CALLANDER (Lea) 2W-GWW. Late-Season.

A fine flower and plant for exhibition or garden, which came from Misty Glen open pollinated. In many respects it is similar to the parent, except that the flowering period is even later, and with me is the last of the all whites to bloom. Seedling No L1-43-78.

Breeding Misty Glen open pollinated.

CHARBURY (Lea) 2W-Y. Mid-Season.

A very large flower of great substance, forming two complete triangles. The bright yellow corona is just short of trumpet measurement, and has a delightful half roll at the mouth, giving the flower a very distinct appearance. Tall stem, good neck with perfect poise. A very fine show flower that sets new standards in this division. Seedling No L 5-20-77.

Breeding L 1-29-71 x Owston Wood.

CHATEAU IMPNEY (Postles) 2Y-O. Early-Season.

The most consistent flower that I have with almost every one reaching show perfection. The dark yellow perianth is flat, smooth and classical in shape. The half length cup of solid dark orange which expands to a neatly serrated mouth. This early cultivar is tall with a good neck and poise. Frequently exhibited in winning groups, and has the advantage of being sun-proof. Seedling No 1-71-80.

Breeding 2-25-69 x Lea Seedling.

LOCH ACHRAY (Lea) 2Y-ORR. Early-Season.

This flower has the potential of being the finest Lea raised yellow-red yet seen, having the smoothness of Loch Carron combined with the colour and vigour of Loch Loyal. The deep yellow perianth is large, smooth and well overlapping, while the medium length cup of deep fiery red has a neatly serrated expanding rim. Early flowering with a very robust constitution. The perfectly held flower is tailor made for top show standards. Seedling No L4-3-78.

MIDNIGHT (Postles) 3Y-R. Mid-Season.

Superb show flower that I have used in many winning exhibits. The large flower is of darkest yellow, suffused orange and similar in style to Achduart, being flat and smooth. The cup is of intense red, bowl shaped with a neatly serrated edge. A tall robust plant that has lovely poise with a strong neck. Very free flowering. Seedling No 3-35-76.

MOON SHADOW (Postles) 3W-GYY. Mid-Season.

As a seedling Moon Shadow has been one of my most successful and consistent show flowers, in winning Engleheart Cup Groups, Bourne Cup and several first prize wins including Best Seedling Harrogate 1992. A very large flower of impeccable show form that opens pale cream, then soon whitens without any loss of colour from the cup, which is a flat disc of bright citron yellow, evenly lobed and serrated. Tall stem, perfect poise, full of substance and completely sun-proof. Seedling No 3-78-79.

SWEET GEORGIA (Lea) 2W-GPP. Late-Season.

A flower in the best Lea traditions being used in one of his winning Engleheart Cup Groups. The stock has taken me a number of years to build up sufficiently to offer it. The perianth is very round and brilliant white, full of substance. The cup is an intense deep pink, green at the base gradually expanding to a very slightly serrated quarter roll. Superb flower for the show bench. Seedling No L1-13-75.

NEW INTRODUCTIONS 1992

CAROLE LOMBARD (Postles) 3W-YYO. Late-Season.

Named by special request to honour the memory of the beautiful film star. As a seedling this flower has already won Best Bloom R.H.S. and Best Bloom (Hybridizers section) at the A.D.S Convention Atlanta. The large well formed perianth is of exemplary quality, and the small goblet shaped cup has a fluted, slightly serrated band of luminous orange at the mouth. This very attractive cultivar is late flowering. Seedling No 2-64-79.

Breeding Purbeck x Estrella.

DESERT STORM (Postles) 2Y-R. Early-Season.

An early flower of outstanding colour and form as one would expect from its well proven parents. The perianth is deep yellow, smooth and very overlapping. While the straight sided half length cup of deepest orange/red has slight serrations at the mouth. I have exhibited this flower with great success both here and in the U.S.A. This very healthy plant of rapid increase has a tall stem, and a good neck that holds the flower perfect for the show bench. Seedling No 1-77-79.

Breeding Torridon x Loch Hope.

FILOLI (Lea) 1Y-P. Late-Season.

This is a most unusual and outstanding flower. Although it has the appearance of a large cup, it actually measures div 1. The primrose yellow perianth is of great substance and quality. Each segment being very broad and smooth. The soft pink trumpet is bell shaped with a wide flange at the mouth. This very distinct yellow/pink won its class at the R.H.S. and has been outstanding on my trade exhibits, causing much comment. Seedling No 2-23-80.

GLEN ALLADALE (Lea) 3W-WYO. Late-Season.

Another very stylish flower with an almost flat, disc shaped corona, with a perfect bright orange/red rim. The sparkling white perianth is very smooth and almost round in form. Wonderful show quality flower with perfect poise. Seedling No 4-28-78.

Breeding (Rockall x Merlin) x Loch Assynt x Achnasheen.

SPECIAL ENVOY (Lea) 2Y-Y. Early-Season.

Gold Convention is proving to be an outstanding parent, and this fine offspring proves the point. I selected Special Envoy from a batch of seedlings previously ear-marked by John Lea for further consideration. Clearly exhibiting good points from both parents, this deep yellow flower is very smooth and of super form. The almost trumpet length cup is of the same deep yellow, and expands gently to a nicely serrated flange at the mouth. With tall stems the flower is carried perfectly. Like its parents the bulbs are large and of rapid increase. Seedling No 8-21-78.

Breeding Gold Convention x Meldrum.

WYCHAVON (Lea) 2W-YRR. Mid-Season.

The brilliant white almost round perianth is the perfect background for the deep red fluted and slightly serrated cup, that has proved almost completely sun-proof with me. The tall stem has an unusually short neck for this type of flower, which is very consistent and of exceptional show quality. Seedling No 1-46-76.

Breeding Ohio x Rockall Seedling.

YORK MINSTER (Lea) 1Y-YOO. Mid-Season.

Another milestone in John Lea's quest for red trumpets. Already gaining several wins on the show bench, and with enthusiastic reports from the U.S.A. York Minster is an exciting prospect. The large dark yellow perianth which is of superior form and substance, is very smooth. The trumpet which is a nice shade of deep orange is funnel shaped, and flares at the mouth. The stems are tall and the neck short. In all a first class flower for show or garden. Seedling No 1-14-76.

ACHDUART (Lea) 3Y-R. Mid-Season.

A large and beautifully formed red and yellow. A most consistent flower with a lovely smooth perianth of soft gold, nicely balanced by a neatly expanded red cup. Quite the best Div 3 red-yellow yet raised. Was given Award of Merit, R.H.S., as a show flower the first time it was shown in the Winning Engleheart Cup Group. A strong and vigorous plant with a good stem and neck. A sister seedling of Torridon.

AMBERCASTLE (Richardson) 2Y-WYY. Mid-Season.

The colouring of the trumpet is difficult to describe by colour coding as the trumpet is basically yellow flushed pink, the overall impression being buff apricot. The lemon yellow perianth is smooth with a slight halo as the plant ages. A good strong plant, stem and neck. A forerunner of yellow perianth pinks.

APRIL LOVE (Abel-Smith) IW-W. Late-Season.

This is a most exquisite flower of the highest quality, flawless in texture and proportion. The perianth is broad and pointed, trumpet beautifully finished with a deep smoothly rolled flange at the mouth. The whole flower being purest white with a green at the base of the trumpet. Best Bloom R.H.S. Show 1985.

ARELEY KINGS (Lea) 2W-GWW. Mid-Season.

To stand any chance in this popular division a new introduction has to be very special, and this one is! Exhibited in the late John Lea's last winning Engleheart Cup 1984. This dazzling white flower has a dark green base, and is of remarkable consistency and form. The outer petals are very broad and rounded at the tips, the inner being spade shape. The whole flower is in perfect balance, carried on tall strong stems, with great poise. Seedling No. 1-32-76.

Breeding *Misty Glen x Croila*.

ASHMORE (Blanchard) 2W-GWW. Mid-Season.

A very uniformly white flower of classical form, that is very consistent in quality. The perianth petals are broad, round and flat. Perfectly balanced by the short bowl shaped cup with a dark green base. The flower opens on the small side and continues to grow on the plant to a good size. A strong vigorous plant with a good straight stem that naturally carries the flower at right angles to the stem. One of the best Div. 2 white flowers available.

Breeding *Easter Moon x Seedling*.

BADANLOCH (Lea) 3W-YYO. Late Mid-Season.

A very large striking flower of great promise carried on a tall, strong stem and neck to match. The beautifully white perianth is made up of broad smooth, bluntly pointed inner petals, whilst the outer petals are rounded giving a nearly circular flower, the expanding cup has small neat serrations at the mouth, nicely balancing the large perianth. It is pale greeny yellow at the base shading to lemon for 2/3 of its length, ending in a bright orange rim that is well defined. A tall strong plant that holds the flower correctly.

Breeding *Dalhauine x Seedling*.

BALLINDALLOCH (Lea) 2Y-Y. Early-Season.

An elegant Div 2 flower. The perianth is of deep rich gold, formed by broad bluntly pointed inner petals, the outer petals are rounded. The rather narrow gently expanding elegant cup is a shade darker in colour and is nicely serrated at the mouth. A good strong plant with a tall stem that is consistent in quality. First shown at the R.H.S. Daffodil Competition 1981, under Seedling No. 3-5-72.

Breeding *Arctic Gold x (Seedling x Capitol Hill)*.

BALLYROBERT (Dunlop) IY-Y. Mid-Season.

Beautifully smooth and consistent exhibition flower in deep golden yellow. Strong free flowering plant.

BELBROUGHTON (Postles) 2W-WWP. Late-Season.

There is no pretence with the colour classification of this flower, with its bright pink rim that is unquestionably non-predominant. The very white perianth is smooth, well overlapping and of good substance inherited from its seed parent. A beautiful flower that is sure to make its mark on the show bench, and in the garden border the effect is startling. On tall strong stems with a well poised bloom. Seedling No. 2-48-76.

Breeding *Rainbow x Dailmanach*.

BEN ALIGIN (Lea) 1W-W. Mid-Season.

This flower has quite a remarkable smooth large perianth, which is well overlapping and of beautiful shape and form. The trumpet, which has a half roll to the mouth, opens pale yellow with pinkish tones and soon fades to a lovely milky white. A prolific seed bearer, that will be valuable for breeding. This long lasting flower which was Best Bloom at the International Garden Festival in Liverpool 1984, is a sister seedling to Silver Convention. Seedling No. 2-36-71.

BEN AVON (Lea) 1W-W. Early Mid-Season.

A very large white trumpet. The outer perianth petals are extremely broad and bluntly pointed. The inner petals, nearly as broad, are rather more sharply pointed, giving great elegance to the flower which is inherited from Canisp. The rather narrow trumpet, dark green at the base, is gently expanding and ends in a neat half roll. A long lasting and very beautiful flower.

Breeding *Canisp x (Glenshesk x Empress of Ireland) x Canisp*.

BEN HEE (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A sister seedling to Inverpolly. This is a beautiful medium sized flower. Both perianth and cup are very white. The perianth is perfectly formed and very smooth. A most consistent flower and good strong plant.

BEN LEDI (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A beautiful white flower of outstanding pedigree. The large perianth petals are flat, smooth, and rounded at the tips. The well proportioned cup has a nice green base and gently expands to give a very refined appearance to the flower. Good stem and neck that holds the flower well. Seedling No. 2-32-76.

Breeding *Misty Glen x Croila*.

BEN LOYAL (Lea) 2W-R. Mid-Season.

A very large flower on a strong stem. The perianth petals are broad overlapping forming a nearly round flower. Bred from two un-named seedlings that I have used particularly for white perianths. The resulting perianth is glistening white and forms a majestic background for the well balanced orange-red cup.

BEN VORLICH (Lea) 2W-YOO. Mid-Season.

Released by popular demand, this cultivar having already won the accolade of Best Seedling at the Daffodil Society Show. The large sparkling white petals of lovely smooth texture, and the bright orange-red flared cup make an instant eye catching bloom. First class for show or in the garden border, where it blooms quite early for this division. Very strong stem and neck that holds the flower perfectly. Seedling No. 2-34-66.

BRIERGLASS (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A flower as polished as the finest crystal glass. A medium sized flower that can only be described as a white Golden Aura. First prize R.H.S. London 1985. Major prize winner at R.H.S. and Daffodil Society Show 1986. Seedling No. 2-21-75.

BROADWAY VILLAGE (Postles) 2Y-YRR. Early-Season.

This very colourful flower has been named after one of the prettiest villages in England. The mid-yellow perianth petals are smooth, flat, very broad and of excellent substance. The rather flat cup is bright red with a yellow base that gives the whole flower a very fiery effect. An excellent plant that is tall, strong and early flowering. Seedling No. 7-42-75.

Breeding Stourbridge x Torridon.

BROOMHILL (Board) 2W-W. Early-Season.

A wonderful show flower and a good strong plant. The beautiful formed pure white perianth has broad overlapping petals that are bluntly pointed. The short pure white corona is nearly straight, only slightly expanding and frilled. The flower is naturally well poised with a good neck and strong stem. Makes a good bulb and increases well.

Breeding Easter Moon x Knowhead.

BURNTOLLET (Lea) 1W-W. Mid-Season.

It is a beautifully smooth textured pure white flower of largest size which consistently produces good show specimens. The petals tend to hood slightly but they are easily pressed back to remain perfectly flat at right angles to the long and nicely flanged trumpet. Best Bloom Daffodil Society Show 1984.

Breeding Glenshesk x Empress of Ireland

Price each £3.50

CAIRNTOUL (Lea) 3W-ORR. Late Mid-Season.

A very striking flower. The brilliant white perianth is formed from smooth flat petals that are carried at right angles. It makes a great contrast to the bright red flat cup. An exceptionally tall flower with a strong stem and good neck. Very consistent in show quality as its record shows. Seedling No. 2-27-67.

Breeding Merlin x Rockall.

Price each £2.50

CANISP (Lea) 2W-W. Early Mid-Season.

An outstanding beautiful flower of near trumpet proportions and of the highest quality. The lovely smooth perianth is formed from pure white petals, broad and overlapping slightly pointed at the tips and making a most elegant foil for the trumpet that is slightly expanding, sometimes the mouth is neatly rolled. The base gleams with green lights. This elegant flower is most consistent and has been Best Bloom at R.H.S. shows on several occasions.

Breeding Ave x Early Mist.

CHELSEA GIRL (Postles) 2W-P. Mid-Season.

Large, slightly reflexed, pointed perianth petals give this flower a very distinctive appearance. It is very white, smooth and of impeccable quality. The rather straight sided corona is a delightful shade of pink, with deeper lilac tones inside. In all, something very different from existing cultivars. Very free flowering, with lovely poise and quite early for a "pink". Seedling No 1-49-76.

Breeding Rose Royale x Dailmanach.

Price each £10.00

CHELTONHAM (Lea) 2Y-YOO. Early Season.

For sheer consistency and perfection of form this cultivar will take some beating. The mid-yellow perianth is broad and well overlapping, and of heavy substance. The nicely balanced bright orange cup is slightly expanding with neat serrations. Free flowering on good stems that hold the flower naturally at right angles. Seedling No L7-3-78.

Breeding 1-24-71 x 1-9-71.

CHINA DOLL (Postles) 2W-WWP. Late-Season.

This is the first pink rimmed flower that I have raised from Dailmanach. It has a sparkling white perianth that is broad, overlapping, and is full of substance. The large cup expands gently to a distinct pink rim. A truly beautiful flower. Seedling No. 2-34-74.

Breeding Lea Seedling x Dailmanach.

CITRONITA (Noton) 3Y-Y. Mid-Season.

A very large, almost perfectly round bloom of faultless quality, that is of soft yellow colour. The saucer crown is of a slightly darker shade. A wonderful show flower, that had many successes at the R.H.S. shows, and is extremely consistent. I regard this cultivar as the raisers finest introduction.

COLLEY GATE (Lea) 3W-YR. Mid-Season.

This quite distinct Div 3 flower is a sister seedling to Cairntoul. It has a beautiful white, slightly pointed perianth which is very smooth and well overlapping. The very neat cup is evenly divided between yellow and bright orange-red, with a nicely frilled edge. A very successful show flower being exhibited under No. 1-27-67 winning many first prizes. A good plant with a tall stem and strong neck that holds the flower perfectly.

Breeding Merlin x Rockall.

COOL CRYSTAL (Mitsch) 3W-W. Late-Season.

Undoubtedly one of the finest of all show flowers. Perfect form and of large size. The neatly frilled cup on this long lasting flower, needs time to whiten, the whole bloom finishing pure crystalline white.

CORBIERE (Lea) 1Y-YOO. Mid-Season.

This being the first of my selections from John Lea's red trumpet breeding programme. The large round perianth is similar in shape and size to Gold Convention. The dark yellow, straight sided and slightly flared trumpet turns a nice shade of orange as the flower develops. A superb show flower, with a tall stem, and good neck that holds the flower perfectly, which is sun-proof. Produces large healthy bulbs of good increase. Will be invaluable for breeding. Seedling No. Lea 1-13-77.

Breeding Gold Convention x Glenfarclas

CRAIG STIEL (Lea) 2Y-R. Mid-Season.

Orange flushes through the deep yellow perianth makes this flower look very special. The form and texture of this flower is superb and is inherited from the pollen parent. The half length, straight sided cup is of deepest red. A medium sized flower of real quality, on tall strong stems with good necks. Seedling No. 1-52-73.

Breeding Bunclody x Torridon.

Price each £1.00

CREAG DUBH (Lea) 20-R. Early Mid-Season.

This very unusual flower caused great interest when first shown in London in 1976. The perianth is coppery orange red, being only a little paler than the orange cup. A medium to large size flower, on a tall strong stem. This new colour break is going to be very important for breeding self orange and red flowers. Seedling No. 2-26-69.

CROILA (Lea) 2W-GW. Late Mid-Season.

A lovely all white Div 2 flower of nearly perfect symmetry and form. The perianth petals are broad and bluntly pointed, smooth and flat. The short cup is straight sided except at the mouth where it expands to form a nice even half roll. A very consistent flower with a good stem and neck that holds the flower perfectly. Seedling No. 1-25-68.

Breeding Pitchroy x Seedling.

Price each £2.50

CULTURED PEARL (Postles) 2W-W. Late-Season.

The name describes the flower perfectly, as it consistently produces such flawless flowers. The perianth is of medium size, smooth and flat, while the rather creamy cup soon changes to give a beautiful self-white flower of great quality. Very late flowering. Perfect cultivar for pot culture, with its tall strong stems. Seedling No 1-30-76.

Breeding Pitchroy x Misty Glen.

Price each £5.00

CUL BEAG (Lea) 3W-R. Mid-Season.

One of the finest Div 3 flowers. A perfectly formed flower with broad rounded petals making an almost round perianth. The well formed cup being an intense red. The very white perianth forms a perfect background. A consistent and strong growing plant.

DAILMANACH (Lea) 2W-P. Late Mid-Season.

A superb pink of great quality and breeding. The first "pink" to be awarded the medal for the Best Flower in the R.H.S. Show 1972. The glistening white perianth is perfectly smooth and flat, being formed by very broad petals, rounded at the tip and of great substance. The three quarter length cup is clear bright pink to the base, but a deeper pink at the mouth where it expands sharply into a lovely half roll and is neatly serrated. A strong plant and very consistent. Has now proved itself a superb parent for pinks.

Breeding Inverpolly x Seedling.

DALCHARN (Lea) 2W-P. Late-Season.

A large flower that has very white broad petals which are bluntly pointed, forming a beautifully smooth and naturally flat perianth of great substance. The large cup is clear china pink, that deepens towards the mouth. The cup expands slightly, ending in neat serrations. A strong and vigorous plant with a good tall stem and neck. Seedling No. 2-31-73.

DAYDREAM (Mitsch) 2Y-WWY. Mid-Season.

A magnificent flower by any standard. Perfectly formed of heavy substance and smooth texture in glowing lemon tones. The crown soon fades to nearly pure white. Excellent for show, garden and the flower arranger.

Breeding Binkie x (King of the North x Content).

DELNASHAUGH (Lea) 4W-P. Late-Season.

A very exciting new pink double which was first seen under number 3-39-68 at the A.D.S. Convention Philadelphia, where it created great interest. The broad flat perianth petals are of good substance and rounded at the tip. The double inner segments are clear deep pink and evenly spaced, with the whiter petaloids making a beautifully balanced flower. Which in spite of its size and weight is carried perfectly by the strong stem and neck. The flowers last an unusually long time and keep their clean pink colour to the end. A very useful flower for breeding that increases well.

Breeding Kinbrance x Romance.

DELOS (Navarro) 3W-GWW. Late-Season.

A large flower of great quality, the pure white majestic perianth is formed from broad flat petals contrasting well with short half flat white corona that is green at the base. The tall stem is strong with short neck that naturally gives it good poise. A good strong plant and consistent in quality.

Breeding Tobernaveen x Verona.

Price each £2.50

DEMAND (Phillips) 2Y-Y Mid-Season.

A fine strong growing plant giving an outstanding show bloom, that I describe as a "super" Strines.

DOCTOR HUGH (Duncan) 3W-R. Late-Season.

This is a first class show flower. Brilliant white perianth of large size and perfect in form. The orange-red cup has a beautiful green eye. In my opinion this will prove to be one of the finest flowers in its class.

DUNLEY HALL (Lea) 3W-Y. Late-Season. A.M. R.H.S.

Named at the special request of Mrs. Betty Lea after seeing my bloom win Best in Show at the R.H.S. London 1986 and 1988. This flower was quite outstanding with a large round perianth of superior form, and brilliant white. The small citron yellow cup, with a green eye, is neatly serrated. This unique flower is very beautiful and most worthy of its distinguished name. Seedling No. 4-37-76.

Breeding Loch Assyn x 68/15A.

ELMBRIDGE (Lea) 1W-Y. Mid-Season.

The first to be introduced from a series of bi-coloured trumpets raised by the late John Lea, in fact the first of his from this division. Elmbridge is a very vigorous plant, with broad blue-green foliage and strong stems. This dramatic "all red" flower is almost self coloured. The perianth being only a little paler than the cup. The broad petals forming the perianth are well rounded at the tip, and slightly incurving. The small red cup is nicely serrated at the edge. A good plant with a tall stiff stem. This unique flower is the darkest coloured "all red" so far, and has consistently won its class when shown at the R.H.S.

A rather late flower for a red and yellow in the non-predominant class. Of medium size with a smooth rich yellow perianth and its nicely formed cup has a broad orange rim.


