carncairn). (Fortune's Sun x Ceylon) x Spelter. The earliest and longest lasting of all the 2y-r seedlings we have bred. Grows very well in pots. The cup has a straight edge and holds its colour well. Exhibited under no. W19/11.

- 2 y-yyr** **ROUND ROBIN 3-4** (Carncairn). A very tall, long lasting flower with Aircastle colour perianth, and chrome coloured corona with narrow red rim. The corona is completely flat. This flower travelled very well to the A.D.S. convention in 1985.

- 3 y-y** **SLANEY 3** (Carncairn). (Aircastle x ?). Soft yellow perianth with a slightly deeper yellow cup.

- 2 y-gwy** **BRACKEN HILL 2-3** (Carncairn) Daydream x Moonspell. A distinctive reverse bicolour, having a longish green-white corona rimmed with deep yellow. Very strong grower.

- 2 y-goo** **CHAGALL 3-4** (Carncairn) Ballintoy x Ballydorn Seedling. Very striking in beds. Long lasting and tall with a brilliant almost sunproof corona.

- 3 w-goo** **COUNTRY MORNING 3-4** (Richardson) Ariel x ? Very like Ariel. Much admired at the A.D.S. Convention in Valley Forge. This flower has a beautiful round overlapping perianth and unusual orange corona. We hope it will prove a show winner.

- 2 y-gwy** **DALLIANCE 2-3** (Carncairn) Probably Daydream x Moonspell. Very like Daydream, and for this reason we were slow to name it, but as it is a much stronger grower and produces such excellent bulbs, public opinion has persuaded us to give it a name. Has proved successful in shows under Seedling No. 5/8/69.

- 6 y-y** **FLIRT 2-3** (Richardson) Jenny OP. Another Richardson cultivar which we have decided to name. A delightful little flower, quite unique, with a round cup and perianth segments which curl back almost as soon as the flower opens. Formerly seedling R699.

- 1 w-w** **LESLIE HILL 2-3** (Carncairn) Chinese White x Ave. A very neat and consistent white trumpet; long-lasting, uniform and making excellent bulbs. Has gained awards on the show bench under seedling 1/8/64.

- 2 w-gwy** **MERMAID'S SPELL 3-4** (Carncairn) Wootton seedling x Shantallow. A tall attractive flower with a deep green eye and yellow edged corona. Sometimes it produces two heads per stem.

- 4 w-p** **APRICOT SUNDAE 4** (Carncairn) Egg Nog x Little Princess. Formerly seedling 1/2/72. A really beautiful flower with smooth texture resembling a pink and white Double Event. Has gained awards on the show bench.

- 2 y-gyo** **BURMA STAR 2-3** (Carncairn) Vulcan x Spelter. Formerly seedling w19/5. A strong grower producing a large number of flowers. Deep yellow perianth and sculptured cup. Lovely green eye shading to yellow and then bright orange which extends 3/4-way down the cup.

- 1 w-w** **CHANIA 2-3** (Carncairn) Empress of Ireland x Arctic Doric. Formerly seedling W6/9. A large flower well proportioned with a slightly greenish tinge where the perianth segments join the corona. Very short neck. Has won on the show bench.

- 4 w-w** **FROU-FROU 4-5** (Carncairn) Frigid x Silver Chimes. Coming sometimes with two heads, this is an enchanting novelty. Small poeticus white double flowers like little ballet skirts, they should be fertile as they come with an obvious pistil, around which tiny petals are bunched.

- 1 y-y** **GOLD STRIKE 3-4** (Carncairn) 1 y-y seedling x Tittle-Tattle. Formerly seedling 2/10/75. Small deep gold flower with rounded trumpet slightly curled at the mouth. Scented. The first success in our attempts to breed trumpet daffodils with jonquil scent.

- 2 w-gww** **MENUCHA 3** (Carncairn) Wootton seedling x White Prince. Christened 'Silver Fox' by some of our visitors, this name had already been taken, so we changed to Menucha, which means peace. It is a very smooth consistent flower slightly resembling Easter Moon but with a larger more rounded cup.

- 2 w-gwp** **PANKOT 3-4** (Carncairn) Easter Moon x Rose Caprice. A beautifully formed flower with a pure white perianth. The cup has a green eye, is pale yellow with a delicate orange pink rim. Produces a large number of show blooms.

- 2 y-goo** **SUDA BAY 2** (Carncairn) Bred from two Wootton seedlings this is an exceptionally strong growing variety. The perianth is a good deep yellow and the cup clear orange with an attractive green eye.

2 y-r **SUN BATHER 2-3** (Carncairn) Vulcan x Spelter. This is another glowing flower from this cross. The perianth is flushed with orange and it could perhaps be shown in the 2 o-r class, but only in some seasons. The corona is a brilliant orange red. We considered it best to register it as 2 y-r.

4 w-orr **ACHENTOUL 4** (Lea) Fine red and white double of good form on a good strong stem.

3 w-w **ACHNASHEEN 4-5** (Lea) Sulven x Hamzali. Very pure white with a small flattish white cup.

4 w-r **ACROPOLIS 4-5** (Richardson). Falaise x Limerick. A very fine red and white double. Good show flower.

3 w-y **AIRCASTLE 4** (Mitsch). Green Island x Chinese White. An almost certain winner at shows. Well known for its perfect form. Petals open milk-white, later changing to lemon. Crown pale lemon with darker rim.

2 w-p **ALICE'S PINK 4** (Carncairn) Breeding unknown. Pure white perianth with a neat smallish cup of deep salmon-slightly frilled at the edge, which holds its colour without fading for a considerable time.

2w-wwy **APRIL CHARM 4** (Mitsch). Green Island x Chinese White. White perianth of good substance, with a flaring, nearly flat white crown with a narrow yellow rim.

1 y-y **ARCTIC GOLD 2-3** (Richardson). Goldcourt x Kingscourt. Still one of the best yellow trumpets with a broad overlapping perianth of smooth waxy texture, and well proportioned trumpet, flanged and serrated at the mouth. The whole flower is a very deep gold.

2 w-w **ARDBANE 2-3** (G.L. Wilson). St.Brendan x Greenisland. A pure ice-white, green based flower with a clean-cut broad perianth and three-quarters-length crown.

3 w-gyr **ARDGLASS 4** (Ballydorn). Won the Northern Bank Trophy, Ballymena 1982. Very circular flower having a richly-coloured open crown with broad orange band on rim and deep green eye extending well into the crown on opening.

3 y-r **ARDOUR 3** (Mitsch). Cheerio x Market Merry. Good size blooms with deep yellow, overlapping perianth and a rather small crown of quite deep orange red.

5 w-w **ARISH MELL 3-4** (J.W. Blanchard) F. C.C. R.H.S. 1963. A very beautiful Triandus having several pure white flowers on a tall straight stem. A consistent prize-winner in shows.

1 y-y **ARKLE 3** (Richardson). Yellow Idol x 298. This wonderful flower is over 135mm across with large overlapping perianth segments of lovely quality and smooth texture. The long well balanced trumpet is widely flanged and neatly serrated. Without doubt one of the finest yellow trumpets. Strong and vigorous plant.

1 y-y **ARMAGH 3** (W.J. Dunlop). A first class large clear golden yellow trumpet of highest exhibition quality with splendid silken smooth perianth and nicely proportioned trumpet. Strong vigorous plant and good doer.

2 w-r **AVENGER 4** (Richardson). One of the first but still one of the best of the Kilworth x Arbar series. Not as large as some, but scores well for whiteness of petal, cup colour and consistency in producing show quality blooms.

2 y-r **BALLINTOY 4-5** (W.J. Dunlop). A nicely proportioned late flower with a golden yellow perianth and a rich deep red crown.

1 y-y **BALLYARNETT 1** (Carncairn). Goldcourt x Moonstruck. This is a large soft yellow trumpet and the earliest large 1 y-y we have grown.

3 w-wwo **BALLYCASTLE 3-4** (W.J. Dunlop). A charming flower with a broad white perianth and shallow white crown lit by a dainty pinkish orange rim.

2 y-y **BALLYTRIM 3** (Richardson). An attractive flower with a neat cup which is completely circular with small indentations and a slight curl as the flower ages. A useful addition to the 2 yy class.

- 2 w-y** **BARLEY COVE 3-4** (Carncairn). Bizerta x Aircastle. A distinctive flower with a glistening white perianth, well overlapping and a good texture. The corona is a deep chrome yellow, crinkled at the edge.

- 3 w-yyo** **BARLEY SUGAR 4** (Carncairn). Bravura x Bushmills. This flower has a flat, very rounded perianth with circular cup of soft yellow, rimmed with orange. Almost perfect form.

- 1 y-y** **BARONSCOURT 3-4** (Carncairn). Kingscourt x Prince Igor. This is a brilliant yellow trumpet, a strong plant and a good laster, one of the few varieties that does not lie down in heavy frost.

- 3 y-y** **BEIGE BEAUTY 3-4** (Mitsch) Green Island x Chinese White. This lovely show flower develops colouring a few days after opening, the perianth taking on a soft chartreuse and the crown fading to almost the same colour.

- 2 w-p** **BELTRIM 4** (Carncairn). Rosario x Irish Rose. A pink of good deep colour, and coming in consistently good form, with a very rounded perianth and round cup with a green eye. An extremely good increaser.

- 6 y-o** **BERYL 2-3** (P.D. Williams). Cyclamineous Crossed poeticus. Primrose perianth and orange bell-shaped cup. Very dainty flower.

- 2 y-w** **BETHANY 3** (Mitsch). Flat, well over-lapping perianth of luminous sulphur lemon, the crown is long, soon fading to white with a tinge of lemon on its margin. A strong grower.

- 3 w-yyr** **BIRDSONG 4** (Carncairn). Corofin x Tulyar. A beautiful well-poised flower with a pure white perianth and flat yellow cup banded with a brilliant orange red. An excellent show flower.

- 7 y-o** **BOBBY SOXER 2-3** (Alec Gray). A small yellow flower not usually exceeding 8 inches in height with a flat pale yellow perianth and a flattish orange crown.

- 1 w-p** **BOUDOIR 4** (Carncairn). A very beautiful and graceful pink, of trumpet measurements. The stem is strong and tall for a pink variety. The perianth of good form and texture. The trumpet, which becomes slightly rolled at the mouth as the flower ages, gives the effect of being covered in pale pink powder.

- 2 w-yyo** **BOVAGH 3-4** (Carncairn). A tall flower with unusual colouring. Greenish-white perianth, and goblet-shaped cup of chrome yellow crinkled at the edge and rimmed with deep orange. Rapid increaser.

- 2 w-w** **BROOKFIELD 2-3** (W.J. Dunlop). A lovely large flower of thick waxy texture and smoothest quality, with rather shallow cup which opens cream, soon passing to white. Splendid exhibition flower and a strong plant.

- 1 w-w** **BROUGHSHANE 3** (G.L. Wilson). A.M., R.H.S. 1943. A magnificent giant white trumpet of perfect form and balance. Noble trumpet is widely flanged and reflexed with a frilled edge. The perianth is fully 5½ inches in diameter. The flower is of great substance and durable, carried on tall, strong stems.

- 3 wgw** **BRYHER 5-6** (Favell). A really wonderful flower having broad almost completely circular perianth of perfect quality and quite small crown, purest ice-white throughout except for a touch of emerald green in the eye. Tall vigorous plant.

- 2 y-r** **BUNCLODY 3-4** (Lea). Revelry x seedling. A medium-sized flower with an intense red cup and smooth flat perianth of richest gold. Excellent show flower.

- 2 w-o** **BUNCRANA 3-4** (Richardson). A most distinct show flower with pure white shovel-shaped segments, the cup is longish and frilled and of a deep peachy orange colour.

- 7 y-r** **BUNTING 3-4** (Mitsch). Narvik x Jonquilla. One of the most beautiful red cupped jonquils. Very bright neat small cup. Most stems have two blooms.

- 2 y-o** **BURNING TORCH 3-4** (Richardson). Cambodia x Vulcan. A large flower with a broad golden yellow perianth. The cup is a deep fiery orange, expanded and serrated at the edge. The colour deepens with age. Practically sunproof.

- 3 w-wr** **BUSHMILLS 4** (W.J. Dunlop). Bred from Portrush by Foggy Dew. Broad, flat extremely smooth pure white perianth, and nicely proportioned crown with a wire rim of pinky orange.

- 1 y-y CABRA 3** (Carncairn). Kingscourt x Prince Igor. A lovely smooth yellow trumpet coming very late in the season and useful for late shows. The flowers are consistently well formed, resembling Prince Igor.

- 2 w-p CAIRNDHU 4** (Carncairn). E93/5 x RA 85/94. This small dainty flower comes consistently in good form. It has a dark olive-green eye, deep pink frilled cup and sparkling white perianth.

- 2 y-y CAMELOT 3-4** (Richardson). Kingscourt x Ceylon. One of the best self yellows, with a circular perianth of exemplary flatness, and broad petals of exceptional quality and thickness. The well-proportioned cup is evenly and neatly serrated at the brim.

- 2 w-w CANISP 2-3** ((Lea). Ave x Early Mist F.C.C. (e) 1967. An outstandingly beautiful flower of near trumpet proportions which received the Best Bloom award at many shows. Lovely smooth and elegant double triangular perianth and a slightly expanded, some-times neatly rolled trumpet crown with green lights in the throat.

- 2 w-p CANBY 3-4** (Mitsch). Precedent x Carita. A large flower of excellent quality, having a broad overlapping, flat white perianth, and a well-balanced cup-shaped crown of rich salmon pink suffused with lilac. Vigorous grower and good increaser.

- 2 w-w CAPE COOL 2-3** (Carncairn). Empress of Ireland x Arctic Doric. A tall, early flower with a straight cup and short neck. A lovely white with green tinges like Empress of Ireland.

- 2 w-gww CARRIGEEN 4-5** (Carncairn). A large graceful flower with a broad perianth and a smallish, goblet-shaped cup tinged with green throughout. Increases well.

- 4 y-r CASTLE DOBBS 3-4** (Carncairn). Falaise self-pollinated. Red and yellow double, not really double enough for exhibition, but very interesting as it is scented, and sets seeds readily. Frequently produces two heads.

- 2 w-p CAVODA 3-4** (Radcliffe). A pink of lovely quality; very pure white perianth and rose-pink cup typical of Tasmanian breeding.

- 2 w-y CHAPEAU 2-3** (Evans). Wahkeena x Festivity. Form intermediate between its parents, this flower has a strong stem, good pose and durability which makes it dual purpose for garden and show. Clean white, overlapping and pointed perianth. Long cup of butter yellow fluted at the margin.

- 2 y-y CHARADE 2-3** (Evans).Greenland x Greenisland.

- 6 y-y CHARITY MAY 1-2** (C.F. Coleman). A charming and graceful flower of lovely quality and a soft clear yellow; broad overlapping much reflexed perianth segments, cup waisted with frilly and expanded mouth.

- 2 y-r CHECKMATE 3** (D.S. Bell). Dunkeld x Burgundy. An exhibition flower with many successes in New Zealand. Rounded, broadly overlapping perianth, smooth, great substance; perfectly proportioned bowl-shaped solid red crown. Lovely show form; tall and vigorous.

- 2 w-p CHELSEA DERBY 4-5**(G.H. Johnston).Interim x Chelsea China. The cup is a very strong pink and the colour passes on to the progeny. Good constitution.
