CULTURED PEARL (Postles) 2W-W. Late-Season.

The name describes the flower perfectly, as it consistently produces such flawless flowers. The perianth is of medium size, smooth and flat, while the rather creamy cup soon changes to give a beautiful self-white flower of great quality. Very late flowering and first prize winner at the R.H.S. Competition 1988 and 89. Perfect cultivar for pot culture, with its tall strong stems. Seedling No 1-30-76.

Breeding Pitchroy x Misty Glen.

INVERCASSLEY (Lea) 3W-R. Mid-Season.

The perianth of this cultivar is so white that it could be used as a yard stick for judging all others. It is large, very broad, and smooth, while the small bright red cup of saucer shape is of perfect proportions. Very free flowering and of superb show quality. The flower has a good neck with lovely poise. Seedling No 4-25-76.

POL CROCAN (Lea) 2W-P. Mid-Season.

A "pink" in the best Lea tradition, having Dailmanach in the breeding on one side and Inverpolly on the other. The rounded, very white perianth is large and well overlapping. The half length deep pink cup has a frosted appearance. A very fine show flower that was much admired in the 3 x 3 "pink" class at the R.H.S. Show 1989. Seedling No 1-45-77.

ROYAL MARINE (Lea) 2W-YOO. Mid-Season.

With this exciting new Lea introduction I am convinced you will have a certain winner. The flower is large, full of substance, colour and vitality. The ovate perianth segments are well overlapping and very smooth. The cup is yellow at the base then changes to the brightest orange-red for $\frac{2}{3}$ of its length, and as a bonus is reasonably sun-proof. Good bulbs, strong growth with good neck all adds to make a first class cultivar. Seedling No 1-20-75.

BELBROUGHTON (Postles) 2W-WWP. Late-Season.

There is no pretence with the colour classification of this flower, with its bright pink rim that is unquestionably non-predominant. The very white perianth is smooth, well overlapping and of good substance inherited from its seen parent. A beautiful flower that is sure to make its mark on the show bench, and in the garden border the effect is startling. On tall strong stems with a well poised bloom. Enthusiastic reports have been received from the U.S.A. when shown at the Washington Convention. Seedling No. 2-48-76.

CORBIERE (Lea) 1Y-Y00. Mid-Season.

This being the first of my selections from John Lea's red trumpet breeding programme. The large round perianth is similar in shape and size to Gold Convention. The dark yellow, straight sided and slightly flared trumpet turns a nice shade of orange as the flower develops. A superb show flower, with a tall stem, and good neck that holds the flower perfectly, which is sun-proof. Produces large healthy bulbs of good increase. Will be invaluable for breeding. Seedling No. Lea 1-13-77.

FLYING COLOURS (Postles) 4Y-Y. Mid-Season.

An all yellow double that has both size and quality. The large perianth is well overlapping, and of good substance. The very full petaloid area is solid and well formed. This very large and heavy flower is held by a short neck on a strong stem at right angles. Most flowers contain a stigma as an added bonus. Exhibited in the winning seedlings class at the R.H.S. Competition 1988. Seedling No. 3-57-76.

LOCH ALSH (Lea) 3W-YYO. Late-Season.

One of the largest roundest flowers that I have seen, which was much admired by visitors last season. The sparkling white perianth is very smooth and round, that can easily measure 4½ inc/115mm in dia. The small yellow cup has a narrow band of orange similar to its seed parent. A superb show flower, as one would expect from its pedigree, being a sister seedling to Dunley Hall. Seedling No. Lea 2-37-76.

Breeding 68/15A x Loch Assynt.

NORMA JEAN (Lea) 2Y-Y. Mid-Season.

This beautiful blonde flower is not just for the show bench, but for all true lovers of daffodils. The two-tone pastel yellow flower was used by John Lea in the 1984 winning Engleheart Cup exhibit with great effect, and has continued to impress with its consistency. Rather pointed perianth petals that are very smooth and overlapping, of pale yellow. The deeper yellow corona is of ¾ length and straight sided. With its subtle colouring it is excellent for multi-vase classes, and beautiful in the garden border. Seedling No. Lea 1-17-75.

WARMINGTON (Lea) 3W-W. Late-Season. A.M. R.H.S.

As a seedling this flower did not fail to impress the most seasoned exhibitor, when seen winning its class and in the Devonshire Trophy at the R.H.S. Competition 1988. Every flower in the daffodil beds were also quite outstanding. New standards of smoothness are set by the beautifully shaped perianth of brilliant white. The small cup is nicely serrated and of the same pure white, with a deep green base. The flower is held at a perfect right angle for exhibition. I am confident that the future is assured for this lovely new cultivator. Seedling No. Lea 4-52-77.

ACHDUART (Lea) 3Y-R. Mid-Season.

A large and beautifully formed red and yellow. A most consistent flower with a lovely smooth perianth of soft gold, nicely balanced by a neatly expanded red cup. Quite the best Div 3 red-yellow yet raised. Was given Award of Merit, R.H.S., as a show flower the first time it was shown in the Winning Engleheart Cup Group. A strong and vigorous plant with a good stem and neck. A sister seedling of Torridon. Best flower R.H.S. 1974, 1981 and 1982.

ARELEY KINGS (Lea) 2W-GWW. Mid-Season.

To stand any chance in this popular division a new introduction has to be very special, and this one is! Exhibited in the late John Lea's last winning Engleheart Cup 1984. This dazzling white flower has a dark green base, and is of remarkable consistency and form. The outer petals are very broad and rounded at the tips, the inner being spade shape. The whole flower is in perfect balance, carried on tall strong stems, with great poise. Seedling No. 1-32-76.

Breeding Misty Glen x Croila.

BADANLOCH (Lea) 3W-YYO. Late Mid-Season.

A very large striking flower of great promise carried on a tall, strong stem and neck to match. The beautifully white perianth is made up of broad smooth, bluntly pointed inner petals, whilst the outer petals are rounded giving a nearly circular flower. The expanding cup has small neat serrations at the mouth, nicely balancing the large perianth. It is pale greeny yellow at the base shading to lemon for $\frac{2}{3}$ of its length, ending in a bright orange rim that is well defined. A tall strong plant that holds the flower correctly. In the Winning Engleheart Cup Group 1980.

BALLINDALLOCH (Lea) 2Y-Y. Early-Season.

An elegant Div 2 flower. The perianth is of deep rich gold, formed by broad bluntly pointed inner petals, the outer petals are rounded. The rather narrow gently expanding elegant cup is a shade darker in colour and is nicely serrated at the mouth. A good strong plant with a tall stem that is consistent in quality. First shown at the R.H.S. Daffodil Competition 1981, under Seedling No. 3-5-72.

Breeding Arctic Gold x (Seedling x Capitol Hill).

Not available for 1990.

BALVENIE (Lea) 2W-WPP. Late Mid-Season.

A very strong large and vigorous pink that forms a large hard bulb that increases well. The white perianth is formed from broad overlapping petals, beautifully in proportion to the half length cup that expands to end in a neat frill and a bright green eye at the base. The cup is pale pink gradually becoming deeper pink in the mouth. In the Winning Engleheart Cup Groups 1977-1978-1979.

Breeding Inverpolly x (Seedling x Merry Widow).

BEN ALIGIN (Lea) 1W-W. Mid-Season.

This flower has quite a remarkable smooth large perianth, which is well overlapping and of beautiful shape and form. The trumpet, which has a half roll to the mouth, opens pale yellow with pinkish tones and soon fades to a lovely milky white. A prolific seed bearer, that will be valuable for breeding. This long lasting flower which was Best Bloom at the International Garden Festival in Liverpool 1984, is a sister seedling to Silver Convention. Seedling No. 2-36-71.

BEN AVON (Lea) IW-W. Early Mid-Season.

A very large white trumpet. The outer perianth petals are extremely broad and bluntly pointed. The inner petals, nearly as broad, are rather more sharply pointed, giving great elegance to the flower which is inherited from Canisp. The rather narrow trumpet, dark green at the base, is gently expanding and ends in a neat half roll. A long lasting and very beautiful flower. Shown in the Engleheart Cup 1980.

BEN HEE (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A sister seedling to Inverpolly. This is a beautiful medium sized flower. Both perianth and cup are very white. The perianth is perfectly formed and very smooth. A most consistent flower and good strong plant. In both Engleheart Cup and Devonshire Trophy exhibits 1978.

Breeding Easter Moon x Omeath.

BEN LEDI (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A beautiful white flower of outstanding pedigree. The large perianth petals are flat, smooth, and rounded at the tips. The well proportioned cup has a nice green base and gently expands to give a very refined appearance to the flower. Good stem and neck that holds the flower well. Its sister seedling was exhibited in John Lea's Winning Engleheart Cup 1984. Seedling No. 2-32-76.

Breeding Misty Glen x Croila.

BEN LOYAL (Lea) 2W-R. Mid-Season.

A very large flower on a strong stem. The perianth petals are broad overlapping forming a nearly round flower. Bred from two un-named seedlings that I have used particularly for white perianths. The resulting perianth is glistening white and forms a majestic background for the well balanced orange-red cup. Shown in the Winning Engleheart Cup 1975.

BEN RINNES (Lea) 3W-R. Mid-Season.

A brilliant red and white Div 3 flower with a sparkling white perianth against which many others look grey. The perianth makes a tremendous contrast with an expanding, rather frilly red cup. The whole flower being beautifully proportioned on a strong straight stem with a good neck.

Breeding (Arbar x Kilworth) x Arbar.

BEN VORLICH (Lea) 2W-YOO. Mid-Season.

Released by popular demand, this cultivar having already won the accolade of Best Seedling at the Daffodil Society Show. The large sparkling white petals of lovely smooth texture, and the bright orange-red flared cup make an instant eye catching bloom. Jointly introduced by Carncairn who had excellent flowers of this seedling on their R.H.S. Stand 1987. First class for show or in the garden border, where it blooms quite early for this division. Very strong stem and neck that holds the flower perfectly. Seedling No. 2-34-66.

BRIERGLASS (Lea) 2W-W. Mid-Season.

A flower as polished as the finest crystal glass. A medium sized flower that can only be described as a white Golden Aura. First prize R.H.S. London 1985. Major prize winner at R.H.S. and Daffodil Society Show 1986. Seedling No. 2-21-75.

BROADWAY VILLAGE (Postles) 2Y-YRR. Early-Season.

This very colourful flower has been named after one of the prettiest villages in England. The mid-yellow perianth petals are smooth, flat, very broad and of excellent substance. The rather flat cup is bright red with a yellow base that gives the whole flower a very fiery effect. An excellent plant that is tall, strong and early flowering. Seedling No. 7-42-75.

Breeding Stourbridge x Torrison.

BUNCLOUDY (Lea) 2Y-R. Late-Season.

A brilliant coloured flower with an intense red cup and a smooth flat perianth of richest gold. A medium sized flower, very useful as a late red-yellow. A consistent show quality flower and excellent in the garden. In the Winning Engleheart Cup Group 1975.

Breeding Revelry x Seedling.

BURNTOLLET (Lea) IW-W. Mid-Season.

It is a beautifully smooth textured pure white flower of largest size which consistently produces good show specimens. The petals tend to hood slightly but they are easily pressed back to remain perfectly flat at right angles to the long and nicely flanged trumpet. Best Bloom Daffodil Society Show 1984.

Breeding Glenshesk x Empress of Ireland.

CAIRNTOUL (Lea) 3W-OOR. Late Mid-Season.

A very striking flower. The brilliant white perianth is formed from smooth flat petals that are carried at right angles. It makes a great contrast to the bright red flat cup. An exceptionally tall flower with a strong stem and good neck. Very consistent in show quality as its record shows. Seedling No. 2-27-67. Won R.H.S. Single Bloom Class 1977 and in the Winning Engleheart Cup Groups 1978-1979-1981-1982 and 1983.

Breeding Merlin x Rockall.

CREAG DUBH (Lea) 2O-R. Early Mid-Season.

This very unusual flower caused great interest when first shown in London in 1976. The perianth is coppery orange red, being only a little paler than the orange cup. A medium to large size flower, on a tall strong stem. This new colour break is going to be very important for breeding self orange and red flowers. Seedling No. 2-26-69. Shown in the Engleheart Cup Group 1980.

Breeding (Chungking x Spry)
x (Home Fires x Vulcan).

Not available for 1990.

CANISP (Lea) 2W-W. Early Mid-Season.

An outstandingly beautiful flower of near trumpet proportions and of the highest quality. The lovely smooth perianth is formed from pure white petals, broad and overlapping slightly pointed at the tips and making a most elegant foil for the trumpet that is slightly expanding, sometimes the mouth is neatly rolled. The base gleams with green lights. This elegant flower is most consistent and has been Best Bloom at R.H.S. shows on several occasions and in Winning Engleheart Cup Group 1971. Best Bloom R.H.S. Competition, R.H.S. Show and Daffodil Society Show 1983 season.

CHINA DOLL (Postles) 2W-WWP. Late-Season.

This is the first pink rimmed flower that I have raised from Dailmanach, which has received the award of Best Seedling at the 1984 Daffodil Society Show. Sparkling white perianth that is broad, overlapping, and is full of substance. The large cup expands gently to a distinct pink rim. A truly beautiful flower. Seedling No. 2-34-74.

Breeding Lea Seedling x Dailmanach.
Only a few bulbs available.

COLLEY GATE (Lea) 3W-YR. Mid-Season.

This quite distinct Div 3 flower is a sister seedling to Cairntoul. It has a beautiful white, slightly pointed perianth which is very smooth and well overlapping. The very neat cup is evenly divided between yellow and bright orange-red, with a nicely frilled edge. A very successful show flower being exhibited under No. 1-27-67 winning many first prizes. Featured in A.D.S. Journal, December 1982, page 69. A good plant with a tall stem and strong neck that holds the flower perfectly.

Breeding Merlin x Rockall.

CRAIG STIEL (Lea) 2Y-R. Mid-Season.

Orange flushes through the deep yellow perianth makes this flower look very special. The form and texture of this flower is superb and is inherited from the pollen parent. The half length, straight sided cup is of deepest red. A medium sized flower of real quality, on tall strong stems with good necks. Seedling No. 1-52-73.

Breeding Bunclody x Torridon.

CROILA (Lea) 2W-GW. Late Mid-Season.

A lovely all white Div 2 flower of nearly perfect symmetry and form. The perianth petals are broad and bluntly pointed, smooth and flat. The short cup is straight sided except at the mouth where it expands to form a nice even half roll. A very consistent flower with a good stem and neck that holds the flower perfectly. Best Seedling Daffodil Society Show 1977. Seedling No. 1-25-68.

Breeding Pitchroy x Seedling.

CUL BEAG (Lea) 3W-R. Mid-Season.

One of the finest Div 3 flowers. A perfectly formed flower with broad rounded petals making an almost round perianth. The well formed cup being an intense red. The very white perianth forms a perfect background. A consistent and strong growing plant, shown in the Winning Engleheart Cup Group 1971-1973-1975-1977 and 1980.

DAILMANACH (Lea) 2W-P. Late Mid-Season.

A superb pink of great quality and breeding. The first "pink" to be awarded the medal for the Best Flower in the R.H.S. Show 1972. The glistening white perianth is perfectly smooth and flat, being formed by very broad petals, rounded at the tip and of great substance. The $\frac{3}{4}$ length cup is clear bright pink to the base, but a deeper pink at the mouth where it expands sharply into a lovely half roll and is neatly serrated. A strong plant and very consistent. Shown several times in the Engleheart Cup Group. Was not only the Best Flower R.H.S. Show 1979 but the reserve Best Flower and the Best in the Novice Classes. In New Zealand it won the Ramsey Cup for pinks. Has now proved itself a superb parent for pinks.

DALCHARN (Lea) 2W-P. Late-Season.

A large flower that has very white broad petals which are bluntly pointed, forming a beautifully smooth and naturally flat perianth of great substance. The large cup is clear china pink, that deepens towards the mouth. The cup expands slightly, ending in neat serrations. A strong and vigorous plant with a good tall stem and neck. Seedling No. 2-31-73.

DELNASHAUGH (Lea) 4W-P. Late-Season.

A very exciting new pink double which was first seen under number 3-39-68 at the A.D.S. Convention Philadelphia, where it created great interest. The broad flat perianth petals are of good substance and rounded at the tip. The double inner segments are clear deep pink and evenly spaced, with the whiter petaloids making a beautifully balanced flower. Which in spite of its size and weight is carried perfectly by the strong stem and neck. The flowers last an unusually long time and keep their clean pink colour to the end. A very useful flower for breeding that increases well.

DUNLEY HALL (Lea) 3W-Y. Late-Season. A.M. R.H.S.

Named at the special request of Mrs. Betty Lea after seeing my bloom win Best in Show at the R.H.S. London 1986 and 1988. This flower was quite outstanding with a large round perianth of superior form, and brilliant white. The small citron yellow cup, with a green eye, is neatly serrated. This unique flower is very beautiful and most worthy of its distinguished name. Seedling No. 4-37-76.

Breeding 68/15A x Loch Assynt
Only a few bulbs available.

ERISKAY (Lea) 4W-Y. Late Mid-Season.

The outer perianth petals are flat, forming a smooth frame for the neatly double inner yellow segments and white petals in alternative layers. The yellow segments are faintly flushed with pink and are slightly serrated and frilled. A good stem and neck holds the flower well. A strong and vigorous plant that increases freely. The flower normally carries both anther and stamen.

GLEN CASSLEY (Lea) 3W-W. Late-Season.

This is a beautiful pure white medium sized flower with great elegance and is one of the whitest flowers raised. The very broad petals well rounded at the tip, form a nearly circular perianth. The rather flat cup that is neatly serrated, opens with a pale citron yellow rim that soon fades to pure white. A fine show flower with a good stem and neck. First shown under No. 2-28-72 in the Winning Guy Wilson Memorial Trophy in 1982.

GLEN CLOVA (Lea) 2Y-ORR. Early-Season.

A flower of almost trumpet proportions. The broad slightly reflexing petals form a nearly circular perianth of rich deep gold. The trumpet, orange at the base, turns to a striking red at the mouth. The flower in our part of the world is sunproof and should be useful for breeding red trumpets.

GLENDARROCH (Lea) 3W-YOO. Mid-Season

The present colour coding is inadequate when trying to describe the cup colour of this beautiful flower, which is of lovely soft tangerine. Glistening white rounded petals of superb form act as a backcloth to this exciting new introduction. Quite distinctly coloured from anything that I have yet seen, and produces perfect show blooms of amazing consistency. A very good strong grower of rapid increase. Good stocks enable me to introduce this at a very modest price. Seedling No. 1-26-74.

GLEN ISLA (Lea) IW-GW. Mid-Season.

A large and majestic very white trumpet with a lovely green flush at the base. The smooth pure white perianth petals are very broad, rounded at the tip and form a fine background for the trumpet that is beautifully proportioned. A good show flower and a strong plant that increases rapidly.

GLEN ROTHES (Lea) 2W-P. Late-Season.

A lovely medium sized pink, bred from Inverpolly. The $\frac{3}{4}$ length cup gradually expands to end in a neat half roll of rich pink, solid to the base. The perfectly smooth white perianth is formed with broad flat petals, being pointed at the tip. A fine flower which has been very consistent in form. It has a strong stem and good neck that holds the flower correctly. In the Winning Engleheart Cup Group 1978.

GOLD CONVENTION (Lea) 2Y-Y. Mid-Season.

A new break in golden trumpets. This wonderful flower has a nearly round flat perianth formed from immensely broad smooth petals, well rounded at the tip. The trumpet is rather narrow, slightly expanding to a neatly serrated mouth and is of rich maximus gold. The whole forming a very beautiful and elegant flower on a tall stem with a good neck. A vigorous and very consistent show flower that has four times been in the Winning Engleheart Cup Group. Seedling No. 1-32-68. Best Bloom Daffodil Society Show 1985.

HALGARRY (Lea) 3W-YJR. Late-Season.

A beautiful smooth round flower formed by very broad perianth petals of glistening white. The small non-predominant cup has a bright red serrated rim. A long lasting flower of consistent show quality with a good tall stem and neck. Shown in the Winning Engleheart Cup 1984. Seedling No. 1-25-76.

Breeding 68/15a x Colley Gate.

HARTLEBURY (Lea) 3W-R. Late-Season.

A really magnificent white and red Div. 3 flower, that has a large brilliant white perianth, well overlapping, smooth and rounded at the tips. The flower is complimented by a deep red small cup which is neatly serrated at the edge. A beautiful flower in the best Lea traditions that should have a great future. Tall stems with good necks, large bulbs of good increase. Seedling No. 1-24-76.

HESLINGTON (Postles) 3W-GYR. Late-Season.

This is a very attractive flower by any standard. The smooth well overlapping perianth has delicately pointed tips giving a very pleasing appearance to the flower. The small neat cup has a serrated edge of bright red. A superb non-predominant which is very consistent in form. Best Bloom R.H.S. Competition 1987. Seedling No. 1-8-74.
