You can see better photos of the plants on my website. I hope you enjoy browsing, and look forward to hearing from you.





This form selected for good contrast between purple outers and white inner tepals.</p>		<p><b>Crocus tommasinianus Pictus</b> £3 8 available</p>	<p>Striking Tommy with dark purple tips to the petals.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus banaticus First Snow</b> £10 5 available</p>	<p>Pure white form of the species from Janis Ruksans.</p>		<p><b>Crocus tommasinianus Roseus</b> £3 10 available</p>	<p>Pretty 'Tommy' with deep pink flowers opening from greyish buds.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus biflorus ssp nubigena</b> £8 2 available</p>	<p>Striking spring crocus, the white flowers tinged buff on the outside, streaked with dark purple and characteristic very dark brownish-black anthers, which split to show the yellow pollen.</p>		<p><b>Crocus tommasinianus Claret</b> £8 10 available</p>	<p>Fabulously deep plum-coloured form. Rare.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus hadriaticus</b> £5 8 available</p>	<p>Very fine form of this autumn flowering crocus. Very solid creamy white flowers with a yellow throat and purple tube.</p>		<p><b>Cyclamen alpinum white flowers</b> £4 1 available</p>	<p>Early spring flowering, flowers shaped like propellers. Good sized flowering plant.</p>	<p>Sorry no photo.</p>
<p><b>Crocus 'Purple Heart'</b> £5 8 available</p>	<p>Hybrid crocus from Janis Ruksans, which looks identical to mathewii!</p>	<p>Sorry no photo</p>	<p><b>Cyclamen coum albissimum</b> £4 8 available</p>	<p>Flowering sized young tubers. White flowers without the pink 'nose'. 3 year-old tubers.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus mathewii</b> £10 5 available</p>	<p>Coveted autumn-flowering species, white petals with deep purple throat.</p>		<p><b>Cyclamen coum dark flowers</b> £4 12 available</p>	<p>Flowering sized tubers. Very dark crimson flowers and plain leaves.</p>	<p>Sorry no photo.</p>
<p><b>Crocus tommasinianus Bobbo</b> £3 18 available</p>	<p>An eyecatching form of this easy spring crocus with lavender flowers neatly tipped with white.</p>		<p><b>Cyclamen hederifolium Fairy Rings</b> £4 5 available</p>	<p>Selected for the foliage patterns. These are 3year old seedlings and should flower this autumn.</p>	
<p><b>Crocus tommasinianus Eric Smith</b> £3 10 available</p>	<p>Pretty crocus with white flowers which usually have extra petals. Photo Mark Smyth.</p>		<p><b>Cyclamen mirabile 'Tilebarn Anne'</b> £5 5 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering species with pretty fringed tips to the petals. This variety has all-silver leaves which are pink on first opening. 4 year-old tubers.</p>	
			<p><b>Cyclamen mirabile 'Tilebarn Nicholas'</b> £4 16 available</p>	<p>Autumn flowering species with pretty fringed tips to the petals. This variety has green leaves with a silver zone which is pink on first opening. 4 year-old tubers.</p>	

<p><b>Cyclamen purpurascens 'Limone group'</b></p> <p>£5 9 available</p>	<p>Summer-flowering species with heavily scented flowers. This variety has all-silver leaves. 2 year-old tubers.</p>	
<p><b>Cyclamen rhodium peloponnesiacum</b></p> <p>£3 5 available</p>	<p>Spring flowering species with leaves freckled with silver, and sweetly scented pink flowers. 3 year-old tubers should be flowering sized.</p>	
<p><b>Fritillaria davidii</b></p> <p>£5 5 available</p>	<p>A very unusual Chinese fritillaria with yellow chubby bells chequered with brown on short stalks. The leaves are fascinating, ground hugging, leathery and with netted veins. Small bulbs offered, and I will put in some rice-grain bulblets for you to grow on as well.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus Abingdon Green</b></p> <p>£6 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 25cm. Scapes almost upright. Flower length including ovary 40mm. Outer segments inrolled longitudinally. Leaves glaucous green, arching. Overall appearance is of a long narrow flower.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Ailwyn'</b></p> <p>£25 1 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright to arching. Three outers, and regular inners with a green inverted V near the sinus, and 2 fuzzy paler green spots near the base. Perfectly formed double, with distinctive markings.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Angelique'</b></p> <p>£15 3 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 13cm. Scapes upright. Semi-poculiform, inner segments 70% the length of the outers, with only 2 small green marks.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus Anglesey Abbey</b></p> <p>£8 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 14cm. Scapes upright. Leaves glossy green, arching to upright. Noticeably green foliage is it's main quality, but the dainty ovary, long claw and narrow flower segments make for delicate-looking flowers as well.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Anne of Geierstein'</b></p> <p>£18 3 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 14cm. Scapes upright. Leaves bluish, arching. The flowers are very thick-petalled, solid looking.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Barbara's hybrid'</b></p> <p>£6 3 lg available</p>	<p>Flowering height 23cm. Scapes very upright, Flower length including ovary 40mm. Outer segments long and narrow. Inner segments with a broad, inverted U covering the apical half. Tall plant with a long, elegant flower.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'Barnes'</b></p> <p>£8 15 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 30mm. Leaves glaucous, pleated. Neat narrow 'moustache' mark on inners. Very early flowering, sometimes in December.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Basisgrüner'</b></p> <p>£40 4 available</p>	<p>One Hagen Engelmann's green snowdrops. Green shaded lines across the outer segments and 2 pale 'eyes' at the base of the inner segments in addition to the bold green inverted U at the apex. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Bertram Anderson'</b></p> <p>£8 25 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 16cm. Scapes arching. Flower length including ovary 42mm. Leaves glaucous, arching. Huge flowers on short arching stems.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Bill Bishop'</b></p> <p>£7 30 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 12cm. Scapes arching. Flower length including ovary 48mm. Leaves glaucous, arching. Huge flowers on short arching stems. Outer petals longer than the similar Bertram Anderson.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Blewbury Tart'</b></p> <p>£5 30 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright. Flower length 20mm, ovary much reduced. Outer segments are shaded green, or with some green lines on the distal 25%. Vigorous double 'spikey' snowdrop, flowers face outwards displaying dark green undersides of inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus byzantinus</b></p> <p>£10 4 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 12.5cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including long ovary 30mm. Inner segments with green mark dark at apex shading to paler, stopping just before base. Straight spathe. Leaves glaucous, spreading.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Cedric's Prolific'</b></p> <p>£5 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 21cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 38mm. Tall, vigorous snowdrop selected by Beth Chatto. Flowers have a two-tone X on inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus cilicicus</b></p> <p>£15 2 available</p>	<p>Rare in cultivation, flowering November to January. Best in alpine house.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Colossus'</b></p> <p>£10 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 23cm. Scapes angled, flower length including ovary 30mm. Leaves at flowering time 18x200mm, glaucous, glossy, arching. Tall robust snowdrop, increases well.</p>	



<p><b>Galanthus 'Comet'</b> £10 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 20cm. Scapes arching, flower length including ovary 45mm, long pedicel. Leaves arching. Tall snowdrop with large flowers. Occasionally shows green tips on the outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Compton Court'</b> £5, or 5 for £20 40 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 19cm. Scapes upright, fat rounded buds. Flower length including ovary 40mm. Leaves glaucous, upright. Vigorous snowdrop with rounded flowers and short pedicel. Good garden variety which increases well. Flowers earlier than the similar S. Arnott.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Cordelia'</b> £6 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 20cm. Scapes almost upright. Three outer segments, and regular inners heavily marked with green almost to the base. Good regular double snowdrop with very green-looking flowers.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Desdemona'</b> £6 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 19cm. Scapes upright. Fat pointed buds. Leaves prostrate. Fairly regular Greatorex double, sometimes with faint green lines at the ends of the outers, of which there are usually three.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Dionysus'</b> £8 8 lg available</p>	<p>Greatorex double with green mark on outers smudged towards the base. Regular inner segments. Pedicel longer than spathe.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Doncaster's Double Charmer'</b> £10 8 available</p>	<p>Extraordinary double which seems to show a different form each year, sometimes a 'spikey', but always with green marks at the base and apex of the outer and inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Dreycott Greentip'</b> £15 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 8cm. Scapes upright. Inflated spathe (sometimes split). Leaves glaucous, arching. Green mark at end of outer segments, strength of mark varies in different years, and can be temporarily lost after chipping. Offered are bulbs that have definitely got good green marks this year.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus elwesii dwarf form</b> £10 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 15cm. Scapes almost upright. Flower length including ovary 35mm. Inner segments all green except for white edge and base. Leaves glaucous, arching. A dwarf form of elwesii from Mark Smyth.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Ermine House'</b> £15 9 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 24cm. Scapes upright, buds pointed. Leaves glaucous, upright. Neat, short, usually regular double, with a distinctive waisted mark on the inner segments.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'Falkland House'</b> £5 11 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 13cm. Scapes fairly upright, flower length including ovary 40mm. Leaves upright to arching. Similar to S. Arnott but shorter, with a smaller ovary.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Faringdon Double'</b> £7 30 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 20cm. Scapes arching. Flower length including ovary 30mm, extra inner segments. Leaves glaucous, spreading. The earliest flowering double. Handsome flowers with normal number of outers which are distinctly ridged, and usually double the normal number of inner segments, making for a very neat flower.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Fieldgate Superb'</b> £20 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 21cm. Scapes very upright, flowers of heavy substance. Flower length including ovary 52mm. Inner segments have strong two-tone green X extending almost to the base. Leaves glaucous, upright, plicate. Very late snowdrop that has a great presence thanks to its huge flowers, vertical stance and strong inner mark.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Fred's Giant'</b> £8 4 lg available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes angled. Flower length including ovary 43mm.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'G71'</b> £10 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 14cm. Scapes upright, buds fat round. Leaves glaucous, spreading. Lesser-known double Greatorex hybrid.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Galatea'</b> £3 5 available</p>	<p>Large, early flowering snowdrop.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Green Necklace'</b> £6 6 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 21cm. Scapes arching. Inner segments with dark inverted V at apex and paler, diffuse U attached above. Leaves glaucous, spreading, plicate. Distinctive tiny glossy green ovary.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Greenish'</b> £10 12 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 8cm. Scapes very upright. Flower length including ovary 22mm. Leaves spreading. A dainty small plant making very small bulbs.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Greenkeeper'</b> £50 4 available</p>	<p>One of Hagen Engelmann's seedlings. Scape upright, height 16cm. Pedicel same length as, and clasped by, the upright spathe. Inner segments distal third deep green with a white rim around the deep sinus. The green mark bleeds a little towards the base. Outer segments clawed and 'shouldered', central third shaded light green with darker green lines running out above and below. First time offered. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'Grüne Donauzwerg'</b></p> <p>£40 3 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 5cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 18mm. Leaves deep green, arching. Tiny green-leaved nivalis. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Helen'</b></p> <p>£15 3 lg available</p>	<p>Flowering height 25cm. Scapes upright. Flower length 40mm. Outer segments with variable light green tips. Inner segments with an unequal X mark - larger dark green end at apex, and small, paler green end at basal side. Tall, elegant plant.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Hill Poë'</b></p> <p>£8 15 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 17cm. Scapes upright, buds fat and pointed. Flower have 4 to 6 outers, very regular inners. Relatively large ovary for a double. Leaves glaucous, prostrate. Probably my favourite double, lampshade-like flowers held well clear of the short prostrate leaves.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Hippolyta'</b></p> <p>£5 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright, globular buds. Flower length including ovary 30mm. Leaves glaucous, upright. Greatorex double.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Hollis'</b></p> <p>£15 2 available</p>	<p>Remarkable reliably November-flowering elwesii.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Jacquenetta'</b></p> <p>£5 15 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 24cm. Scapes upright. Flower usually with green lines on distal 30% of outers, which are usually obvious on the fat, pointed buds. Leaves glaucous, arching. Vigorous, usually regular double.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'John Gray'</b></p> <p>£7 12 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 19cm. Scapes arching under the weight of the flower. Glossy bright green ovary. Flower length including ovary 45mm. Leaves glaucous, spreading. Large flowers, distinctive 2-tone bold X on inners.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus koenenianus x fosteri</b></p> <p>£30 6 available</p>	<p>Rare hybrid snowdrop, the leaves closely ridged on the backs. Dark inverted V at apex of inner segments, and pale green smudge at the base. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lapwing'</b></p> <p>£10 8 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 20cm. Scapes upright. Mark on inners like a pair of scissors, handles dark green and blades lighter. Leaves glaucous, arching. Popular showy variety with distinctive markings.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Lerinda'</b></p> <p>£3 15 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright, buds large rounded. Flower of heavy substance. Leaves bluish, arching. Vigorous.</p>	



<p><b>Galanthus 'Llo'n'green'</b></p> <p>£12 6 available</p>	<p>Early green-tipped snowdrop, flowering in January this year. Good green marks.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Merlin'</b></p> <p>£5 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 24cm. Scapes arching, distinctive spherical ovary. Leaves bluish, upright. Classic snowdrop with its signature spherical ovary and almost all deep green inner segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Mighty Atom'</b></p> <p>£8 10 available</p>	<p>Scapes 18cm upright, but bent over under the weight of the flowers. Flower length including glossy, round ovary 45mm. Inner segments longitudinally ridged, the green mark fuzzy on the basal side. Leaves almost upright. Small plant – big flower!</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Modern Art'</b></p> <p>£15 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 19cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 35mm. Leaves glaucous, upright. Distinctive green mark at base and apex of outers. Another which can temporarily lose its outer marks after chipping, offered are bulbs that have definitely had green marks this year.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Mrs McNamara'</b></p> <p>£7 or 3 for £18 50 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 26cm. Scapes upright. Very vigorous and early, as far as I know the only known quadruploid galanthus. Often the first to flower after the new year, well shaped solid flowers held above the spathe, and the flowers presented well above glaucous leaves.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Mrs Thompson'</b></p> <p>£10 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 16cm. Leaves glaucous, arching. Flowers often have extra outers, or 2 flowers per stem, sometimes fused together. A mad, fun snowdrop.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus nivalis green tips</b></p> <p>£8 40 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 15cm. Scapes upright. Flower length including ovary 25mm. Leaves glaucous, upright. Another which can temporarily lose its outer marks after chipping, offered are bulbs that have definitely had green marks this year.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus peshmenii Kastellorizo</b></p> <p>£8 12 available</p>	<p>As it grows with me, similar to straight peshmenii, but a little larger and more robust-looking. Neat inverted heart mark on inners with the point extended.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Primrose Warburg'</b></p> <p>£18 18 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 180mm. Scapes slightly arching. Leaves glaucous with a yellowish tinge, spreading. Flower has yellow ovary, longer spathe than Spindlestone Surprise, and the yellow mark on the inners has rounded ends to the 'arms' of the inverted U.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'Pusey Greentips'</b> £3 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 14cm. 6 fairly regular outer segments, inner segments usually regular but with a layer of irregular segments between the outers and inners. The large flowers hang vertically downward like a street lamp, outer segments with a strong green vertical mark on the tips.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus reginae-olgae</b> £5 10 available</p>	<p>Welcome autumn-flowering snowdrop, and one to surprise the neighbours with if you plant it near your front door! Hardy planted outside here, does well at the base of trees where it is quite dry in the summer.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus Richard Ayres'</b> £10 7 available</p>	<p>Beautiful double with distinctive X mark on outer segments.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus rizehensis 'Baytop'</b> £15 1 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 21cm. Scapes arching, flower length 40mm including 10mm ovary. Inner segments have reflexed apex and a green inverted U to half their length. Leaves glaucous with a pale silvery central stripe.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Sandersii'</b> £10 3 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 14cm. Scapes upright. Leaves glaucous, upright. I acquired it many years ago as 'Lutescens' and it is the father of my Dryad Gold hybrids. Delightful yellow marks and ovary.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Scharlockii'</b> £4 or 3 for £10 20 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 11cm. Scapes upright. Long pedicel and long split spathe making 'Donkey ears' Leaves glaucous, upright. Delicate and distinctive plant, vigorous and good increaser.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Schmalhans im Grünen'</b> £40 2 available</p>	<p>Another from Hagen Engelmann, a delightful dwarf virescent snowdrop, flowering at about 7cm high. Late flowering. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Selborne Greentips'</b> £12 8 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 16cm. Scapes upright. Good deep green double mark on the inner segments, usually joined. Usually has green marks on the ends of the outers, but not consistently. Sometimes has 2 flowers on the same stem, mature flowers have reflexed outers.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Shepton Merlin'</b> £15 7 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 29cm. Scapes very upright. Straight, erect spathe. Inner segments all green with white margin, outer segments broad, cupped. Leaves very upright. An amazing sight as it emerges like spears thrusting vertically straight up, the unusually long spathe providing the point of the spear. The huge spathe extending above the flower gives the plant a very distinctive presence in the garden.</p>	

<p><b>Galanthus 'South Hayes'</b> £40 4 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright. Leaves glaucous, upright, often with the margins pinched together about half way along. Inverse poculiform, with green mark on outers stretching the full length. Another which can permanently revert back to the 'normal' flower form, offered are bulbs that are definitely correct. <b>Max one per customer.</b></p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Spindlestone Surprise'</b> £18 10 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 18cm. Scapes upright. Leaves tinged yellow, arching, some are plicate on one side. Yellow ovary and mark on inners, which has the "arms" of the inverted U distinctly narrowed at the ends. Vigorous.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Sutton Courtenay'</b> £15 5 available</p>	<p>Striking gracilis variety with a very long yellowish ovary and narrow sinus mark on inner segments and 2 green dots above, fading towards the base. Vigorous.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'The Pearl'</b> £10 5 lg available</p>	<p>Flowering height 30cm. Scapes upright, flower length including ovary 50mm. Leaves glaucous, upright to arching. A very large, tall snowdrop, beautiful buds like drop pearls - a classy snowdrop which is well named.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Three Ships'</b> £15 5 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 150mm. Famously flowers in December, very long lasting flowers. The good X-mark on inners and crinkled outers would make it a desirable snowdrop even if it flowered with everything else. Deservedly popular.</p>	
<p><b>Galanthus 'Trumps'</b> £25 4 available</p>	<p>Flowering height 13cm. Scapes upright. Leaves bluish, arching. Outer segments have a sunken mark similar to the mark on inner segments.</p>





