DELIVERY: Free delivery, all costs paid to destination, for all prepaid orders over \$ 10.00 to all points in the United States East of the Mississippi. Customers in States farther West are requested to add 5% to amount of order. If orders under \$ 10.00 are placed \$ 1.00 should be added. Orders under \$ 5.00 cannot be accepted.

PRICES: The prices in this catalogue are net in U.S.A. currency. For trial purposes 6 and even fewer bulbs of one variety will be charged at the dozen rate, 25 of one variety at twice the dozen rate, 50 of one variety at the rate per 100 and 250 of one variety at the rate per 1000.

PAYMENT: Unless otherwise arranged our terms are net cash with order. Please make checks or postal money orders payable to J. Heemskerk, Sassenheim-Holland. You may also make payment to our brokers, Messrs. T. D. Downing Company, 88 Broad Street, Boston 10, Mass. in our favor.

INSURANCE will be effected at our expense. In cases of damage, report to our Holland address.

GENERAL: Our forwarding agents will see to all customs formalities and prompt forwarding to ultimate destination. Because of the rush of packing and shipping and also for reasons of economy, we shall not send detailed statements of all the bulbs shipped. These statements will only be sent when specifically requested. Therefore kindly keep a copy of your order.

DATE OF SHIPMENT. Although we like to follow carefully the desires of our customers, yet, too early shipment is not advisable. The earliest shipments often have too high seasonable temperature and bulbs stand travelling better a little later. We are obliged to choose the time that is most favorable for the flowering results.

CLUB ORDERS, which are to be shipped jointly to one address, are gladly accepted. We label each individual lot separately.

In this connection we should advise visitors to the National Exhibition Keukenhof not to come before the end of April.

In presenting to you with pleasure our new 1964 catalog we ask your attention to the following items that deserve your special interest. On page 10 the varieties of COLLAR DAFFODILS which are fine for flower arrangements. CITRIX on page 7 is a large sized new green trumpet daffodil of recent years. Also BACKHOUSE's GIANT (page 7) and SWANSDOWN (page 10) are worth a fair trial. The Greigii Hybrid Tulips MARGARET HERBST and ORIENTAL SPLENDOUR (page 18) are equally splendid for your garden as before but the price of these novelties has been very considerably reduced.

It is our aim to execute all orders with bulbs that are true to name and description. In case of substitution a similar or better named variety will be chosen.

All bulbs have had their proper treatment both in our gardens and in our stores and only the best handselected quality is being shipped.

All bulbs are being shipped FREE DESTINATION, duty and freight paid. Cultural hints will be sent together with the bulbs.

Spring catalog of Gladioli, Dahlias, Begonias etc. will be sent upon request.

WHEN TO ORDER: In order to ensure that no variety you wish to order is sold out, and to allow us sufficient time for selecting the stock and preparing the shipments, we strongly advise our patrons to mail their orders as early as possible. Orders reaching us in June and July and the first week of August can easily be prepared for shipment. After that time, orders are also welcome, but we are then very busy with packing. It will often be impossible to supply every item on orders arriving after October 1st.

AIR MAIL will bring us your order within 5 days.

What to do when the bulbs arrive. Unpack the bulbs immediately on arrival, and if they cannot be planted at once, store them thinly placed in trays in a cool, dark room with sufficient ventilation. The outdoor culture of daffodils, tulips, hyacinths, crocuses, scillas, etc., is very easy. If requested

we shall gladly give any detailed advice as to their treatment under special conditions. Cultural directions are being sent together with the bulbs.

WHOLESALE PRICES will be quoted by us upon request, but only to DEALERS, WHOLESALE SEEDSTORES, and LICENCED GROWERS. These prices are for delivery f.o.b. cars port of entry so that insurance, freight and duty are paid by us. NO CHARGE for cases and packing. You pay only carriage from port of entry to destination. Orders from wholesale list for less than \$ 50.00 cannot be accepted.

If non-commercial parties should want more considerable quantities of bulbs for resale purposes, a special discount may be arranged by correspondence when quantities and varieties required are stated.
