Welcome to my 2013 list. In this year's summer list I am excited to be offering, for the first time, a few plants of some stunning new varieties of wood anemones collected by Taavi Tuulik in Estonian woods. I've spent several years nurturing the tiny pieces he sent me, and can at last offer just one or two pieces of some of the varieties. These are very special plants not available elsewhere in the UK, and won't be in any quantity for several more years. Now is your chance to buy one of these very rare and beautiful anemones. You can see better photos of the plants on my website. I hope you enjoy browsing, and look forward to hearing from you.

PLEASE NOTE – MOST ITEMS ARE IN VERY LIMITED NUMBERS, SO PLEASE APPLY EARLY, most items are in very limited numbers, so please apply early, **LAST DATE FOR ORDERS END OF JULY**, as I will replant any unsold bulbs then. Orders will be dealt with in the order in which they arrive. Dispatch will begin in July, or as soon as bulbs can be harvested. Snowdrops and anemones will be damp-packed for posting. Please note that occasionally a rogue seedling finds its way in, so if you end up with the wrong flower, please let me know and I will replace it. All bulbs should be flowering size, unless otherwise stated.

POSTAGE AND PACKING- £4-00 per order. The new Royal Mail charges for parcels are much higher than last year! I am asking for less than the actual cost of delivery and packaging. If your order can be sent as Large Letter, I will refund any extra postage. If ordering from the EU, please ask for delivery prices. Parcels will be sent by first class post, recorded delivery, so will need to be signed for.




<p>Acis nicaeensis</p> <p>£3 5 available</p>	<p>Formerly Leucojum nicaeense, a pretty little April-flowering bulb, which will happily seed into a sand plunge, if you let it. Grows to 8-10cm, with 2 or 3 little white lampshades per stem. Survived -7°C under glass last winter. Dry summer rest.</p>	
<p>Acis rosea</p> <p>£3 5 available</p>	<p>(Used to be Leucojum roseum) Autumn-flowering snowflake with tiny pink bells to 6cm high over short prostrate foliage.</p>	
<p>Adoxa moschatellina</p> <p>£2.50 5 available</p>	<p>Town Hall Clock. A native plant of ancient woodland with anemone-like foliage and small curious green flowers composed of five florets, one each pointing in four directions outwards and one pointing straight up.</p>	
<p>Anemone nemorosa</p> <p>£1-50</p>	<p>Wild English type. Well-loved woodland anemone flowering March to April. White, often tinged pink. To 15cm.</p>	
<p>Anemone nemorosa Blue seedling</p> <p>£3 5 available</p>	<p>Good blue seedling, self-sown here into a gravel path! Compact grower. First time offered.</p>	
<p>Anemone nemorosa 'Flore Pleno'</p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>The naming of this and the following variety are not 100% certain. These are the names I received them under, but the descriptions are of the plants offered. Similar to 'Vestal', below, but later flowering and having no stamens so a cleaner, neater looking flower - our favourite.</p>	




<p>Anemone nemorosa Maret</p> <p>£15.00 2 available</p>	<p>New variety from Taavi Tuulik in Estonia. Lovely large semi-double white flowers. First time offered, and only two to spare. One per customer.</p>	
<p>Anemone nemorosa 'Virescens'</p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>All petals replaced by leaves to give a rosette effect. The first variety into 'flower' and the longest lasting since the 'petals' never drop.</p>	
<p>Anemone ranunculoides Golden Dream</p> <p>£20.00 1 available</p>	<p>Fabulous new variety from Taavi Tuulik in Estonia. Yellow flowers with variable ruff of dark green petaloid stamens in centre. First time offered, and only one to spare.</p>	
<p>Anemone ranunculoides Hiiumaa</p> <p>£20.00 1 available</p>	<p>Beautiful new variety from Taavi Tuulik in Estonia. Yellow flowers with a boss of narrow yellow petaloid stamens in centre. First time offered, and only one to spare.</p>	
<p>Anemone ranunculoides 'Laciniata'</p> <p>£2.50 15 available</p>	<p>I'm not sure about this name, although original stock came from a very reputable source. It is a very compact form of A. ranunculoides in which the foliage is quite dark at emergence and flowering time, which sets off the golden flowers beautifully.</p>	
<p>Anemone ranunculoides 'Pleniflora'</p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>Semi-double golden yellow flowers, vigorous.</p>	





<p>Anemone x lipsiensis bracteate Swedish form</p> <p>£15 1 available</p>	<p>Another beautiful new variety from Taavi Tuulik in Estonia. A bracteate form of the hybrid between <i>Anemone nemorosa</i> and <i>A. ranunculoides</i>, with some of the petals partly converted to leaves. First time offered, and only one to spare.</p>	
<p><i>Colchicum hungaricum</i></p> <p>£4 5 available</p>	<p>Small growing colchicum suitable for pot or trough. Beautiful pink flowers about 4cm across and narrow, short leaves.</p>	
<p>Crocus banaticus</p> <p>£3 8 available</p>	<p>Beautiful autumn-flowering crocus. Three long outer petals, three shorter upright inner ones and long lilac stigmata. Easy and reliable even outside here.</p>	
<p>Crocus banaticus First Snow</p> <p>£5 5 available</p>	<p>Pure white form of the species from Janis Ruksans.</p>	
<p>Crocus baytopiorum</p> <p>£4 5 available</p>	<p>Stunning spring crocus with ice blue flowers veined in turquoise. Our form is reputedly easier to grow than other forms! Small bulbs, hopefully flowering size.</p>	
<p>Crocus biflorus biflorus</p> <p>£2.50 5 available</p>	<p>Lovely spring crocus with buff coloured outer petals strongly feathered in deep maroon, over white inners.</p>	
<p>Crocus sieberi George</p> <p>£2.50 8 available</p>	<p>A sport of the well-known 'Hubert Edelsten' with larger flowers, and a narrower white mark on outer petals. Reputably hardier and easier to grow than it's parent. Increase well.</p>	
<p>Crocus sieberi Ronald Ginns</p> <p>£2.50 3 available</p>	<p>Beautifully marked crocus from Ray Cobb, and a good doer. Pale violet flowers with yellow throat, and purple speckling on outside of petals.</p>	
<p>Crocus Sunspot</p> <p>£6.50 5 available</p>	<p>Fabulous crocus with deep gold flowers offset by a wonderful black stigma. Often has more than 6 petals, and usually more than one flower per corm.</p>	

<p>Crocus veluchensis x cvjicii Rainbow Gold</p> <p>£8 3 available</p>	<p>Choice rare hybrid crocus with pale yellow blooms, overlain with purple to give a curious 'shot' effect.</p>	
<p>Eranthis x tubergenii 'Guinea Gold'</p> <p>£5-00 10 available</p>	<p>Choice hybrid between <i>E. hyemalis</i> and <i>E. cilicica</i>, later flowering and with larger flowers and bronzy leaves.</p>	
<p>Fritillaria davidii</p> <p>£5 6 available</p>	<p>A very unusual Chinese fritillaria with yellow chubby bells chequered with brown on short stalks. However, it is difficult to flower, so it's a good job that the leaves are so fascinating - unlike any other fritillaria - ground hugging, leathery and with netted veins. Small bulbs offered, and I will put in some rice-grain bulblets for you to grow on as well.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Bertram Anderson'</p> <p>£10 8 available</p>	<p>An early flowering snowdrop with large, thick textured flowers on upright stems.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Bill Bishop'</p> <p>£10-00 15 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 12cm. Scapes arching. Flower length including ovary 48mm. Leaves at flowering time 10x110mm, glaucous, arching. Huge flowers on short arching stems. Outer petals longer than the similar Bertram Anderson.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Blewbury Tart'</p> <p>£9 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright arching. Flower length including ovary 15mm. Flowers face outwards displaying dark green undersides of inner segments. Leaves at flowering time 7x170mm, bluish, upright.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Cedric's Prolific'</p> <p>£4-00 15 available</p>	<p>Tall, vigorous snowdrop selected by Beth Chatto. Flowers have a two-tone X on inner segments.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Compton Court'</p> <p>£7-00 20available</p>	<p>Flowering height 19cm. Scapes upright, fat rounded buds. Flower length including ovary 40mm. Leaves at flowering time 9x130mm, glaucous, upright. Vigorous.</p>	
<p>Galanthus elwesii Hiemalis Gp 'Barnes'</p> <p>£7-00 12 available</p>	<p>Probably the earliest flowering elwesii, with well shaped flowers and a neat 'moustache' mark on the inner segments.</p>	

<p>Galanthus 'Erway'</p> <p>£10-00 5 available</p>	<p>This snowdrop surprised me with its distinctiveness even at a distance. The flower stem is very upright with the flower hanging close to the stem, with an elongated olive green ovary as long as the inner segments which are almost all green.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Faringdon Double'</p> <p>£8-00 15 available</p>	<p>This is the earliest of the double snowdrops, flowering here in mid-December last year. It has a sturdy upright habit, and well shaped, large flowers.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Ginns' Imperati'</p> <p>£8-00 5 available</p>	<p>A vigorous mid-season snowdrop famed for its powerful almond scent.</p>	
<p>Galanthus gracilis</p> <p>£6-00 8 available</p>	<p>Mixed seedlings from a strain with chunky flowers on 6-7cm stems. Much admired.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Greenish'</p> <p>£10 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 8cm. Scapes very upright. Flower length including ovary 22mm, shaded green on outers. Leaves at flowering time 6x50mm, spreading. A dainty small plant making very small bulbs. Double nosed bulbs offered.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Hill Poë'</p> <p>£5 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 16cm. Scapes upright, buds pointed. Flower length including ovary 27mm; 4 or 5 outers, very regular inners. Leaves at flowering time 10x60mm, glaucous, spreading. Neat double.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Hippolyta'</p> <p>£5-00 8 available</p>	<p>Another Greatorex double hybrid with chunky little flowers. The outer segments are deeply dished, and the mark on the regular inners a neat green 'U'.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Jacquetta'</p> <p>£5 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 25mm, usually with green lines on outers. Leaves at flowering time 11x115mm, glaucous, arching. Greatorex double.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'John Gray'</p> <p>£9-00 5 available</p>	<p>Fat buds give way to large flowers with a dark green X on the inner segments.</p>	

<p>Galanthus 'Lerinda'</p> <p>£3-00 15 available</p>	<p>Tall shapely snowdrop with rounded flowers.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Magnet'</p> <p>Start a classic clump at 3 for £10 10 packs available</p>	<p>Classic snowdrop with long arching pedicels which set the flowers swinging in the faintest breeze.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Merlin'</p> <p>£6-00 15 available</p>	<p>Classic snowdrop with its signature small spherical ovary and almost all green inner segments.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Mighty Atom'</p> <p>£10 12 available ' '</p>	<p>Flowering height 8cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 40mm. Leaves at flowering time 7x60mm, glaucous, prostrate. Small plant – big flower.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Modern Art'</p> <p>£12-00 4 available</p>	<p>Very distinctive snowdrop with green marks on both apex and base of outer segments.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Mrs McNamara'</p> <p>£7-00 20 available</p>	<p>A classy snowdrop usually flowering in January, well shaped solid flowers held above the spathe, and the flowers presented well above glaucous leaves.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Mrs Thompson'</p> <p>£10-00 3 available</p>	<p>A beautiful snowdrop, despite being completely crazy and frequently producing an assortment of flower types, from two to a scape, or several extra segments, sometimes two flowers fused together.</p>	
<p>Galanthus peshmenii</p> <p>£4-00 or 3 for £11-00 20 available</p>	<p>Dainty autumn flowering snowdrop with flowers 12cm high before the leaves in Sep-Oct. Leaves are glaucous. I grow mine in an alpine house where it is easy given a dry summer rest.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Primrose Warburg'</p> <p>£18-00 8 available</p>	<p>Glaucous leaved snowdrop with well-shaped flowers with an oval yellow ovary, and greenish yellow apical mark with rounded ends on inner segments.</p>	

<p>Galanthus 'Spindlestone Surprise'</p> <p>£18-00 15 available</p>	<p>Green-leaved snowdrop with yellow ovary and greenish yellow apical mark on inner segments with pointed ends. Vigorous.</p>	
<p>Galanthus 'Wendy's Gold'</p> <p>£12-00 20 available</p>	<p>A vigorous <i>plicatus</i> variety with all yellow markings.</p>	
<p>Narcissus albidus ex SF110</p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>December flowering hoop petticoat with good solid white flowers. These are seedlings from this form.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Andy Blanchard' P.C.</p> <p>£15 8 available</p>	<p>A beautiful hybrid between triandrus and cyclamineus, with prostrate curling leaves and 1-2 flowers per stem which are, in essence, a pale lemon version of <i>N. cyclamineus</i>. Named after my brother. Much admired at the shows. Small bulbs, but hopefully flowering-size. Max 2 per customer.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Atlas Gold</p> <p>£4-00 8 available</p>	<p>Hoop petticoat daffodil with widely-flaring golden yellow flowers.</p>	
<p>Narcissus bulbocodium subsp. bulbocodium var. nivalis</p> <p>£2.50 10 available</p>	<p>Short golden hoop petticoat with exerted stamens. Flowers at about 7cm. Suitable for a trough.</p>	
<p>Narcissus bulbocodium subsp. praecox var. paucinervis RRW84.18</p> <p>£3 10 available</p>	<p>Pale yellow hoop with upward facing flowers, a Bob and Rannveig Wallis collection. Anout 10cm in flower.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Coo'</p> <p>£10 2 available</p>	<p><i>N. bulbocodium</i> subsp. <i>bulbocodium</i> var. <i>tenuifolius</i> x <i>N. cyclamineus</i> from Glenbrook Bulb Farm in Tasmania. Charming little hybrid growing to only 8cm in flower. First time offered by me, by great demand. One bulb per customer - hopefully flowering size.</p>	

<p>Narcissus cantabricus ex petunioides 17cm</p> <p>£2.50 6 available</p>	<p>Unselected seedlings from a form of <i>N. cantabricus</i> var. <i>petunioides</i> with shallow bowl-shaped flowers. Assorted flower shapes in bright white with a 'diamond-dust' sparkle. This form grows to about 16-17cm in flower.</p>	
<p>Narcissus cantabricus ex petunioides 8-12cm</p> <p>£2.50 8 available</p>	<p>Unselected seedlings from a form of <i>N. cantabricus</i> var. <i>petunioides</i> with shallow bowl-shaped flowers. Assorted flower shapes in bright white with a 'diamond-dust' sparkle. This form grows to about 10cm in flower.</p>	
<p>Narcissus cyclamineus x Candlepower BD3147</p> <p>£4 5 available</p>	<p>One of Brian Duncan's hybrids, a small daff with sewpt back perianth, similar to 'Mite', but a little smaller.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Douglasbank</p> <p>£3.00 12 available</p>	<p>The original bulbs of this variety came from Douglasbank, the garden of Willie Buchanan in Milngavie, Glasgow. It is similar to <i>N. asturiensis</i>, but larger at about 12-15cm, and a good garden variety. Photo: Mark Smyth.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Eystettensis'</p> <p>£4-50 10 available1</p>	<p>"Queen Anne's Double Daffodil" a very special old variety with creamy petals, each layer stacked up on the one below. I think this one will prefer a cool, lightly shaded site.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Fairy Chimes</p> <p>£1.50 10 available</p>	<p>A very nice April-flowering triandrus hybrid from the USA, with several clear lemon flowers to a stem. To 30cm under glass.</p>	
<p>Narcissus fernandesii</p> <p>£2.00 8 available</p>	<p>Pretty little jonquil with 1-3 small, highly scented flowers per stem, and thin, arching, rush-like leaves. About 20 cm in flower.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Gipsy Queen</p> <p>£2.00 15 available</p>	<p>Another small Alec Gray hybrid, and a good parent as it is very fertile both ways. Growing to only about 8cm even under glass, it has glaucous foliage and pale lemon flowers with the trumpet tipped in a darker shade.</p>	
<p>Narcissus hispanica Patrick Syngé</p> <p>£3.50 6 available</p>	<p>Classic trumpet daffodil with slightly paler perianth. Another rare plant from Kath Dryden. About 18cm in flower.</p>	

<p>Narcissus jeanmonodii</p> <p>£3 3 available</p>	<p>Small short cream hoop petticoat, from Brian Duncan</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Jim Lad' P.C.</p> <p>£4 10 available</p>	<p>Narcissus rupicola x asturiensis. Our own hybrid. Flower about 2cm wide, with a corona about 8mm long, golden yellow throughout and growing to about 12cm high, shorter outside. Did well in a trough here the last 3 winters, even down to -17°C.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Joy Bishop'</p> <p>£2-00 5 available</p>	<p>A creamy yellow hoop petticoat with very clean, solid flowers neatly scalloped rather than frilled around the mouth of the corona. Name confirmed by Joy herself.</p>	
<p>Narcissus KB/M/1/98</p> <p>£10-00 5 available</p>	<p>A miniature bicoloured hybrid from Keira nursery in Australia. Useful for breeding miniatures, fertile both ways. 12cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Little Spell'</p> <p>£3-50 4 available</p>	<p>Obtained from Kath Dryden, this is a lovely intermediate daffodil with elegant flowers with lemon perianth and long white trumpet. 25cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Mite'</p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>An elegant early spring daffodil with a long narrow trumpet and swept back perianth. Good doer outside.</p>	
<p>Narcissus 'Mitimoto'</p> <p>£4-00 10 available</p>	<p>An innovative daffodil – the first bicoloured hoop petticoat. Another Aussie import. Golden corona, white perianth.</p>	
<p>Narcissus pallidiflorus x watieri clone 1</p> <p>£8-00 6 available</p>	<p>A release of just a very few of this lovely daff bred here. Growing to 15cm high, With a white perianth and pale yellow cup fading to creamy white.</p>	
<p>Narcissus radinganorum</p> <p>£3.50 3 available</p>	<p>A nice small Pseudonarcissus Section daff, considered by some to be a synonym of N. hispanicus. About 20cm in flower, golden yellow trumpets.</p>	

<p>Narcissus romieuxii subsp. albidus var. zaianicus M168</p> <p>£3.00 5 available</p>	<p>Very nice small white hoop with upward facing flowers of pristine white. Flowers at about 8cm.</p>	
<p>Narcissus rupicola x cyclamineus</p> <p>£8-00 3 available</p>	<p>Mixed seedlings of this lovely cross. About 8cm high with swept back perianth. Golden yellow.</p>	
<p>Narcissus triandrus x pallidiflorus</p> <p>£5 8 available</p>	<p>Another mixed bag of my own seedlings, offered as a curiosity.</p>	
<p>Narcissus Wavertree</p> <p>£4 10 available</p>	<p>An N.asturiensis selection made by F R Whalley, in essence a larger version of the species, growing to about 15-18cm under glass. Bulbs are big enough to flower but it's unpredictable....</p>	
<p>Narcissus wilkomii</p> <p>£2-00 10 available</p>	<p>One to three deep golden flowers per stem, and rush-like foliage. About 15-20cm high.</p>	
<p>Narcissus x incurvicervicus</p> <p>£3-00 10 available</p>	<p>A natural hybrid between <i>N fernandesii</i> and <i>N triandrus</i>, growing to about 30cm high with several lemon yellow flowers with swept back petals to each stem. Delicate and lovely. Flowers March.</p>	
<p>Narcissus x tenuior</p> <p>£4 4 available</p>	<p>Another very old cultivar, described in 1797, and assumed to be a hybrid between N.jonquilla and N. poeticus. Grows to about 18cm in flower</p>
