Welcome to my 2012 list. I'm pleased to be able to offer a good selection of galanthus this year, although there are only a few of each one available, since I will only send flowering sized bulbs, and my stocks are recovering from the 2010-2011 winter. There are also some new and VERY rare narcissi available for the first time in the UK. I'm currently attempting to construct my new website (cue much wailing and gnashing of teeth) so hopefully soon you'll be able to access better photos of the plants online. I hope you enjoy browsing, and look forward to hearing from you.

**PLEASE NOTE – MOST ITEMS ARE IN VERY LIMITED NUMBERS, SO PLEASE APPLY EARLY**, most items are in very limited numbers, so please apply early, **LAST DATE FOR ORDERS END OF JULY**, as I will replant any unsold bulbs then. Orders will be dealt with in the order in which they arrive. Dispatch will begin in July, or as soon as bulbs can be harvested. Snowdrops, celandines and anemones will be damp-packed for posting. Please note that occasionally a rogue seedling finds its way in, so if you end up with the wrong flower, please let me know and I will replace it. All bulbs should be flowering size.

Postage and Packaging - A single bulb - £1-50 Other orders containing only dry bulbs - £3-50.

Orders containing damp-packed items – £4-50.

Parcels will be sent by first class post, recorded delivery, so will need to be signed for.


<p><b>Acis nicaeensis</b></p> <p>£2.00 40 available</p>	<p>Formerly Leucojum nicaeense, a pretty little April-flowering bulb, which will happily seed into a sand plunge, if you let it. Grows to 8-10cm, with 2 or 3 little white lampshades per stem. Survived -7°C under glass last winter. Dry summer rest.</p>	
<p><b>Acis rosea</b></p> <p>£3-00 20 available</p>	<p>(Used to be Leucojum roseum) Autumn-flowering snowflake with tiny pink bells to 6cm high over short prostrate foliage.</p>	
<p><b>Adoxa moschatellina</b></p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>Town Hall Clock. A native plant of ancient woodland with anemone-like foliage and small curious green flowers composed of five florets, one each pointing in four directions outwards and one pointing straight up.</p>	
<p><b>Allium callimischon ssp haemostictum</b></p> <p>£2-50 for 5 40 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering onion to 10cm, small white flowers with red spots. Do not remove 'dead' upright stems during dormancy - these will carry the flowers later. I will carefully pack these so as not to disturb the flowering stems, so unpack with care!</p>	
<p><b>Anemone nemorosa</b></p> <p>£1-50</p>	<p>Wild English type. Well-loved woodland anemone flowering March to April. White, often tinged pink. To 15cm.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone nemorosa deep pink form</b></p> <p>£2-00</p>	<p>A selection of the wild type found many years ago, opening white and quickly fading to a deep pink.</p>	


<p><b>Anemone nemorosa 'Flore Pleno'</b></p> <p>£2.50</p>	<p>The naming of this and the following variety are not 100% certain. These are the names I received them under, but the descriptions are of the plants offered. Similar to 'Vestal', below, but later flowering and having no stamens so a cleaner, neater looking flower - our favourite.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone nemorosa 'Vestal'</b></p> <p>£2.50</p>	<p>Anemone-centred double white, ie outer 'petals' normal with a white boss in the centre surrounded by stamens giving a button effect.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone nemorosa 'Lychette'</b></p> <p>£2.50 5 available</p>	<p>Large flowered variety of the UK wild wood anemone.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone nemorosa 'Virescens'</b></p> <p>£3-00</p>	<p>All petals replaced by leaves to give a rosette effect. The first variety into 'flower' and the longest lasting since the 'petals' never drop.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone ranunculoides 'Laciniata'</b></p> <p>£2.50</p>	<p>I'm not sure about this name, although original stock came from a very reputable source. It is a very compact form of A. ranunculoides in which the foliage is quite dark at emergence and flowering time, which sets off the golden flowers beautifully.</p>	
<p><b>Anemone ranunculoides 'Pleniflora'</b></p> <p>£2.50</p>	<p>Semi-double golden yellow flowers, vigorous.</p>	


<p><b>Anemone x lipsiensis</b></p> <p>£2.50</p>	<p>A beautiful pale sulphur yellow hybrid between <i>Aa. nemorosa</i> and <i>ranunculoides</i>.</p>	
<p><b>Colchicum agrippinum</b></p> <p>£2-00 or 3 for £5-00</p>	<p>Neat colchicum with pink, heavily chequered flowers in autumn, and leaves to 20cm in spring.</p>	
<p><b>Colchicum autumnale 'Alboplenum'</b></p> <p>£3.00 5 available</p>	<p>Autumn-flowering bulb with beautiful double white flowers for a very long period from Sept-Nov. 30cm/12" high leaves appear in spring. Full sun or partial shade in a well-drained soil.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus tommasianus albus</b></p> <p>£2-00 10 available</p>	<p>The first of 2 forms of the white 'tommy', this one has white flowers with faint blue flecks on the outside.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus tommasianus albus blue stripe</b></p> <p>£2-50 10 available</p>	<p>This form has white flowers with delicate lilac lines on the segments, from Janis Ruksans.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus tommasianus 'Bobbo'</b></p> <p>£2-50 5 available</p>	<p>An eye-catching form of this easy spring crocus with lavender flowers neatly tipped with white.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus tommasianus roseus</b></p> <p>£2-50 5 available</p>	<p>Pretty 'Tommy' with deep pink flowers opening from greyish buds.</p>	
<p><b>Eranthis x tubergenii 'Guinea Gold'</b></p> <p>£5-00 5 available</p>	<p>Choice hybrid between <i>E. hyemalis</i> and <i>E. cilicica</i>, later flowering and with larger flowers and bronzy leaves.</p>	
<p><b>Fritillaria aurea</b></p> <p>£4-00</p>	<p>A charmer, only a few cm high with large chubby bells of golden yellow chequered with black.</p>	
<p><b>Fritillaria davidii</b></p> <p>£5-00</p>	<p>Grow in a humus-rich soil and do not allow to dry out when dormant. Leafs up very early for a frit in early autumn. Very unusual netted-vein leaves and yellow bells with chequered insides on short stalks.</p>	

<p><b>Fritillaria pinardii Ilgaz form</b></p> <p>£4-50</p>	<p>A beautiful little frit with yellow-edged purple bells with a blue 'bloom', grows to about 17cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Anne of Geierstein'</b></p> <p>£15-00 5 available</p>	<p>Smallish snowdrop with flowers of heavy substance, with corrugated outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Armine'</b></p> <p>£5-00 5 available</p>	<p>A curious flower with a small spherical ovary, a narrow 'v' at the apex of the inner segments, and two paler oval eye-spots near the base.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Bertram Anderson'</b></p> <p>£9-00 5 available</p>	<p>An early flowering snowdrop with large, thick textured flowers on upright stems.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Bill Bishop'</b></p> <p>£10-00 10 available</p>	<p>Another fine early snowdrop, the large flowers on short stems having very long outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Blonde Inge'</b></p> <p>£10-00 3 available</p>	<p>Distinctive small snowdrop with yellow markings on the inner segments, but a green ovary.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Cedric's Prolific'</b></p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>Tall, vigorous snowdrop selected by Beth Chatto. Flowers have a two-tone X on inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Compton Court'</b></p> <p>£9-00 3 available</p>	<p>A gift from Brian Duncan in Ireland, this is a tall and shapely snowdrop with lovely solid, rounded flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Diggory'</b></p> <p>£20-00 1 available</p>	<p>Well-known snowdrop with heavily puckered outer segments pinched under at the apex, and green inners.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Dionysus'</b></p> <p>£5-00 3 available</p>	<p>Another Greatorex double hybrid, this time the mark on the inner segments is deep green at the apical end, blurring to paler as it approaches the base.</p>	


<p><b>Galanthus 'Dreycott Greentip'</b></p> <p>£18-00 8 available</p>	<p>Hard to come by green-tipped snowdrop growing to about 12-15cm high, the fleshy spathe valves pressed together over the pedicel. Occasionally the valves will split as in 'Scharlockii' .</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus elwesii Hiemalis Gp 'Barnes'</b></p> <p>£7-00 3 available</p>	<p>Probably the earliest flowering elwesii, with well shaped flowers and a neat 'moustache' mark on the inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Erway'</b></p> <p>£10-00 15 available</p>	<p>This snowdrop surprised me with its distinctiveness even at a distance. The flower stem is very upright with the flower hanging close to the stem, with an elongated olive green ovary as long as the inner segments which are almost all green.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Faringdon Double'</b></p> <p>£9-00 3 available</p>	<p>This is the earliest of the double snowdrops, flowering here in mid-December last year. It has a sturdy upright habit, and well shaped, large flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus fosteri</b></p> <p>£8-00 3 available</p>	<p>A favourite species with glossy dark green leaves and scented flowers with flattened outer segments, and marks on top and base of inners. Not tried outdoors.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Ginns' Imperati'</b></p> <p>£5-00 15 available</p>	<p>A vigorous mid-season snowdrop famed for its powerful almond scent.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus gracilis</b></p> <p>£7-00 5 available</p>	<p>Mixed seedlings from a strain with chunky flowers on 6-7cm stems. Much admired.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Hippolyta'</b></p> <p>£4-00 5 available</p>	<p>Another Greatorex double hybrid with chunky little flowers. The outer segments are deeply dished, and the mark on the regular inners a neat green 'U'.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'James Backhouse'</b></p> <p>£2-50 15 available</p>	<p>Formerly 'Atkinsii', this is a very early flowering snowdrop with elongated flowers on 20cm stems, occasionally producing an aberrant petal or two – see photo.</p>	



<p><b>Galanthus 'John Gray'</b></p> <p>£8-00 10 available</p>	<p>Fat buds give way to large flowers with a dark green X on the inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lady Beatrix Stanley'</b></p> <p>£3-00 20 available</p>	<p>Distinctive little double snowdrop with two small dots at the apex of the inner segments. A good doer in the garden.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lady Elphinstone'</b></p> <p>£4-00 20 available</p>	<p>A double nivalis, with variable yellow markings. Even on old clumps some plants will show green marks, but not the same ones each year - frustrating! Caveat emptor..</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lavinia'</b></p> <p>£5-00 10 available</p>	<p>A medium height double with good regular, large flowers. Flowers second half of February for us.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lerinda'</b></p> <p>£3-00 20 available</p>	<p>Tall shapely snowdrop with rounded flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Magnet'</b></p> <p>£4-00 20 available</p>	<p>Classic snowdrop with long arching pedicels which set the flowers swinging in the faintest breeze.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Merlin'</b></p> <p>£6-00 10 available</p>	<p>Classic snowdrop with its signature small spherical ovary and almost all green inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Modern Art'</b></p> <p>£12-00 5 available</p>	<p>Very distinctive snowdrop with green marks on both apex and base of outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Mrs McNamara'</b></p> <p>£10-00 15 available</p>	<p>A classy snowdrop usually flowering in January, well shaped solid flowers held above the spathe, and the flowers presented well above glaucous leaves.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Mrs Thompson'</b></p> <p>£10-00 2 available</p>	<p>A beautiful snowdrop, despite being completely crazy and frequently producing an assortment of flower types, from two to a scape, or several extra segments, sometimes two flowers fused together.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus nivalis green tips</b></p> <p>£5-00 5 available</p>	<p>From Cliff Curtis, as described in the name!</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus peshmenii</b></p> <p>£4-00 or 3 for £11-00 30 available</p>	<p>Dainty autumn flowering snowdrop with flowers 12cm high before the leaves in Sep-Oct. Leaves are glaucous. I grow mine in an alpine house where it is easy given a dry summer rest.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Primrose Warburg'</b></p> <p>£20-00 5 available</p>	<p>Glaucous leaved snowdrop with well-shaped flowers with an oval yellow ovary, and greenish yellow apical mark with rounded ends on inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Robin Hood'</b></p> <p>£7-00 15 available</p>	<p>Robust upright growing snowdrop with X shaped mark on inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'S. Arnott'</b></p> <p>£2-50 15 available</p>	<p>Tall and vigorous with large rounded flowers that are well scented. A deservedly popular classic.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Scharlockii'</b></p> <p>£5-00 10 available</p>	<p>The classic 'donkey-eared' snowdrop with the long split spathe, and green tipped outer segments. Smaller growing than 'Viridapice'. Few.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Selborne Green Tips'</b></p> <p>£9-00 2 available</p>	<p>A snowdrop with strikingly marked inners, having a bold double green mark, and variable green lines on apex of outer segments. Often produces an extra flower.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Spindleston Surprise'</b></p> <p>£20-00 5 available</p>	<p>Green-leaved snowdrop with yellow ovary and greenish yellow apical mark on inner segments with pointed ends. Vigorous.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Straffan'</b></p> <p>£4-50 10 available</p>	<p>A very old cultivar with well-shaped flowers of good substance, regularly producing two scapes once settled. Vigorous and sturdy.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Tiny Tim'</b></p> <p>£2-00 20 available</p>	<p>A snowdrop identical to ordinary G. nivalis, except slightly smaller in all its parts.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'Viridapice'</b></p> <p>£3-00 15 available</p>	<p>Tall, vigorous snowdrop with green-tipped outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Washfield Colesbourne'</b></p> <p>£15-00 5 available</p>	<p>Elegant hybrid snowdrop with all-green inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Wendy's Gold'</b></p> <p>£15-00 15 available</p>	<p>A vigorous <i>plicatus</i> variety with all yellow markings.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus x allenii</b></p> <p>£9-00 3 available</p>	<p>A very old sterile hybrid, probably alpinus x woronowii, broad leaves and flowers with an oblong ovary, neat mark on inners, and flattened outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Ipheion dialystemon</b></p> <p>£3-00 5 available</p>	<p>An interesting small (non-weedy!) ipheion, growing to 8cm or so, with 8 golden yellow segments, the outer 4 bisected by a blackish narrow line.</p>	Sorry no photo, I'm afraid you'll have to resort to Google...
<p><b>Leucojum vernum</b></p> <p>£1-00 20 available</p>	<p>One or two large green-tipped bells on 30cm stems in spring.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Andy Blanchard' P.C.</b></p> <p>£15-00 5 available</p>	<p>I'm pleased to be able to offer a few of this hybrid for the first time. A beautiful hybrid between triandrus and cyclamineus, with prostrate curling leaves and 1-2 flowers per stem which are, in essence, a pale lemon version of N. cyclamineus. Named after my brother. Much admired at the shows.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus asturiensis</b></p> <p>£8-00 5 available</p>	<p>A tiny daffodil, not often offered, and a favourite of mine. These have the classic shape of the wild plant with perianth swept forward, and a long waisted corona. Only 5-6cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus asturiensis x Candlepower ex 01/19</b></p> <p>£3-00 5 available</p>	<p>A Brian Duncan hybrid, grows to about 15cm with nicely poised yellow flowers.</p>	

<p><b>Narcissus Atlas Gold</b></p> <p>£4-00 5 available</p>	<p>Hoop petticoat daffodil with widely-flaring golden yellow flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Candlepower'</b></p> <p>£12-00 10 available</p>	<p>A very classy Alec Gray hybrid with dainty trumpet flowers about 3cm across, pale yellow fading to white, on 10cm stems. A rare gem.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus cantabricus foliosus</b></p> <p>£1-50 15 available</p>	<p>Very early creamy white hoop petticoat with long narrow flowers. Grows to about 15cm.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus cuatrecasasii</b></p> <p>£2-50 5 available</p>	<p>Not sure about this plant. Seed with this name came from a friend in New Zealand, and the flowers resemble N. rupicola but a different colour – a soft sulphur yellow – and so far only one flower per stem.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus cyclamineus x Camborne 3236</b></p> <p>£6-00 1 available</p>	<p>A hybrid from Brian Duncan – the small creamy white flowers have a long trumpet and strongly reflexed perianth. 10cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Douglasbank'</b></p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>The original bulbs of this variety came from Douglasbank, the garden of Willie Buchanan in Milngavie, Glasgow. It is similar to N. asturiensis, but larger at about 12-15cm, and a good garden variety. Photo: Mark Smyth.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Eyestettensis'</b></p> <p>£4-50 5 available</p>	<p>"Queen Anne's Double Daffodil" a very special old variety with creamy petals, each layer stacked up on the one below. I think this one will prefer a cool, lightly shaded site.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Gipsy Queen'</b></p> <p>£2-00 15 available</p>	<p>Another small Alec Gray hybrid, and a good parent as it is very fertile both ways. Growing to only about 8cm even under glass, it has glaucous foliage and pale lemon flowers with the trumpet tipped in a darker shade.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Jim Lad' P.C.</b></p> <p>£4-00 30 available</p>	<p>Narcissus rupicola x asturiensis. Our own hybrid. Flower about 2cm wide, with a corona about 8mm long, golden yellow throughout and growing to about 12cm high, shorter outside. Did well in a trough here the last 3 winters, even down to -17°C.</p>	

<p><b>Narcissus jonquilla var henriquesii</b></p> <p>£1-00 15 available</p>	<p>Note we now have a varietal name for the bulbs previously offered as just jonquilla, although some people still are not convinced! A latish, multi-headed daffodil with powerfully scented golden flowers. To 30cm under glass.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Joy Bishop'</b></p> <p>£2-00 15 available</p>	<p>A creamy yellow hoop petticoat with very clean, solid flowers neatly scalloped rather than frilled around the mouth of the corona. Name confirmed by Joy herself.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus KB/M/1/98</b></p> <p>£12-00 7 available</p>	<p>A miniature bicoloured hybrid from Keira nursery in Australia. Useful for breeding miniatures, fertile both ways. 12cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus K2/2000</b></p> <p>£15-00 3 available</p>	<p>Another of Graham Fleming's hybrids from Keira nursery, opening with white perianth and yellow trumpet, quickly fading to all white. 10cm high. Exhibition quality flower, rated very highly by Graham.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Little Spell'</b></p> <p>£3-00 3 available</p>	<p>Obtained from Kath Dryden, this is a lovely intermediate daffodil with elegant flowers with lemon perianth and long white trumpet. 25cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Mite'</b></p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>An elegant early spring daffodil with a long narrow trumpet and swept back perianth. Good doer outside.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Mitimoto'</b></p> <p>£4-00 10 available</p>	<p>An innovative daffodil – the first bicoloured hoop petticoat. Another Aussie import. Golden corona, white perianth.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus obesus</b></p> <p>£2-00 10 available</p>	<p>Sturdy hoop petticoat daffodil with large golden yellow bells about 5cm long, slightly incurved at the open end. Up to 15cm high, with prostrate, curling leaves.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus obesus x triandrus</b></p> <p>£7-50 4 available</p>	<p>My own hybrids, mixed seedlings so it's pot luck, but all charming. Short stems with tubby primrose yellow flowers, slightly pendant.</p>	

<p><b>Narcissus pallidiflorus x triandrus</b></p> <p>£5-00 10 available</p>	<p>Another mixed bag of my own seedlings, offered as a curiosity.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus pallidiflorus x watieri clone 1</b></p> <p>£8-00 4 available</p>	<p>A release of just a very few of this lovely daff bred here. Growing to 15cm high, With a white perianth and pale yellow cup fading to creamy white.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus rupicola x cyclamineus</b></p> <p>£8-00 5 available</p>	<p>Mixed seedlings of this lovely cross. About 8cm high with swept back perianth. Golden yellow.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Sidora' P.C.</b></p> <p>£6-00 5 available</p>	<p>Narcissus cyclamineus x asturiensis. Elegant small narcissus of my own raising, longish frilled trumpet and slightly swept-back petals. Starts flowering mid-February and continues for a long period. Recently accepted into the approved list of miniatures for exhibition.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus wilkomii</b></p> <p>£2-00 8 available</p>	<p>One to three deep golden flowers per stem, and rush-like foliage. About 15-20cm high.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus x incurvicervicus</b></p> <p>£3-00 5 available</p>	<p>A natural hybrid between <i>N fernandesii</i> and <i>N triandrus</i>, growing to about 30cm high with several lemon yellow flowers with swept back petals to each stem. Delicate and lovely. Flowers March.</p>	
<p><b>Narcissus 'Xit'</b></p> <p>£1-50 8 available</p>	<p>Another fine Alec Gray hybrid from <i>N. watieri</i>, similar to Segovia above, but with pristine white flowers. Grows to 30cm under glass.</p>	
<p><b>Oxalis perdicaria (syn lobata) 'Cetrino'</b></p> <p>£2-00 20 available</p>	<p>A beautiful cream-coloured form of this normally yellow species. Leaves in spring, which die away, then leaves with flowers in late summer/autumn. Easy in alpine house.</p>	
<p><b>Paris quadrifolia</b></p> <p>£4-00 10 available</p>	<p>A British native of ancient woodlands. Whorl of four leaves topped with a flower comprising four narrow green petals, followed by a single large black berry. Good divisions supplied.</p>	

<p><b>Ranunculus ficaria 'Aurantiacus'</b></p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>Green heart-shaped leaves and warm orange flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Ranunculus ficaria 'Collarette'</b></p> <p>£2.50 5 available</p>	<p>A form of the native celandine with normal outer petals and a tight boss of petals in the centre. Compact and sterile.</p>
