Assurance of Quality

Our aim is to provide top quality, healthy bulbs and, to achieve this, we take the following measures:

- During the growing season, stocks are sprayed regularly with fungicide and checked for health. Any diseased plants are removed and destroyed.
- Stocks are inspected by MAFF each Spring, so that a growing season Health Certificate can be issued.
- All our bulbs for re-planting are given Hot Water Treatment.

All bulbs offered in this catalogue have been grown by us for at least two years.

2 Y-Y BUGLE MAJOR (A.J.R.Pearson) 1-2
Arctic Gold x *70-10-C16 (1Y-O Fine Gold SP)* : 88-5-K19
The flat, velvet-smooth, dark lemon yellow petals are long, pointed and broad at the base, making them look almost triangular. The trumpet crown, just shorter than the petals but well-proportioned with an elegantly fluted brim, is more golden with apple-green in the eye. An excellent early, but long-lasting show flower, which is carried well above the leaves on a tall robust stem. Each £25.00

1 YYW-Y FRESH LIME (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
89-7-E2 (Fine Gold SP x Camelot) x *Daydream* : 89-59-M14
The smooth perianth is slightly reflexed, the back petals being ace-of-spade shaped and the front more rounded, while the crown is just a trumpet with a neatly serrated brim. When the flower opens lime-lemon with a white halo, one expects it to reverse, but the perianth remains unchanged and the trumpet just becomes paler with a golden brim. A good flower for collection classes. Each £15.00

2 W-W STOKE DOYLE (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4
Stoke Charity x *Panache* : 87-71-J35
Broad, overlapping, silken smooth petals and a classically proportioned bell-shaped crown make this a flower with poise, elegance and distinction. Like its parent, Stoke Charity, the crown is a shade whiter than the milk white petals. A show flower which increases well and makes superb bulbs. Each £25.00

3 W-YYO SWEET SUE (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4
Dell Chapel x *Corozal* : 88-60-L15
The broad, ovate, slightly mucronate petals are smooth with good substance and pure white. The lightly fluted, straight-sided crown is solid chrome yellow with a waved but sharply defined rim of rich orange. The flower is held well on a short neck and strong stem and has been admired for being distinctively different from others in its class. Each £25.00

2 Y-Y **GOLDHANGER** (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Camelot SP : 85-48-F30

Broad, rounded and overlapping petals make an almost circular golden yellow perianth, full of substance and satin smooth. The goblet crown, fluted and straight, is darker gold with a hint of bronze. As a seedling in 1993, at Wembley it was 1st in the one seedling class and at Tonbridge 1st in the 2 Y-Y class and Best Seedling.

2 W-Y **HOLME FEN** (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4

(Easter Moon x Rashee) x Fair Prospect : 87-32-K29
 The best of a number of bi-colours in a batch of otherwise pink and white seedlings. The pointed, broadly ovate petals are smooth and sparkling white with no staining at the base and the crown, trumpet in character with an elegant brim, is citron yellow. Consistently good; almost every flower being of show quality. *Each £15.00*

1 W-W **QUIET WATERS** (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Stoke Charity x Panache : 86-28-J35

Smooth, broadly ovate, snow-white petals make a rounded double triangle and the trumpet crown, expanding gently to a fluted brim, is icy white with a moss-green base. Good poise and a strong stem. A sister seedling of Sheelagh Rowan but earlier, just a trumpet and differing in style; quietly elegant with just a touch of frosty grandeur. Best Div. 1 at Tonbridge in 1993.

3 W-Y **AIRCASTLE** (G.E.Mitch) 3-4

Green Island x Chinese White

Smooth, rounded white petals which change to a greenish cream and a flattish, lemon crown. A lovely show flower.

2 Y-W **ALTUN HA** (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4 FCC(e) 1993

Camelot x Daydream : 81-13-F1

The rounded petals are broad and smooth with much substance and the fluted crown expands in good proportion. When it opens, the whole flower is soft greenish lemon, but as it matures, the petals darken and the crown becomes completely white without any yellow rim. A strong grower with fine bulbs. 'Best Flower in the Show' award at RHS Daffodil Shows in 1989 & 1993.

Camelot x Daydream

An attractive flower that opens lemon, but with age the crown develops apricot shades and the petals darken a little.

Bryher SP

Long, smooth, snow-white petals and a short, attractively frilled white cup with an intensely moss-green eye make this a dazzling flower. Given to me in 1956 by Guy Wilson as seedling 45/94, it was nearly lost at one stage, but I have built up the stock again and offer it to those who love the late, green-eyed whites with gorgeous poet scent.

Goldcourt x Kingscourt

Smooth petals of substance and a well-proportioned trumpet crown, all deep gold. Still a very useful show flower.

Easter Moon x Seedling

A consistently good quality show flower with broad, rounded and smooth petals and a short, bowl-shaped crown. The whole flower is pure white except for the strong green eye. Still one of the best white flowers in Division 2.

Breeding not known

A deep golden yellow trumpet, smooth and consistently good. A flower which still wins prizes at major shows.

Green Island x Chinese White
A lovely, rounded show flower, which opens ivory-lemon and develops apple-green overtones. The frilled cup is pale lemon. *Each £1.00*

2 W-R BORROBOL (J.S.B.Lea) 3-4
Arbar seedling
Well-rounded pure white petals and a short, crinkled, dark red cup. A good show flower.

2 Y-Y CAMELOT (J.L.Richardson) 3
Kingscourt x Ceylon
Almost circular perianth of great quality and substance and a well-proportioned cup; the whole flower being butter yellow except for a touch of green at the base of the crown. *Each £1.00, 5 for £4.50*

2 Y-YYO CAPITOL HILL (J.S.B.Lea) 2-3
Bastion x (Nanking x Ambergate)
A rich orange-yellow crown and flat, slightly pointed petals of paler yellow. Increases rapidly and makes enormous bulbs. Excellent in the garden.

2 Y-WWY CARIB GIPSY (A.J.R.Pearson) 4-5
Camelot x Daydream : 81-23-F1
Opening late, almost with the poets, it is a flower of many moods; all enchanting. At first a greenish lemon throughout, then, as it matures, the petals darken and the crown fades to white with a golden velvet brim. The petals are broad and smooth and the crown almost a trumpet. Useful for late shows. Best Division 2, RHS Late Competition 1989.

2 W-W CLONEEN (G.L.Wilson) 3-4
White Maiden x Greenland
A most graceful, ice-white flower with gently reflexing petals and a fluted, goblet crown. Lovely in a vase. Has produced reflexing seedlings in unexpected colours.

3 W-GWW COOL CRYSTAL (G.E.Mitch) 4 AM(e) 1985
Chinese White seedling
Large, rounded, pure white perianth of good substance and a flat, nicely frilled cup, which takes a day or two to whiten properly. One of the standard show flowers for its class and wins many prizes. Sets seed readily. *Each £3.00*

2 Y-Y COOL SHADES (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Camelot x Daydream : 80-16-F1
An attractive flower of show quality on the borderline between divisions one and two; trumpet in character, but usually just division two by measurement. Broad, smooth, shovel-shaped petals and a fluted, gently expanding crown. Unlike its siblings, it rarely reverses, retaining its cool tones of lemon and lime at maturity. Its lemon flowers above dark green leaves make a striking contrast in the garden. Grows well. *Each £3.50, 3 for £9.00*

3 W-YR COROFIN (J.L.Richardson) 4
Seraglio x Mr. Jinks
An old, but still useful show variety. Rounded snow-white petals and a flat, crinkled yellow cup with a rim of bright cherry red. *Each £1.00, 5 for £4.50*

3 W-GYO COROZAL (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4
Fairy Tale x (Fairy Tale x Corofin) : 79-24-D21
The white well-rounded petals are smooth with much substance and a silken sheen. The cup, really a disk and nearly flat, is primrose yellow with an apple green eye and a broad band of copper-orange at the brim. Has a strong stem and short neck and grows well. *Each £4.00*

2 W-P DAILMANACH (J.S.B.Lea) 3-4
Pink seedling x Inverpolly
The large, rounded perianth is flat, smooth and glistening white with much substance. The three-quarter length crown is clear rose-pink and expands to an attractive roll at the mouth, where the pink is stronger. A superbly elegant show flower that has won and still wins many prizes. Good parent. *Each £5.00*

2 Y-WWY DAYDREAM (G.E.Mitch) 3 FCC(e) 1966
Binkie x (King of the North x Content)
Smooth, broad petals and a well-shaped crown. The flower opens greenish lemon, but at maturity the petals are darker and the crown almost white with a faint golden yellow brim. Has been a consistent prize-winner at shows.

3 W-WWO DELL CHAPEL (J.S.B.Lea) 3-4
Suilven x Hamzali
Glistening white, almost circular perianth and a creamy-white cup with an orange-pink rim. For showing it must be protected from the sun or cut in bud.

- 2 W-GWW EASTER MOON (G.L.Wilson) 3
Tryst x Greenland
 A flower of splendid quality with broad, overlapping petals and a squarish, fluted cup. The flower is ice-white throughout except for the sage-green throat. Still a good show flower and parent of many fine 'whites' and 'pinks'.

- 1 Y-Y ELMLEY CASTLE (J.M.de Navarro) 2-3
Royalist x Arctic Gold
 A smooth, golden-yellow flower with broad, flat, ovate petals and a straight trumpet, expanding slightly at the mouth and neatly serrated.

- 1 W-W EMPRESS OF IRELAND (G.L.Wilson) 2
Guardian x Kanchenjunga
 A large white show flower of wonderful form and substance with broad ace-of-spades shaped petals. The trumpet, slender at the base, expands to a nicely rolled brim and the throat is apple-green.

- 2 Y-Y EUPHONY (G.E.Mitch) 3
Leonaine OP
 A flower of good form and substance and well-proportioned. Its colour throughout is a delicate shade of creamy lemon. Enchantingly lovely.

Portrush seedling
 The long, pointed petals are glistening white and the green-eyed yellow cup has a bright orange-red rim. A most attractive flower, but needs protection from the sun.

Infatuation x Debutante
 The pure white overlapping petals are smooth with much substance and the wide, bowl-shaped crown is soft coral-pink with an apple-green eye. A lovely show flower.

Ceylon x (Narvik x Marksman)
 Brilliant colour and fine form make this a splendid flower for both show and garden. Broad, smooth, glistening golden-yellow petals and a cup of solid orange-red to the base. Grows well.

- 2 W-WPP FINE ROMANCE (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4
Stoke Charity x Romance : 87-50-J33
 Rounded, smooth, glistening white petals make a perfect background for the straightish crown, which is clear rose-pink almost to the base and expands gently to a fluted brim of deeper pink. The base of the crown is pale peach and the throat is green. Not a large flower, but most attractive and with much breeding potential. 1st in its class at the RHS Show, 1992.

- 6 W-P FOUNDLING (Carncairn) 3-4 AM(e) 1972
 A small flower with broad white petals, gently reflexing and pointed at the tips and a short, straight-sided cup of rose-pink shading darker at the base. A prizewinner at shows.

- 3 W-GGW FRIGID (G.L.Wilson) 6 FCC(e) 1950
Emerald Eye x Dactyl
 The flower, over 3 inches across, with broad, pointed petals and a small, fluted, almost flat cup, is the purest frosty white throughout except for its vivid emerald eye. Opening in May, it vies with Reprieve and the poets for the privilege of being the last to bloom.

- 1 Y-W GIN & LIME (Carncairn) 2-3
Goldcourt x Moonstruck
 A large flower with broad petals full of substance and a nicely proportioned trumpet, lightly serrated and rolled at the brim. The whole flower opens a greenish lemon and the trumpet takes several days to whiten on the inside, leaving the brim lemon. A regular prize-winner at shows.

- 2 Y-ORR GLEN CLOVA (J.S.B.Lea) 2-3
(Vulcan x Capitol Hill) x Arctic Gold
 A trumpet in character and almost by measurement, this flower should be useful in breeding flowers with red trumpets. Its deep gold, almost circular perianth reflexes very slightly and the nicely rolled trumpet crown is orange at the base shading to almost red at the brim.

- 1 Y-O GLENFARCLAS (J.S.B.Lea) 2-3
([Kingscourt x R658] x [Galcador x R556]) x Vulcan
 The deep gold perianth has much substance, with broad outer petals rounded at the tip and the inner petals a little narrower. The trumpet, bell-shaped and occasionally just shorter than the petals, is orange to the base. It is proving to be a fine parent of yellow/orange trumpets.

2 W-GWW GLENSIDE (F.E.Board) 3
Easter Moon x Pigeon
An exhibition flower of good form and quality. The nicely rounded perianth and the rather slender crown are ice-white throughout except for the moss-green eye.

2 YYW-W GOFF'S CAYE (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Daydream x (Camelot x Daydream) : 88-26-L5
The broad, rounded petals, smooth as silk, open pale greenish lemon and darken with age, leaving a white halo at the base. The bell-shaped crown, with its attractive ruffle, opens lemon with apple-green deep in the throat and then reverses to solid chalk-white. Consistently good; most flowers being of show quality. In my winning vase of 3 reversed bicolours, Solihull 1992 and 1st in its class in the RHS Daffodil Competition, Wembley 1993. Each £35.00

2 Y-Y GOLDEN AURA (J.L.Richardson) 3
Halo OP
Golden yellow throughout with silk-smooth petals and a most attractive cup. Smaller than some, but a show flower of great quality with the consistent ability to pass on this quality to its progeny.

2 YW-WYY HAMBLEDON (J.W.Blanchard) 3 AM(e) 1982
Daydream x Golden Aura
When it opens, the whole flower is primrose but, as it matures, the base of the perianth becomes paler and the cup becomes first apricot and then white, leaving apricot in just the brim. A smooth, distinctive flower, with much breeding potential.

2 Y-O HOT GOSSIP (A.J.R.Pearson) 2-3
([Home Fires x Ceylon] x Court Martial) x Vulcan : 79-9-E8
The deep gold, shovel-shaped petals are flat, velvet-smooth and in good proportion to the broadly expanding, slightly goffered, glowing orange-red crown, which is practically sunproof. Held well above the foliage on strong stems with short necks, the flowers look up, making it good for garden as well as show. 1st in the Single Bloom classes at both Tonbridge and Solihull, 1992.

2 Y-GYY HUNTING CAYE (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Camelot x Daydream : 80-19-F1
A lovely smooth, deep gold flower with quality, poise and elegance. The well-proportioned, bell-shaped crown, with its touch of green at the base and nicely serrated brim, is a slightly deeper shade of gold than the broad, ovate petals, which reflex slightly just at the tips.

2 W-W INVERPOLLY (J.S.B.Lea) 3-4
Easter Moon x Omeath
The long white petals are well-rounded, smooth and flat, and the slender, straightish crown opens pale peach but soon becomes white. A consistently reliable show flower that has won many best bloom awards.

3 Y-YYO IRISH COFFEE (G.E.Mitch) 3-4
Green Island x Chinese White
The smooth, almost circular perianth opens ivory, but soon turns to pale lemon with green overtones. The flat, crinkled cup at first is lemon with a broad orange margin, but then the lemon fades to white. A good show flower and an important parent.

3 W-GWW IRISH LINEN (Carncairn) 3-4
Shantallow seedling x Hamzali
A lovely snow-white flower with broad, rounded petals which glisten in the sunlight and a short cup with a dark sage-green eye.

2 Y-Y KINGSWORTHY (J.L.Richardson) 3
Kingscourt x Ceylon
Deep golden yellow throughout with broad, overlapping petals and an attractive fluted cup.

Lea 1-58-53 x Vulcan
A flower of brilliant colours and consistently good form and quality. The very smooth, rounded, deep gold petals are a perfect background for the glowing orange-red goblet crown. A grand show flower.

2 Y-R LOCH LUNDIE (J.S.B.Lea) 3 AM(e) 1980
L1-63-53 (Chungking x Spry) x (L1-63-53 x [Carbineer x Mexico])
Its rich colouring makes this flower stand out. The golden petals are broad, rounded and velvet-smooth and the nicely serrated cup is vivid orange-red to the base. Good stem and neck. Is proving to be a potent parent for yellow-reds.

2 W-P MELBURY (J.W.Blanchard) 3
([Green Island x Roseworthy] x Debutante) x Romance
Pure white rounded petals and a well-proportioned rich carmine-rose, frilled cup. A striking contrast of colours and a good show flower.

1 Y-Y MELDRUM (J.S.B.Lea) 2-3
Arctic Gold x ([Bastion x Nanking x Ambergate]] x Caramba)
The broad, smooth ovate petals are a rich, deep gold and the nicely serrated trumpet is darker, almost orange. A striking flower. Each £2.00

1 Y-P MEMENTO (G.E.Mitch) 3
Gloriola x Rima
Pale lemon perianth of show quality and a long, rather straight trumpet of apricot pink. Increases well. Each £3.50

3 W-YYR MERLIN (J.L.Richardson) 4 AM(e) 1962, FCC(g) 1976
Mahmoud SP
Smooth, rounded petals, white as glistening snow, surround a crinkled, nearly flat cup of pale chrome with a clean-cut rim of cherry-red. A reliable show flower and parent of flowers in unexpected colours. Only a few for sale. Each £2.00

2 Y-Y MICHAELS GOLD (A.J.R.Pearson) 3
Camelot x Daydream : 81-20-F1
The petals are broad, smooth, with much substance and the green-eyed crown expands from a slim throat to an attractive fluted brim. Strong, broad foliage and vigorous growth. Named to mark the Golden Wedding of dear friends at 'Michaels' in Hampshire, who generously gave up a lawn for our bulbs while we moved house. Each £10.00, 3 for £28.00

1 W-Y NEWCASTLE (W.J.Dunlop) 3 AM(e) 1957
Niphetos x Kanchenjunga
Unfortunately not as consistent as some bi-colour trumpets, but when in form produces magnificent blooms, as its record on the show bench testifies. The elegant gold trumpet does not fade and the petals, broadly ovate and overlapping, take a while to whiten. Each £2.50

3 W-OOY ORANGE WALK (A.J.R.Pearson) 3-4
Kilworth x (Fairy Tale x Corofin) : 79-25-D22
Forming a rounded double triangle, the smooth, glistening white petals show off well the ruffled, shallow saucer-crown of glowing orange with a golden brim. A good show flower with tall stems carrying the flowers well above the foliage, making it good for the garden too. Each £9.00

1 W-Y OWSTON WOOD (W.A.Noton) 3
Newcastle x Ballygarvey
The smooth, broad, slightly pointed petals become pure white, giving good contrast for the well-proportioned trumpet of citron yellow. A reliable show flower. Only a few for sale. Each £1.50

1 W-W PANACHE (G.L.Wilson) 3 FCC(e) 1967
(Courage x Broughshane) x Kanchenjunga
A large, eye-catching pure white show flower of great quality and substance. Broad, ovate petals and an elegant trumpet which expands from a slender base to a neatly rolled, serrated brim. Each £2.00, 3 for £5.50

2 W-P PINK PANTHER (Mrs.J.Abelsmith) 3
Infatuation x Chelsea Derby
An attractive, tall-stemmed flower with a good white perianth and a shortish, wide crown of deep rose-pink which darkens towards the base. Each £1.00, 5 for £4.50

3 W-GWW PORTRUSH (G.L.Wilson) 4-5
Silver Coin x Crimson Braid
Another old variety that one cannot give up. Broad creamy-white petals of great substance and a white crinkled cup with a moss-green eye. Has an attractive scent. Each £1.00

3 W-YYO PURBECK (J.W.Blanchard) 3-4 AM(e) 1970
Roimond x Arbar
