


*The ever increasing charges for postage and carriage are a constant cause for concern but I endeavour to send a few gratis bulbs to compensate for packing and postage on retail orders where practical.*

## Terms of Business

All bulbs are offered subject to being unsold on receipt of order and to a satisfactory crop being lifted and being available at time of dispatch

No complaints as to quality of bulbs, health, size or number will be entertained unless made immediately on receipt of bulbs.

I will not be responsible for results of planting or forcing.

Orders cannot be cancelled except by mutual consent.

All bulbs travel at customers' risk and expense.

Not less than 5 bulbs supplied at the 10 rate.

All prices are for nett cash within two months from date of invoice.

Receipts for payments by cheque are not sent unless requested.

New customers are requested to send cash with order or satisfactory references.

Orders are dispatched as far as possible during August and early September and any customer in the British Isles who has not received bulbs on order by the 20th September is requested to notify me immediately.

Overseas orders will be insured at customers' expense, if requested.

Small lots of valuable bulbs can be sent by letter post or air mail if desired.

Prices are given in new British Decimal Currency and U.S.A. Dollars.

Dollar prices are based on an exchange rate of U.S.A. \$2.40 to £1.00 sterling and are subject to market fluctuations. The best method of payment is by a personal dollar cheque or banker's draft in U.S.A. Dollars.

**IMPORT PERMITS AND MAILING TAGS ARE NO LONGER REQUIRED FOR U.S.A. ORDERS. BULBS CAN NOW BE SENT DIRECT TO CUSTOMERS.**

CANADIAN customers must still apply to their Department of Agriculture for an import permit and address label and post to me to attach to the parcel. Bulbs cannot be dispatched until it is received.

## Cultural Notes

The Daffodil is not fastidious regarding soil, but if possible a position sheltered from winds at flowering time should be selected. A plot which has been well manured for the previous crop and is in good heart is ideal, and if it can be thrown up in ridges and exposed to the weather until planting time so much the better. Fresh animal manure should not be added prior to planting or the bulbs may be damaged. However, if the soil appears to be on the poor side a light dusting of bonemeal may be given with advantage.

The beds should be made up a few weeks prior to planting in order to give the soil time to settle. I plant in beds four-and-a-half feet wide with a path one-and-a-half feet wide between each. The rows across the beds are spaced about ten to twelve inches apart with six to eight bulbs in each row, but these distances are approximate as the smaller bulbs can be spaced a little closer than those of stronger and more vigorous varieties. Groups of Daffodils planted between shrubs or in the herbaceous border are very charming for garden decoration in Springtime, but if possible each group should be confined to one variety. Three to twelve bulbs make a charming group.

Planting should be completed as early as possible. August and early September being the best time if the very finest results are to be secured. After planting, little can be done apart from keeping weeds in check until the foliage appears in the New Year when the soil between the rows should be stirred with the hoe when weather conditions permit.

Many varieties of Daffodils and in particular the newer whites come in magnificent form when grown in pots in a cool greenhouse. If the finest flowers are to be obtained, only enough heat to prevent the pots being frozen should be used and forcing should not be attempted. Pot the bulbs as soon as possible, using good loam and with enough sharp sand to keep the compost open, adding a light dusting of bonemeal as the mixing proceeds. Crock the bottom of the pots well to ensure good drainage and pot firmly, just covering the noses of the bulbs with soil. After potting, plunge the pots in the soil in a sheltered bed in the open garden, putting slates under the pots to prevent worms entering the drainage holes, filling in between and covering the pots with about two inches of soil. This plunging bed is very important, and the pots should **NOT** under any circumstances be brought into the greenhouse until after the New Year. Before plunging it is advisable to cover the tops of the pots with a little moss, as this prevents the soil in the pots getting mixed with that of the plunging bed. After bringing into the greenhouse, the pots should be kept under the staging for a week or so to accustom the young growth to the light, and then placed on the staging where growth will be fairly rapid as the days lengthen. Plenty of ventilation should be given and care taken that the pots are never allowed to dry out.

It is important to select varieties which do really well in pots and the following have proved very satisfactory—Aldergrove, Armada, Armagh, Ballycastle, Binkie, Brookfield, Broughshane, Crebilly, Craigywarren, Glenocum, Golden Ducat, Glenwherry, Hunter's Moon, Kanchenjunga, Kilrea, Ormeau, Pink Isle, Pink Smiles, Red Ranger, Show Dream, Stormont, Sun Chariot, Trousseau, Wedding Bell.

## New Introductions for 1970

**BALLYROBERT (Yellow trumpet 1a) 3 (W. J. Dunlop).** Best Flower in the competitive classes and also best seedling at the Daffodil Society's Show, 1968. A splendid exhibition flower of superb quality having broad silken smooth perianth and perfectly proportioned trumpet slightly frilled at the mouth. The whole flower is rich deep golden yellow throughout. Strong plant and free of bloom and increase.

**CLOYFIN (Large-cupped 2a) 3-4 (W. J. Dunlop).** This is a most beautiful flower of lovely clear soft lemon yellow throughout both perianth and crown. A flower of fine size with smooth overlapping perianth and well proportioned cup. Very vigorous and free flowering making a splendid garden plant and a delightful flower for cutting for house decoration.

**RED BAY (Large-cupped 2a) 5-6 (W. J. Dunlop).** This is by far the latest flowering yellow red which has appeared here to date coming at the same time as the last of the red and whites. The broad flat perianth is deep yellow and the well proportioned crown is dark crimson red.

## General Collection

**ALDERGROVE (Large-cupped 2b) 3 (W. J. Dunlop).** I consider this much the finest and most brilliantly contrasted bicolour in the Large-cupped Division which I have seen to date. The large pure white perianth is very broad and perfectly flat, of immense substance and lovely smooth texture standing at right angles to the perfectly proportioned deep golden yellow crown. A first class show flower combining wonderful size and perfect quality.

Broad smooth flat pure white perianth standing at right angles to the deep golden trumpet which is beautifully rolled at the brim. **BALLYMARLOW (Large-cupped 2a) 3** (W. J. Dunlop). The whole flower is of a most lovely deep old gold colour throughout which seems to deepen with age as the flower develops its wonderful size and substance. Very broad foliage and immense bulbs.

Tall strong stem and very good neck.

**BINKIE (Large-cupped 2d) 4** (Wolfhagen). A most distinct but rather curious seedling raised in Tasmania; it is really a reversed bicolor. On first opening, the whole flower is clear sulphur-lemon, but the cup gradually passes to almost white.

A flower of immense substance and quite exceptionally durable. Strong vigorous plant.

**BUSHMILLS (Small-cupped 3b) 4** (W. J. Dunlop). Bred from *Portrush* by *Foggy Dew* this is one of the very finest flowers of its type seen to date. Broad, flat, extremely smooth pure white perianth of perfect quality and nicely proportioned crown with a wire rim of pinky orange. Apparently a good doer and free of bloom and increase.

**CANTATRICE (White Trumpet 1c) 3** (Guy L. Wilson). F.C.C., R.H.S. Best flower R.H.S. Daffodil Show, 1939 and 1951. Absolutely pure clear white throughout. Splendid show flower. Very scarce.

The whole flower is of a lovely deep old gold colour throughout. Should prove of much value coming as it does when many yellow varieties are past their best. **CARNBEG (Large-cupped 2a) 2-3** (W. J. Dunlop). A most striking flower of the very largest size measuring up to 5" in diameter when grown here under my conditions of soil and climate. The broad smooth overlapping perianth is deep yellow with an orange flush while the base of the crown is of similar colour gradually becoming deeper until the rim is quite deep solid red. Exceptionally vigorous giving an extremely prolific display of bloom. Attracted much attention here, being the most striking piece of colour on my grounds.

**CARRICKFERGUS (Large-cupped 2b) 4** (W. J. Dunlop). A magnificent seedling from *Castlecoole* x *Pride of Erin* combining the best features of these two excellent varieties. An outstanding flower in every respect. Only a few bulbs to offer.

**CASTLECAT (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4** (W. J. Dunlop). One of the best of a splendid series of yellow trumpet seedlings which are quite remarkable for clarity of colour and exceptionally fine form and proportion. This is a flower of most delightful clear yellow throughout both trumpet and perianth. Tall strong stem and good neck. Very scarce.

**CASTLEWELLAN (Yellow Trumpet 1a) 4** (W. J. Dunlop). A first class yellow trumpet of superb quality and thick waxy texture, coming fairly late in the season when many yellow flowers are going over. Broad perfectly smooth perianth standing at right angles to the perfectly proportioned trumpet. The whole flower is clear deep golden yellow throughout and lasts an amazing time in good condition. Very vigorous and free flowering coming consistently good each season.

**CEYLON (Large-cupped 2a) 2-3** (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. Tall, robust plant with stiff stem and short neck. Free flowering and rapid increaser.

This is a most charming and graceful flower of lovely quality and soft clear yellow colour: broad overlapping much reflexed perianth segments: cup waisted, with frilled and slightly expanded mouth. Tall stem and good doer.

Beautifully proportioned and rather similar in build to *Binkie* which was one of its grandparents. Strong vigorous plant, exceptionally free flowering making a delightful garden plant. **DOUBLE EVENT (Double 4) 4-5** (J. L. Richardson). F.C.C., R.H.S. 1956 as a Show flower. One of the very finest doubles introduced to date. A splendid show flower and fine robust plant with strong tall stems.

A really first class show flower of most wonderful thick waxy texture and superb quality.


